BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their last and longest homestand of the season with the rubber game of a three-game series with the San Francisco Giants ... The Cardinals are 3-2 on their nine-game/10-day homestand against the White Sox (2-1), Giants (1-1), and Nationals (Sept. 18-20) ... With 10 games remaining, St. Louis enters today's game in 4th place in the National League Central and 7.5 games out of the final NL Wild Card spot ... St. Louis has been mathematically eliminated from the NL Central division race.

WETHERHOLT RE-JOINS ST. LOUIS: The Cardinals announced a series of roster moves prior to today's series finale with the Giants:

- Activated rookie 2B/SS **JJ Wetherholt** from the 10-Day Injured List ... Wetherholt missed 15 games since Aug. 30 with right wrist tendinitis.
- Designated 2B/3B **Ramón Urías** for assignment.
- Reinstated RHP **Peter Strzelecki** from the 15-Day Injured List and designated him for assignment.

NO FLY ZONE: The Cardinals and their opponents have combined to hit 125 homers at **Busch Stadium III** this season, matching **Angel Stadium** for fewest in any Major League Ballpark ahead of (125), while San Francisco's **Oracle Park** ranks 3rd-fewest (137) ... The four lowest slugging percentages include **Angel Stadium** (.344), **Petco Park** (.366), **Busch Stadium** (.373), and **Oracle Park** (.376).

LET THE KIDS PLAY: The three youngest active Major League rosters include the **Nationals** (25.6 yrs), **Cardinals** (26.3) and **Giants** (26.3).

STEAK DINNER: **Alec Burleson** has recorded an RBI in three straight games to up his career high and MLB-leading RBI total to 111 as the 2025 Silver Slugger sits four RBI ahead of Reds **Sal Stewart** (107).

- The last Cardinal to lead MLB in RBI was 3B **Joe Torre** in (137 in 1971) and the last to lead the NL was 1B **Albert Pujols** (118 in 2010).
- Burly's 111 RBI are most by a Cards left-handed batter since OF **Jim Edmonds** (111 in 2004), while his 110 RBI while playing 1B are the most by a Cardinals left-handed batting 1B since **Johnny Mize** (130 in 1940).

OUCH: **Ivan Herrera**'s MLB-high 29 hit-by-pitches are 2nd-most in Cardinals single-season history behind only **Steve Evans** (31 in 1910) ... St. Louis has been plunked 91 times this season, tying the Angels, Red Sox, and White Sox for the MLB lead this season and surpassing the 1901 Redbirds for most in franchise single-season history.

BRINGING HEAT TO THE DESERT: Eight Cardinals minor leaguers were recently named to the Peoria Javelinas for the 2026 Arizona Fall League season: OF **Tai Peete**, C/1B **Sammy Hernandez**, 3B **Cade McGee**, LHP **Brandon Clarke**, RHP **Tekoah Roby**, RHP **Nate Dohm**, LHP **Michael Watson**, and RHP **Frank Elissalt**.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 16, 2022): In the Cardinals come-from-behind 6-5 win over the Reds at Busch Stadium, **Albert Pujols** hits his 698th career home run and closer **Ryan Helsey** tosses the third Immaculate Inning in franchise history, joining **Jason Istringhausen** (9th inning on April 13, 2002 vs. Astros) and **Bob Gibson** (7th inning on May 12, 1969 vs. Dodgers) ... Helsey fanned **Kyle Farmer**, **Jake Fraley**, and **Donovan Solano** (all swinging) in the 9th inning.

Quinn Mathews pitched at nearby Stanford University from 2020-23, going 25-10 in 68 games (45 starts) and was the 2023 Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year.

Daniel Descalso was born in Redwood City and resides in Danville, Calif...graduated from Saint Francis High School in Mountain View in 2004... played college baseball at UC-Davis (2005-07).

Alec Burleson and **Carson Whisenhunt** were teammates at East Carolina University in 2020 ... **Andre Pallante** and **Christian Koss** were teammates at UC-Irvine from 2017-19.

Giants Manager **Tony Vitello** is a St. Louis native... attended De Smet High School and the University of Missouri, where he played baseball from 2000-02...was an asst. coach at Mizzou from 2003-10.

Cardinals Bullpen Coach **Julio Rangel** was the Giants Minor League Pitching Coordinator in 2018.

Giants Hitting Coach **Hunter Mense** played baseball at the Univ. of Missouri (2004-06) and was an assistant coach (2011-16)...Bench Coach **Jayce Tingler** played at Mizzou from 2000-03.

Justin Bruhl was born in nearby Petaluma, Calif., and earned his first save on Sept. 18, 2022 at San Francisco while with the Dodgers.

Andrew Knizner played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2019-23)...selected in the 7th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Cardinals.

Giants 1B Coach **Shane Robinson** was selected by St. Louis in 5th round of the 2006 MLB Draft and played in 268 games for STL from 2009, 11-14.

Cardinals Assistant Hitting Coach **Casey Chenoweth** was a hitting coach for the DSL Giants (2017-18) and the AZL Giants Orange (2019).

JT Brubaker (July 26, 2020 at STL w/ PIT), **Adrian Houser** (Sept. 26, 2015 at STL w/MIL), **Trevor McDonald** (Sept. 29, 2024 at Oracle Park w/SF), **Blade Tidwell** (May 4, 2025[1] at STL w/NYM) & **Keaton Winn** (June 13, 2023 at STL w/SF) all made their MLB debuts against the Cardinals.

