AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a nine-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game set at Boston (through Thurs.)...will also face the Astros (Fri.-Sun.) and Rangers (4/27-29)...went 5-2 on their recent seven-game homestand after splitting their four-game set vs. Los Angeles-AL and sweeping a three-game set against Kansas City.

- ▶ Have won or split five of their seven series this season (4-2-1).
- ▶ Have won five of their last seven games (since 4/13) after dropping their previous five games (4/8-12).
- ▶ The Yankees' +28 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees completed a three-game sweep with a 7-0 win over the Royals on Sunday vs. Kansas City at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Ryan Weathers** (7.1IP, 5H, 0R, 1BB, 8K) earned his first win as a Yankee after tossing 7.1 scoreless innings...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his ninth home run of the season with a go-ahead two-run home run in the first inning...**DH Ben Rice** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base three times for his second straight game and homered in his fourth consecutive game, hitting his eighth home run of the season with a solo shot in the second inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit his third home run of the season with a three-run shot in the fifth inning...**C Austin Wells** (0-for-1, 1RBI, 2BB, 1SF) reached base twice and drove in a run in the first inning with a sac fly...**LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 2BB) reached base three times and extended his season-high hitting streak to eight games with a fifth-inning double...**RHP Angel Chivilli** (1.2IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K, 1HP) tossed 1.2 scoreless innings of relief.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers recorded their fourth shutout of the season on Sunday vs. Kansas City (also 3/25 at San Francisco, 3/27 at San Francisco and 3/31 at Seattle).

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** rank second in the Majors in BB/9.OIP (2.76, second in AL), third in K/BB (3.35, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.293, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.642, first in AL), fourth in WHIP (1.17, first in AL), sixth in ERA (3.40, second in AL), seventh in opponents' SLG (.348, second in AL), eighth in K/9.OIP (9.25, sixth in AL) and HR/9.OIP (0.83, fourth in AL), and 10th in opponents' BA (.229, fourth in AL).

WEATHERS REPORT: Ryan Weathers earned his first win as a Yankee after tossing 7.1 scoreless innings on Sunday vs. Kansas City (5H, 1BB, 8K)...marked his first scoreless start of the season and first since 9/11/25 vs. Washington with Miami (5.OIP)...was the second-longest scoreless start of his career, trailing only his 8.0 scoreless innings on 5/14/24 at Detroit with Miami.

- ▶ Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in three of his five starts this season.

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger reached base three times and extended his season-high hitting streak to eight games on Sunday vs. Kansas City...has hit .355/.444/.613 (11-for-31) with 6R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 5BB and 1SB over his hitting streak (since 4/11).

- ▶ As a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .343/.401/.583 (60-for-175) with 11 doubles, 2 triples, 9HR, 20BB and 1HP vs. left-handed pitching.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit 18HR over their last seven games (since 4/13) after hitting only 14HR over their first 15 games from 3/25-4/12.

- ▶ **Yankees batters** rank second in the Majors in stolen bases (27, first in AL) and PA/BB (7.61, first in AL), tied for second in walks (109, second in AL), third in home runs (32, second in AL), fourth in SLG (.410, second in AL) and pitches per PA (4.05, third in AL), tied for fifth in XBH (68, tied for second in AL), sixth in OPS (.733, second in AL), ninth in runs scored (110, fourth in AL) and tied for ninth in RBI (103, fourth in AL).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Yankees batters scored 3R in the first inning on Sunday vs. Kansas City...their 19R in the first inning this season are the most in the AL and tied with Philadelphia for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Washington (22R)...the Yankees are 6-4 this season when scoring in the first inning.

- ▶ **Are 11-3 this season when scoring first.**

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells reached base twice and drove in a run in the first inning with a sac fly on Sunday vs. Kansas City...has reached base safely in 12-of-26PA (4H, 8BB, 1SF) over his last seven games (since 4/11), posting a .462 OBP during that stretch.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has hit .308/.391/.436 (12-for-39) with 6R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 6BB and 1SF over his last 12 games against the Red Sox (since 6/14/24).

WALK IT OUT: Yankees batters walked 10 times on Sunday vs. Kansas City, marking their third game this season with double-digit walks (also 11BB on 4/3 vs. Miami and 10BB on 4/4 vs. Miami)...recorded only one such game in 2024 and 2025...their 109BB this season are tied for the second-most in the Majors (second in AL).

