## NEW YORK YANKEES (0-0) at SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (0-0)

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees open their 124th season in franchise history tonight against the San Francisco Giants at Oracle Park... their current three-game series (also Fri.-Sat.) is part of a season-opening six-game road trip as the Yankees will also travel to Seattle from 3/30-4/1.

- ▶ Have won each of their last four Opening Day games and are 7-1 in their last eight Opening Day games since 2018.
- ▶ Are 70-52-1 (.574) all-time on Opening Day.
- ▶ Are 31-34 (.477) all-time on the road on Opening Day...are opening the season on the road for just the third time in the last eight seasons (since 2019)...is the fifth time the Yankees have begun the season on the road in the last 12 years (since 2015).
- ▶ Are facing San Francisco on Opening Day for the second time in franchise history (5-0 win in 2023).
- ▶ Will open the season against a National League opponent for the fourth time in franchise history (also 2020 at Washington, 2023 vs. San Francisco and 2025 vs. Milwaukee).
- ▶ Today's 3/25 season opener marks the earliest regular season game in Yankees history (previous: 3/27/25 vs. Milwaukee).

**SPRING FLING:** The Yankees went 19-12 in 31 spring training games this year...among Grapefruit League clubs, Yankees hitters ranked first in home runs (47), second in walks (130), RBI (145), runs scored (153) and total bases (426), and third in SLG (.426) and OPS (.750).

- ▶ **OF Aaron Judge** hit .316/.458/.789 (6-for-19) with 6R, 3HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1HP in eight spring training games.
- ▶ **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit .286/.276/.714 (8-for-28) with 5R, 4HR, 6RBI and 1SF in 11 spring training games.
- ▶ **RHP Paul Blackburn** went 1-1 with one save and a 1.88 ERA (14.1IP, 13H, 3R/ER, 7BB, 12K, 1HR) in five games (two starts) in spring training.
- ▶ **RHP David Bednar** made five relief appearances in spring training, went 1-0 over 4.2 scoreless innings (0H, 1BB, 2K)...also made four scoreless appearances for Team USA in the WBC (4.0IP, 6H, 8K, 1HP).
- ▶ **RHP Will Warren** went 2-1 with a 1.42 ERA (25.1IP, 13H, 5R/4ER, 3BB, 22K) in six spring starts...among Grapefruit League pitchers, ranked first in innings pitched, opponents' BA (.148), and WHIP (0.63), was tied for first in starts, second in ERA and fourth in strikeouts.
- ▶ **RHP Cam Schlichter** went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (9.2IP, 6H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 11K) in three spring starts.
- ▶ **RHP Carlos Lagrange** was the recipient of the 2026 James P. Dawson Award, given annually to the most outstanding Yankees rookie in spring training.

**THE SKIPPER, TOO:** Manager **Aaron Boone** begins his ninth season at the helm in 2026...Boone has compiled a career 697-497 (.584) managerial record and has led the Yankees to a postseason berth in seven of his first eight seasons at the helm (2018-22, '24-25)...excluding the abbreviated 60-game 2020 season, the Yankees have averaged 95 wins per year during Boone's tenure... **has 697 career regular season managerial wins and needs three wins to reach 700**...his 697 wins rank seventh on the Yankees' all-time list, trailing only Joe McCarthy (1,460-867-21), Joe Torre (1,173-767-2), Casey Stengel (1,149-696-6), Miller Huggins (1,067-719-10), Ralph Houk (944-806-7) and Joe Girardi (910-710).

**OPENING DAY NOD:** LHP **Max Fried** will make his fourth career Opening Day start and first with the Yankees tonight at San Francisco...also started on Opening Day three times with Atlanta (2021-23)...will be the 61st different pitcher to start on Opening Day for the Yankees and the 19th left-handed pitcher to do so...along with Nestor Cortes in 2024 and Carlos Rodon in 2025, it will mark the first time the Yankees have had three different left-handed pitchers start three straight Opening Days.

