SATURDAY IN THE PARK: The Detroit Tigers and Chicago White Sox today continue their three-game set at Rate Field after the Tigers took a 4-3, walk-off defeat last night in 10 innings ... Detroit has now lost 11 of its last 13 games, 14 of its last 17 games and 19 of its last 23 games starting May 4 ... the Tigers are now 6-20 (.231) in games decided by two runs or less, last in baseball.

- The Tigers have lost their last seven series and nine of their last 10 series overall dating to April 24 after going 5-2-1 in their first eight series to begin the season ... the Tigers had not lost seven or more series in a row since August 13-September 12, 2019 (nine in a row).
- Through their first 26 games, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in their last 32 games since, the Tigers have gone 8-24 to drop their record to 22-36 and alone in last place in the A.L. Central ... Detroit's 8-24 (.250) record in the last 36 days starting April 24 is the lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

WALK-OFF WONDERS: Following last night's setback, the Tigers have now endured a walk-off loss in each of their last seven series (road, of course), one of only two teams in baseball to experience this happening in the last 65 years since the expansion era began in 1961 ... the only other team to be walked-off in seven-straight series in this span?: the 1992 Chicago White Sox ... thanks to Elias.

RIGHTY TIGHTY LEFTY LOOSY: The Tigers began the season by facing 16 consecutive right-handed starting pitchers ... today they will face their 20th southpaw starter in their last 43 games ... Detroit has seen more left-handed starting pitchers than any other team in baseball since this 43-game stretch began on April 14 ... the Orioles are next closest having seen 19 southpaw starters.

- The Tigers are 6-13 (.316) vs. left-handed pitching this season, tied for the fourth-lowest winning percentage vs. southpaw starters in the majors this season ... last year, the Tigers went 25-17 (.595) vs. left-handed starters, the fourth-highest winning percentage in baseball.
- Last season, Tigers right-handed hitters led the majors with a team .280 batting average and an .835 OPS vs. left-handed pitching ... this year, Tigers right-handed hitters have a .198 batting average, second-to-last in baseball, and a .665 OPS, 10th-to-last in baseball, vs. lefties.

WHEN LEFT IS RIGHT: Riley Greene ranks third among all left-handed hitters with a .431 on-base percentage against left-handed pitching, trailing Arizona's Corbin Carroll (.481) and Boston's Willyer Abreu (.441) for the best such mark in the majors ... Greene's .293 batting average vs. left-handed pitching ranks fifth in the A.L. among left-handed hitters while his .862 OPS ranks sixth in the A.L.

- Last year, Greene batted .218 (39-for-179) with a .290 on-base percentage and a .620 OPS vs. left-handed pitching ... right now, year-over-year, Greene has experienced a 75-point improvement in batting average, a 151-point improvement in on-base percentage and a 242-point improvement in OPS vs. southpaws.

THIS IS ON THE RECORD: At 22-36, the Tigers have reached 14 games below .500 for the first time this season and for the first time since waking up on September 1, 2023 with a 60-74 record ... the Tigers are in last place in the A.L. Central, 11.5 games behind the Guardians, which is Detroit's largest deficit in the division since waking up on August 23, 2024 the same 11.5 games out.

- Yesterday the Tigers had their 20th loss of the year in a game in which they were leading at one point, the most such setbacks in baseball this season and more than halfway to their full-season 2025 total ... the Tigers were middle-of-the-pack with 35 losses after leading in 2025.
- The Tigers have taken an outsized 12 losses after leading in their last 17 games starting May 12 ... the Giants (seven, just more than half) and Royals (five, less than half) are the next closest teams in baseball when it comes to losses in games they were leading in this 18-day span.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle has a 3.2 bWAR through his first 56 major league games, tied with Cody Bellinger for the third-best mark in all of baseball this season, trailing only Andy Pages (3.6) and Bobby Witt Jr (3.3) ... the next closest A.L. rookie is Chicago's Munetaka Murakami, a considerable distance behind Kevin at a 1.9 bWAR ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

TO OUR DISMAY: The Tigers have posted a .207 (176-for-852) team batting average and .605 team OPS in May, the lowest OPS and second-lowest team average this month in the majors.

