METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Padres, 6-1, yesterday to earn a series win...The Mets have won three of their last four games...New York is in a stretch of 16 games in 17 days (4-9)...The Mets are in the midst of their final homestand of the regular season, a 10-day, nine-game (3-3) stand against the Rangers (1-2), Padres (2-1) and Nationals (three games)...The Mets are off on Monday before the start of their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Chicago (three games) and Miami (three games).

FOUR SCORE....: Pete Alonso has homered in four straight games...it is the third time he has done so in his career (last: 5/16-19/23)...During the regular season, the Mets have had only one play homer in five straight games - Richard Hidalgo (July 1-5, 2004)...Daniel Murphy homered in six straight Postseason games from October 10-21, 2015.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: Through 16 games in September, Pete Alonso is slashing .286/.329/.619 (18-63) with three doubles, six home runs, 11 RBI and seven runs...His 121 RBI are the second-most in the majors and are the fourth-most in a single season in Mets history...Since he joined the league in 2019, Alonso has hit 263 home runs, the third-most in that span behind Aaron Judge (280) and Kyle Schwarber (265).

DIRTY 30S: The Mets feature two players with 30 + homers - Pete Alonso and Juan Soto...They are one of six teams with two players who have socked 30 or more homers this season...The Mets have never featured three players with 30+ homers each...Francisco Lindor is three homers away from 30 this season...Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 are the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 30/30 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB).

40/40 CLUB: The Mets have never featured a team with two 40+ homer players...The last team to feature two players with 40+ homers was the 2024 Yankees (Aaron Judge and Juan Soto).

THIS IS GETTING SILLY: Juan Soto is the third player in MLB history to record 100 or more runs, walks and RBI, 40+ Homers and 40 + steals in a single season...He joins Jeff Bagwell (1997 and 1999) and Barry Bonds (1996 and 1997) as the only players to accomplish that feat.

LOVELY LINDOR: Francisco Lindor is on a seven-game hitting streak... Over that span he is batting .308 (8-26)...It is the fifth time this season he's had a streak as long (last: 12 games 8/12-24/25)...Yesterday, he recorded his 1000th career run scored in the third inning...He joins Mookie Betts and Freddie Freeman as the only players to score 1000 or more runs since 2015.

DEBUT NOTES: Allowed three runs over 6.0 innings, allowed three hits, issued four walks and struck out seven in his Major League debut on September 7 vs. Cincinnati...Sproat joined Matt Harvey (11), Collin McHugh (9), Bill Denehy (8), Nolan McLean (8), Tom Seaver (8), Kodai Senga (8), Brent Strom, Randy Tate, Zack Wheeler and Masato Yoshii as the only pitchers in franchise history to record seven or more strikeouts in their Major League debut...Additionally, Sproat joined McHugh, Yoshii, Strom, Denehy Dillon Gee, Brian Bannister and Jason Isringhausen as the only pitchers in franchise history to record a quality start and allow three or fewer hits in their Major League debut...The right-hander did not allow a hit through his first 5.1 innings of work.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Brandon Sproat became the eighth Met (seventh pitcher) to make their debut this season, joining Hayden Senger, Justin Hagenman, Blade Tidwell, Jonathan Pintaro, Alex Carrillo, Nolan McLean and Jonah Tong...The Mets have had four different pitchers make their debut this season as a starter (also: Tidwell, McLean and Tong) which is the most in a single season in franchise history and the most by a team this season...The previous most was when the Mets had three players make their debut as a starter in 1967, 1982 and 2006...He became the 45th pitcher to make an appearance for the club, tying a Major League record (also: 2024 Miami Marlins)...With McLean and Tong, it was the first time in franchise history the Mets have had three pitchers debut as a starter in a 21-game span...The last team to do so were the 2023 Cleveland Guardians (Peyton Battenfield, Logan Allen and Tanner Bibee)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

SMETS: Spent the entire season with the Syracuse Mets, combining to go 8-6 with a 4.24 ERA (57 ER/121.0 IP), 53 walks and 113 strikeouts over 26 games (25 starts)...Made his last start with the team on August 30 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and earned the win after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3 H, 2 BB, 9 K)...His nine strikeouts tied a season high (also: July 19 and July 31) and it was the second time this season he has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (also: July 10)...Among qualified Triple-A pitchers this season, was first in opponents' BA (.218), tied for third in games started, fourth in WHIP (1.24), and eighth in ERA...In 11 appearances (10 starts) since June 28 (G1), he has gone 5-1 with a 2.44 ERA (16 ER/59.0 IP), 21 walks and 70 strikeouts...Over that span, his .163 opponents' BA is the best in Triple-A, his strikeouts and WHIP (0.93) are both second, and his 2.44 ERA (in 11 appearances) is the fourth-best...In 10 starts in that span, he posted a 1.79 ERA (11 ER/55.1 IP)...Sproat has pitched at least 5.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer in nine of those starts...He was named the International League Pitcher of the Year for the month of July after going 2-0 with a 0.67 ERA (2 ER/27.0 IP), eight walks and 33 strikeouts...He pitched 5.0 innings in all five July starts, completing seven innings in one of those outings.

