RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue on their second road trip this season and first departing from St. Louis. Today marks the rubber match of a three-game series against the defending National League Champion Arizona Diamondbacks. A win would clinch the Cardinals their second straight road series (San Diego, 4/1-3) and 3-of-5 overall this season. The road trip continues tomorrow as the Cardinals depart Phoenix for the Bay Area following this afternoon's game for a three-game series with the Oakland Athletics, April 15-17.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals open today's schedule in 5th place in the National League Central, 4.0 games behind first place Milwaukee (10-3). The four-game deficit is the largest of the season for the Cardinals matching their position on April 8. St. Louis has spent one game over .500 on April 6 (5-4), five games at .500, most recently yesterday, and nine gamedays below .500, with their largest deficit at two games under .500 on March 31.

GALLEN → OZUNA → BURLESON: The Cardinals selected RHP Zac Gallen in the 3rd round of the 2016 MLB Draft, and later packaged him with RHP Sandy Alcantara, RHP Daniel Castano and OF Magneuris Sierra in a trade to the Marlins in exchange for OF Marcell Ozuna (Dec. 14, 2017) ... Two years later, Ozuna rejected a qualifying offer from St. Louis and signed with Atlanta, which gave the Cardinals the 70th overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft ... OF Alec Burleson was then selected 70th overall out of East Carolina University.

YOU CAN ALWAYS GO "HOME": Paul Goldschmidt was 2-for-5 last night extending his hitting streak at Chase Field to eight games, currently the longest hitting streak among active players. In the stadium's 27-year history, the former Diamondback has run off four hit streaks of 10 games or more, all while with Arizona. Trea Turner (LAD, WSH) holds the stadium mark with a 25-game hit streak (2016-22), while Yadier Molina (2016-22) holds the Cardinals mark with 15.

A CASE OF THE WILLIES: With a 2nd inning single last night, Cardinals catcher Willson Contreras established a new career-high for on-base streak with 19, besting the 18 he ran off in July 2016 as a member of the Cubs. Dating back to September 6, 2023, Contreras' mark ranks T-3rd in MLB trailing only Christian Yelich (MIL, 23) and the suspended Noelvi Marte (CIN, 22).

FREE-MASYN: Masyn Winn collected his team-leading 6th multi-hit game last night, which included a stolen base and an RBI in consecutive games for the first time this season. His record for RBI in consecutive games is three (Sept. 23-27, 2023).

TRIP' CITY: The Cardinals hit their 5th triple of the season last night as Jordan Walker raced out the trifecta in the 5th inning leading to the first Cardinals run. St. Louis is tied for the Major League lead with five triples along with Colorado and Cincinnati. The last time the Cardinals hit five triples in their first 15 games of the season was 2016. The 1901 Cardinals hit 18 triples over their first 15 games for the team record. Masyn Winn is tied for the National League lead with two triples (CJ Abrams-WSH, Charlie Blackmon-COL & Ha-Seong Kim-SD).

REVERSE PSYCHOLOGY: Oddly enough, the Cardinals are 5-1 this season when the bullpen works 4.0 or more innings with their only loss vs. Philadelphia in a rain storm on April 10. The Cardinals bullpen leads the National League with 11.25 strikeouts/9 IP and 2nd in MLB to only Minnesota's bullpen bunch (11.89 K/9 IP).

CATCHERS IN THE RYE: Cardinals catchers Willson Contreras and Iván Herrera lead all Major League teams with five home runs from the catcher position. Their .536 slugging percentage ranks 2nd as well as their 10 runs scored. Contreras or Herrera have combined to hit safely in 11-of-15 games started at catcher this season and 10-of-the-last-11.

GETTING NOLAN ROLLIN': Nolan Arenado drilled a three-run home run in the 1st inning on Friday night to give St. Louis a 3-0 lead, but more importantly snapped a career-long stretch of 39 games covering 154 plate appearances without a home run dating back to August 19, 2023. Arenado is currently leading the Cardinals with 17 hits and two three-hit games. Arenado is one of three Cardinals to play in all 15 games (Nolan Gorman & Victor Scott II). His 32 career dingers against Arizona are his 2nd-most against any opponent (San Francisco, 33).

NOOTS HOOTS: Outfielder Lars Nootbaar returned from the 10-day Injured List on April 11 and came out gangbusters by smoking a 438-foot home run in his second plate appearance on Friday night in Arizona. The blast was the longest of the season by a Cardinals batter and the longest at Chase Field in 2024.

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS

Paul Goldschmidt was selected by Arizona in the 8th round of the 2009 MLB Draft...played eight seasons with the Dbacks (2011-18), hitting .297/.398/.532 with 209 home runs and 710 RBI...selected to six All-Star squads (2013-18)...won four Silver Sluggers (2013, '15, '17-18) and three Gold Gloves (2013, '15, '17)...acquired by St. Louis from Arizona for Carson Kelly, Luke Weaver, Andrew Young, and the 2019 Cardinals Compensation Round B selection (Dec. 5, 2018).