- The Tigers are in danger of posting their lowest team batting average in any calendar month since batting .199 in April of 2021 and are in danger of posting their lowest team OPS in any calendar month since turning in a .602 OPS in May of 2022.
- The Tigers are 6-20 in May, the lowest winning percentage (.231) in the majors this month ... the club is in danger of its weakest month of May in 30 years (4-23, .148, 1996).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers have lost 20 games in a row when allowing four or more runs, only their fifth-such streak in the last 30 years ... the Tigers had a similar run just recently when they lost 22-games in a row from August 24, 2025-March 31, 2026 ... they also tallied a 22-game skid in 2022, a 20-game skid in 2019 and a 22-game skid in 1996 ... thanks to Elias.

- Enters play today with a 2-3 record and a 4.28 ERA in 11 starts with Detroit...seven of his 11 starts have been quality starts, but has allowed 21 earned runs over 17.1 innings in his other four.
- Allowed seven earned runs on nine hits including three home runs last time out against Boston...pitched 3.0+ innings and got ejected in the fourth after allowing back-to-back solo home runs.
- Tied his career high allowing eight earned runs including six in the first inning on April 8 against Minnesota...had previously surrendered eight earned runs twice, both with the Astros while facing the Angels.
- Spun six scoreless innings in his home debut and Detroit's home opener on Friday, April 3 against St. Louis.
- Made his Tigers debut on Friday, March 27 against San Diego...allowed one earned run on seven hits and a walk while striking out five over 6.0 innings.
- Signed with the Detroit Tigers as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...went 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA in four Spring Training starts for the Tigers.
- In 2025, led the Astros in wins (13) and innings (192)...marked the 3rd-highest win total of his career behind his 17 wins in 2022 and 15 wins in 2024...also led the team in starts alongside RHP Hunter Brown (31).
- Among AL pitchers on the 2025 season, finished 2nd in GB% (59.2), 2nd in opponent GIDP (22), 2nd in GIDP/9 (1.03), 5th in Pitching WAR (4.3), T-5th in quality starts (20), 6th in innings pitched (192.0), T-6th in wins, and 10th in opponent OPS (.667).
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeouts in his start on July 28, 2025, vs. WSH, finishing the season with 1,053...surpassed 1,000 career innings during his start on July 5 at LAD last season.

- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Began the season on the 60-day injured list with a left adductor strain...rehabbed with Lakeland and Toledo in May, allowing four earned runs on six hits including two home runs while walking three and striking out five over 5.2 innings with Toledo.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2025...pitched in 22 games (one start) to a 1-3 record and a 6.55 ERA.
- Pitched in 46 games (12 starts) for the Tigers in 2024, finishing with a 4-5 record, 3.59 ERA (27ER/67.2IP) and 69 strikeouts...set career-best marks in strikeouts, wins, holds (6), opponent batting average (.224), slugging percentage (.354) and OPS (.664).
- Started on Sept. 13 and 14 vs. Baltimore in 2024, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to start back-to-back team games, which were on consecutive days, since George Uhle on Aug. 4-5, 1929.
- Made his postseason debut on Oct. 1, 2024, at Houston, walking one in a scoreless two-thirds of an inning to pick up the save...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher in franchise history to record a save in his first career playoff game.
- Started his postseason career with 5.1 no-hit innings with two walks and six strikeouts in his first four outings.