DYNAMIC DUO: OF Aaron Judge (9HR) and C/INF Ben Rice (8HR) are just the third pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history to hit at least 8HR in the club's first 22 games of a season...Judge (8HR) and Anthony Rizzo (9HR) accomplished the feat in 2022, and Yogi Berra (10HR) and Mickey Mantle (11HR) also did so in 1956.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base three times for his second straight game and hit his eighth home run of the season with a solo shot in the second inning on Sunday vs. Kansas City...**has homered in four straight games for the first time in his career...joins Aaron Judge as the only Yankees in the last four seasons (since 2023) to accomplish the feat** (Judge did so in 5G from 9/21-26/24 and 4G from 5/22-25/24 and 8/20-23/24).

- ▶ **Three of his last 4HR have come vs. left-handed pitchers.**
- ▶ **Has reached base safely in 18 of his 21 games this season, batting .338/.476/.800 (22-for-65) with 21R, 6 doubles, 8HR, 18RBI, 18BB/11BB, 1SF and 1SB.**
- ▶ Has reached base safely in 36-of-71PA over his last 18 games (since 3/31), batting .358/.507/.906 (19-for-53) with 19R, 5 doubles, 8HR, 16RBI, 17BB/11BB, 1SF and 1SB...has reached base multiple times in 12 of his last 16 games with multiple plate appearances over that span.
- ▶ Has reached base at least three times in seven games this season, tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Yordan Alvarez (10).
- ▶ According to Baseball Savant, ranks third in the Majors in hard hit percentage (64.4) and tied for eighth in average exit velocity (94.8).
- ▶ Has batted .333/.385/.625 (8-for-24) with 2R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1HR, 2RBI and 2BB over his last eight games vs. the Red Sox (since 6/15/25).
- ▶ **Leads the Majors in OBP (.476), SLG (.800) and OPS (1.276),** ranks third in runs scored (21, second in AL) and XBH (14, second in AL), is tied for third in HR (eight, tied for third in AL), fourth in BA (.338, second in AL), fifth in PA/BB (4.67, fourth in AL) and tied for fifth in walks (18, tied for fifth in AL)...is also tied for third in the AL in RBI (18), ranks eighth in pitches per plate appearance (4.37) and tied for 10th in doubles (six).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge hit his ninth home run of the season with a go-ahead two-run home run in the first inning on Sunday vs. Kansas City...**five of his 9HR this year have come in the first inning, including each of his last three home runs, four of his last five and five of his last seven...his five first-inning home runs are more than 22 Major League teams...**since 2024, 43 of his 120HR have come in the first inning...his 90 career home runs in the first inning are the third-most in franchise history, trailing only Babe Ruth (126) and Mickey Mantle (103).

- ▶ **Six of his 9HR this season have given the Yankees the lead...**since 2019, 142 of his 294HR have either tied the game (21) or given the Yankees the lead (121).
- ▶ Has reached base in 15 of his last 16 games (since 4/3).
- ▶ Has batted .310/.430/.690 (31-for-100) with 26R, 5 doubles, 11HR, 27RBI, 21BB/21BB and 3SB over his last 27 games vs. the Red Sox (since 9/14/23-G2)...has 9HR over his last 20 games vs. Boston (since 7/26/24).
- ▶ Over his last 13 games at Fenway Park (since 9/14/23-G2), has batted .340/.492/.830 (16-for-47) with 15R, 2 doubles, 7HR, 16RBI and 14BB/21BB.

SUPER ROSARIO: INF/OF Amed Rosario has batted .286/.333/.571 (12-for-42) with 4R, 1 double, 1 triple, 3HR, 8RBI and 3BB over his last 13 games (since 4/1).

- ▶ Since 2025, has hit .289/.322/.489 (39-for-135) with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR and 7BB vs. left-handed pitchers.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham reached base three times and hit his third home run of the season with a three-run shot in the fifth inning on Sunday vs. Kansas City...**has hit 3HR and recorded 10RBI over his last six games (since 4/13).**

- ▶ Is batting .333/.375/.867 (5-for-15) with 1 triple, 2HR, 12RBI and 1BB with RISP this year.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.98 ERA (123.2IP, 41ER) and 133K in 22 starts this season...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 19 of their 22 starts...rank first in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.261), opponents' OPS (.587), K/BB (4.43) and WHIP (1.00), second in BB/9.OIP (2.18, second in AL) and opponents' SLG (.327, first in AL), tied for second in strikeouts (133, tied for second in AL), and third in ERA (2.98, first in AL) and opponents' BA (.206, first in AL).

HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF José Caballero is batting .333/.371/.515 (11-for-33) with 6R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 4SB over his last nine games (since 4/11)...has recorded multiple hits in four of his last nine games (since 4/11) and five of his last 12 games (since 4/7).

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees baserunners have recorded 27SB this season, the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (33SB)...their 87.1 stolen base percentage is the second-best in the AL and third-best in the Majors.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 21, 2012: Down 9-0 after the fifth inning, the Yankees rally at Fenway Park to win 15-9, marking the fifth time the Yankees have erased a nine-run deficit to win. Nick Swisher hits a grand slam and Mark Teixeira homers twice.

April 21, 1912: At the Polo Grounds, the Yankees and Giants stage a benefit game for survivors of the Titanic. The Giants win, 11-2, as \$9,425.25 is raised.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 22, 2010: At the Oakland Coliseum, the A's Kurt Suzuki hits into a 5-4-3 triple play (Rodriguez-Cano-N. Johnson), marking the Yankees' first triple play since 1968.

April 22, 2001: With two outs in the bottom of the 10th inning, David Justice hits a solo HR off Derek Lowe to give the Yankees a 4-3 "walk-off" win vs. Boston.

April 22, 1956: Don Larsen earns a no-decision (4.2IP, 4ER) but hits a grand slam in the Yankees' 13-6 win over the Red Sox.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (0-1, 7.00 ERA)

RHP Luis Gil will make his third start of the season in tonight's series opener at Boston...the 27-year-old will make the start on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his second start of the season on Wednesday vs. Los Angeles-AL, allowing 4R/ER in 5.0IP without recording a decision (5.0IP, 5H, 4R/ER, 2BB, 5K, 3HR)...made his season debut on 4/10 at Tampa Bay, taking the loss after allowing 3R/ER in 4.0IP (3H, 3BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP)...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/10...made one start for the Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders on 4/15 at Rochester, allowing 3R/ER in 4.2IP without recording a decision (4H, 4BB, 6K, 1HR)...in 11 starts with the Yankees in 2025, went 4-1 with a 3.32 ERA (57.0IP, 47H, 23R/21ER, 33BB, 41K, 5HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of his 11 starts...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his starts...missed the first 111 team games on the 60-day I.L. with a right lat strain (3/24-8/3)...over his final 10 starts last season (8/9-9/28), went 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA (53.2IP, 16ER)...in 49 career Major League starts, has gone 20-10 with a 3.62 ERA (251.0IP, 184H, 105R/101ER, 136BB, 262K, 31HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 37 of his first 49 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 24 of those starts...**his 262 career strikeouts are tied with Orlando Hernández for the third-most by a Yankees pitcher over their first 49 career games**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (308K) and Al Downing (296K)...**was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year in 2024...became the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to win the award**, joining Aaron Judge (2017), Derek Jeter (1996), Dave Righetti (1981), Thurman Munson (1970), Stan Bahnsen (1968), Tom Tresh (1962), Tony Kubek (1957), Bob Grim (1954) and Gil McDougald (1951)...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his second start of the season on Wednesday vs. Los Angeles-AL, allowing 4R/ER in 5.0IP without recording a decision (5.0IP, 5H, 4R/ER, 2BB, 5K, 3HR).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Will be making his second road start of the season tonight...made his first road start in his season debut on 4/10 at Tampa Bay, taking the loss after allowing 3R/ER in 4.0IP (3H, 3BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP).

- ✦ Made five road starts in 2025, going 2-1 with a 4.38 ERA (24.2IP, 22H, 13R/12ER, 15BB, 20K, 1HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in three of his starts.
- ✦ **Over his last 1 road starts (since 5/1/24), is 11-4 with a 3.50 ERA (90.0IP, 67H, 36R/35ER, 45BB, 82K, 7HR)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in nine of those starts.**

VS. BOSTON: Will be making his sixth career start vs. Boston tonight...**in five career starts vs. the Red Sox, has gone 2-1 with a 0.99 ERA (27.1IP, 15H, 4R/3ER, 17BB, 26K, 1HR).**

- ✦ Made two starts vs. the Red Sox in 2025, going 1-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) and 7K...made his most recent start on 9/12/25 at Fenway Park, tossing 6.0 hitless innings in the Yankees' 4-1 victory (4BB, 4K).
- ✦ Has made two career starts at Fenway Park, going 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) and 10K.
- ✦ Made his first career start vs. the Red Sox at Yankee Stadium on 8/17/21-G2, tossing 4.2 scoreless innings without recording a decision (3H, 4BB, 4K).

