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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (65-71) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (68-68)

August 29, 2026 - Busch Stadium - St. Louis, MO - 1:15 CDT - Game #137/Road #71

RHP Lake Bachar (1-3, 3.70 ERA) vs. RHP Kyle Leahy (10-4, 3.13 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have gone 2-5 in the first seven games of this season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-1, August 24-26) and St. Louis (0-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 4-1 loss against the Cardinals on Friday at Busch Stadium...Will have the day off on Monday before starting a six-game homestand vs. San Francisco (Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (September 4-6)...Have hit 158 home runs (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)...Have the most hits (1178) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the fifth-most runs (658) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Washington (713), Chicago-NL (703), Milwaukee (674) and Los Angeles-NL (663), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs all of last season (they are looking to become only the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs the year after finishing last in the league in runs and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

CENTRAL PARKS: Pittsburgh is 20-21 vs. the National League Central, including 10-11 on the road...The Pirates won each of their first four road series vs. the division when they won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Cincinnati, won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago, won two of three games from April 24-26 at Milwaukee and won two of three games from May 19-21 at St. Louis...Pittsburgh lost three of four games from July 30-August 2 at Cincinnati and lost three of four games from August 3-6 at Milwaukee...The Pirates will play 11 of their final 26 games vs. the division, including five vs. St. Louis...Pittsburgh has finished with a winning record against the division twice since it formed in 1994, coming in 2013 (45-31) and 2018 (43-33).

THE GREAT LAKE: Lake Bachar, who will start for the Pirates today at St. Louis, is one of nine different pitchers who has started for Pittsburgh (also Braxton Ashcraft, Bubba Chandler, Jared Jones, Mitch Keller, Carmen Mlodzinski, Mason Montgomery, Yohan Ramirez & Paul Skenes)...The Pirates have not used nine or fewer starting pitchers in a full season since they used nine in 2018 (Chris Archer, Steven Brault, Clay Holmes, Nick Kingham, Chad Kuhl, Joe Musgrove, Iván Nova, Jameson Taillon & Trevor Williams).

SWITCHING THINGS UP: Bryan Reynolds enters today three hits shy of 1100 for his Major League career...He is one of three switch hitters in team history (since 1887) with at least 1000 hits, along with National Baseball Hall-of-Famer Max Carey (2418) and Johnny Ray (1009)...He leads all Major League switch hitters in hits since making his debut on April 20, 2019 vs. San Francisco.

BACK WHERE IT ALL BEGAN: Luke Weaver, who was selected by St. Louis in the first round (27th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft and pitched 233.0 innings over 52 appearances (43 starts) with the Cardinals from 2016-18, enters today one strikeout shy of 800 for his Major League career...He made his Major League debut on August 13, 2016 at Wrigley Field, where he struck out future teammate Dexter Fowler looking for his first career strikeout...Weaver earned his first Major League win here on August 26, 2016 vs. Oakland...He has pitched 12.1 scoreless innings across six career games (one start) against the Cardinals.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Pirates will play their 17th and 18th road games of August today and tomorrow at Busch Stadium...Pittsburgh played two games from August 1-2 at Cincinnati, four games from August 3-6 at Milwaukee, three games from August 11-13 at Miami, three games from August 21-23 at Los Angeles (NL), three games from August 24-26 at San Diego and on Friday at St. Louis...The Pirates' 18 road games will be their most road games played in a single calendar month since playing 19 road games in September 2015.

BE LIKE TRI: Jared Triolo went 2-for-3 with an RBI on Friday at St. Louis...He has gone 30-for-100 (.300) with nine extra-base hits, 15 RBI and an .837 OPS in his last 37 road games (since June 3 at Houston), including a .417 mark (10-for-24) and a 1.023 OPS in his last eight road games (since August 13 at Miami)...He is 15-for-45 (.333) in his 14 career games here at Busch Stadium.

FEELING BULLISH: Pittsburgh's bullpen has a 2.88 ERA (103.0ip/33er) in August...That is the fourth-lowest mark among all Major League bullpens during the month, trailing Milwaukee (1.49), Boston (2.25) and San Diego (2.79)...The bullpen's 103.0 innings pitched during the month are the third-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind Chicago-AL (132.0) and Toronto (112.1)...Their 123 August strikeouts are the most in Major League Baseball.

Starter Trevor Williams improved to 11-9 after allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out a career-high eight batters over his 6.0 innings of work. Adam Frazier, Gregory Polanco and Corey Dickerson each recorded multiple hits for the Pirates in that evening's victory.

LAST TIME OUT: Bachar stranded his inherited runner and pitched 1.1 perfect innings of relief (he struck out Luis Rengifo) in the Pirates’ 3-0 loss on Wednesday at San Diego.

AGAINST THE CARDINALS: Bachar has a 6.00 ERA (6.0ip/4er) in four career relief appearances against St. Louis...He has a 4.91 ERA (3.2ip/2er) in two games at Busch Stadium...Bachar allowed one run and had three strikeouts in 1.2 innings here on July 28, 2025, while also allowing one run over his 2.0 innings here this season on June 27.

START ME UP: Bachar has a 1.93 ERA (14.0ip/3er), 16 strikeouts and a .152 batting average against (7-for-46) in six starts this year, coming on June 2 at Washington (2.2ip), June 6 vs. Tampa Bay (3.0ip), June 13 at Pittsburgh (2.0ip), June 19 vs. San Francisco (1.1ip), August 16 vs. Boston (3.0ip) and August 23 at Los Angeles-NL (2.0ip)...He tossed 2.0 innings in his first career start last year on Sept. 1 at Washington.

I WANT YOU, BACH: Bachar was acquired by Pittsburgh from Miami, in exchange for right-handed pitcher Brandon Bidois, outfielder Brian Sanchez and infielder Hyun Seung Lee, prior to Major League Baseball’s Trade Deadline on August 3...He went 1-2 with two saves, a 3.84 ERA (58.2ip/25er), 61 strikeouts and a .201 batting average against (43-for-214) over his 38 appearances (four starts) with the Marlins this season.

RIGHT ON: Bachar has limited right-handed hitters to a .164 batting average against (19-for-116), a .238 on-base percentage and a .566 OPS this year...His batting average against versus righties is the fifth-lowest mark in Major League Baseball (minimum 115 at-bats)...He trails only Texas’ Jacob Latz (.108), Los Angeles (NL)’ Shohei Ohtani (.142), Tampa Bay’s Kevin Kelly (.154) and Chicago (NL)’s Ben Brown (.157) on the list.

ROAD TO THE SHOW: Bachar pitched in parts of seven minor league seasons (2016-19 and 2022-24) in San Diego’s organization (there was no minor league season in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and he missed all of 2021 while recovering from “Tommy John” surgery)...He was designated for assignment by the Padres on September 1, 2024 and was claimed off waivers by Miami on September 3, 2024...He made his Major League debut on September 8, 2024 vs. Philadelphia, where he struck out the side (Weston Wilson, Brandon Marsh and Aramis Garcia) in the eighth inning.

BACH-GROUND INFO: Bachar was originally selected by San Diego out of the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, where he played both football (2013-15) and baseball (2015-16), in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft (was rated by Baseball America as the No. 100 draft prospect before the season)...He led the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference w/103 strikeouts as a junior (‘16).