Cardenales broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played parts of four seasons with the Giants (2007-10), and Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** made his MLB debut at San Francisco (April 7, 1984).

2025 Cardinals Hall of Famer **Édgar Rentería** played two seasons in San Francisco (2009-10)... member of the 2010 World Series Champion Giants and was named World Series MVP.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The 26-year-old Cardinals Opening Day starter makes his team-leading 30th start of the season, establishing a new career-high. It marks his 150th career Major League appearance and his 83rd career start.
- Becomes the first Cardinals left-hander to make 30 starts in a season since Jaime Garcia in 2016 (30).**
- Enters tonight's start on an eight-game losing skid, last earning a win on July 11 vs. Atlanta at Busch Stadium. The last left-handed Cardinals starting pitcher with a streak of that length was **Tyler Lyons** (8-game losing streak) from June 2, 2013-May 16, 2015.
- Leads St. Louis with a single-season career high 146 strikeouts, most by a Cardinals southpaw since **Jaime Garcia** (150 in 2016 and 156 in 2011).
- Ranks 21st among left-handers in franchise history with his 82 starts. **Bob Weiland** (1937-40) ranks 20th with 87.
- His 14 losses are the most by a Cardinals southpaw since **Joe Magrane** (10-17) with 17 in 1990 over 31 starts.
- Is one of five Cardinals who have induced double-digit GDP this season (11).
- Tied for 3rd in the National League with four pick-offs, most by a Cardinal since **Lance Lynn** (4 in 2015) and by a southpaw since **Mark Mulder** (5 in 2005). Last pick-off was 7/27 vs. CHI.
- Is the third Cardinals lefty with 21+ wins since 2000, joining **Jamie Garcia** (62-45) and **Mark Mulder** (22-18). His next win ties **Alex Jackson** (1966-67), **Jerry Reuss** (1969-71), **Ferdie Shupp** (1919-21), and **Mulder** (2005-08) for 34th all-time among Cardinals left-handed pitchers.
- Boasts a 52.5% strikeout rate on his curveball, 3rd-best among MLB qualifiers behind **Mason Miller**'s slider (58.4%) and **Nolan McLean**'s curveball (56.8%). Opponents are batting .193 (11-57) off his curveball this season.
- The Cardinals are 20-20 in his 40 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 13-15 with a 4.57 ERA (197.0 IP) with 11 quality starts (all 11 starts with 6.0 IP or more).

LAST TIME OUT (Friday, September 11 at Busch Stadium): W, 7-3: 4.1 IP, 6 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 3 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR - 72 pitches

- Cardinals won a start made by him (no decision) for the first time since Aug. 2 at Toronto and the first at home since his last win July 11 vs. ATL.
- Was removed after 4.1 innings with a runner aboard and the Cardinals leading 3-2, as Gordon Graceffo closed out the inning.
- Allowed two runs, both on solo home runs by Chase Meidroth, including a lead-off home run on the first pitch; the 3rd lead-off HR allowed in his career.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

POWERED UP: Has a career high 146 strikeouts, ranking 14th among MLB lefties in 2026, but he's also allowed a career high 27 HR, 3rd-most among MLB southpaws.

AND THE AWARD FOR BEST SUPPORTING CAST MEMBER ...?: Supported with 3 runs or fewer (18 total) in each of his 10 starts since the All-Star Break.

JUST PEACHY: Fanned 9 batters, one shy of his career high, in a 5-3 win vs. ATL (6/30) at Truist Park to earn his 20th career win and the blanked the Braves over 6.0 IP two weeks later in a 4-1 win at Busch Stadium on 7/11.

SUNDAY FUNDAY: Had his deepest start (5.1 IP) since a 6.0 inning effort at SD (5/7) and led the Cardinals to a series win over the Cubs on NBC Sunday Night Baseball in his 5-1 win vs Chicago on 5/31.

K-CLUB: Libby notched single-game career highs for strikeouts in consecutive starts when he fanned 9 on 5/19 vs. PIT and then he bettered that with 10 K's on Memorial Day (5/25) at MIL; He and Brewers starter Jacob Misorowski (12) combined for 22 strikeouts in the 5/25 game.

LIBBY vs. LEFTY: Recorded 38 strikeouts in May, the most by a Cardinals lefty in the month of May since Hall of Famer **Steve "Lefty" Carlton** fanned 52 in May, 1970.

LIBBY'S LID-LIFTER: Made his 1st career Opening Day start and received a no decision vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (he exited with game tied 1-1).

LEFTY LIFT-OFFS: Made his 1st career Opening Day start on 3/26 vs. TB, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that he was born. Became 1 of just 16 LHPs to make the Opening Day start for St. Louis since 1901 (MLB).

 - Is a career 18-35 with a 5.11 ERA (396.1 IP) in his 82 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.

- LIBERATORE vs. SAN FRANCISCO:**
- Making his 2nd career start and 4th appearance vs. the Giants.
 - Made one career start vs. SF on June 12, 2023 at Busch Stadium. Tossed 6.0 innings allowing 2 runs in a no decision the Cardinals lost 4-3.
 - Appeared twice in relief, both at Oracle Park during the final weekend of the 2024 season. Did not allow an earned run in either game.
