TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a season-opening 3-game homestand vs **Abby Murphy's Red Sox** and the third game (1-1) of a 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game set vs the **Pirates**.

- Following Wed's game vs **Pit**, the Reds will embark on their first road trip of the 2026 season with a 3-game series at **Tex** and a 4-game set at **Mia**.

WALK IT OFF: CF **Dane Myers'** produced an RBI-single off RHP **Justin Slaten** in the 11th inning of yesterday's 6-5 win over the **Red Sox**...it marked **Myers'** third career walkoff hit.

- Myers'** hit was his first with the club, making him the first Red since **Paul Janish** (5/14/08 vs **Fla**) to record a walkoff hit for his first hit with the team.
- Yesterday's victory in the second game of the season marked the Reds' earliest walkoff win since 4/6/16 vs **Phi**, when **Scott Schebler's** bases loaded 2-run double in the 9th inning scored **Eugenio Suárez** and **Tyler Holt** to give the Reds a 3-2 win in Game 2 of that year.
- Last year, the Reds earned their first walkoff win on 6/6 vs **AZ**.

OUR PAL SAL: 1b **Sal Stewart** is the second Reds rookie since 1958 (when rookie rules were established) with at least 5 hits through the team's first 2 games of a season (**SS Zack Cozart**, 2012).

- Stewart** is the eighth Red (11th occurrence) since 1961 to reach base 3 or more times in each of the club's first 2 games of a season, the first since **Hall of Famer Barry Larkin** did it in 2001.

MATT STAT: 2b **Matt McLain** has reached safely 6 times in his first 10 PAs of 2026, including a career high 5 times in yesterday's 6-5 win vs **Bos**.

SPRING RECAP: The **Reds** finished 2026 Spring Training action with a 14-17 record, going 9-6 at Goodyear Ballpark (including when **Cin** was the "away" team vs **Cle**) and 5-11 on the road...the overall record reflects the 2 exhibition games the Reds lost vs the **Brewers** in Milwaukee on Mon and Tue.

- Reds** batters concluded their spring schedule ranked among Major League leaders in extra-base hits (129, 1st), average exit velocity (91.6 mph), home runs (55, T1st), total bases (535, 2nd), slugging pct (.499, 2nd), hard-hit balls (237, 2nd), and runs scored (182, 6th).
- The **Reds'** 55 home runs were their most in a single Spring Training season since 2006 (as far back as ST data is available), surpassing the previous best of 44 set by the 2024 club.
- Temperatures in the Phoenix area ran 20-30 degrees above normal this March and reached over 100 degrees for 5 consecutive days leading up to the Reds' departure on 3/22.
- Cin** earned its 200th win all-time in Cactus League action with a 3-2 victory on 2/25 at **CWS**.
- The Reds were successful in 37 of their 62 ABS challenges this spring (59.7%)...only **StL** (65.6%), **Sea** (62.3%), and **Phi** (62.3%) had higher success rates.

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Terry Francona** returns for his second season after guiding the 2025 Reds to their first Postseason berth since 2020 and their first during a full season since 2013...his 83-79 Reds were the 12th Postseason club he has managed in the majors.

- Francona** finished as the runner-up to **Mil's Pat Murphy** for the **2025 National League Manager of the Year Award**.
- He became the fifth skipper in Reds history to lead the team to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining **Lou Piniella** (1990), **John McNamara** (1979), **Sparky Anderson** (1970), & **Patrick Moran** (1919).
- Francona** became the 12th manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason (**Cin**, **Cle**, **Bos**).
- His 2,034 career wins as a Major League manager lead all active skippers and rank 12th in Major League history.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and **Red Sox** are meeting for the only time in 2026... **Bos** won 2 of 3 games vs **Cin** at **Fenway Park** in 2025, which marked the 50th anniversary of their historic battle in the 1975 World Series.

- These teams last met here at **Great American Ball Park** when **Bos** took 2 of 3 games from the Reds from 6/21-6/23, 2024...**Bos'** .733 winning pct here (11-4) is tied with **KC** (11-4) for best among all teams.
- The Reds won 2 of 3 games at **Fenway** in 2023...it was the first time **Cin** won a series vs the **Red Sox** since the aforementioned '75 Fall Classic, and the first regular season series win against a team from Boston since a 2-1 series victory vs the **Braves** in September 1952 (was the opening series of the **Braves'** final homestand in Boston).
- The Reds' 2-1 win on 5/31/22 was their first victory at **Fenway Park** since Game 7 of the 1975 World Series.
- Reds skipper **Terry Francona** managed the **Red Sox** from 2004-2011 and led them to 2 World Series championships, 5 Postseason apps, and 6 seasons of 90 or more wins...he finished his 8-year tenure in Boston with a 744-552 (.574) record while not suffering a single losing season.

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: With yesterday's 6-5 win in 11 innings, the Reds have avoided being swept in **32 consecutive home series** (including this one, min. 1g) dating back to 2024...it's the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept in **Cincinnati** in a franchise-record **52 consecutive home series**.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the **Cin** teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

2025 IN REVIEW: In 2025, the Reds reached the Postseason for the first time since 2020 and for the first time in a full season since 2013...they were swept in a best-of-3 National League Wild Card Series by the eventual World Series champion **Dodgers**.

