## TRANSACTIONS

Today the Reds recalled from Class AAA Louisville RHP R.J. Alaniz (\#32, ah-lahNIECE) and optioned to Louisville RHP Matt Bowman...on $5 / 31$, Alaniz was claimed off waivers from the Mariners and was optioned to Louisville, where he went 1-2, 2.93 with 4 saves in 25 relief apps...in April, he made his Major League debut by pitching in 4 games for the Mariners.

## PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Rookie RF Aristides Aquino is the reigning National League Player of the Week...from $8 / 5-8 / 11$ he led the Major Leagues in slugging percentage (1.364), tied for the lead in HR (6) and led the National League in hitting (.500) and RBI (11)...he is the first Reds rookie to win a Player of the Week award since RHP Chris Reitsma in April 2001 and the first Reds rookie position player since Hal Morris in July 1990...last season, the Reds won Player of the Week honors 3 times (Scooter Gennett twice, Joey Votto)

## PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Since his promotion on August 1, rookie RHP Aristides Aquino is tied for the Major League lead in HR (10), ranks T2nd in the majors in RBI (19), leads the National League in slugging percentage (.961) and ranks among the NL leaders in batting average (.353, 13th), hits (18, T 16 th ) and extra-base hits (11, T 4 th ).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES
In their previous 7 series, the Reds went 4-12 (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl, $2-0$ vs LAA, $2-2$ vs Cubs, $0-3$ at Wsh)...the $4-0-2$ stretch was the Redlegs' longest series streak of the season without a loss.

2ND HALF
Since the All-Star break the Redlegs lead the National League in hitting (.287) while ranking second in slugging (.494), on-base percentage (.348) and runs ( $183,5.38 \mathrm{r} / \mathrm{g}$ ).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 4 -game series vs Carlos Villoria's first-place Cardinals and Game 3 (1-1) of a 7-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3 -game series vs the Padres...is Game 12 (56) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park ( $2-0$ vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, $0-3$ at Wsh, 1-1 vs StL, 3 g vs SD)...Reds went 4-2 on their previous homestand (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs).

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the 150th anniversary of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the 1869 Red Stockings...this season, the team will wear 15 uniforms from various periods throughout the team's history...tonight are wearing replica uniforms of the 1976 World Series championship team...the Reds are 3-7 wearing throwback uniforms...already wore uniforms from 1902 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961, 1967 and 1969.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are $5-8 \mathrm{vs}$ StL this season, including 2-4 at Great American Ball Park....over the last 4 seasons, the Cardinals' .571 winning percentage (20-15) is third-best among opponents at GABP (Wsh .769, LAD .615)...the Reds are 3-2-2 in their last 7 completed series vs StL, including a $1-1$ series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League.. Cin won 6 of its last 11 games at Busch Stadium

## REDS vs CARDINALS:

Joey Votto has 196 career hits vs the Cardinals (196-625, .314), the most among active players...in the live ball era, his career . 437 OBP vs StL ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (Lefty O'Doul 1st, .477; Ralph Kiner 3rd, .424)...in 91 apps over the last 6 seasons vs StL, Votto has produced a 1.034 OPS (.335ba, $.571 \mathrm{slg}, .463 \mathrm{obp}$ )...in his ast 60 apps overall vs StL beginning $8 / 2 / 16$ is hitting .339 ( $75-221,16$ 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 36rbi, . 543 slg , .449 obp )
Beginning $8 / 5 / 17$, Eugenio Suárez has reached base safely in 28 of his last 30 apps vs StL ( $30-106, .283,5 \mathrm{2b}$, $9 \mathrm{hr}, 25 \mathrm{rbi}$, .585 slg , .384 obp ), including a 25 -game on-base streak snapped on $\mathbf{7 / 1 9}$.
Beginning $7 / 13 / 18$, Jesse Winker has a 14 -game hitting streak vs StL (21-53, .396, 5 2b, 3hr, $10 \mathrm{rbi}, .660 \mathrm{slg}, .484 \mathrm{obp}$ )...beginning 9/19/17 has reached base safely in each of his last 24 apps vs $\operatorname{StL}(35-93, .376,82 \mathrm{~b}$, $4 \mathrm{hr}, 16 \mathrm{rbi}, .591 \mathrm{slg}, .453 \mathrm{obp}$ ).... hit safely in 23 of those 24 apps.
RHP Raisel Iglesias is 12 -for-12 in save opps vs the Cardinals, joining

 Bill Landrum (10-for-10) and Jeff Brantley (12-for-12) as the only pitchers, since the save became an official statistic, with a minimum of at least 10 perfect save conversions vs StL...in his last 23 apps vs StL beginning 8/4/16, Raisel Iglesias has posted a 1.57 ERA (12sv, 28.2ip, 15h, $5 \mathrm{er}, 19 \mathrm{bb}, 32 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )...in that span, Cardinals batters are hitting just 152 against him (15-99).

