METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 3-1, on Saturday... The Mets are 9-6 over their last 15 games and 21-18 over their last 39 games...The team is in the midst of a six-game homestand (2-3) against the Cardinals (1-2) and Braves (1-1)...Following this series, the team hits the road for a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

BO KNOWS BALL: Bo Bichette singled in the first inning and doubled in the sixth inning yesterday...He has hit safely in seven of his last nine games including five multi-hit games...Over that span he is batting .389 (14-36) with six runs, three doubles, one triple, three home runs, 12 RBI and has a 1.146 OPS.

THE HUSASCAR GOES TO: Huascar Brazobán retired all five batters he faced, four via strikeout on Friday...His four strikeouts on the night were his most in an outing since May 21, 2025 at Boston...As a relief pitcher, has pitched to a 1.30 ERA (4 ER/27.2 IP) across 23 appearances...He ranks sixth in the NL in relief pitcher ERA (min. 20.0 IP).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in stretch of nine of 17 games are against the division including the Braves (1-1) and Phillies (six games)...The Mets are 7-8 against the NL East this season... They have posted a 4.29 ERA against the division, while batting .235/.301/.404.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won 11 of their last 17 games at Citi Field...They are now 17-18 at home this season...The team has posted a 4.33 ERA, while batting .233/.299/.374 at Citi Field.

POWER OF THE PEN: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.35 ERA (113 ER/304.0 IP) as a group...That ranks fourth in the majors and third in the National League...They have struck out 309 this season, the most in the NL and the most in The Show.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 640 strikeouts this season, that is the fourth-most in the National League and the fifth-most in the majors...Their 640 punchouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through the team's first 70 games of a season.

JUAN SOLO CUP: Juan Soto singled in the fourth inning and doubled in the ninth inning yesterday...Has reached base safely in each of his last six games...He is batting .350 (7-20) with three runs, two doubles, two homers, three RBI, six walks with a 1.230 OPS over that span...Overall, his .937 OPS ranks fourth in the National League.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 259 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 259 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic...George Bell is next with 265.

WILL I AM: On Friday, Devin Williams picked his sixth career save of four or more outs and his first since May 28, 2023...He is unscored upon in 15 of his last 17 appearances dating back to April 26 and has 24 strikeouts during that span...His 37 strikeouts this season are seventh-most among NL relief pitchers.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 65-84 all-time against the Braves at Citi Field...The Mets are 6-4 against Atlanta dating back to June 25, 2025 and have outscored the Braves 65-43 during that span...Had lost eight of their previous nine contests against Atlanta from July 27, 2024 - June 24, 2025

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 16 appearances...He has tossed 18.0 scoreless innings, allowing 10 hits, four walks and has struck out 19 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.40 ERA (8 ER/30.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 27 strikeouts in 27 appearances...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

DOWN ON THE FARM: – The St. Lucie Mets enjoyed a dominant 10-1 win over the Palm Beach Cardinals on Saturday night at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...RHP Jonathan Jimenez limited the Cardinals to one run on two hits over 6.0 innings...He did not walk a batter and struck out four, throwing only 78 pitches to earn his first win of the season.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets won their fourth straight game as they defeated the Pirates, 5-1, at Shea Stadium...Sid Fernandez tossed a complete game allowing one earned run on three hits with one walk and eight strikeouts...Wally Backman collected two hits in the win, while Ed Hearn notched a double...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

PREVIOUSLY ON: Allowed a season-high six earned runs over 6.0 innings on June 9 vs. St. Louis...Was the 10th time in his career he has allowed at least six earned runs and the first time since June 14, 2024 vs. Cincinnati while with Milwaukee...He has completed at least 6.0 innings in five of his last eight starts after only doing so once over his first six starts of the season.

THE GAME OF RISP: So far this season, opposing batters are 11-68 (.162) with runners in scoring position against Peralta...Peralta ranks 10th in the NL and 16th in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Peralta ranks 10th in the majors in opponents' OBP (.247, min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .203 (108-532) average with RISP, the second-best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

BRINGING THE HEAT AGAINST HOTLANTA: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his 10th career appearance (9th start) against the Braves...Through his first nine outings against Atlanta, is 5-2 with a 4.26 ERA (21 ER/44.1 IP) and 54 strikeouts...Has allowed two or fewer runs in five of his eight career starts against the Braves.

DAY AND NIGHT: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his 10th day start of the season...In nine day games this season, Peralta is 2-3 with a 3.73 ERA (21 ER/50.2 IP)...After today, Peralta's 10 day game starts will be tied with Kyle Bradish for the most in the majors...In 133 career night games (98 starts), Peralta is 45-27 with a 3.69 ERA (237 ER/578.1 IP)...In 92 career day games (78 starts), Peralta is 29-20 with a 3.53 ERA (169 ER/430.2 IP).

NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE: On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/9 IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

2025 RECAP: Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE: On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

KEEPIN' IT 200: In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

REVERSE, REVERSE: For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .205 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL: In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%...This season, Peralta has thrown his fastball 54% of the time and his changeup 23.5% of the time...Peralta has held opposing batters to a .227 (33-140) average with his fastball and has struck out 33 batters with the pitch.
