**THE TWINS:** Have gone 1-3 through four games on their six-game roadtrip, going 1-2 in Cleveland over the weekend, followed by a loss in Detroit last night...tonight, they will continue the trip with the second of three at Comerica Park against the Tigers...they will complete the series tomorrow afternoon then travel home for an off-day on Thursday, followed by a short three-game homestand/series vs. Kansas City over the weekend.

**ADAMS STRONG BUT TIGERS TAKE TWINS:** The Twins lost to the Tigers last night at Comerica Park by a score of 6-3, dropping their third-straight to the Tigers...Travis Adams was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with no walks and a career-high seven strikeouts...Adams struck out five-straight over the first and second inning, the second pitcher in club history to K five-in-a-row in their first start, the other being Mike Irombley in 1992 also at Detroit...Noah Davis (0-2) was issued the loss, allowing three runs on five hits in 1.0 inning...the offense recorded six hits, three being home runs...the homers were hit by Ryan Jeffers (8), Trevor Larnach (14) and Matt Wallner (15).

**MINNY AND THE MOTOR CITY:** The Twins and Tigers are playing the eighth of 13 games this season...Twins are 2-5 against the Tigers this season, going 1-2 at Target Field and 1-3 at Comerica Park...they will wrap the season-series with four games at Target Field August 14-17.  
✦ Twins lead baseball in home runs vs. Detroit since the start of 2019, hitting 141, 30 ahead of Cleveland (111)...65 of those have come at Comerica Park...they have homered 25 times in their last 18 games at Comerica and 16 times in their last 10 here.  
✦ Christian Vázquez is hitting .302 (42-for-139) with nine doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI in 42 career games vs. the Tigers.  
✦ Royce Lewis is hitting .356 (16-for-45) with three doubles, two home runs, six walks, nine RBI and a .987 OPS in 14 career games vs. the Tigers...he has reached base safely in all 14 career games vs. the Tigers...at Comerica Park, he is hitting .360 (9-for-25) with two home runs and a 1.047 OPS in seven career games.  
✦ Brooks Lee is hitting .294 (10-for-34) with two doubles and seven RBI in 10 career games vs. the Tigers.

**TWINS MAKE ROSTER MOVES:** Twins have made the following roster moves:  
✦ The Twins have returned infielder Luke Keaschall from his rehab assignment and reinstated him from the 60-day Injured List...Keaschall, who missed the club's last 86 games with a right forearm fracture, recently played in 14 games on rehab assignment for Triple-A St. Paul, hitting .265 (13-for-49) with one double, one triple, four RBI and eight walks...Keaschall sustained the injury on April 25 vs. Los Angeles-AL after being hit by a pitch from Angels starter Kyle Hendricks...prior to sustaining the injury, he played in seven games for the Twins, hitting .368 (7-for-19) with three doubles, two RBI, five walks, four runs scored, five stolen bases, a .538 on-base percentage and a 1.065 OPS...the rookie made his major league debut on April 18 at Atlanta, going 2-for-4 with one double, one stolen base and one RBI.  
✦ The Twins have activated right-handed pitcher Thomas Hatch, who was claimed off waivers from the Kansas City Royals yesterday.  
✦ To make room for Keaschall and Hatch on the 26-man roster, the Twins have optioned outfielder DaShawn Keirsej Jr. and right-handed pitcher Noah Davis to St. Paul...Keirsej Jr. went 2-for-18 with one home run, two RBI, one walk, three stolen bases and four runs scored in 22 games for the Twins in his latest major league stint, from June 15-August 3...Davis was recalled on July 30 and made two relief appearances, allowing five runs on six hits (2 HR), with one walk and four strikeouts in 3.0 innings.  
✦ Twins have also claimed right-handed pitcher Brooks Kriske off waivers from the Chicago Cubs...Kriske, who was designated for release or assignment on Saturday, appeared in four games for the Cubs this season, pitching 6.0 scoreless innings of relief, allowing two hits, five walks and four strikeouts...the 31-year-old has pitched in parts of four major league seasons with the Yankees (2020-21), Orioles (2021), Royals (2023) and Cubs (2025), going 2-1 with an 8.78 ERA (27.2 IP, 27 ER), 22 walks and 29 strikeouts.  
✦ To make room for Kriske on the 40-man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Darren McCaughan for release or assignment...McCaughan had his contract selected from Triple-A St. Paul yesterday and did not appear in last night's game for Minnesota...Kriske will be active for tomorrow afternoon's game against the Tigers in Detroit.  
✦ The roster for tonight's game will be 25.

**AMERICA'S NEXT TOP JEFF:** Ryan Jeffers has hit safely in seven-straight (1 hit in each), one short of his season-high of eight (done twice: April 26-May 6 and July 5-21)...over his last 19 games, Jeffers is hitting .343 (23-for-67) with four doubles, two home runs, six RBI, three walks, a .380 on-base percentage, a .493 slugging percentage and an .873 OPS...in those 19, he has reached safely in 16.

**TO THE WINDOW TO THE WALLNER:** Over his last 15 games, Wallner has reached base safely in 13 games, posting a .421 on-base percentage (12 hits, 11 walks), a .682 slugging percentage and a 1.103 OPS in that span.  
✦ Last night's home run marked Wallner's 15th of the season, setting a new single-season career-high, passing his previous high of 14, done in 2023...he now has four home runs in his last eight games and seven in his last 21.

**SERIES STUFF:** The Twins need a win today and tomorrow to earn their 15th series victory this season and their first since taking two of three from Pittsburgh at Target Field from July 11-13, leading into the All-Star break...Minnesota is 14-20-2 in series play, going 9-7-2 at home and 5-13-0 on the road.  
✦ Minnesota has lost each of their last two series vs. the Tigers — both this season...their last series win against Detroit came July 26-28, 2024, taking two of three at Comerica Park.

**HEART & HUSTLE:** The Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association (MLBPAA) today announced the 30 preliminary winners of the 2025 Heart and Hustle Award...this esteemed award honors active players who demonstrate a passion for the game of baseball and best embody the values, spirit and traditions of the game...the Heart and Hustle Award is also the only award in Major League Baseball that is voted on by former players...the Twins winner/nominee is Byron Buxton for the third time in his career (2017 and 2019)...the 2025 All-Star and clubhouse leader has played in 85 games this season, slashing .282/.343/.561 (.905 OPS) with 23 home runs, 59 RBI, 68 runs scored and 17 stolen bases (0 caught stealing)...he is currently on the 10-day IL with left ribcage inflammation but is with the club in Detroit.

**BEWARE OF WALKERS:** Double-A Wichita outfielder Walker Jenkins yesterday afternoon was named Texas League Player of the Week...in six games for the Wind Surge, Jenkins hit .500 (12-for-24) with two doubles, three home runs, five RBI, eight runs scored, four walks, two stolen bases, a .552 on-base percentage, a .958 slugging percentage and a 1.510 OPS...Jenkins is ranked by MLB.com as the club's top prospects as well as the 12th-best in all of baseball...among outfielders, in that same group, he ranks as the second-best outfield prospect in baseball, behind only Detroit's Max Clark (10th)...Jenkins, 20, was selected by the Twins fifth overall in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of South Brunswick High School in Southport, North Carolina.