PADRES UP NEXT: Monday night the Reds will begin their second series of the season vs the Padres...Cin earned a 3-1 series win in April at Petco Park...haven't won a season series vs SD since 2012 (6-2) and since then are 18-25, including $\mathbf{1 5 - 2 2}$ the last 6 years...over the last 6 seasons, Cin is $8-14$ at Petco Park.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino has produced 10 HR in his first 16 career games, including a 3-homer game last Sat vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season. Is the first player in modern Major League history with 10 HR in his first 16 career games (Rhys Hoskins, 9, 2017). Is the first player in modern Major League history with 9 HR in his first 14 career games (Trevor Story, 8, 2016). Is the first player in modern Major League history with 8 HR in his first 12 career games (4 players with 7). s the second player in modern Major League history with 7 HR in his first 10 career games (Trevor Story, 2016). s the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it.

SUSPENDED: LHP Amir Garrett is 5 games into an 8 -game suspension...in his absence the Reds are 1-4, while the bullpen's ERA is 6.52 (19.1ip, 14er)...he cannot be replaced on the 25-man roster...Garrett was 1 of 9 ejected in the 11-4 loss on $7 / 30$ vs Pit and, 2 days later, 1 of 8 suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager David Bell ( 6 g ), RHP Jared Hughes ( 3 g ) and RF Yasiel Puig (3g) of the Reds and manager Clint Hurdle ( 2 g ), RHP Keone Kela $(10 \mathrm{~g})$, José Osuna $(5 \mathrm{~g})$ and RHP Kyle Crick $(3 \mathrm{~g})$ of the Pirates.
Bell and Hughes already served their suspensions.
FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (99), HR (35), RBI (96), batting average (.308) and slugging percentage (.589) while ranking second in the majors in on-base percentage (.367)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 99-67, and are 29-7 (.806) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first.

REHABBING: RHP Tyler Mahle, on the injured list since $\mathbf{7 / 2 2}$ with a left hamstring strain, last night began a rehabilitation assignment for Louisville vs Rochester, started and received no decision in the $5-2$ loss (1.1ip, 3h, 3er, 1bb, 2k, 37 pitches)...C Curt Casali, on the injured list since $7 / 18$ with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee, made 2 rehab apps before he was shut down with soreness in his left hamstring...in the 3-1 Bats win on $8 / 9$ at Rochester started behind the plate and caught 5 innings (0-3)...in last Sat's $6-5$ loss in 10 innings, he was the Bats' DH (0-2) but left the game with the hamstring injury.

## Tonight's Pitcher - \#28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

## RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...in Mon's $7-6$ loss at Wsh made his 100th Major League start...in his last 3 starts allowed 13 runs, including 12 runs on home runs (Freddie Freeman 3-run, Justin Upton 3-run, Mike Trout solo, Matt Adams 2-run, Trea Turner 3-run)...has allowed 3 leadoff HR (Pit's Adam Frazier, Chi's Kyle Schwarber, Cle's Francisco Lindor)...in the $7-5$ loss on $6 / 23$ at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record 9 strikeouts through the first 3 innings of a game (Mil's Corbin Burnes, $3 / 31 \mathrm{vs} \mathrm{StL}$ ) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available...retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the franchise record for strikeouts to begin a game (Robert Stephenson, 8/25/17 vs Pit)...missed the entire 2017 season with a sprained ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 44 starts since he returned from those injuries is 14-15, 4.72.

Went hitless on $6 / 2$ vs Wsh, snapping his season-high 9 -game hitting streak (14-41, $.341,52 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}, .378 \mathrm{bbp}$ ) and a 20 -game on-base streak that ties Joey Votto's for the longest by a Reds hitter ( $26-86, .302$, 6 2b, 23 b , 1 hr , 8rbi, 4sb, .358 obp ). Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on $3 / 25$ during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on $4 / 23$ and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his $5 / 3$ promotion hit 257 ( $12 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 2rbi).

Left last night's game in the sixth inning with a left thumb sprain....x-rays were negative. Since the All-Star break ranks among the National League leaders in $\operatorname{HR}$ (13, 2nd), slugging percentage (.653, 4th) and on-base percentage (.381, 16th).
In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR, ranks fourth in the majors in $\mathrm{RBI}(21)$ and ranks 11 th in the National League in batting average (.330).
In his last 18 apps beginning $7 / 29$ is hitting . 302 (19-63, 1 2b, 5hr, 7rbi, 961 ops ). Beginning $6 / 30$, homered in 15 of his last 41 apps (17hr), including a pair of 2 -homer games (7/1 vs Mil, 7/22 at Mil).
Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
