The Mariners and Cardinals have squared off 27 times, tied for the 2nd-fewest games against an opponent for Seattle (only its 26 G against Pittsburgh ranks fewer)...the Mariners have won 3 consecutive series against the Redbirds:

**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners take on the St. Louis Cardinals tonight in the first game of a 3-game series...the Mariners will also take on the Minnesota Twins (3 G, 4/27-4/29) on the road trip...tonight's game at the Redbirds will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners defeated the Athletics in walk-off fashion, 5-4, in Wednesday's bout prior to yesterday's off day...Seattle capped off a 3-3 homestand against Texas (2-1) and the A's (1-2).

- **Kirb Your Enthusiasm - George Kirby** is the only pitcher in the American League to throw a complete game (April 7 at Texas) this season.
- **Unsung Hero of Wednesday's Win** - Left-hander **José A. Ferrer** tossed 2.0 scoreless innings last game...the 2.0 IP tied a career-high, the 8th time in 155 career appearances that he recorded 2 IP.

**THE STARTING FIVE**...Mariners starting pitchers have been excellent to start the 2026 season, with the rotation of **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo** combining to go 7-9 with a 3.41 ERA (57 ER, 150.1 IP), 34 walks and 139 strikeouts...among MLB rotations, the Mariners ranks T-4th in fWAR (3.3), T-2nd in quality starts (13), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.04), 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.09), 4th in WHIP (1.13) and 7th in ERA.

**NAYLZ HEATING UP**...first baseman **Josh Naylor** supplied the walk-off single in the bottom of the 9th of Seattle's 5-4 win over the Athletics on Wednesday...Naylor went 3-for-5 in the game, registering his fourth career walk-off (first with the Mariners)...over his last 5 games (4/17-c), Naylor is hitting .529 (9x17) with 2 doubles, 3 RBI and 3 walks compared to just 2 strikeouts, slugging .647 with a 1.218 OPS.

**PLAYED OUR CARDS RIGHT**...last time the Mariners faced the Cardinals, they won a 4-2, 13-inning thriller at T-Mobile Park on **Leo Rivas'** 2-run, walk-off home run...the game on Sept. 10, 2025 completed a 3-game sweep of the Cards which marked Seattle's fifth consecutive victory of what turned out to be a season-long, 10-game winning streak from Sept. 6-16...the 10-game winning streak catapulted the team to its first AL West Division crown since 2001.

**NEVER DONE WITH ONE RUN**...the Mariners have played 9 one-run games (3-6) this season, tied for 2nd-most in the Majors...Seattle has played the most one-run games (276, 153-123) since 2021, and the most (498, 275-223) since 2016...the Mariners own the best one-run record in the American League since both 2021 and 2016, ranking 2nd to the Brewers in both.

**JULIO ON-BASE STREAK REACHES 19 GAMES**...**Julio Rodríguez** has reached base safely (via hit, walk or HBP) in 19 consecutive games (4/3-c), tied with Nick Kurtz-ATH for the longest on-base streak by an American League batter this season (both are active streaks) and tied for the 3rd-longest active streak in the Majors...it's also the 3rd-longest on-base streak of Julio's career, trailing streaks of 27 G (2023) and 22 G (2022)...Julio has hit safely in his last 7 games (4/16-c), during which he is batting .385 (10x26) with 1 double, 3 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base.

**YOUNG AND SPRY ON DEFENSE**...Mariners infielder **Cole Young** has 8 defensive runs saved (*FanGraphs*) this season, leading MLB second basemen and tied for the lead among all defenders, regardless of position, with Cubs center fielder Pete Crow-Armstrong...Young leads the Mariners with 1.2 wins above replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) and has accumulated 1.0 defensive WAR, which leads MLB.

**BRASH DECISION**...right-handed reliever **Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 8.1 IP) with 5 strikeouts and 2 walks (1 intentional) in 10 appearances this season...he's posted a 0.600 WHIP and held opponents to a miniscule .120 batting average (3x25).

**MARINERS MAKE TRADE WITH RAYS**...today the Mariners announced they have acquired minor league right-handed pitcher **Ty Cummings** from the Tampa Bay Rays in exchange for right-handed pitcher Casey Legumina, who was designated for assignment on April 21...Cummings was originally drafted by the Mariners in the 7th round of the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft, and was traded to the Rays as the player to be named later in the deal that netted them All-Star outfielder **Randy Arozarena** in 2024.

