THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY
On this date in 1986, DH Jim Dwyer and LF Larry Sheets each hit grand slams in the ninth inning, but the pair of bases-loaded homers weren't enough as the Orioles fell to the Rangers, 13-11...2B Toby Harrah hit a grand slam for Texas in the second inning as the teams combined to tie the American League record with three grand slams in the same game.

RACKING UP THE K'S: From July 29-August 2, O's pitchers struck out at least 10 batters in five consecutive games, setting a new club record...The previous record of four-straight had been done three times...The O's have recorded 10-or-more strikeouts in seven of their 11 games this season.

⚾ The Orioles rank fourth in the AL and eighth in the majors with a 9.47 strikeouts per 9.0 innings mark (100 K/95.0 IP).

⚾ Orioles starting pitchers are tied for fifth in the AL and are tied for 11th in the majors with 52 strikeouts...Only Rays starters (58 K) have more among AL East clubs.

NO HOMERS CLUB: Wednesday's Game 2 loss against Miami marked the first game at home this season without a home run by either team and the first since June 30, 2019...The Orioles are 0-1 this season in homerless games at Oriole Park, after going 0-2 in such games last year...According to STATS, LLC., it was the 259th homerless game at Oriole Park since opening in 1992...The Orioles are 128-130-1 in homerless games at Camden Yards since 1992.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Orioles were swept by the Miami Marlins in Wednesday's double-header as they fell 1-0 in Game 1 and 2-1 in Game 2.

⚾ OF Austin Hays notched an RBI single in the sixth inning of Game 2 to snap a 21.0-inning scoreless stretch for the Orioles.

⚾ Following a three-game series sweep of the Tampa Bay Rays, the last three games against the Marlins mark the first time this season dropping three-straight games.

⚾ INF José Iglesias collected his sixth double of the season in Game 2...He is tied for second in the majors with six doubles, trailing only Boston's J.D. Martinez (7)...Six of his 11 hits on the season have been for extra bases.

AVOID THE SWEEP: The Orioles will attempt to avoid the series sweep tonight against Miami, as the Marlins have won the first three games of the set...The O's have never swept the Marlins in a series, but the Marlins have swept the Orioles three times since 1997.

⚾ September 1-3, 1997 at Florida, July 15-17, 2001 at Florida, and June 23-25, 2009 at Florida (all three were three-game series).

ON THE "ROAD" AGAIN: According to the Elias Sports Bureau, for statistical purposes, the home team is determined by whose grounds the game is played on...Therefore, even though the Marlins will bat last tonight, the O's (and Oriole Park at Camden Yards) will be the home club for statistical splits.

INTERLEAGUE INFO: The O's will play a total of 20 games against National League opponents this season, including contests with the Miami Marlins (0-3), Washington Nationals (six games), Philadelphia Phillies (three games), New York Mets (four games), and Atlanta Braves (three games)...Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the O's are 197-229...The O's went 7-13 in Interleague Play last season...Baltimore's 14 Interleague victories in 2016 were the most in club history.

ALL ABOUT THAT (ON) BASE: The Orioles rank seventh in the American League with a .697 team OPS (on-base percentage plus slugging percentage)...INF Hanser Alberto (.876) leads the team in OPS among qualifying hitters.

THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW: Since the start of the 2019 season, INF Hanser Alberto leads the majors with 94 hits off of left-handed pitching (22 more than then the next on the list)...In that time, he also leads the majors with a .407 (94-for-231) average against lefties...This season, Alberto ranks tied for 11th in the AL with a .326 (15-for-46) against all pitchers.

ROUGH ROAD AHEAD: Based on 2019 winning percentages, the Orioles own the second-toughest strength of schedule in the American League (tied for third-toughest in the majors)...The Orioles will play four of last year's 10 postseason teams in 2020...The toughest 2020 schedules based on 2019 winning percentages:

SABR 50 2.0: The Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) has announced that their 50th national convention will be held in Baltimore from June 16-20, 2021...SABR 50 was originally scheduled for July 2020, but was rescheduled due to the COVID-19 pandemic...The SABR national convention is an annual gathering of writers, researchers, fans, players, executives, scouts, and many others throughout the baseball community...Attendance is open to all baseball fans... INJURED LIST: Four players are on the Injured List...RHP Hunter Harvey (right forearm strain) and RHP Dillon Tate (right elbow contusion) are on the 10-day Injured List...INF/OF Trey Mancini (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment) and INF Richie Martin (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL...LHP John Means is currently on the bereavement list.

