TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the final road trip of the 2024 regular season with the 2nd of 3 games at the Texas Rangers (1-0)...Seattle will also visit the Houston Astros (3 G, 9/23-9/25) to finish the current trip...the Mariners are coming off a 9-game homestand (5-4) against the San Diego Padres (1-1), Rangers (3-1) and New York Yankees (1-2)...tonight's game against Texas will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the Rangers by an 8-2 score in last night's series opener...Seattle has won back-to-back games, improving to 10-5 (.667) over their last 15 games (9/4-c), tied for the best record in MLB during that span with the Tigers, Yankees and Mets...with 8 regular season games remaining, Seattle is 5.0 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 2.0 games back of Minnesota for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **Bully Pen** - Over 7 games in the last week (9/13-c), the Mariners bullpen holds a 1.50 ERA (4 ER, 24.0 IP) with 8 walks and 24 strikeouts, while holding opponents to a .120 batting average and a .342 OPS.
- **So Close** - The Mariners have played in 52 one-run games this season, tied for most in the Majors with Detroit...Seattle is 26-26 in those contests.
- **Hope Is Alive When Scoring Five** - Seattle is 53-4 (.930) when scoring 5+ runs this season, best record in MLB...Seattle is 26-71 (.268) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.

LAST 26 GAMES...Seattle is 15-11 (.577) over 26 games in the **Dan Wilson** and **Edgar Martinez** era (8/23-c), sporting a +36 run differential (128 R, 92 RA)...Seattle's .577 winning percentage during that span is tied for 3rd-best in the American League (also: New York-AL), trailing only Detroit (18-8, .692) and Cleveland (17-11, .607)...during that span (8/23-c), Seattle owns a 4-2-2 series record with 8 of its 11 losses coming in 1-run games.

OFFENSIVE STUFF...over their last 15 games (9/4-c), Seattle's offense ranks 2nd in MLB in batting average (.278), 1st in on-base percentage (.366), 3rd in OPS (.826), T-4th in hits (143), 4th in runs (81) and 5th in extra-base hits (52)...during that span, the Mariners offense has recorded 10+ hits in 9 of 15 games and 4+ walks in 12 of 15 games, while striking out 10+ times in only 5 of those 15 contests.

FIRST 3 SEASONS OF THE J-ROD SHOW...center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .268 (142x529) with 68 runs, 16 doubles, 18 home runs, 59 RBI, 22 stolen bases and 38 walks in 135 games this season, toting a .323 on-base percentage, .401 slugging percentage and .724 OPS (113 OPS+)...with 2 more home runs this season Julio would join Bobby Witt Jr.-KC as the only 2 players in MLB history to record 20 HR and 20 SB in each of their first 3 MLB seasons.

- **75 HR / 75 SB** - With 76 career home runs and 84 career stolen bases coming into play tonight, Rodríguez is 1 of 2 players in MLB history with 75+ homers and 75+ steals through a player's first 3 career seasons (other: Bobby Witt Jr.-KC, also 2022-24)
- **15+ bWAR** - Julio has accumulated 15.2 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*), 1 of 7 center fielders in MLB history with 15.0+ bWAR through their first 3 career seasons, along with Mike Trout (2011-13), Joe DiMaggio (1936-38), Oscar Charleston (1920-22), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (1989-91), Austin Jackson (2010-12) and Earl Averill (1929-31).
- **Lately** - Over his last 21 contests (8/28-c), Julio is batting .352 (32x91) with 20 runs, 4 doubles, 7 homers, 19 RBI, 9 walks and 4 stolen bases, getting on base at a .402 clip, slugging .626 with a 1.028 OPS...Julio has hit safely in 17 of those 21 games.

SWEET VICTOR(Y)...outfielder **Victor Robles** has reached base safely in 12 consecutive games (9/4-c), batting .528 (19x36) during that span...since his first game with the Mariners on June 5, Robles is batting .337 (68x202) with 33 runs scored, 16 doubles, 4 home runs, 21 RBI, 14 walks and 26 stolen bases (1 CS), while reaching base at a .404 clip and slugging .475...during that span (6/5-c), Vic's .337 average is 4th-best in MLB (min. 200 AB), trailing only Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (.344), Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-KC (.339) and Aaron Judge-NYY (.338).

CAL RALEIGH: DOING IT ALL...catcher **Cal Raleigh** has solidified himself as one of the best catchers in the Majors over several seasons...his 87 home runs over the last 3 seasons (2022-c) lead MLB catchers, while his 13.2 Wins Above Replacement (*FanGraphs*) since 2022 rank 2nd in the Majors to only Adley Rutschman-BAL (13.3)...Raleigh has firmly placed himself as the frontrunner for both the American League Silver Slugger and Gold Glove Awards this season:

- **Silver Slugger Candidate** - Cal leads MLB catchers with 30 home runs...after pacing the Majors with 27 home runs in 2022 and 30 in 2023, he is set to become the first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons (1999-2002).
- **Gold Glove Candidate** - Cal leads the Majors in catcher caught stealing (26), ranking ahead of Will Smith-LAD (24) and Alejandro Kirk-TOR (23)...after leading the Majors in CCS last season, Raleigh could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in CCS in consecutive seasons, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83.

