METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets swept a doubleheader against the Cubs yesterday... The team earned a 2-1 victory in game one and a 4-3 victory in game two... The Mets are 46-10 when scoring first this season... New York is 21-5-3 in 29 series this year... The Mets are in a stretch of 17 games in 17 days (10-5) to finish out the first-half... The Mets finish the first half of the season with a seven game road trip (5-1) to Atlanta (2-1) and Chicago-NL (3-0)... Following the All-Star break, the Mets return to Citi Field for a six-day, five-game homestand against the Padres (three games) and Yankees (two games).

30-FOR-30: New York is 30-19 on the road this year... That matches their 2021 total for wins on the road (30-51)... Their .612 road winning percentage is the fourth-best in the majors and is the second-best in the NL... New York is batting .253/.322/.400 away from Citi Field... Their .253 road average ranks fourth in the NL.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Each contest of the Mets doubleheader went to extra-innings yesterday... This marked the fifth time in Mets history that both ends of a nine-inning doubleheader went to extra innings and the fourth time the team swept an all extra-innings doubleheader... Prior to 2020, the last time both ends of a Mets doubleheader went to extras was July 31, 1983 vs. Pittsburgh (also a Mets sweep)... The team played two extra-inning games on September 26, 1975 at Philadelphia (split), June 6, 1967 at Pittsburgh (Mets sweep) and June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh (Mets sweep)... The team also did it on June 25, 2021 vs. Philadelphia (eight innings) and August 30, 2020 at New York-AL (eight innings).

BURNT ENDS: Yesterday, Pete Alonso recorded the game-winning RBI in extra innings in both of the Mets victories in Chicago... He's the first major league player to have the game-winning RBI in extras in both games of a road doubleheader since Hank Aaron did it on September 13, 1956... Courtesy of Stats Inc... Alonso leads the majors with 14 game-winning RBI and 20 go-ahead RBI this season.

EXTRA-EXTRA: The Mets improved to 9-1 in extra-inning contests yesterday... The team's nine wins are tied with the Padres for the most in the majors... Their .900 winning percentage in extra-innings is the best in the majors.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won four straight games and five of their last six games... The team's four game winning streak is their second-longest of the season... The Mets had a six-game win streak from May 27-June 1.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are looking for their third sweep of the season today... The last time the Mets swept a four-game series against the Cubs was from June 30-July 3, 2016 at New York... The team has never recorded four-game sweep at Chicago, but has recorded a five-game sweep from June 22-25, 1970.

DOUBLE MINT GUM: The Mets played their first doubleheader against the Cubs since April 22, 2000 at Shea Stadium and their first in Chicago since July 24, 1998... The Mets have swept the last four doubleheaders at Wrigley Field including their twinbill on June 13, 1990 and on August 6, 1986.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Max Scherzer struck out 11 last night, marking the 108th time in his career he struck out 10+ batters in game... That ties him with Pedro Martínez fourth in MLB history... Next up is Roger Clemens with 110 games with 10+ strikeouts.

GIMME A BREAK: The Mets have won 58 games before the All-Star break this season, despite the first slate of games being rescheduled due to the lockout... That is the second-most wins before the break in franchise history... Only the 1986 Mets (59-25) won more games before the break... The last time the Mets won 50 or more games before the break was in 2006 (53-36)... The Mets will head into the break in first place for the second straight season... This marks just the second time in franchise history that the Mets head into the break in first place in back-to-back seasons (also, 2006-2007).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Yesterday, catcher Francisco Álvarez and infielder Mark Vientos participated in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium... Álvarez, went 0-1 with a walk... The 20-year-old is ranked as the top prospect in the Mets system and the No. 2 prospect in baseball according to MLB Pipeline... Vientos went 0-2 with a walk... The 22-year-old ranks fifth in the organization.

HANG 10: Francisco Lindor is on a 10-game hitting streak, his longest as a member of the Mets... He is batting .279 (12-43) with six runs, a double, a triple, three home runs, nine RBI and an .899 OPS in that span... In 14 games this month, Lindor is batting .262/.342/.492 with nine runs, a double, one triple, four home runs, seven walks, a steal and 10 RBI... He has posted a 3.3 fWAR this year which places him ninth in the National League.

LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE: Lindor has recorded 66 RBI in 91 games this year... Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021... Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break... José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic... He's broken his own record for most RBI before the break (62) when playing with Cleveland in 2018.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: Francisco Lindor is a .340 (16-47) career hitter with nine runs, four doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and eight walks in 12 regular season games at Wrigley Field... Brandon Nimmo has hit .286 (10-35) with four runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, with two walks and a .429 SLG OPS in nine career games at Wrigley... J.D. Davis has hit .350 (7-20) at the ballpark with three runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI and four walks in nine games... Starling Marte has played 65 career games at Wrigley, hitting .270/.324/.460 with 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 17 walks and 34 RBI.

HOT IN JULY: New York's 2.37 team ERA this month is the second-best mark in the majors, trailing only Seattle (2.30)... The club's 182 strikeouts in July lead the majors... Mets starters have gone 7-3 with 2.50 ERA (26 earned runs/93.2 innings) with 21 walks and 106 strikeouts in 16 games in July... Their 2.50 ERA places them third in MLB... Their 116 strikeouts from starters in July are also the most in the majors.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won three straight games at Wrigley Field for the first time since they won five straight from April 4, 1994 - July 18, 1995.

DAY MAN: New York is 25-14 in day games this season... The team's .641 winning percentage in the sunlight is the third-best in the majors and the best in the National League... The Mets have posted a 3.01 ERA with 98 walks and 380 strikeouts in the daytime... Their 3.01 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and first in the NL, while their 380 punchouts are third in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit.

