TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 3-game series vs Traci Annis' Padres and Game 6 (2-3) of a 7-game homestand that included a 2-2 series split vs the first-place Cardinals...is Game 15 (6-8) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh, 2-2 vs StL, 0-1 vs SD)...following this series and Thu's off day the Reds will embark on their longest road trip of the season, a **3-city**, **10-day**, **11-game** road trip to Pit's **PNC Park** (3g), Mia's **Marlins Park** (4g) and StL's **Busch Stadium** (4g, day/night DH on 8/31).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 3-2 this season vs SD but haven't won a season series vs the Padres since 2012 (6-2)...since then are 18-26, including 15-23 the last 6 years...over the last 6 seasons, Cin is 8-14 at Petco Park

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds are 1-1-2 in the first 4 series of the season vs the Pirates...from 4/4-4/7 the Pirates swept a 4-game series from the Reds for the first time since 7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium and did it in Pittsburgh for the first time since 8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field... from 3/31-4/5 the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in 3 consecutive games (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since 7/31-8/2, 1931 (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aguino produced 11 HR in his first 17 career games, including a 3-homer game on 8/10 vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

- Established modern Major League records for home runs in a player's first 12 career games (8), first 14 career games (9), first 16 career games (10) and first 17 career games (11)...will share, at least, with Rhys Hoskins the modern Major League record for HR in a player's first 20 career games.
- Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it, the second this season (Chi's Kris Bryant, 5/17 at Wsh, 7th-9th).
- Is the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
- Is the third rookie batter since 1900 to produce at least 10 HR over an 11-game span (8/6-8/17), joining LAD's Cody Bellinger (2017) and Det's Rudy York (1937).
- With 11 HR, all in August, is 3 shy of the club record for home runs in a calendar month...Frank Robinson hit 14 HR in August 1962, and Greg Vaughn had 14 HR in September 1999.

SUSPENDED: LHP Amir Garrett tonight returns from an 8-game suspension...in his absence the Reds went 2-6, while the bullpen's ERA was 4.30...he was not replaced on the 25-man roster...Garrett was 1 of 9 ejected in the 11-4 loss on 7/30 vs Pit and, 2 days later, 1 of 8 suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager David Bell (6g), RHP Jared Hughes (3g) and RF Yasiel Puig (3g) of the Reds and manager Clint Hurdle (2g), RHP Keone Kela (10g), José Osuna (5g) and RHP Kyle Crick (3g) of the Pirates.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (101), HR (37), RBI (98) and slugging percentage (.593) while ranking second in the majors in batting average (.307) and third in on-base percentage (.366)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 101-67, and are 30-8 (.789) when leading after the first inning...6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first.

REHABBING: RHP Tyler Mahle, on the injured list since 7/22 with a left hamstring strain, on Friday began a rehabilitation assignment for Louisville vs Rochester, started and received no decision in the 5-2 loss (1.1ip, 3h, 3er, 1bb, 2k, 37 pitches)... he is expected to pitch again for the Bats tomorrow night at Columbus... C Curt Casali, on the injured list since 7/18 with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee, on 8/9 and 8/10 made 2 rehab apps before he was shut down with soreness in his **left hamstring**...tonight is expected to return to that rehab assignment with Louisville...**IF/OF Derek Dietrich**, on the injured list since **8/5** with **left shoulder inflammation**, last night began a rehabilitation assignment with **Louisville** at Columbus, started at 2B and in the 5-4 Bats loss went 2-for-4 (1hbp, 2r).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 77 of the Reds' 124 games so far this season, including 51 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once solely as a pinch hitter, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a P/RF, 4 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 8 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/

 $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{LF}}$ (5/9 at Oak) and once as a $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{pinch}}$ runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...on Sun, 9/8 vs Ari will wear replica uniforms of the 1995 NL Central Division championship team...already wore uniforms from 1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967, 1969, 1976 and 1990...the 1869 Pavilion at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on May 4, the 150th anniversary of the Red Stockings' 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game.

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...tonight is making his first career appearance vs SD...in his last 9 starts is 5-1, 1.59 with 8 quality starts and 3 times was the victim of blown saves...in his last 6 starts at Great American Ball Park is 6-0, 2.27...is only the second pitcher ever to win 6 consecutive starts at GABP...Johnny Cueto did it twice, winning 7 straight starts from 6/6-8/18, 2012 and 6 consecutive starts from 6/11-8/10, 2014...will take a career-high 18-inning scoreless streak into tonight's start, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and the longest by a Reds pitcher since Jared Hughes led last year's staff with a career-high 19.2-inning scoreless streak (5/4-6/17)...the longest scoreless streak of Gray's career had been 14.2 innings (4/28-5/8, 2015)... in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on 8/5 vs LAA...has 8 wins and 4 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third Major League season at just 26 years old, was the Reds' Opening Day starter and is a 2019 National League All-Star...per Baseball America, his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League...in Fri's 13-4 loss vs StL allowed a career-high 8 runs and tied career highs by allowing 9 hits and 3 home runs (3-run by Dexter Fowler, 2-run by Paul DeJong, 2-run by Paul Goldschmidt)...in his last 30 apps beginning 9/1/18 is 14-6 and in that span ranks third among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.73...this season ranks among the National League leaders in wins (T7th), ERA (8th), strikeouts (6th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (5th, 10.64)...in his career has allowed 13 HR in the first inning, his highest total in any inning and including 3 HR in the first frame this year...in his 7-4 win on 8/5 vs LAA, his career-high 13 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher since Raisel Iglesias had 13 strikeouts on 8/23/15 vs Ari...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's Pitcher of the Month for March/April (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his Major League debut in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
