TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 16, 2020: Kyle Higashioka hits a career-high 3HR vs. Toronto. He becomes just the third player in franchise history to hit 3HR in a game as a catcher, joining Bill Dickey on 7/26/39 vs. St. Louis-AL and Mike Stanley on 8/10/95 vs. Cleveland-G1.

Sept. 16, 2008: Derek Jeter singles off Chicago-AL's Gavin Floyd in the first inning for his 1,270th career hit at Yankee Stadium, surpassing Lou Gehrig for the most all-time hits at the ballpark.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 17, 2020: In the final game of a three-game set vs. Toronto, the Yankees hit 5HR in the fourth inning (Gardner/LeMahieu/Voit b2b2b; Stanton/Torres b2b), setting a single-inning franchise record and tying the MLB mark (seventh time). The Yankees also hit 19HR in the series from 9/15-17/20 (while outscoring the Blue Jays 43-15) to set an MLB mark for HRs over any three-game stretch.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their seven-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Pittsburgh (1-0 thus far)...are 4-1 on the road trip after winning three-of-four at Boston and winning their series opener at Pittsburgh...after this series, will return home for their final homestand of the season that includes a three-game set vs. Toronto (9/19-21) and a three-game series vs. Arizona (9/22-24).

- Have won five of their last six games...are **13-5 in their last 18 games** (since 8/28) and 15-8 in their last 23 games (since 8/23).
- **Eight of the Yankees' last nine wins have been come-from-behind wins.**
- **Have won 10 of their last 12 road games** (since 8/28).
- Have won four of their last five completed series (since 8/28).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Pirates, 7-5, on Friday at PNC Park...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (5.0IP, 6H, 2ER, 3BB, 4K) started and did not record a decision...**C Ben Rortvedt** (1-for-4, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB) drove in the first run for the Yankees with an RBI single in the second inning...**1B DJ LeMahieu** (2-for-5, 1R, 1RBI) recorded a game-tying RBI single in the sixth inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (3-for-5, 1R, 1RBI) hit a go-ahead RBI single in the sixth inning...**CF Estevan Florial** (0-for-3, 1RBI, 2BB) drew a bases-loaded walk in the ninth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1RBI) hit a double in the second inning and grounded into a fielder's choice in the ninth inning that scored two runs...**LF Oswald Cabrera** (3-for-4, 1R, 1RBI, 1SB) reached base a season-high-tying four times, including an RBI single in the ninth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (0-for-2, 1R, 3BB) recorded a career-high-tying 3BB...**LHP Anthony Miesiewicz** (0.2IP, 2H, 3ER, 1BB, 1K) exited the game in the sixth inning after he was struck by a line drive...**RHP Zach McAllister** (1.0IP, 2H, 2K, 1HP) allowed two inherited runners to score...**LHP Nick Ramirez** (1.1IP) earned his first win of the year after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 1K) earned his 20th save of the season.

WHERE'S WALDO: INF/OF **Oswaldo Cabrera** reached base a season-high-tying four times on Friday, including an RBI single in the ninth inning...marked the fourth time in his career he has reached base at least four times and second time this season (also 4TOB on 7/16 at Colorado)...his 3H matched a career high (seventh time, first since his 3H on 7/1/23 at St. Louis-Game 1).

- Has hit safely in a season-high five straight games (since 9/10), batting .389/.522/.500 (7-for-18) with 3R, 2 doubles, 2RBI, 5BB and 1SB...has reached base in 12-of-23 plate appearances in that span (7H/5BB)...marks the second-longest hitting streak of his career, trailing only a seven-game stretch from 9/23-30/22.

CLOSING TIME: **RHP Clay Holmes recorded his 20th save of the season on Friday, becoming the eighth pitcher in franchise history (since saves became an official stat in 1969) to record multiple seasons of at least 20 saves (also 20 saves in 2022)**...joined Mariano Rivera (16), Dave Righetti (seven), Aroldis Chapman (five), Rich Gossage (five), Sparky Lyle (four), Steve Farr (three) and John Wetteland (two).

- Has not allowed a run in each of his last eight outings (since 8/31) after allowing at least one run in five of his previous six appearances (8/13-29)...has retired 23-of-28BF over his last eight games.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.88 ERA (131.1IP, 42ER) in their last 25 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 23 of those 25 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 20 of those starts.

BATTERS' EYE: Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a **9.21 PA/BB ratio and a 4.05 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in both categories (11.90 PA/BB and 3.86 P/PA).

LEMACHINE: INF **DJ LeMahieu** hit a game-tying RBI single in the sixth inning on Friday...on the road trip, is 4-for-6 with 2 doubles and 4RBI with RISP.

- Has reached base in 13 of his last 14 games (since 8/30), 31 of his last 34 games (since 8/1), 48 of his last 53 games (since 7/4) and 55 of his last 62 games (since 6/23).

ALL RISE: OF **Aaron Judge** recorded 3H on Friday, including a go-ahead RBI single in the sixth inning...marked his ninth game this season with at least 3H (first since his 3H on 8/23 vs. Washington).