Nolan Arenado made his MLB debut vs. the Dbacks (April 28, 2013 at Chase Field)...Signed his letter of intent to play college baseball at Arizona State University before drafted by the Rockies.

Nolan Gorman was born in Phoenix...graduated from Sandra Day O'Connor High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the University of Arizona before drafted by the Cardinals.

Dbacks First Base Coach Dave McKay served in the same position for the Cardinals for 16 seasons (1996-2011).

Dbacks Hitting Coach Joe Mather was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2001 MLB Draft...played parts of two years in St. Louis (2008, '10).

Keynan Middleton pitched in 18 games for the Diamondbacks in 2022.

Daniel Descalso played two seasons for the Diamondbacks (2017-18)...served as a Special Assistant to Baseball Operations for Arizona in 2023.

Brandon Crawford resides in Scottsdale, Ari.

JoJo Romero played college baseball at Yavapai College in Prescott, Arizona.

Matthew Liberatore was born in Peoria, Ari...graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the Univer-

sity of Arizona before drafted by the Rays.

Randal Grichuk played parts of his first four MLB seasons in St. Louis (2014-17)...originally joined the Cardinals via trade with the Angels, packaged with Peter Bourjos in exchange for David Freese and Fernando Salas (Nov. 22, 2013).

Turner Ward played two seasons (1999-2000) and spent eight years coaching in the Dbacks organization, serving as AA-Mobile Hitting Coach (2008-10) and Manager (2011-12), and Arizona Asst. Hitting Coach (2013) Hitting Coach (2014-15)...Ward's Mobile teams won Southern League championships in 2011 and 2012...Turner's son, Tucker Ward, was selected by Arizona in the 40th round of the 2015 MLB Draft draft and pitched three seasons in the Arizona organization (2015-17).

Brandon Allen played parts of three seasons (2009-11) with the Dbacks...made his MLB debut

TODAY'S GAME

- The Cardinals' Opening Day starter for 2024 makes his 4th start of the season and his 154th career (182nd appearance).
- Pushed his career won-loss record to one game over .500 (55-54) with win on April 2 at San Diego.
- Is 23-23 in his 71 starts at Busch Stadium as a Cardinal, with 42 Quality Starts. The Cardinals are 40-31 in those games.
- Entering his 7th season (was injured in 2020) with the Cardinals in 2024. Is currently ranked 2nd among active Cardinals pitchers in career innings pitched (856.2), wins (51), strikeouts (626) and games started (144) for St. Louis; trailing only **Lance Lynn** in all categories.
- Led Major League Baseball with 35 starts in 2023, becoming the first pitcher to record 35 starts in a season since **Jhoulys Chacin** (35) in 2018 with Milwaukee. Was the first Cardinals pitcher since **Chris Carpenter** had 35 in 2009 to do so.
- Hasn't committed an error since August 2, 2018 vs. COL. Is one of two pitchers (**Erick Fedde**) with 100+ total chances and zero errors since Aug 3, 2018. Ranks 9th among MLB pitchers in fielding pct. (.988) since 2018 (min. 100 TC).

- Making his 4th career start and 6th career appearance vs. the Diamondbacks.
- Tonight's start is his 3rd career appearance at Chase Field. Has won both of his two previous starts in 2018 and 2022.
- In his most recent start at Chase Field in 2022, threw 8.0 innings for his team-leading 10th win of the season in a 5-1 Cardinals win. His lone run allowed came on an infield groundout in the 8th inning.
- Made first two career outings in relief as a member of the San Diego Padres in 2012.

2024

- Notched his 1st win of the season, besting the Padres and **Yu Darvish** by a 5-2 score on April 2 at PETCO Park. It was his 1st win in San Diego since May 10, 2018, and marked the 6th quality start among seven career starts against his former team.
- Was 2-0 with a 2.14 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring. He led the staff in IP (21.0) and starts (5) and co-led in wins (2) and strikeouts (15).

CAREER

- Two-time National League All-Star (2018 and 2022). Did not appear in the 2022 contest at Dodger Stadium and chose to miss the 2018 game in Washington D.C. to be with his wife as they welcomed twins.
- St. Louis is 80-64 (.559) in his 144 career outings (143 starts) since joining the organization (2018-present).
- Has registered 32 or more starts in every season in which he was not injured or sidelined by COVID-19 protocols.
- Since joining St. Louis in 2018, Mikolas trails only **Clayton Kershaw** (67.6%) for the 2nd-highest percentage of first pitch strikes in MLB with 67.2%.
