TODAY'S GAME: Will be streamed exclusively on YouTube with booth announcers Scott Braun and former Reds No 1. draft pick Yonder Alonso (2008, 7th overall) along with dugout reporter Amy Gutierrez...is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs Tom Haudricourt's first-place Brewers and Game 6 (3-2) of a 6-game homestand that included a 2-1 series win vs the Pirates...the Reds' weekend series vs Pit was their first against a team with a record below .500 since the second game of the season, following an Opening Day win at Atl.

ROAD TRIPPIN': Following this afternoon's game the Redlegs will hit the road again for an 11-day, 9-game, 3-city jaunt to Pit's PNC Park (4g), Cle's Progressive Field (off day, 2g) and Tor's Rogers Centre (off day, 3g)...the Reds' active 13-game road losing streak is their longest in a single season since an 0-19 road stretch from 7/5-8/24, 1933...are coming off their second consecutive winless road trip (0-3 at Col, 0-3 at Mil) that included their first series sweep loss at Coors Field since 9/6-9/10, 2010 and their first series sweep loss at American Family Field since 4/24-4/26, 2017.

<u>SERIES NOTES</u>: The 18 runs scored by the Brewers in Wed's **18-4 win** at **American Family Field** was their highest total ever in a game vs the Reds... the Brewers' 3-game sweep last week was their first series sweep vs the Reds at their home ballpark since 4/24-4/26, 2017...over the last 4 seasons, the Brewers' .676 winning percentage (23-11) at Great American Ball Park is the best of any NL Central Division team in that span.

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds went 10-23 at PNC Park the last 4 seasons. including an 11-game losing streak spanning 2018-2019 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season...are 22-10 vs Pit over the last 3 seasons, including 14-6 at Great American Ball Park...including 3 series wins and 2 series sweeps last year, the Reds have won 19 of the last 26 games vs the Pirates, including 16 of the last 18 games vs Pit at GABP...4 times in 2021 the Reds beat the Pirates by 10 runs, a club record vs any opponent in a season...the 1945 Pirates club was the National League's last team to beat an opponent 4 times in a season by at least 10 runs (Brooklyn).

- The Reds' minor league **Players of the Month for April** are Class A Dayton **LHP Andrew Abbott** (4g, 3gs, 3-0, 0.86, 21ip, 13h, 7bb, 35k) and Class AA Chattanooga **OF T.J. Hopkins** (22g, .259, 62b, 6hr, 22rbi, 5sb, .917ops)... Abbott was selected in the second round (53rd overall) of last summer's draft...Hopkins was selected in the ninth round of the 2019 draft.

- Per @EliasSports, the Reds have played the toughest schedule in the Major Leagues...in games already played, their opponents have posted a winning percentage of .575...the winning percentage for the teams remaining on the Reds' schedule is **.510**, 11th-highest.
- Since a 2-2 series split at Atl to open the season the Reds are 4-22, including an 11-game losing streak (4/12-4/23) and a 9-game losing streak snapped by the 9-2 win vs Pit in the opener of Sat's doubleheader
- The Reds are 1-7-1 in 9 series this season (1-3 home, 0-4-1 road), their only series win vs Pit from 5/7-5/8 (2-1)...have been swept 6 times.
- is 57 (2003).
- The Reds' current injured list includes 13 players...began the season with 8 players on the injured list, their highest total to begin a season since they began the 2014 campaign with 8 players on the disabled list...since 2022 Opening Day have made 14 more additions to the injured list - including Jonathan India, Tyler Naquin, Nick Senzel & Mike Moustakas twice each - for a season total of 22 IL stints.
- The Reds' 11.5-game deficit on May 1 was their largest ever on that date
- The Reds began the season 0-4 at Great American Ball Park, their first 0-4 home start since the 1955 club began 0-4 at Crosley Field.
 Over 11 games and 99 innings from 4/12-4/23 the Reds
- failed to hold a lead through the end of a full inning, including a 6-game, 54-inning stretch from 4/12-4/17 in which they never led at any point.

 $\underline{YOUNG\,GUNS}: The\,Reds'\,Opening\,Day\,roster \\ included\,3\,pitchers$ with 0.000 days of service time (relievers RHP Alexis Diaz & RHP Daniel Duarte, starter RHP Hunter Greene) and 9 pitchers with less than 1.000 year of service time...a fourth pitcher with no service time, LHP Nick Lodolo, replaced Duarte when Lodolo was promoted to start on 4/12 vs Cle...in LHP Reiver Sanmartin (Game 2, 3rd Major League start), Greene (Game 4, ML debut) and Lodolo (Game 6. ML debut), the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the first 6 games of a season for only the second time in their history (1902).