- Although **Cin** and **NYM** finished with identical 83-79 records, the Reds secured the final Wild Card berth by winning 4 of 6 from the **Mets** during the season series.
- Following a 5-4 loss on 9/5 vs **NYM**, the Reds trailed both the **Mets** and **Padres** by 6.0 games for the final NL Wild Card berth with 21 games remaining...from there, the Reds went 13-8, while the **Mets** finished 7-14.

- Missed the entire 2025 regular season with injuries... began the year on the 15-day injured list with a right forearm strain...made rehab appearances at R-ACL Reds, A-Dayton, and AAA-Louisville...suffered a left oblique strain while rehabbing at Louisville and was transferred to the 60-day IL on 6/4/25.
- Didn't pitch again until he made 4 apps with Peoria in the Arizona Fall League (9ip, 5r/5er, 1bb, 8k, 1bb, 2hr, 2hb, 145 TP)...was selected as an Arizona Fall League Fall Star.

STILL A ROOKIE: Still meets rookie qualifications despite entering the season with over a year of service time (1.031).

SPRING RECAP: Went 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA in 5 Spring Training appearances (15.0ip, 17h, 10r/6er, 6bb, 18k, 0hr).

- Last pitched on Tue in the 4-1 exhibition loss vs Mil at American Family Field (3.0ip, 4h, 2r/1er, 0bb, 3k, 50 TP).

TOP PROSPECT: Enters the season rated as one of the Reds' top prospects per *Baseball America* (#3) and MLB Pipeline (#5)...is considered by *Baseball America* as having the best slider and best control in the Cincinnati system.

A STAR AT WAKE: After his 2023 junior season at Wake Forest, was named ACC Male Athlete of the Year, ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight season, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, *Baseball America* All-America first team, and Collegiate Baseball All-America first team...was a finalist for the National Pitcher of the Year and Dick Howser Trophy awards and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.

- He and teammate Chase Burns (2024) are the only pitchers from Wake Forest to win the ACC Pitcher of the Year Award.

PERSONAL: Graduated from North Stanly HS in New London, NC where he pitched a pair of no-hitters as a junior...twice was named to the North Carolina All-State team...was a member of the National Honor Society and Beta Club and president of the North Stanly chapter of the National Art Honor Society...as a junior led Wake Forest to its third College World Series (1949, 1955, 2023) after establishing program single-season records in wins (15) and strikeouts (143) while pitching the fourth-most innings (120.1) in school history... that season led the nation in wins while ranking fourth in both strikeouts and ERA (1.87)... in the 2023 College World Series, in his final collegiate appearance threw 7.0 shutout innings against eventual national champion LSU.

ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (7th overall) of the 2023 MLB Draft...was signed by Charlie Aliano.

SPRING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA in 6 spring starts for the Reds (17.0ip, 14h, 9r/9er, 7bb, 22k, 3hr, 288 TP).

- Last pitched on Tue in the Brewers' 4-1 exhibition win at American Family Field (5.0ip, 4h, 2r/2er, 0bb, 7k, 1hr, 68TP).

2025 REVIEW: Went 0-3 with a 4.57 ERA over 13 appearances (8 starts) in his Major League debut.

- Was placed on the 15-day injured list on 8/12 with a grade 1 right flexor strain...was activated on 9/11 and made his next 5 appearances out of the bullpen to end the season.

• Began the season at A-Dayton and made 3 apps with the Dragons before he was promoted AA-Chattanooga on 4/22...appeared in 8 games (all starts) for the Lookouts when he was promoted to AAA-Louisville on 6/10...made 2 starts for the Bats when he was promoted to Cincinnati on 6/24...was named Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year.

- At the time of his promotion to Cincinnati on 6/24, ranked among all full-season minor league pitchers in WHIP (0.77), ERA (1.77), strikeouts (89), opponents batting average (.167) and K/BB ratio (89k/13bb).

TENNESSEE STUD: The Hendersonville, TN native started the inaugural MLB Speedway Classic vs Atl in Bristol, TN on 8/2 at Bristol Motor Speedway.

- Was the first American League or National League game ever played in the Volunteer State.

57 STRIKEOUTS: His 57 strikeouts over his first 8 Major League appearances were the most by a Reds pitcher to begin his career since Gary Nolan (60k, 1967).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: On 6/24 vs NYN made his Major League debut after having his contract selected from AAA-Louisville earlier in the day...became the first Major League starting pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) to strike out the first 5 batters he faced in his Major League debut...struck out 8 batters total that day, becoming just the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 8 strikeouts in his Major League debut.

PERSONAL: Was born in Italy where his parents were stationed with the US Navy...his sister was born in Japan...grew up in Hendersonville, TN which is about 20 miles northeast of Nashville...pitched collegiately at Tennessee (2022-2023) before transferring to Wake Forest (2024)...graduated from Beech High School in Hendersonville, TN where he was selected by Baseball America as a 2021 First Team High School All-American...his father, David, played college football at Division II North Greenville College.