- ▶ Went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 62ER) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025...set career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...was named to his third career All-Star team and won his fourth career Gold Glove Award...finished fourth in AL Cy Young Award voting.
- ▶ Last season, led the Majors in wins (19), ranked second in winning percentage (.792, first in AL) and pickoffs (eight, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP ratio (0.65, second in AL), eighth in ERA (2.86, fourth in AL), ninth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.97, third in AL), groundball percentage (52.7%, third in AL) and opponents' SLG (.334, fourth in AL), and tied for ninth in starts (32, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranked sixth in the AL in opponents' OPS (.615) and ninth in opponents' OBP (.281) and WHIP (1.10).

**FIRST IMPRESSIONS:** **OF Aaron Judge** has hit safely in each of his nine career Opening Day games, batting .389/.450/.639 (14-for-36) with 8R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI and 4BB in those games... **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** has hit 5HR in his career on Opening Day, including 4HR with the Yankees...has reached base in 11-of-32 Opening Day plate appearances with the Yankees, batting .300/.344/.733 (9-for-30) with 6R, 1 double, 4HR, 8RBI and 2BB in seven games... **OF Trent Grisham** has hit .333/.385/.417 (4-for-12) with 2R, 1 double and 1BB in four career Opening Day games.

**HOW THEY WERE BUILT:** Of the 26 players on the Yankees' 2026 Opening Day active roster, 10 were signed as free agents (Bellinger, Blackburn, Escarra, Fried, Goldschmidt, Grichuk, Hill, Judge\*, Rosario and Yarbrough), 10 were acquired by trade (Bednar, Bird, Caballero, Chisholm Jr., Cruz, Doval, Grisham, McMahon, Stanton and Weathers), five were originally drafted and signed by the Yankees (Judge\*, Rice, Schlittler, Warren and Wells), one was claimed off waivers (Headrick) and one was selected in the Rule 5 Draft (Winquest).

- ▶ Of the 26 players on the Yankees' 2026 Opening Day active roster — **P (7):** Bednar, Bird, Blackburn, Doval, Schlittler, Weathers, Winquest; **INF (1):** McMahon; **OF (2):** Grichuk, Stanton; **UTIL (2):** Caballero, Rosario.
- ▶ The Yankees' Opening Day active roster includes players from the Bahamas, Dominican Republic, Panamá, Puerto Rico and United States.
- ▶ Schlittler and Winquest are making their first career Opening Day active roster...Winquest is the only rookie and only player in line to make his Major League debut...three players are in line to make their Yankees debuts (Grichuk, Weathers and Winquest).

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** won his third career American League MVP and his first career batting title in 2025 after hitting .331/.457/.688 (179-for-541) with 137R, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 53HR, 114RBI, 124BB/36IBB, 7HP, 75F and 12SB in 152 games...set career highs in BA, runs scored and IBB...led the Majors in BA (.331), OBP (.457), SLG (.688), OPS (1.144), times on base (310), intentional walks (36) and WAR (10.1 - FanGraphs), ranked second in runs scored (137, first in AL), total bases (372, first in AL), walks (124, first in AL), XBH (85, first in AL) and go-ahead RBI (31, second in AL), fourth in home runs (53, second in AL), tied for fourth in hits (179, third in AL) and game-winning RBI (17, tied for third in AL), fifth in RBI (114, second in AL) and tied for fifth in multi-hit games (51, tied for fourth in AL).

- ▶ Became only the fourth player in franchise history to win the AL MVP at least three times (also 2022 and '24), joining Mickey Mantle (three times), Yogi Berra (three times) and Joe DiMaggio (three times)...became only the fourth Yankee to win the AL MVP in consecutive seasons, joining Roger Maris (1960-61), Mantle (1956-57) and Berra (1954-55).