2025: In 11 starts with the Yankees, went 4-1 with a 3.32 ERA (57.0IP, 47H, 23R/21ER, 33BB, 41K, 5HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of his 11 starts...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his starts.

- ✦ Went 2-0 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1IP, 9ER) in six home starts.
- ✦ Held opponents to a .217/.279/.267 (13-for-60) slash line with RISP.
- ✦ Allowed only 5HR to 244BF, posting a 0.79 HR/9.0IP ratio.
- ✦ Allowed 4H-or-fewer in seven of his 11 starts.
- ✦ The Yankees went 8-3 in his starts, winning each of his final five starts (9/6-28)...exited only two of his 11 starts with the team trailing.
- ✦ Missed the first 111 team games on the 60-day I.L. with a right lat strain...was placed on the 60-day I.L. on 3/24...combined to make four rehab starts with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, posting a 5.65 ERA (14.1IP, 11H, 9R/ER, 7BB, 24K, 4HR)...was returned from his rehab assignment and reinstated from the I.L. on 8/3.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 8/3 at Miami and suffered his only loss after allowing a season-high 5R/ER in 3.1IP (5H, 4BB, 3K, 0HR)...marked his first appearance since 9/28/24 vs. Pittsburgh.
- ✦ Over his final 10 starts (8/9-9/28), went 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA (53.2IP, 16ER).
- ✦ Allowed 2R-or-fewer in a career-high-tying seven straight starts from 8/9-9/12 (also had a seven-start streak from 5/1-6/4/24)...went 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (38.0IP, 8ER) over that span.
- ✦ Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing 6.0 hitless innings on 9/12 at Boston (4BB, 4K, 2WP, 1BK)...was the second Yankees pitcher in 2025 to toss at least 6.0 hitless innings in a start, joining Clarke Schmidt (7.0IP/0H) on 6/21 vs. Baltimore...marked the eighth time in franchise history a Yankees pitcher tossed at least 6.0 hitless innings in a start and did not record a no-hitter: also Clarke Schmidt's 7.0IP on 6/21/25 vs. Baltimore, Luis Severino's 7.0IP on 10/3/22 at Texas, Domingo Germán's 6.0IP on 5/6/18 vs. Cleveland, Phil Hughes' 6.1IP on 5/1/07 at Texas, David Cone's 7.0IP on 9/2/96 at Oakland, Andy Hawkins' 8.0IP in a complete-game loss on 7/1/90 at Chicago-AL, and Whitey Ford's 7.0IP on 5/22/62 vs. Los Angeles-AL.
- ✦ Made his only postseason start in ALDS Game 1 at Toronto and took the loss after allowing 2R/ER in 2.2IP (4H, 0BB, 2K, 2HR)...was not on the Yankees' ALWCS roster.

THE RIGHT STUFF: In his career, has limited right-handed batters to a .194/.301/.342 (94-for-485) slash line.

- ✦ **Allowed just 2HR to 113 right-handed batters faced in 2025, including 1HR to his final 106 right-handed batters faced last season.**

CAREER NOTES: In 49 career Major League starts, has gone 20-10 with a 3.62 ERA (251.0IP, 184H, 105R/101ER, 136BB, 262K, 31HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 37 of his first 49 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 24 of those starts.

- ✦ **His 262 career strikeouts are tied with Orlando Hernández for the third-most by a Yankees pitcher over their first 49 career games**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (308K) and Al Downing (296K).
- ✦ His 37 starts of allowing 3R-or-fewer are tied with Masahiro Tanaka and Jordan Montgomery for the most by a Yankee over their first 49 career games.
- ✦ **Has struck out at least six batters in 23 of his first 49 career starts, the second-most such games in a pitcher's first 49 career games in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (31)...**his nine games with at least eight strikeouts are tied for the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 49 career games**, trailing only Al Downing (15), Masahiro Tanaka (13), Ron Guidry (11) and Dave Righetti (10).
