METS NOTES



Mets: Have won five consecutive games, their longest streak since August 17-22, 2019 (also five games)...Are a season-high-tying three games above .500 (were 7-4 on April 18)...Earned their second series sweep of the year...Improved to 14-2 when scoring four or more and 30-31 all-time on Mother's Day.

- Have won 10 consecutive games vs. the D-backs at Citi Field...It's the ninth time in franchise history the Mets have had a winning streak of 10 games or longer at home against one opponent.

Pitching at Home: New York is 9-4 at Citi Field this season...Mets hurlers have combined for a 1.88 ERA (24 ER/115.0 IP) at home...New York has allowed three runs or fewer in 11 of its 13 home games this season.

Bullpen: Mets relievers threw 4.0 innings and allowed one earned run tonight, lowering their season ERA to 3.04 (33 ER/97.2 IP)...The bullpen has a 1.71 ERA (12 ER/63.0 IP) since April 22.

Jacob deGrom (5.0 IP, H, ER, 3 BB, 6 K): Earned his third win...Left the game before the top of the sixth inning for precautionary reasons with right side tightness...Did not allow a baserunner until the fifth inning, when he walked three batters and allowed a double...It was only the second time in his career he's walked three batters in one frame (also, May 13, 2018 at Philadelphia)...He had not allowed more than two walks in a single start since September 3, 2019.

- Has thrown at least 5.0 innings and allowed no more than five baserunners in each of his six starts...That is the longest season-opening streak in MLB history...Has a 0.60 WHIP through six starts, the lowest ever among pitchers who had at least 40.0 IP in their first six games of the season.
- Has 65 strikeouts through six starts, tied for the fifth-most ever...Only Nolan Ryan (71, 1978), Shane Bieber (68, 2021) and Pedro Martinez (67, 2000 & 66, 2001) have had more through six starts.

Edwin Díaz (1.2 IP, H, 3 K): Induced a double play in the eighth and fanned three in the ninth to pick up a five-out save, tied for the longest of his career (also, August 26, 2016 at Chicago-AL)...It was his first save of more than 1.0 inning for New York and the sixth time he has been used for more than 1.0 inning in his Mets career.

Francisco Lindor (1-3, RBI, R): Drove in the Mets' first run with a sac fly in the third...Added an infield single to extend his hitting streak to four games...Has also scored a run in four consecutive games.

Dominic Smith (1-3, RBI, HBP): Had an RBI single in the seventh inning...Is 3 for his last 6 with runners in scoring position.

Michael Conforto (2-4, RBI): Drove in a run with an RBI single in the third...Has a .450 OBP in nine games this month.

Miguel Castro (1.0 IP, BB): Entered the game after Jacob deGrom left with right side tightness...Threw his third consecutive scoreless inning...Has allowed two earned runs in his last nine games (8.1 IP).

Patrick Mazeika (0-0, RBI, BB): Drew a pinch-hit, bases-loaded walk in the sixth...Has two pinch-hit RBI, most on the team, and zero hits in his career.

- The Mets have seven bases-loaded walks this season, tied for second in the majors.

Jacob Barnes (1.1 IP, 2 H, ER, 2 K): Struck out Pavin Smith to finish a 16-pitch at-bat, the longest plate appearance in the majors this season.



D-BACKS NOTES



D-backs: Have lost six consecutive games (longest streak since dropping eight in a row from August 19-26, 2020)...Were swept for the third time this year...Fell to 9-14 on the road.

Josh Rojas (1-3, 2B, BB): Extended his hitting streak to nine games (.441, 15-34).

Riley Smith (4.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, BB, K): Made his fourth career start.

Asdrúbal Cabrera (1-1, HR, RBI, R): Led off the eighth inning with a home run, his third of the year...Has a .954 OPS in 12 games as a visitor at Citi Field since the Mets traded him away in 2018.