**THE SAN FRANCISCO TREAT:** **OF Aaron Judge** has hit .484/.590/1.000 (15-for-31) with 11R, 1 double, 5HR, 10RBI, 7BB, 1HP and 2SB in nine career games vs. San Francisco...in three career games at Oracle Park, has hit .600/.692/1.500 (6-for-10) with 5R, 3HR, 6RBI, 3BB and 2SB... **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** has hit .320/.401/.727 (62-for-194) with 34R, 17 doubles, 1 triple, 20HR, 42RBI, 23BB and 4HP in 51 career games vs. San Francisco...has hit 8HR in his last 11 games against the Giants (since 7/7/17)...has also batted .310/.377/.690 (36-for-116) with 16R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 22RBI, 11BB and 2HP in 29 games at Oracle Park.

**YEAR IN REVIEW:** The Yankees posted a 94-68 (.580) record in 2025, tied with Toronto for the best record in the American League and tied for the third-best record in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (97-65, .599) and Philadelphia (96-66, .593)...their 94 wins matched their 2024 total.

- ▶ The Yankees recorded their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.
- ▶ Recorded at least 90 wins for the seventh time in their last eight 162-game seasons (2017-19, '21-22, '24-25)...are one of only two teams to record at least seven 90-win seasons over that span, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers (eight: 2017-19, '21-25)...have recorded at least 90 wins in 22 of their last 29 full seasons since 1996 (1996-99, 2001-07, '09-12, '17-19, '21-22, '24-25)...their 22 seasons are the most in the Majors over that span (next: Atlanta and Los Angeles-NL - 16).

**ELITE COMPANY:** The Yankees have four former MVPs on their Opening Day roster: **INF/OF Cody Bellinger**, **INF Paul Goldschmidt**, **OF Aaron Judge** and **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton**...the Yankees are only the ninth team in Major League history to have at least four former Most Valuable Players play for them in a single season...join the 2025 Yankees (Bellinger/Goldschmidt/Judge/Stanton), 2025 Dodgers (Betts/Freeman/Kershaw/Ohtani), 2024 Dodgers (Betts/Freeman/Kershaw/Ohtani), 2022 Dodgers (Bellinger/Betts/Freeman/Kershaw), 2021 Dodgers (Bellinger/Betts/Kershaw/Pujols), 1996 Red Sox (Canseco/Clemens/Mitchell/Vaughn), 1982 Angels (Baylor/Carew/Jackson/Lynn) and 1978 Reds (Bench/Foster/Morgan/Rose) - credit: Elias.

**GOT YOUR NUMBER:** **OF Aaron Judge** has hit .429/.556/1.429 (3-for-7) with 1 double, 2HR and 2BB against San Francisco's RHP Logan Webb... **INF Ryan McMahon** has hit .310/.370/.452 (13-for-42) with 3 doubles, 1HR and 4BB against Webb.

**CADE'S QUEST:** RHP **Cade Winquest** is the first Rule 5 pick to make the Yankees' Opening Day roster since INF Josh Phelps in 2007.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (19-5, 2.86 ERA IN 2025)

**LHP Max Fried** will make his fourth career Opening Day start tonight at San Francisco...the 32-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest after making his final spring training start on Thursday vs. Baltimore (ND, 5.0IP, 5H, 3R/ER, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...posted a 4.40 ERA (14.1IP, 12H, 7R/ER, 4BB, 12K, 2HR) without recording a decision in three official spring training starts...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over nine Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025), has gone 92-41 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.03 ERA (1,079.2IP, 947H, 405R/364ER, 297BB, 1,052K, 90HR) in 200 career games (183 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.82), winning percentage (.709) and pickoffs (26), is tied for first in wins (73) and shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.66) and opponents' SLG (.331), third in opponents' OPS (.613), groundball percentage (54.1%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.20), tied for sixth in complete games (five) and seventh in WHIP (1.09) and opponents' OBP (.281)...his 90 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

**OPENING DAY NOD:** Will make his fourth career Opening Day start and first with the Yankees tonight at San Francisco...also started on Opening Day three times with Atlanta (2021-23): 3/30/23 at Washington (ND, 3.1IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 0BB, 2K, 0HR), 4/7/22 vs. Cincinnati (L, 5.2IP, 8H, 5R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR, 1HP) and 4/1/21 at Philadelphia (ND, 5.0IP, 6H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 8K, 0HR, 1HP)...is 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA (14.0IP, 8ER) and 15K in three Opening Day starts...was just the fifth Braves left-hander to start three Opening Days, joining Warren Spahn (10), Tom Glavine (four), Irv Young (three) and Ed Brandt (three)...was the first Braves left-hander to start consecutive Opening Days since Warren Spahn started six consecutive Opening Days from 1957-62.

