## RHP Miles Mikolas (6-8, 4.27) vs. RHP Kodai Senga (9-6, 3.30) <br> WPIX • MLBN • WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cardinals, 7-1, last night...Th Mets have won three straight and four of their last five games...New York is seeking their 15 th series victory of the season tonight...The Mets continue a seven-game road trip (2-0) to St. Louis (2-0) and Atlanta (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Ron Darling celebrates his birthday today...He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2021...One of the pillars of the Mets pitching rotation in the 1980s, he hanks fourth in team history in wins with $99 \ldots$ Darling is also in the top 10 in club history in complete games, innings, strikeouts and shutouts...A member of the 1986 World Series Champions, he won Game 4 of the World Series to even the series...Darling spent nine years with the Mets and was an All-Star in 1985 an earned a Gold Glove award in 1989.

ONE AWAY: Kodai Senga enters tonight with 149 strikeouts this season...With his next strikeout, he will become just the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in their rookie season...Senga is six strikeouts away from passing Gary Gentry for sixth place among rookie pitchers in team history (Gentry had 154 in 1969)... His next strikeout will also make him the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)...Courtesy of sportsradar.

SENGA GENISIS: Kodai Senga improved to 9-6 and has posted a 3.30 ERA (45 ER/122.2 IP) with 59 walks and 149 strikeouts... He ranks sixth in the National League in ERA and 10th in strikeouts,...His 149 strikeouts through 22 career starts is the third-most in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (171) and Matt Harvey (159) have struck out more... His 149 punchouts are the fourthmost by a Japanese born player through 22 career starts... He trails Hideo Nomo (194), Yu Darvish (162) and Masahiro Tanaka (151).

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely hit in 12 of his last 14 games, batting .321 (17-53) with 10 runs, two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, and four walks with a . 383 OBP in that span...In 33 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting . 273 (35-128) with 19 runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 19 RBI, seven walks with a .333 OBP...He has struck out only 11 times in 141 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

RAFAEL IS COOL BUT CRUDE: In 17 games with the Mets, Rafael Ortega is hitting . 269 (14-52) with eight runs, two doubles, three RBI, six walks, three steals with a . 345 OBP...Over his last six games, he is batting . 421 (8-19) with six runs, one doubles, three RBI, two walks and one steal.

HANG 10: Brandon Nimmo is on a 10 -game hitting streak, which is tied for the second-longest of his career...He is batting . 436 (17-39) with five runs, two doubles, three home runs, seven walks, four RBI with a 1.240 OPS in that span...He has slugged his 18 homers this season, setting a new single-season career-high mark.

IT STARTED OUT WITH KISS: Brandon Nimmo belted the 11th leadoff home run of his career and the fourth of the season last night... His 11 leadoff home runs are the third-most in club history...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leader board with 21 leadoff home runs each.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Nimmo is batting .296 (45-152) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .366 OBP and a .421 SLG against left-handed pitchers this year...His .296 average is the ninth best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League in home runs...Alonso has recorded 40 or more home runs twice in his career...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season... He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)...Alonso's 183 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and in the NL with 91 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

CARDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 23-30 at Busch Stadium since the ballpark opened in 2006.

SLIPPERY PETE: Alonso is hitting 277 (28-101) with 17 extra-base hits, 29 RBI, 17 runs, 13 walks and a 1.051 OPS in his last 28 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a . 549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18).

THE SOUND OF REFRESHMENT: Rafael Ortega is a lifetime 360 (18-50) hitter with four runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, seven RBI and three walks with a . 396 OBP and a . 500 SLG in 15 career games at Busch Stadium...Pete Alonso has gone 13-41 (.317) with nine runs, two doubles, two triples, one home run, three RBI and eight walks in 12 career games at the ballpark...Omar Narváez has appeared in 14 games at the yard and is 16-50 with three doubles, one triple and four RBI.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 26-38 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.82 ERA in away games...New York has played 64 games on the road this year...That is tied for the most in the majors.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .298 (70-235) with 34 runs 11 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 30 RBI, 33 walks, a . 385 OBP and a . 460 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .238/.345/.444 slashline with 21 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a 265 (66-249) with 44 runs, 18 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 49 RBI, 24 walks, a .338 OBP, and a . 510 SLG on the road in 2023...He is slashing .223/.322/.398 with 18 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks 10th in the majors and fifth in the National League with a 4.6 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 15.7 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (17.9) and Mookie Betts (16.6) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 15.6 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a five-game hitting streak, batting . 333 (7-21) in that span with four runs, two doubles, four RBI and a walk...Over his last 51 games, he is batting .295 (56-190) with 38 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 30 RBI, 26 walks, 14 steals with a . 385 OBP, a . 526 SLG and a . 911 OPS...Lindor has stolen 20 bases in 121games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 36-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches $7.0+$ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2018, the Mets defeated the Phillies, 8-2, in the Little League Classic in Williamsport, PA...LHP Jason Vargas earned the win, allowing two earned runs on six hits with three strikeouts in 5.1 innings...The Mets combined for 14 hits including two from Jeff McNeil who finished 2-5 with two RBI.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Yesterday, the Rumble Ponies defeated the Sea Dogs, $7-4$ as they improved to 56-55 on the season...Luisangel Acuña and Drew Gilbert powered the offense...Acuña finished the game going 3-5 with two runs, one RBI, one double and a steal, while Gilbert went $3-3$ with one run, four RBI and a homer...Acuña has recorded eight steals in 15 games with the Mets...Gilbert is batting .367 (18-49) with eight runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs, 11 RBI and a steal in 13 games in the organization

## SENGA NEWS \& NOTES

METS ROOKIE MILESTONE WATCH: With his next strikeout, Senga would join Noah Syndergaard (2015), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jon Matlack (1972), Gary Gentry (1969) Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets relief pitchers to reach 150 strikeouts in a season...With his next win, Senga would become the 11th Met rookie to reach 10 wins in a season and the first since Dillon Gee in 2011.
SENGA GENESIS: Has recorded 149 strikeouts through his first 22 career major league games, the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (171), and Matt Harvey (159) have recorded more in their first 21 career starts...His 142 strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 21 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (205), Yu Darvish (162) and Masahiro Tanaka (151)... Senga's 3.30 ERA is the ninth-best mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 22 career major league games (Min. 100.0 IP).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's nine wins are tied for the most among all major league rookies this season and his 149 strikeouts are the most by any rookie... Among rookies with 50.0 or more innings pitched, Senga is third in the majors and second in the NL with a $10.93 \mathrm{SO} / 9$ rate and fourth in the majors in opponent's average (.217)

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 79 of his 149 strikeouts through 22 starts...The pitch has a 58.4 percent whiff rate and a 27.2 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 16 hits in 121 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .132 batting average.

SHUT 'EM OUT: On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a $87-44$ record with a 2.59 ERA ( $313 \mathrm{ER} / 1,089.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and 1,252 strikeouts ( $10.3 \mathrm{~K} / 9.0$ )... He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 3.0 innings against the Pittsburgh Pirates on August 14 at Citi Field...Allowed two earned runs on four hits and three walks...Fanned five batters in a 7-2 Mets victory

MILESTONES \& MEMORIES: Carrasco made his 300th career appearance on August 8 against the Cubs at Citi Field...Made his 250th career start at Fenway on July 23, becoming the 21st active pitcher and seventh Venezuelan pitcher to reach that milestone...Became the 16th active pitcher to make 300 career appearances and 250 career starts