QUALITY STUFF...the Mariners starting rotation has recorded 90 quality starts this season, leading the Majors by a wide margin...Philadelphia (77) ranks the next-closest...Seattle starters have a chance to crack the franchise record of 95 quality starts, set by the 1990 Mariners...the Mariners own a 59-31 record (.656) when their starting pitchers go 6.0+ innings and allow 3-or-fewer earned runs.

ASTOUND ON THE MOUND...Seattle's overall pitching staff leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.50), opponent batting average (.220), fewest runs allowed (581), WHIP (1.08), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.83), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.32), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.38), opponent OBP (.276), opponent OPS (.651) and quality starts (90) this season.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**J.P. Crawford** leads American League shortstops with a .990 fielding percentage this season (min. 800 inn. at SS), having made only 3 errors in 308 total chances, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Crawford's .990 fielding percentage is on-pace to be the best mark in franchise history by a shortstop with at least 800 innings at the position?...Omar Vizquel currently holds the best fielding percentage in Mariners history by a shortstop with a mark of .989 during the 1992 season, ranking ahead of Alex Rodriguez-2000 (.986) and Brendan Ryan-2012 (.985)...Crawford is on-pace to be the first American League shortstop to post a .990+ fielding percentage in nearly a decade, with J.J. Hardy-BAL (.992) serving as the last shortstop to reach the mark in 2015.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, his 2nd against the Rangers...he is also scheduled to make the 14th start of his career, his 2nd career start against Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 9/13 vs. Texas...he tossed 5.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 6 hits (1 home run) with 1 walk and 5 strikeouts...he has gone 5.0-or-more innings in 8 of his 13 career starts.

THE COMPLETE PACKAGE...on July 21 vs. Reno, Hancock threw 9.0 inning complete game shutout...it is the only 9.0 inning complete game shutout in Triple-A in 2024 and only 1 of 2 in the full-season minor leagues this year... there have only been 2 complete game shutouts in the Pacific Coast League since the start of 2019.

PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH...was awarded Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Month for June...held a 1-0 record with a 0.84 ERA in 4 starts as he allowed 2 runs on 14 hits with 7 walks over 21.1 innings...he tallied 17 strikeouts and held opponents to a .187 (14x75) average...after allowing 2 runs in the first inning of June, he did not allow another run in his last 20.1 innings in June with Tacoma.

FEELING SUPPORTED...Hancock is 3-0 in 6 games when the Mariners score 3 or more runs while he is in the game...in those games the Mariners are 6-0...he is 0-2 with a 2.70 ERA when given 0-2 runs of run support.

THROWING STRIKES...his 64.9% first strike percentage is the highest of his career and well above the league average of 58.1%.

QUALITY TIME...has recorded quality starts in 4-of-10 major league outings... in quality starts this season, he is 2-1 with a 2.16 ERA (6 ER, 25.0 IP) with 13 strikeouts and 5 walks...notched his first career quality start on 4/13 vs. Chicago-NL.

TACOMA TIME...in 17 starts in Tacoma he pitched 94.1 IP with a 3.43 ERA with 66 strikeouts to 37 walks and a 1.29 WHIP...his 3.43 ERA was the lowest of any Rainier pitcher with at least 10 starts.

ALL-AMERICAN...this will be the right-hander's 2nd career appearance against the Rangers and his 8th career appearance against a team from the American League...of the 7 previous starts against American League opponents, 4 have been from the AL Central (Royals, Twins, Guardians and White Sox)...his only other starts against an AL opponent was the Houston Astros, Texas Rangers and Toronto Blue Jays.

HOME SWEET HOME...through his first 5 career starts at home. is 2-2 with a 2.77 ERA (8 ER, 26.0 IP), 10 walks and 16 strikeouts over his first 5 career starts at T-Mobile park...his 2.77 ERA is the 8th-best mark in franchise history through a pitchers first 5 career starts at home, trailing Joel Piñiero (0.82 ERA), James Paxton (1.45), Sam Gaviglio (2.00), Michael Pineda (2.23), Matt Young (2.45), Hisashi Iwakuma (2.70) and Ryan Franklin (2.70).

KNOCK 'EM OUT, KNOCK 'EM OUT...entering 2024, had a career-high 3 strikeouts during his MLB debut vs. San Diego on 8/9/23...he has surpassed that total on 7 occasions this season, including a career-high 6 strikeouts on 4/7 at Milwaukee.

HOME SWEET GEORGIA...is 1 of 5 players in MLB history born in Cairo, GA, the same birthplace as Jackie Robinson, Ernie Riles, Willie Harris and Hurston Waldrep...was the 11th Georgia Bulldog in school history to be drafted in the first round...he became the highest Georgia selection since Derek Lilliquist went 6th overall in 1987...1 of 7 Bulldogs to play in MLB this season (also: Jonathan Cannon-CWS, Kyle Farmer-MIN, Jared Walsh-TEX, Alex Wood-OAK, Zac Kristofak-LAA and Aaron Schunk-COL).
