## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (37-25) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (23-40) June 6, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #64/Home #33 RHP Joe Ross (2-1, 4.34 ERA) vs. LHP Bailey Falter (4-3, 3.14 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** lost two of three games vs. Houston to begin this nine-game homestand...Will welcome Miami to town for three games (Monday-Wednesday) following this weekend's series vs. Philadelphia...Have gone 11-14 since Don Kelly managed his first game on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have posted the second-best fielding percentage (.992) in all of Major League Baseball since Kelly took over (New York-AL has an MLB-best .993 fielding percentage during that time)...Have played in 11 one-run games since Kelly became manager (have a 5-6 record in those games)...Are tied with Kansas City and St. Louis for the third-most shutouts (seven) in all of Major League Baseball...Only San Diego (10) and Cleveland (eight) have more.

**FALTER ON FIRE:** Bailey Falter, who pitched in parts of three seasons with Philadelphia from 2021-23 before being acquired by Pittsburgh for Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023, allowed two hits and one walk in 6.1 scoreless innings in his last start on May 31 at San Diego...He finished May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among all qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City's Kris Bubic (0.56)...His 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...Falter became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings on one or zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

**YOU GOT THAT RIGHT:** Bailey Falter is holding right-handed hitters to a .180 (31-for-172) batting average...Per OptaStats, the only qualified lefties in MLB with a lower average are Kansas City's Noah Cameron (.159) and New York (AL)'s Carlos Rodón (.163).

**QUALITY STUFF:** Pittsburgh pitchers have recorded 29 quality starts, tied with Houston and San Francisco for fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball (Philadelphia, 32, is tied with Tampa Bay for most)...The Pirates are 4-2 when Falter turns in a quality start.

**LATE NIGHT BUCN:** The start of Thursday's game here at PNC Park between Houston and Pittsburgh was delayed by weather from 6:40 P.M. to 10:02 P.M. (three hours, 22 minutes)...It was the latest start for a game in Pittsburgh since July 6, 1987, when the second game of a doubleheader vs. San Francisco at Three Rivers Stadium did not begin until 10:07 P.M. due to a weather delay...Thursday night's game was only the second in PNC Park history to begin at 10:00 P.M. or later...The other came on June 4, 2010 vs. San Francisco, when the game's start was delayed by weather and didn't start until exactly 10:00 P.M. (Giants won the game, 6-4).

**CRUZIN' AROUND THE BASES:** Oneil Cruz has a Major League-best 22 stolen bases, matching his career high for a single season (also 2024)...He's the first Pirate to steal at least 20 bases in consecutive seasons since Starling Marte did that in seven straight seasons from 2013-19...His five multi-steal games this year are tied with Baltimore's Jorge Mateo for second-most in all of MLB.

**ISIAH'S IMPACT:** Isiah Kiner-Falefa has hit safely in 15 of his last 17 games (since May 17 at Philadelphia), going 21-for-59 (.356) with six doubles, six RBI and eight runs in that stretch...The .356 average in that span is tied for 11th-best in the National League.

**PHILTHY NUMBERS:** Pittsburgh will continue its nine-game homestand with three games against Philadelphia this weekend...In 72 games against their cross-state rival here at PNC Park since the stadium opened in 2001, the Pirates are 43-29 (have won three of the last four series).

**ALL THE TOOLS:** Oneil Cruz singled and had two RBI on Thursday vs. Houston...In his last 14 games (since May 21 vs. Cincinnati), Cruz has nine extra-base hits (four doubles, one triple, four home runs), 10 RBI, seven walks, four stolen bases and 11 runs scored...It's his second-such 14-game span posting those stats or better this season (also April 16-May 1)...Prior to him, the last Pirate to do that in a 14-game span was Nate McLouth from September 5-18, 2008.

**22 CLOSING IN ON 2200:** Andrew McCutchen comes into tonight's game two hits shy of 2200 for his career (he would become the 190th player in Major League Baseball history to record at least 2200 hits)...McCutchen has recorded 1713 hits as a member of the Pirates, the ninth-most in team history...His 240 home runs with Pittsburgh are tied with Roberto Clemente for third-most in team history, while his 2198 career hits are third-most among active players.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

**STARTING OFF:** The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Falter allowed two hits in 6.1 innings in the team's 5-0 shutout on May 31 at San Diego...The only two hits he allowed were singles by Fernando Tatis Jr. leading off the first inning and Martín Maldonado with one out in the third inning.

**AGAINST THE PHILLIES:** Falter will make his second career start against Philadelphia... He allowed one run on four hits and zero walks (three strikeouts) on April 12, 2024 at Citizens Bank Park, winning a 5-2 decision in his only game against his former team.

**THE MERRY MONTH OF MAY:** Falter finished the month of May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City's Kris Bubic (0.56)... Falter's 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...In his outing on May 31 at San Diego, he became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings on one/zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) did in a 10-0 win on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

**WINNING THE DAY:** Falter brings a season-high three-game winning streak into tonight...He has posted a 0.63 ERA (28.2ip/2er) and a .160 batting average against during the streak (began on May 9 vs. Atlanta)...This is Falter's longest winning streak since winning four consecutive decisions last season from July 30 to September 11.

**SHUT 'EM DOWN:** In his starts on May 3 vs. San Diego and May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter pitched 6.0-plus innings while allowing one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Sam Leever (June 28-July 2, 1900) as the only Pirates since at least 1893, within a single season, to pitch 6.0-plus innings with one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer in consecutive games (Babe Adams did it in his final appearance of 1915 and his first outing of 1916).

**NOTHING TO SEE HERE:** Falter has three separate scoreless streaks of at least 11.0 innings this season...He brings an 11.0-inning scoreless streak (began on May 25 vs. Milwaukee) into tonight's contest...Falter also compiled a scoreless streak of 11.0 innings from April 11-22, as well as a 16.2-inning streak that stretched from May 9-20.

**SOUTHPAW SUCCESS:** Falter enters tonight with a 3.14 ERA (66.0ip/23er)...That ranks seventh in the National League (13th in MLB) among lefties with at least 65.0 innings.

**PESKY LEFTIES:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Falter (7.0ip/0r on April 16) and Andrew Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.