COACHING STAFF: The O's named Fredi González as Major League Coach, Darren Holmes as Bullpen Coach, and Anthony Sanders as First Base Coach...José Hernández shifted from Major League Coach to Assistant Hitting Coach...All other coaches remained in their same positions from the 2019 season: Doug Brocail as Pitching Coach, Tim Cossins as Major League Field Coordinator/Catching Instructor, José Flores as Third Base Coach, and Don Long as Hitting Coach.

THE SKIPPER: Brandon Hyde was named the 20th manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

LAST START: LeBlanc started at home against the Rays on 8/1, and did not factor in the decision after tossing 5.1 innings...Allowed one run on four hits, one home run, and one walk with three strikeouts...Now owns a 0-2 record and 4.29 ERA (10 ER/21.0 IP) in four career appearances (two starts) against Tampa Bay.

ORIOLES DEBUT: After signing with the team as a minor league free agent on February 3, 2020, he made his Orioles debut on 7/26 against Boston...Earned the win after allowing four earned runs on four hits, including two home runs, with no walks and four strikeouts over 5.2 innings at Fenway Park...He spent the 2018 and 2019 seasons with the Mariners, and appeared in 26 games (eight starts) for Seattle last year...He has also spent time with the Padres, Marlins, Astros, Yankees, Angels, and Pirates organizations.

CAREER VS. MIAMI: Will be making his seventh career outing (fifth start) against the Marlins...Owns a 1-2 record and 7.56 ERA (21 ER/25.0 IP) with 11 walks and 19 strikeouts through his first six appearances...His last outing against Miami came on 6/9/17 in which he pitched two innings in relief and surrendered three runs on four hits with two strikeouts...His last start against the Marlins was on 8/25/14 when he was dealt the loss after throwing 3.1 innings and allowing six runs on seven hits and three walks with three strikeouts.

FACING THE NL EAST: In his career, LeBlanc has made 46 appearances (18 starts) against the NL East, and holds a 5-11 record and 4.85 ERA (71 ER/131.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts...NL East opponents are batting .295 (152-for-516) with 14 home runs and 63 RBI against LeBlanc in his career...The .295 opponent average against the NL East ranks as his highest among all divisions.

ROCKY ROAD: Appeared in 11 games on the road last season and pitched to a 3-4 record with an 8.21 ERA (45 ER/49.1 IP), compared to a 3-3 record with a 4.00 ERA (32 ER/72.0 IP) in 15 games at home...Has gone 19-25 with a 5.33 ERA (240 ER/405.1 IP) in career road games...In road games, opponents hit .284 (458-for-1611) against LeBlanc, compared to .251 (444-for-1767) at home.

OH, THE RELIEF: Has pitched in 120 career games as a reliever, working to a 12-7 record with a 4.21 ERA (115 ER/246.0 IP), compared to his 34-40 record and 4.55 ERA (316 ER/625.0 IP) in 116 career starts...As a reliever, opponents hit .252 (238-for-946) against LeBlanc, while, opponents hit .273 (664-for-2432) against him as a starter...In 2018, LeBlanc pitched in relief in his first five games of the season before going on to make 27 consecutive starts, as opposed to his 2019 campaign in which his longest stretch of consecutive starts was six...LeBlanc made nine consecutive relief appearances to end the 2019 season, and the Mariners lost each of his final 10 outings.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS: Posted a 6-7 record with a 5.71 ERA (77 ER/121.1 IP) and 92 strikeouts in his 26 appearances (eight starts) with the Mariners...Fourteen of his 26 outings were 5.0-or-more innings...In his eight starts, he pitched to an 8.35 ERA (34 ER/36.2 IP), compared to a 4.57 ERA (43 ER/84.2 IP) in 18 relief appearances...Was 4-3 with a 4.09 ERA (33 ER/72.2 IP) in 13 games as the “bulk” pitcher following an opener...Earned the win in each of his first two starts (3/31 vs. BOS and 4/7 at CWS).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - LHP TOMMY MILONE (0-1, 5.63 ERA)

Milone will be making his third start of the season; started the season opener, the first of his career, on 7/24 at BOS...In his last start, on 8/2 vs. TB, Milone worked 5.0 innings, allowing one run on six hits with eight strikeouts...The eight strikeouts are the most in a single-game by an Orioles pitcher this year...Milone has made two career starts against the Nationals, going 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA (1 ER/12.1 IP) and 12 strikeouts in these two games...His last start against Washington came on August 27, 2017 while with the Mets...Made his Major League debut with Washington back on September 3, 2011.