**RALEY SUCCESSFUL**...outfielder **Luke Raley** is batting .292 (21x72) with 11 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs and 13 RBI in 24 games, slugging .583 with a .938 OPS and 168 OPS+...Raley recently attributed Hall of Famer and Mariners Director of Hitting Strategy **Edgar Martinez** for his 2026 success:

"Talking with Edgar, we saw something he thought might help and after last year we figured 'why not try?' We just found something that's been comfortable and seems to be helping me stay on some pitches."

**SPLENDID STARTERS CEMENT PLACE IN SPECIAL CLUB**...only 11 pitchers in MLB history have recorded 400+ strikeouts while walking fewer than 100 batters through their first 75 career starts and the Mariners have 3 of them currently in their rotation: **Logan Gilbert**, today's starter **George Kirby**, and **Bryan Woo**, who made his 75th career start last outing.

**MITCH GARVER STOPS BY "THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW"**...Mariners catcher **Mitch Garver** joined **Cal Raleigh** and Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer** on this week's episode of "**The Cal Raleigh Show**"...all episodes of the show air on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **SeattleSports.com**.

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...**Cal Raleigh** has been red-hot lately...he homered in all 3 games of the Mariners series against the Athletics, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...it marks the seventh time in Cal's career that he's homered in 3+ consecutive games?...all 7 streaks have occurred since the start of the 2024 season, most such streaks in the big leagues during that time frame, ranking ahead of Aaron Judge-NYY (6 such streaks since 2024) and Shohei Ohtani-LAD (6)...if Cal homers in his next game, he will match a career-high 4-game home run streak, accomplished from June 20-23, 2025 at the Cubs (3 G) and Twins (1 G).

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 24

- **1989** - Joining **Reggie Jackson** and the Reggie bar, **Ken Griffey Jr.** becomes the second player to have a candy bar named after him when he signs a contract with Pacific Trading Cards Company. Unfortunately, the Mariners center fielder can't enjoy the popular confectionery, more than one million will be sold, because the 19-year old rookie is allergic to chocolate.
- **1994** - **Ken Griffey Jr.** hits a game-winning, three-run homer in the eighth inning of a 7-6 win at Baltimore. The blast travels an estimated 438-feet landing on Eutaw Street.
- **2015** - **Félix Hernández** recorded his 23rd complete game and 11th career shutout as the Mariners defeated the Twins, 2-0.
- **2022** - The Mariners walk-off the Kansas City Royals in 12 innings to complete a 3-game sweep...**Jesse Winker** drives home the winning run in the 5-4 win.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 6th start of the season and 1st against the Cardinals...is making the 118th start of his career and his 3rd career start against St. Louis.
• Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
• Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
• Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...W#3 on April 18 vs. Texas, tossing 5.2 innings of 1-run (1 ER) baseball with 5 strikeouts while allowing 7 hits, 2 walks, and 1 home run...he threw 96 pitches (63 strikes) in his 5th start of the season.

THE FIRST FIVE...his 33.1 IP are the most he has tossed across his first five starts of any season in his career (prev. 30.2 IP in 2023) ...his 27 hits allowed are tied for fewest and his 2.97 ERA ranks 2nd-best (highest: 2.93 in 2023) among his first five starts of a season.

QUALITY STUFF...has thrown a quality start in 3 of his 5 starts this season (last: 4/13 vs. HOU)...has thrown 66 quality starts across his career, tied with Logan Gilbert for 11th-most in MLB since 2022...has also thrown a quality start without any walks in 36 career starts (1x this season, 4/7 at TEX), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Tarik Skubal-DET and Logan Webb-SF (25 G).

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 8/12/23 vs. BAL)...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX) and is 1 of 7 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, joining fellow teammate Logan Gilbert (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (101), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.42), walks-per-nine innings (1.35), and walk rate (3.7%).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...making his 2nd road start of the season...among MLB pitchers with 20+ road starts, his 1.25 walks-per-nine innings ranks 3rd-best all-time, trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.08) and Deacon Phillippe (1.21)...his 6.41 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road leads MLB all-time among starters (min. 20 road starts), ahead of Shane Bieber's 5.73 SO/BB.