- Was 1 of 9 pitchers on the Reds' 2022 Opening Day roster with less than 1.000 year of service time...started the Reds' third game of the season.
- Since 1893, when the pitcher's mound was moved to its current distance from the plate, is 1 of only 3 Reds pitchers to lose each of his first 5 apps, all starts (Joey Jay, 1963 & Frank Dwyer, 1899)...no Reds pitcher ever has lost each of his first 6 apps, all starts...courtesy @EliasSports.
- His career ERA in the first inning is 8.00 (27ip, 24er) and after the first inning is 4.74 (108.1ip, 57er).
- In 2021 was recognized by the Baseball Writers' Association of America with a third-place vote for the Jackie Robinson Award as the National League's Rookie of the Year, won by teammate 2B Jonathan India. Also in 2021 received the Latino MVP National League Rookie Award from Latino Sports, an organization
- founded 32 years ago to recognize each season's best Latino players in Major League Baseball.
- In 2021, wasn't promoted until 5/28 but still ranked among the National League's rookie leaders in wins (T1st w/ Atl's Ian Anderson), ERA (6th), strikeouts (6th), starts (4th), inning pitched (5th), opponents' batting average (5th, .263) and WHIP (7th, 1.41).
- In his first 16 starts through 8/22 went 9-4, 3.68 with all 11 of his quality starts and 11 starts of at least 6.0 innings.
- In his last 6 starts beginning 8/28 went 0-2, 9.43 without pitching into the sixth inning.
- Received votes for National League Rookie of the Month for August (6gs, 4-2, 2.80)...Cubs 1B Frank Schwindel (26g, .344, 6hr, 18rbi) won the August award.

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow at Pit's PNC Park will make his third appearance and start of the season...will be his 12th Major League appearance and sixth career start, his second straight and second career appearance and start vs the Pirates.
- Joined the Reds in Denver on 4/29, when he was named to the Taxi Squad...the next day was promoted from Class AAA Louisville to the 28-man active roster to start that night's game at Coors Field...left that 4-3 loss with a 2-0 lead and was the victim of a blown save.
- Was a non-roster invitee to 2022 early minor league spring training camp and post-lockout Major League camp...in 3 exhibition "A" game relief apps for the Reds posted a 5.40 ERA (5ip, 5h, 3er, 2bb, 3k).
- On 3/28 was reassigned to minor league camp...began the season at Louisville, where in 2 starts and 2 relief apps he went 2-1, 2.84 (19ip, 16h, 2bb, 22k, 2hr, 222baa).
- On 11/26/21 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2022 Major League spring training camp.
- In 2021, in his Major League debut made 3 starts and 6 relief apps for the Blue Jays and Pirates.
- During the 2021 season, didn't allow a run in 6 relief apps (8.2ip, 4h, 2bb, 6k, .143baa)...posted an ERA of 10.80 in his 3 starts (6.2ip, 10h, 8er, 3bb, 9k, 2hr, .357baa).
- Didn't allow a run in his first 7 Major League apps (11.2ip, 6h, 3bb, 9k, .154baa).

* Career highs, (bs) Victim of blown save

- While pitching for the Pirates in 2021 made 2 apps vs the Reds, both at Great American Ball Park...pitched in relief in a 9-5 loss on 9/20 (1ip, 1k) and started the 13-1 loss on 9/27 (1ip, 6h, 4er, 0bb, 2k, Joey Votto 2-run HR).
- Pitched in 2 seasons in the independent leagues, for the American Association's Sioux City Explorers in 2016 and in the Atlantic League for the Lancaster Barnstormers in 2019.
- Spent most of the 2016 season pitching for Sioux City but did make 1 appearance, on 8/13, for the Giants' Class A San Jose affiliate...didn't pitch again the rest of that season because of a right elbow injury.
- Missed the entire 2017 season following "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.
- Played shortstop and pitched at Atlee High School in Mechanicsville, VA...played 3 seasons at Old Dominion University...missed out on a fourth collegiate season because of a right shoulder injury...his father, Dee, was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 1982 secondary draft.