- ✦ Will be the 61st different pitcher to start on Opening Day for the Yankees and the 19th left-handed pitcher.
- ✦ Along with Nestor Cortes in 2024 and Carlos Rodón in 2025, it will mark the first time the Yankees have had three different left-handed pitchers start three straight Opening Days.
- ✦ Has made eight career Opening Day rosters (2019-24 with Atlanta and 2025-26 with the Yankees).

**SPRING FLING:** Made three official spring starts, posting a 4.40 ERA (14.1IP, 12H, 7R/ER, 4BB, 12K, 2HR) without recording a decision...also made his spring debut in the Yankees' exhibition against Team Panamá on 3/3 and earned the win (3.0IP, 1H, 0R, 3BB, 1K).

**2025:** Went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees...set career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...was named his third career All-Star team...opponents batted .223/.281/.334 (164-for-737, 14HR); LH .209/.282/.393 (34-for-163, 8HR); RH .226/.281/.317 (130-for-574, 6HR)...finished fourth in AL Cy Young Award voting.

- ✦ Led the Majors in wins (19), ranked second in winning percentage (.792, first in AL) and pickoffs (eight, first in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP ratio (0.65, second in AL), eighth in ERA (2.86, fourth in AL), ninth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.97, third in AL), groundball percentage (52.7%, third in AL) and opponents' SLG (.334, fourth in AL), and tied for ninth in starts (32, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranked sixth in the AL in opponents' OPS (.615) and ninth in opponents' OBP (.281) and WHIP (1.10).
- ✦ Won his fourth career Gold Glove Award (also 2020-22 with Atlanta), becoming the fourth pitcher in franchise history to win the award (13th time by a pitcher), joining Ron Guidry (5x: 1982-86), Bobby Shantz (4x: 1957-60) and Mike Mussina (3x: 2001, '03 and '08)...also won his second career Fielding Bible Award (also 2020 with Atlanta).
- ✦ Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of his 32 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 15 of those starts...his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were tied for the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors...his 15 starts of 1ER-or-fewer were tied for the sixth-most in the AL...was the first pitcher in franchise history (excluding openers) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first 11 starts of a season (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...Chad Green did so in his first 11 starts as an opener in 2019.
- ✦ The Yankees went 22-10 in Fried's starts...his 22 team wins were the second-most in the AL and tied with San Francisco's Robbie Ray (22-10) for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Crochet (23-9) and Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (23-9).
- ✦ His career-high 19 wins matched the most by a Yankee in a single season in the last 15 years since 2011 (also CC Sabathia in 2011 and Luis Severino in 2018)...his 19 wins were tied with CC Sabathia (19-8 in 2009) and Ed Figueroa (19-10 in 1976) for the third-most by a Yankees pitcher in his first season with the club in the Expansion Era (since 1961), trailing only Catfish Hunter (23-14 in 1975) and Tommy John (21-9 in 1979).
- ✦ His 2.86 ERA was the fourth-lowest by a Yankee in the last 44 years (since 1982), trailing only Gerrit Cole's 2.63 ERA in 2023 and 2.84 ERA in 2020, and David Cone's 2.82 ERA in 1997.
- ✦ Tossed at least 6.0 innings in 21 of his 32GS, tied for the sixth-most in the AL and tied for the eighth-most in the Majors...tossed at least 7.0 innings in 13 of his starts, tied with Detroit's Tarik Skubal (13) and Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (13) for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Garrett Crochet (14)...were the most by a Yankee since 2017 when Luis Severino recorded 14GS and Masahiro Tanaka recorded 13GS.