POT IT IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Edwin Díaz has converted 84 saves as a member of the Mets... That ties him with Roger McDowell (1985-89) for seventh place on the team's all-time list... Tug McGraw is next... He converted 86 saves with the Mets from 1965-74... Díaz has struck out 313 batters as a member of the Mets... That is eighth all-time by a Mets reliever.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with 10 saves, a 0.48 ERA (one earned run/18.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 41 strikeouts over his last 19 appearances since May 27... He has recorded 20 saves this season, tied for the fourth in the majors... He leads the major leagues among relievers with 75 strikeouts... His 18.08 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors... No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00... He has struck out 75 of the 145 batters he faced, good for 51.7%... He is 2-1 with 20 saves, a 1.69 ERA (seven earned runs/37.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks... The Mets are 34-4 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

GLASS HALF FULL: Mets pitchers have struck out 883 batters this season... That is a franchise record for most strikeouts in the first half of a season... The previous record with 837 through 94 games in 2018... The Mets rank second in the majors in strikeouts this season... On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 708 times this season... That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit... The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game six times this year, which is tied for the second-most in the majors... The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 49 times this year, the most in the majors.

ALONSO ON ADDISON STREET: Pete Alonso is a .243 (9-37) hitter with eight runs, two doubles, 13 RBI, five walks with a .356 OBP and a .784 SLG in 10 career games at Wrigley Field... In his career, he has hit 75 home runs on the road... That is seventh on the Mets all-time list... Dave Kingman is next with 81.

FEEL THE ILLINOISE: Colin Holderman grew up in Bourbonnais, IL, roughly 60 miles from Wrigley Field... He recorded four wins in first 13 major league appearances... That is the third-most wins by a Mets reliever in his first 13 major league games... Only Drew Gagnon (five in 2018) and Roger McDowell (five in 1985) had more... Overall the rookie is 4-0 with a 2.04 ERA (four earned runs/17.2 innings) with seven walks and 18 strikeouts... Opponents are batting .186 against him... Righties are 6-36 (.167) against him.

CONNECT FOUR: New York is 49-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game... The team's 49 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors... Their .908 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors... The Mets have won 17 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 27-1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times... The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 58 games this season, the second-most in the National League... Their .630 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL... The team has posted a 58-34 record through the team's first 92 games... Only the 1986 (63-29) team posted a better record through the first 92 games of the season... The Mets are a season-high 24 games above .500... The last time the Mets were 24 or more games over .500 was at the end of the 2006 season (97-65).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Major League Baseball announced that first baseman Pete Alonso, second baseman Jeff McNeil, outfielder Starling Marte and RHP Edwin Díaz were named to the 2022 National League All-Star team... The 92nd All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 19 at Dodger Stadium in Los Angeles... The last time the Mets had four All-Stars was in 2016 (Noah Syndergaard, Yoenis Céspedes, Jeurys Familia and Bartolo Colón)... This is the 10th time in franchise history the Mets had four or more All-Stars.

DERBY DAY: On Monday, Pete Alonso will compete in the Home Run Derby for the third time... Pete Alonso won the 2021 Home Run Derby, defeating Trey Mancini to earn his second Derby title... He is the only Met to win the competition twice and is the lone player in team history to win the derby outright... He is the second player in franchise history to win the Derby, joining Darryl Strawberry, who shared the victory with Wally Joyner in 1986... No player in major league history has won the competition three straight years.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Went 5.1 innings and allowed two earned runs on two hits on July 12 against the Braves at Truist Park...Recorded nine strikeouts and walked three batters...Tied a season-low in hits allowed with two.

VS. CUBS: Peterson has faced the Northsiders twice in his career...He threw 6.0 shutout innings when the Cubs visited New York on June 14 last season and allowed six runs (three earned) in 3.1 innings of work at Wrigley last April 21...All told, he is 1-1 with a 2.89 ERA (three earned/9.1 innings) and a .167 opponent batting average against the Cubs.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: In eight road outings this season, Peterson has an ERA of 2.84 (12 earned runs/38.0 innings), more than five earned runs lower than his 2021 road total (7.97)...He is 5-7 with a 4.64 ERA (54 earned runs/104.2 innings) in his career on the road.

SWING AND A MISS: Has a 13.5 K/9 rate in his last five starts, fanning 41 batters in 27.1 innings...Peterson has generated at least 12 swings and misses in five straight starts, causing 85 whiffs total in that span...Before this stretch, he had four starts total in his career in which he made opposing hitters swing and miss a dozen or more times...He has racked up at least seven strikeouts in five straight starts after never doing so in consecutive outings in his career previously...Peterson's 41 strikeouts over a five game span are the most by a Mets left-handed pitcher since Johan Santana fanned 43 during a five-start stretch in August 2010.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has limited left-handed batters to a .172 (10-58) average...He owns the seventh-lowest opponents' batting average in the majors among left-handed pitchers (min. 55 LHB faced).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: This season, Peterson has held batters to .145 (12-92) average off his slider and 51 of his 76 strikeouts this season have come via the slider...Last season, opposing hitters batted .299 (20-67) off his slider... Peterson's 55.4 strikeout percentage on his slider is the second-highest in the majors (min. 50 PA) behind teammate Edwin Díaz (57.6)...His slider also ranks third in the majors in put away rate (35.2 percent).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: The southpaw has allowed four hits or fewer in eight of his 12 starts and 11 of his 14 appearances overall this year...He has held the opposition to four hits or fewer in 28 of his 39 career games.

TAKIN' CARE OF BUSINESS: Peterson has not allowed more than four earned runs in all 12 of his starts this season...In his career, he has allowed more than three earned runs just seven times in 36 career starts.