FIRST TIME VISITOR...is making his 1st career start at Busch Stadium (STL)...Busch Stadium is one of just 6 MLB ballparks Kirby has yet to make a start at (also: Great American Ball Park-CIN, Chase Field-AZ, American Family Field-MIL, Oracle Park-SF, Doger Stadium-LAD).

GETTING STARTED...across 16 career starts in March/April, he is 8-6 with a 3.36 ERA (36 ER, 96.1 IP), 89 strikeouts, 1.038 WHIP, 8.03 strikeouts-per-nine, while allowing just 14 walks...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 11 of those starts, including a quality start in 10 starts during March/April.

IT'S BEEN DECIDED...has factored into the decision in his last 8-consecutive starts, going 5-3 since Sept. 14, 2025)...has factored into the decision in 23 of his 28 starts since last season, going 13-10...since 2023, he has factored into the decision in 71 of his 92 starts (77% of starts), going 40-30 over the stretch...his 71 decisions since 2023 are tied for 4th-most in MLB, alongside Chris Bassitt.

NO FREE PASSES...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any start over his first 117 career games, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher, behind only Carlos Silva's 150 game streak from 8/2/2003-8/15/2008...Kirby's 38 career games of 6.0+ IP without a walk are the most such games among a pitcher's first 117 career games, ahead of Hall of Famer Cy Young (37 G).

FEW FREE BAGS...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 109 of 117 career regular season starts, which are the most such games in MLB through a starting pitcher's first 117 career starts, ranking ahead of Doug Fister (103 G, 2009-13) and Masahiro Tanaka (103 G, 2014-18)...are also the 3rd-most such games by any starting pitcher since 2022, trailing Miles Mikolas-STL (122) and Logan Webb-SF (113)...his 109 career games of 2-or-fewer walks are tied with Randy Johnson for the 8th-most such games among starters in Mariners history...his 101 walks allowed are the fewest among all MLB pitchers through their first 117 career games.

GOING THE DISTANCE...since 2025, the Mariners are 11-6 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 5-6 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...across his career, they are 48-25 when he tosses 6.0+ innings and are 17-27 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings.

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4), ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma (1.9) and Logan Gilbert (1.9)...also leads franchise in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.42), also ahead of Gilbert (4.99)...ranks 6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.55), trailing Luis Castillo (3.52), and just ahead of Logan Gilbert (3.61)...12th in total strikeouts (648 SO).

2025 TOTALS...went 10-8 with a 4.21 ERA (59 ER, 126.0 IP) with 29 walks and 137 strikeouts over 23 starts last season...wrapped the 2025 season with a career-best 9.8 strikeouts-per-nine innings, surpassing his previous career-high 9.2 SO/9 in 2022, and a career-best K% of 26.1...tossed a combined 31 strikeouts across his last 3 starts of the 2025 regular season (9/14-9/26) which is the most by a Mariners pitcher across a 3-game span since James Paxton tossed 33 strikeouts from April 26-May 8, 2018.

14:0 (x2)...tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk twice during the 2025 regular season, on June 8 at Los Angeles-AL then on Sept. 14 vs. Los Angeles-AL at home...was the only pitcher in the MLB last season to record multiple games of 14+ strikeouts without a walk and the first to do so since Jacob deGrom tallied 3 such games in 2021...the feat has also been accomplished only 5 times in franchise history by 3 different pitchers: Kirby (done 2x), Randy Johnson (done 2x) and Mark Langston (done 1x).

- **Unreal Stretch** - Took his first career regular season loss on 4/22 vs. ATH...prior to which he held the Major League record for most career innings pitched (151.0) without a loss...was also the only pitcher in MLB history with at least 100 strikeouts and a 1.000 winning percentage.
- **Steady Eddy** - Made 8-consecutive relief appearances (3/30-4/18) without allowing an earned run...tossed 7.2 innings over those appearances.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (22 ER, 78.2 IP) with 27 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 1.017 WHIP in 73 appearances, limiting opponents to a .187 batting average in 2025.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.

- **Scoreless Streak** - Has begun his season with 8.1 scoreless innings over 10 appearances...last season set Mariners record after not allowing a run in his first 19 appearances of the season.