- Ripped a two-run single into center field to give Detroit a 4-1 lead in their victory Sunday night.
- 50 games into his big league career entering play on May 23, McGonigle led all major league rookies with 53 hits, 12 doubles, a .285 batting average and a .393 on-base percentage...he had 31 walks compared to only 29 strikeouts, one of only five big leaguers, rookie or non-rookie, with more walks than strikeouts (minimum 31 walks) this season.
- Since the year 1990, McGonigle is one of only four players with at least 53 hits and 31 walks in his first 50 major league games, joining Juan Soto (Nationals, 2018), Logan Morrison (Marlins, 2010) and Kosuke Fukudome (Cubs, 2008)...he is the first in Tigers history to accomplish the feat.
- Only three Tigers in the history of the franchise have 53 or more hits in their first 50 major league games at 21-years-old or younger: Kevin McGonigle (53 hits in 2026), Travis Fryman (60 hits in 1990) and Lou Whitaker (53 hits in 1977-78).
- Named the American League Rookie of the Month for March/April on May 4, becoming the seventh-ever Tiger to win the award and first since Colt Keith in July of 2024...is the second Tiger to ever win it in the first month of the season, joining Austin Jackson who did so in April of 2010.
- Reached base safely in 27 consecutive starts spanning exactly one month, from March 30-April 30...he is the first Tigers rookie to do so since outfielder Dick Wakefield reached in 29 straight starts back in 1943 (thanks to Elias)...the last 21-year-old or younger Tiger prior to reach base safely in 27-or-more starts in a row was Al Kaline, who reached in 34-straight starts nearly 70 years ago from July 26-Aug. 28, 1956.
- Is the first 21-year-old or younger Tiger with nine doubles in any calendar month in 110 years when 21-year-old Harry Heilmann also had nine doubles in April 1916.
- Just the fifth player in major league history with 30 or more hits, 10 or more doubles and less than 15 strikeouts in his first 25 big league games at 21-years-old or younger, and the first such player in 90 years when Cleveland's Roy Weatherly and New York's Joe DiMaggio each did so at 21-years-old in 1936.
- Clubbed his first major league home run on Sunday, April 12, against Sandy Alcantara and the Miami Marlins.
- Became the first Tiger to record six doubles in his first 15 major league games in 16 years since Brennan Boesch did exactly that in 2010.
- Became the first player in Tigers franchise history to notch a multi-RBI game in each of his first two major league games when he laced his tiebreaking, game-winning two-run eighth-inning single into right field in game two for Detroit.
- First Tiger with a go-ahead or game-winning RBI in the eighth inning or later within his first two major league games since Omar Infante was credited with an eighth-inning game-winning RBI on Sept. 7, 2002, in his big league debut at Yankee Stadium (Elias).
- Ripped the first pitch he ever saw in the big leagues into right field for a two-run double, instantly becoming only the sixth Tiger since the RBI became a stat in 1920 to record two RBI in his major league debut, the first since Isaac Paredes on Aug. 17, 2020...is the second of the six to accomplish this feat on Opening Day, joining Paredes, JaCoby Jones (Aug. 30, 2016), Rob Richie (Aug. 19, 1989), Jake Wood (Opening Day April 11, 1961), Hank Riebe (Aug. 26, 1942) and Sammy Hale (April 20, 1920) in turning this trick.
- Became the first Tiger ever with two doubles in his major league debut on Opening Day and the second in the history of the franchise with two doubles in his major league debut on any day, joining Hank Riebe on Aug. 26, 1942.
- McGonigle is the second player in franchise history to collect four hits in his major league debut, joining Billy Bean (April 25, 1987).
- At 21 years, 220 days old on Opening Day, he became the second-youngest player in the history of the Tigers franchise to make his major league debut in the starting lineup on Opening Day and the youngest in 112 years since starting first baseman George Burns made his major league debut on Opening Day April 14, 1914...thanks to Elias.
- Named to the Opening Day roster at 21 years old, marking the youngest Tigers player to do so since Omar Infante in 2003.
- Is a career .308 (208-for-676) hitter in three minor league seasons, collected 51 doubles, six triples, 25 home runs and 130 RBI over that span...also drew 123 walks compared to just 84 strikeouts, good for an OBP of .410.

- Hit two sacrifice flies on May 26 against Los Angeles-AL, plating each of the Tigers first two runs...he became the first Tiger to record two sacrifice flies in a game since Gio Urshela on July 22, 2024, at Cleveland; the first Tiger to record two sacrifice flies in a home game in more than 12 years since Austin Jackson did so on April 17, 2014, vs. Cleveland; and the first Tigers left-handed hitter to do so at home in more than 14 years since Prince Fielder on May 16, 2012, vs. Minnesota.
- Placed on the 10-day injured list on April 17 (retro April 16) with left hip/abdominal inflammation...sent on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Toledo on May 2 and activated by Detroit on May 5.
- Had a career year with the Tigers last season, playing in 144 games, batting .259/.333/.438 with 23 doubles, 11 triples, 12 home runs and 49 RBI.
- Earned his first career Silver Slugger Award, becoming the first Tiger in franchise history to win the award as a utility player.
- Named an All-Star reserve on July 9 for the first time in his career...became the fifth Tigers player to be on the 2025 All-Star team.
- Led the Tigers in triples and tied for fourth-best in all of major league baseball...notched his 11th triple of the season on Sept. 1, good for the most triples in a single-season by a Tigers left-handed hitter since Curtis Granderson had 13 triples in 2008.
- Became just the seventh Tigers player in franchise history with at least nine triples, 11 home runs, and 19 stolen bases in a single season, and the first since Curtis Granderson in 2007.
