DETROIT TIGERS (60-41) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-61)

July 22, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #102/Home #52

RHP Casey Mize (9-3, 3.15 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (3-10, 3.48 ERA)

THE PIRATES: snapped a three-game losing streak with a 3-0 win over Detroit on Monday...Will host the Tigers for two more games (Tuesday-Wednesday) before welcoming Arizona (July 25-27) to PNC Park for three games to conclude this nine-game homestand (were swept by Chicago-AL in a three-game series from Friday-Sunday)...Are in the 14th game of a stretch of 15 straight games against American League opponents (11th game of a 12-game stretch against the American League Central)...Have gone 27-24 at home in 2025...Are 28-35 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta.

SHUT 'EM DOWN: Pittsburgh pitched its 11th shutout of the season on Monday vs. Detroit, tied with Chicago (NL) for the second-most shutouts in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only San Diego (14)...The Pirates had 12 shutouts during the 2024 season...It also marked Pittsburgh's first shutout of the Tigers here at PNC Park since April 26, 2018, when Corey Dickerson belted a walkoff, solo home run (off Alex Wilson), giving the Pirates a 1-0 victory.

A QUALITY INDIVIDUAL: Mitch Keller enters today with a team-best 14 quality starts (tied for the third-most in all of MLB)...Keller and Paul Skenes tied for the team lead with 15 quality starts last season, while Keller led the team with 18 quality starts in 2023...Keller's 47 quality starts since the start of 2023 are the eighth-most in all of MLB, trailing only Zack Wheeler (62), Logan Webb (59), Framber Valdez (51), Seth Lugo (49), José Berrios (48), Corbin Burnes (48) and Luis Castillo (48).

MONEY MITCH: Mitch Keller has recorded a 2.32 ERA (42.2ip/11er) dating back to his start on June 10 vs. Miami...That's the seventh-lowest mark among National League pitchers in that span (13th-best in all of MLB)...Keller's .201 batting average against during that stretch is the seventh-lowest in the National League (12th in MLB).

RELIABLE RENEGADE: David Bednar converted his 14th straight save opportunity to begin the season with a scoreless ninth inning on Monday vs. Detroit...The only Pittsburgh pitcher to finish a season with at least 10 saves and zero blown saves (since saves became an official stat in 1969) was Mike Gonzalez (24) in 2006...Bednar has not allowed an earned run in 20 straight outings (19.1ip), dating back to May 24 vs. Milwaukee, the longest-such streak of his career (his previous high was 13 straight from June 11-July 22, 2023).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds drove in two runs during Pittsburgh's three-run second inning on Monday vs. Detroit...The Pirates are 12-3 in the last 15 games when he records at least one RBI, dating back to May 20 vs. Cincinnati...Reynolds has hit safely in five of his last six games (since July 12 at Minnesota), going 7-for-23 (.304) with three doubles.

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Horwitz hit leadoff on Monday vs. Detroit, going 3-for-4 and driving in the game-winning run with his second-inning single that scored Ke'Bryan Hayes...He became the fourth Pittsburgh leadoff hitter since 2020 with three hits and the game-winning RBI in a game, along with Isiah Kiner-Falefa on September 15, 2024 vs. Kansas City, Andrew McCutchen on May 29, 2024 [G2] at Detroit and Hayes on September 6, 2021 vs. Detroit.

ALL-STAR CREW: Paul Skenes has tossed at least 5.0 innings with two or fewer runs allowed in 18 starts this season, the most in all of Major League Baseball...His 36-such starts since the start of 2024 are the third-most in all of MLB, trailing only Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler (42) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (37)...Skenes' 44 total starts in that stretch are tied for the 50th-most in MLB.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 22, 1918: Corey Dickerson homered in his fourth straight game, as the Pirates defeated the Reds, 9-2, at Great American Ball Park, completing a three-game sweep and increasing their winning streak to nine games. It was Pittsburgh's first sweep of Cincinnati since September 27-29, 2013. Dickerson also doubled and scored three times as part of his four-hit performance.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 29-year-old Keller is in his seventh Major League season...He signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 23, 2024... He earned Opening Day honors in both 2023 and 2024, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16... He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Keller allowed one run on four hits (zero walks) over 6.0 innings on July 13 at Minnesota...He had with a no-decision in the team’s 2-1, last at-bat victory.

AGAINST THE TIGERS: Keller will make his sixth career start against Detroit tonight... He has gone 1-1 with a 3.67 ERA (27.0ip/11er) in his previous five outings, having allowed two runs or fewer in four of the first five outings...Tonight will mark Keller’s first start against the Tigers since April 8, 2024, when he allowed two runs on five hits and three walks (nine strikeouts) in 6.0 innings, winning a 7-4 decision vs. Reese Olson.

DON'T WALK HERE: Keller has allowed two walks or fewer in each of his last 12 starts, dating back to May 13 at New York (NL)...The last Pittsburgh pitcher to do that in at least 13 straight starts within a single season was Bailey Falter, who did so in 14 straight starts from April 6-June 24, 2024...Keller’s 27 total walks this season are tied with New York (AL)’s Max Fried for the fifth-fewest among all Major League pitchers with at least 119.0 innings pitched, behind only Detroit’s Tarik Skubal (16), Tampa Bay’s Zack Littell (17), Seattle’s Bryan Woo (22) and Philadelphia’s Zack Wheeler (26).

THE CONSISTENCY OF KELLER: Keller made 20 starts prior to the All-Star break, tied for the most in the National League, along with Arizona’s Zac Gallen, Washington’s Jake Irvin, Arizona’s Merrill Kelly, Milwaukee’s Freddy Peralta, San Francisco’s Robbie Ray, teammate Paul Skenes and San Francisco’s Logan Webb...His 119.0 innings pitched prior to the break were tied with Ray for the fourth-most in the National League, behind Webb (125.2), Philadelphia’s Zack Wheeler (122.0) and Skenes (121.0).

AND THE WHIFF: With his third-inning strikeout of Masyn Winn in the 5-0 win on July 2 vs. St. Louis, his last start at PNC Park, Keller became the stadium’s all-time leader in strikeouts (he has 389 total strikeouts here)...Paul Maholm ranks second with 383.

FLYING HIGH IN JULY: Keller has a 1.37 ERA (19.2ip/3er) in his first three starts in the month of July...That’s the seventh-lowest ERA among all National League pitchers with at least 19.0 innings pitched this month...The only National League pitchers with a lower ERA than Keller this month are Nick Pivetta (0.74), Paul Skenes (0.86), Matthew Boyd (0.90), David Peterson (0.92), Eury Pérez (1.17) and Cristopher Sánchez (1.27).

QUALITY IS JOB ONE: Keller has recorded 14 quality starts this season, tied for the third-most in all of MLB, trailing Logan Webb and Zack Wheeler, who have 15 apiece.

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller enters tonight’s start with 779 strikeouts, 18th-most in Pirates history...Howie Camnitz ranks 17th with 806 (Bob Friend ranks first with 1682).

CLOSE CALLS: Keller has pitched in 10-one run games this season (last on July 13 at Minnesota)...He is 1-4 with a 2.53 ERA (67.2ip/19er) and 49 strikeouts in those starts.

STAYING IN THE PARK: Keller is averaging only 0.68 home runs allowed per 9.0 innings pitched, the fifth-lowest mark among all qualified pitchers in the National League, trailing only teammate Paul Skenes (0.43), New York’s David Peterson (0.55), Philadelphia’s Cristopher Sánchez (0.55) and San Francisco’s Logan Webb (0.62).