RIISING THROUGH THE RANKS: Sproat is currently the Mets' No. 5 prospect and the No. 3 pitching prospect behind teammates Nolan McLean and Jonah Tong...He was the No. 13 Mets prospect in 2024, starting the season with High-A Brooklyn...He made five appearances (four starts) with the Cyclones before being promoted to Double-A Binghamton on May 13, 2024...Sproat made 11 appearances with the Rumble Ponies and was then promoted again to Triple-A Syracuse on August 5...In his first professional season, combined across High-A, Double-A and Triple-A to go 7-4 with a 3.40 ERA (44 ER/116.1 IP), 42 walks and 131 strikeouts in 24 appearances (23 starts)...After the season, he was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year and a Postseason All-Star...He was also named to the 2024 MLB All-Star Futures Game roster.

DRAFT DAY x3: Was originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the seventh round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Pace High School in Pace, Florida but did not sign...Was then drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...Forwent signing with the Mets to play in his senior year at UF where he pitched in the 2023 NCAA Men's College World Series Finals...Was drafted again by the Mets in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...Sproat has since spent parts of two seasons (2024-25) in the Mets organization, combining to go 15-10 with a 3.83 ERA (101 ER/237.1 IP), 95 walks and 244 strikeouts.

- Was recalled on September 18 for his fourth stint with the team this season...This season he has gone 5-2 with two saves, 12 holds and a 3.67 ERA (23 ER/56.1 IP) through 47 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .231 average (46-199)...Right-handed hitters have batted .203 (24-118) against him compared to a .272 average against left-handers (22-81)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .170 average (17-100)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth best in franchise history through as many games.
- In his last time out he threw 3.1 scoreless innings in relief on September 12 vs. Texas...Marked the second-longest scoreless outing of his career (longest: 3.2 IP, 6/8/24 MIA vs. CLE) and his longest appearance of the season...Has not allowed a run in nine outings (1 start) of 2.0 or more innings this season
- Has posted a 3-1 record with six holds and a 2.93 ERA (9 ER/27.2 IP) at Citi Field this season.
- Allowed one run over 1.0 inning and earned a hold on August 26 vs. Philadelphia (1.0 IP, 3 H, ER)...Has allowed at least three hits in two of his last four outings in the majors after only allowing three or more hits in three of his first 43 appearances.
- In 10 games with Syracuse he posted a 5.93 ERA (9 ER/13.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts...Seven of his 10 appearances were scoreless.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA)...Five of his last six appearances have been scoreless dating back to July 8.
- 14 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...13 of those appearances have been scoreless...Has posted 11 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the 11th-most such outings among Major League relievers.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on September 18 for his sixth stint with the team this season...This season he has appeared in 12 games for the Mets (one start), has earned two holds and has a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP).
- His last appearance for the Mets came August 30 against Miami (3.0 IP, BB, 3 K)...Was his ninth career relief appearance of 3.0 or more scoreless innings and his first since April 5, 2017.
- Has appeared in 35 games (one start) for Triple-A Syracuse and he has a 3.35 ERA (14 ER/37.2 IP) with 32 strikeouts in those appearances...Is holding batters to a .273 batting average (39-143) in Triple-A this season.
- Made his eighth career start on July 6 vs. New York-AL and his first since August 13 (G2), 2019 at Chicago-AL while with the Astros...He tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and allowed one hit while striking out two.
- On June 22 at Philadelphia, tossed a hitless inning of relief (K)...Was his first time pitching on consecutive days since June 20-21, 2024 with Tampa...Tossed a perfect ninth inning on June 21 at Philadelphia...Made his first appearance vs. the Phillies and has now faced all

- 30 Major League teams at least once in his career.
- He made his Mets debut on April 30 vs. Arizona, allowing two earned runs over 2.0 innings in relief (2 H, BB, 2 K)...Was his longest Major League appearance since June 21, 2024 at Pittsburgh with Tampa Bay (also: 2.0 IP).
 - In his Major League career, has held left-handed batters to a .209 average (157-751) compared to a .244 average (194-795) against right-handed hitters.
 - Over parts of 10 seasons with the Houston Astros (2016-20), Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22), Philadelphia Phillies (2022), Los Angeles Angels (2023), Tampa Bay Rays (2023-24) and the Mets (2025), has combined to go 27-22 with a 3.92 ERA (181 ER/415.2 IP), 116 walks and 427 strikeouts in 315 games (eight starts)...Was originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 25th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of California State Fullerton...Was signed by the Mets as a minor league free agent on October 31, 2024.
 - Was an All-Star and World Series Champion in 2017 with the Astros.