- Has reached base in 22-of-50 plate appearances over his last 11 games (since 9/5), posting a .440 OBP in that span (9H, 13BB).
- Has reached base safely in 77 of his 94 games this season...has hit safely in 56 of those games...has reached base safely in 54 of his last 65 games (since 5/12).
- Has reached base multiple times in 47 of his 94 games this year, including 36 of his last 67 games (since 5/10).
- Has batted .389/.436/.750 (14-for-36) with 8R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI, 3BB and 1SB in eight career games vs. the Pirates...has hit safely in each of those eight games.
- Has hit .330/.430/.660 (32-for-97) with 20R, 2 doubles, 10HR, 20RBI, 17BB and 1SB in 26 Interleague games this season...has batted .311/.405/.638 (136-for-437) with 90R, 19 doubles, 2 triples, 40HR, 78RBI, 68BB and 9SB in 120 career Interleague games.
- **Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, his 32HR this season rank fourth in the AL and his 75BB are tied for sixth.**
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, leads the AL with 40BB and ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (51).

GLEYBER DAY: INF **Gleyber Torres** recorded a career-high-tying 3BB on Friday...marked the fifth time in his career and second time this season he has recorded 3BB in a game (also 3BB on 4/3/23 vs. Philadelphia, 5/4/21 vs. Houston, 6/24/19 vs. Toronto and 6/16/19 at Chicago-AL).

- Is batting .316/.435/.421 (6-for-19) with 2R, 2 doubles, 3RBI and 4BB in five games on the current road trip.
- Has reached base multiple times in 10 of his last 16 games (since 8/28) and 12 of his last 20 games (since 8/24).
- Is batting .311/.402/.563 (47-for-151) with 26R, 11 doubles, 9HR, 21RBI, 21BB, 2HP and 5SB in 40 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 28 of those games and has reached base safely in 33 of those contests.
- Since 7/6, is batting .306/.372/.524 (70-for-229) with 36R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 29RBI, 24BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 59 games.
- Has recorded a career-high 60BB in 145 games this season.

ON A ROLL: INF **Oswald Peraza** has hit .356 (16-for-45) with 3R, 5 doubles, 1HR and 6RBI in his last 11 games (since 9/2)...also owns a career-high eight-game hitting streak (since 9/6).

COLETRAIN: RHP **Gerrit Cole** started on Friday and allowed just 2ER over 5.0IP in a no-decision...is **13-4 with a 2.81 ERA (192.0IP, 60ER) and 208K in 31 starts this season...owns the lowest ERA in the American League and the third-lowest in the Majors**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (2.43) and Chicago-NL's Justin Steele (2.73).

- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 26-of-31 starts this season and 2R-or-fewer in 24 of those starts...his **24 starts of 2R-or-fewer are the most in the Majors.**
- **Is one of just three pitchers in franchise history to record at least 24 starts of 2R-or-fewer in a single season**, joining Jack Chesbro (28 in 1904) and Ron Guidry (26 in 1978).
- **According to Elias, his 2.81 ERA is the lowest by a Yankees starter through his first 31 starts of a season in the last 44 years (since 1980)**...the last time a qualified Yankee finished a non-strike season with as low of an ERA was 1980 when Rudy May recorded a 2.46 ERA in 41G/17GS (Tommy John had a 2.63 ERA in 20GS in 1981 and Ron Guidry posted a 2.76 ERA in 23G/21GS in 1981).

- Is in his sixth season at the helm for the Yankees (2018-23)...guided the Yankees to a 99-63 mark in 2022 (first place in the AL East) and their first division title since 2019.
 - With the Yankees reaching the playoffs in each of his first five seasons as manager, he became the first manager in Baseball history to reach the postseason in each of his first five managerial seasons...is the third manager to make the playoffs in his first five seasons with the Yankees, joining Casey Stengel (first five from 1949-53) and Joe Torre (first 12 from 1996-2007).
 - Was re-signed by the Yankees on 10/19/21 to a three-year contract through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...is the 18th person to both play for, and manage, the Yankees...is one of 11 active managers to have played for the franchise he currently manages, joining Kevin Cash (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (Boston), Craig Counsell (Milwaukee), Terry Francona (Cleveland), A.J. Hinch (Detroit), Mark Kotsay (Oakland), Dave Martinez (Washington/Montreal), Phil Nevin (Los Angeles-AL), Dave Roberts (Los Angeles-NL) and David Ross (Chicago-NL).
 - His 502 career managerial wins rank eighth on the Yankees’ all-time list...reached 500 career managerial wins in Game 2 on 9/12 at Boston...became just the eighth Manager in Yankees history to accomplish the feat, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460-867-21), Joe Torre (1,173-767-2), Casey Stengel (1,149-696-6), Miller Huggins (1,067-719-10), Ralph Houk (944-806-7), Joe Girardi (910-710) and Billy Martin (556-385).
 - Managed his 800th game with the Yankees on 7/21/23...according to *Elias*, his 476 wins through his first 800 decisions are the 11th-most by any manager in Major League history.
 - Has 32 career managerial ejections (six in 2023: 8/7 at CWS, 7/2 at STL, 5/25 vs. BAL, 5/21 at CIN, 5/15 at TOR and 4/12 at CLE; nine in 2022; six in 2021; two in 2020; five in 2019; four in 2018).
