## LHP Zack Thompson (2-4, 3.96) vs. LHP Joey Lucchesi (1-0, 4.43) <br> SNY - WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cardinals, $4-2$, to open up the road trip...The Mets have won three of their last four games...The Mets continue a seven-game road trip (1-0) to St. Louis (1-0) and Atlanta (three games).

EN FUEGO: Tonight, LHP Joey Lucchesi is expected to be recalled from Triple-A Syracuse and make the start... He is $1-0$ with a 4.43 ERA ( 11 $E R / 22.1$ IP) with eight walks and 17 strikeouts in five starts with the Mets this season...The lefty has made 11 starts ( 12 games) at Triple-A Syracuse this season and posted a 6-3 record with a 4.39 ERA ( 30 ER/67.2 IP) with 30 walks and 63 strikeouts.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Jose Quintana, Trevor Gott and Tim Locastro recorded their respective first win, first save and first home run as a Met Thursday night...It marked the first time three Mets had notched those Met "firsts" in the same game since April 20, 1967, when Tommy Davis hit his first Met homer, Don Shaw was credited with his first Met save and starter Tom Seaver picked up his first Met - and career - win...The only other time such a trio of initial events occurred in the same game was one week earlier, April 13, 1967, when the starter was also Seaver (his first MLB game), Chuck Estrada claimed the victory in relief for his first and only Met win; Ron Taylor notched his first Met save, while Jerry Buchek delivered his first Met homer...Credit to Faith and Fear in Flushing research.

REVOLUTION NO. 9: Brandon Nimmo is on a nine-game hitting streak, which is the third-longest of his career...He is batting .412 (14-34) with three runs, two doubles, two home runs, seven walks, three RBI with a 1.159 OPS in that span... He has slugged his 17 homers this season, matching his single-season career-high mark set in 2018...Nimmo is batting . 291 (43-148) with 11 doubles, one triple, one home run, 12 RBI, 12 walks and a . 363 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Last night, Pete Alonso launched his 37th home run of the season...He is third in the majors and second in the National League in home runs...Alonso has recorded 40 or more home runs twice in his career...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season... He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)...Alonso's 183 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and in the NL with 91 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)... He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

SLIPPERY PETE: Alonso is hitting 289 (28-97) with 17 extra-base hits, 29 RBI, 17 runs, 12 walks and a 1.087 OPS in his last 27 games... He was hitting . 132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18).

THE SOUND OF REFRESHMENT: Rafael Ortega is a lifetime 348 (16-46) hitter with four runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, seven RBI and three walks with a .388 OBP and a .500 SLG in 14 career games at Busch Stadium...Pete Alonso has gone 13-37 (.351) with nine runs, two doubles, two triples, one home run, three RBI and seven walks in 11 career games at the ballpark...Omar Narváez has appeared in 14 games at the yard and is 16-50 with three doubles, one triple and four RBI.

CARDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 22-30 at Busch Stadium since the ballpark opened in 2006.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 25-38 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.88 ERA in away games...New York has played 63 games on the road this year...That is tied for the most in the majors.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .291 (67-230) with 32 runs, 11 doubles, three triples, six home runs, 29 RBI, 33 walks, a .381 OBP and a . 443 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a $.238 / .345 / .444$ slashline with 21 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .262 (64-244) with 42 runs, 18 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, $48 \mathrm{RBI}, 24$ walks, a .337 OBP, and a .512 SLG on the road in 2023 .. He is slashing .223/.322/.398 with 18 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks 10th in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 4.6 fWAR....Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 15.6 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (17.8) and Mookie Betts (15.6) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit... His 15.6 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

LINSANITY: Over Francisco Lindor's last 50 games, he is batting .292 (54-185) with 36 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 29 RBI, 26 walks, 14 steals with a .384 OBP, a .530 SLG and a .914 OPS...Lindor has stolen 20 bases in 120 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 11 of his last 13 games, batting . 313 (15-48) with nine runs, two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, four walks and seven RBI in that span with a .382 OBP...In 32 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .268 (33-123) with 18 runs, five doubles, one triple, two home runs, 15 RBI, seven walks with a .331 OBP.. He has struck out only 11 times in 136 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 36-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches $7.0+$ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2002, Tommie Agee was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame...The Gold Glove center fielder is best remembered for his spectacular catches in game three of the 1969 World Series that saved a combined five runs... He also led off that game with a home run... Hit the longest home run in Shea Stadium history of April 10, 1969, the only ball ever to be hit into the upper deck in fair territory...Overall, Agee played 12 years in the majors, including five with the Mets... He hit $.262 / .329 / .419$ with 82 home runs and 265 RBI

DOWN ON THE FARM: Yesterday, INF/OF Jett Williams went 2-6 with one run, two doubles and a steal for the Brooklyn Cyclones...Williams is on a five-game hitting streak, batting $.350(7-20)$ in that span with three runs, four doubles, five walks with a . 480 OBP...In 15 games with Brooklyn this season, Williams is batting .289/.448/.462 with seven extra-base hits... He was selected with the 14th overall pick in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Rockwall-Heath High School in Texas...Williams is ranked as the third-best prospect in the organization according to MLB Pipeline.

LUCCHESI NEWS \& NOTES
LAST TIME OUT IN THE MAJORS: Lucchesi threw 2.0 innings on May 13 at Nationals Park against Washington, allowing one earned run on four hits and a walk...Fanned one Nationals batter in a 3-2 Mets loss.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made two appearances with Brooklyn (A + ) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 7 -day IL, both against the Aberdeen IronBirds...Threw 52 pitches in his first rehab start on August 8, allowing one earned run on four hits and a walk while striking out five...On August 13 , threw 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing one hit and one walk while fanning three batters in a 63 -pitch outing.

SOMETHING IN THE CARDS: Lucchesi will face the Cardinals for the first time this season and the first time since $2021 \ldots$...He has faced St. Louis twice previously in his career, pitching to a 0-1 record with a 9.00 ERA (8 ER/8.0 IP).

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi has made 12 appearances, 11 of which were starts, this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In those appearances, he has pitched to a 3.99 ERA ( $30 \mathrm{ER} / 67.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and has tallied 63 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a .224 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.27 WHIP...Lucchesi earned International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 12-18 after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings against the Buffalo Bisons on June 13, during which he allowed two hits while striking out six batters.

CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In three away games in the majors this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 3.46 ERA ( $5 \mathrm{ER} / 13.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ), tallying 10 strikeouts, and earned his one win on the year thus far in San Francisco on April 21...In two home starts this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 5.79 ERA (6 ER/9.1 IP).

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi-who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA (19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery....Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings... Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his churve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

- Selected from Triple-A Syracuse on August 2...Was hitting .244/.344/.429 with 14 doubles, three triples, 14 homers, 49 RBI, 58 runs scored and 52 walks.
