PITTSBURGH PIRATES (16-11) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (13-13)
April 26, 2026 - American Family Field - Milwaukee, WI - 1:10 CDT - Game #28/Road #15
RHP Carmen Mlodzinski (1-1, 3.28 ERA) vs. LHP Kyle Harrison (1-1, 3.06 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won three of the first five games on this six-game road trip to Texas (1-2, April 21-23) and Milwaukee (2-0, Friday-Sunday) after picking up a 6-3, 10-inning win on Saturday night at American Family Field...Are in the third game of a stretch of 10 consecutive games against the National League Central (have gone 6-2 against the division so far this year)...Will play one more game here in Milwaukee before returning to PNC Park for a seven-game homestand vs. St. Louis (Monday-Thursday) and Cincinnati (May 1-3)...Are 15-8 in their last 23 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) following a 1-3 start to the season...Have not lost back-to-back games since dropping each of their first two games of the season from March 26-28 at Citi Field...Are five games over .500 for the first time since being 11-6 following their game on April 15, 2024 at New York (NL)...Rank tied for sixth in Major League Baseball in stolen bases (26) and seventh in runs (135).

BREAK OUT THE BREWMS: Pittsburgh would pick up its first series sweep of Milwaukee since sweeping a three-game series from August 2-4, 2022 at PNC Park with a win today...The Pirates have swept four series in Miller Park/American Family Field history (since 2001), coming from April 15-17, 2002 (three games), August 23-25, 2002 (three games), April 30-May 2, 2004 (three games) and August 25-28, 2016 (four games)...Pittsburgh's last prior series win in Milwaukee came from July 9-11, 2024.

GRIT AND GRIND: The Pirates earned a 10-inning win without an extra-base hit on Saturday at Milwaukee...It was Pittsburgh's first road extra-inning win without an extra-base hit since August 27 (G1), 2020 at St. Louis (4-3, eight innings) and its first road extra-inning win without an extra-base hit in a game of at least 10 innings since September 23, 1974 at St. Louis (1-0, 10 innings).

MAKE A DIFFERENCE: Pittsburgh has outscored its opponents, 135-106 (+29), over its first 27 games...That is tied with 1933 and 1980 for the Pirates' 10th-best run differential through their first 27 games of a season in the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind 1921 (+62), 1992 (+58), 1990 (+48), 1937 (+40), 1977 (+39), 2023 (+38), 1960 (+37), 1971 (+35) and 1991 (+31)...The only one of those seasons that did not end with a winning record was 2023...Pittsburgh's 114 runs in April are its sixth-most in the month in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901), behind 2023 (151), 1996 (131), 2018 (129), 2016 (128) and 2008 (116).

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: The Pirates' 10 home runs against left-handed pitchers so far this season rank tied for seventh in Major League Baseball...Oneil Cruz' 26 total bases against left-handed pitchers are tied for the second-most in Major League Baseball.

GOOD GONZO: Nick Gonzales went 3-for-5 with an RBI and a run scored in the Pirates' 6-3, 10-inning win on Saturday at Milwaukee's American Family Field...He has gone 11-for-24 (.458) with three RBI and four runs during his six-game hitting streak (since April 19 vs. Tampa Bay)...Gonzales has also gone 19-for-58 (.328) in his career here at American Family Field...That is the fourth-best batting average among all active visiting Major Leaguers at the venue (minimum 50 at-bats)...The average trails only Arizona's Ketel Marte (.403, 29-for-72), Minnesota's Byron Buxton (.360, 18-for-50) and Bryan Reynolds (.335, 59-for-176).

FEELING BULLISH: Isaac Mattson, Mason Montgomery, Dennis Santana, Gregory Soto and Yohan Ramirez combined to allow just one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings of relief in Pittsburgh's 6-3, 10-inning win on Saturday at American Family Field...It was the fifth time in the 21st century where the Pirates' bullpen pitched at least 5.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed during an extra-inning victory, along with August 8, 2008 at Philadelphia (won, 2-0, in 12 innings), April 7, 2010 vs. Los Angeles-NL (won, 4-3, in 10 innings), May 20, 2021 at Atlanta (won, 6-4, in 10 innings) & March 28, 2024 at Miami (won, 6-5, in 12 innings).

PICK SIX: Pirates pitchers have at least six strikeouts in 64 straight games (since last year on August 18 vs. Toronto)...That marks the fifth-longest streak by any Major League team during the Modern Era (since 1901), trailing New York-AL (77 games, August 4, 2018-April 23, 2019), Miami (76 games, April 5-June 29, 2023), Cincinnati (71 games, August 2 [G2], 2020-April 23, 2021) and New York-AL (66 games, August 22, 2017-April 29, 2018)...Pittsburgh's 254 strikeouts rank fourth in Major League Baseball.

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE: Pittsburgh has won each of its first three series against the National League Central this season (won two of three games from March 30-April 1 at Cincinnati, won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago and have won the first two games of this series at Milwaukee)...It marks the third time since the division formed in 1994 that the Pirates have won each of at least their first three series against the division in a season, along with 2014 (three) and 2018 (four)...Pittsburgh is also 6-2 on the road against the National League Central so far this year after going 7-19 on the road against the division in 2025.

April 26, 2017: Gift Ngoepe became the first Major League player from the continent of Africa to appear in a game when he debuted during the Pirates' 6-5 win over the Cubs at PNC Park. He singled off Jon Lester in the fourth inning for his first Major League hit. Josh Harrison connected for his fifth career leadoff home run, as part of a two-hit night. Josh Bell hit a solo home run in Pittsburgh's victory.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in Comp. Balance A round (No. 31) of the 2020 Draft.

FOR STARTERS: Mlodzinski (pronounced "ma-JINSK-ee") was a member of Pittsburgh's Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season...The 27-year-old is in his fourth season with the team...He was drafted out of the University of South Carolina in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT: Mlodzinski lost a 5-1 decision after allowing a career-high-tying five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings on April 21 at Texas' Globe Life Field.

PROVIDING RELIEF: Mlodzinski earned his first win of the season after relieving starter Mason Montgomery in the second inning and proceeding to toss a career-high 6.0 innings without allowing a run in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win on April 15 vs. Washington... He was the first Pirates reliever to pitch at least 6.0 innings in a game since Quinn Priester (also 6.0ip) on July 9, 2024 at Milwaukee...Mlodzinski was also the first Pittsburgh reliever to pitch at least 6.0 scoreless innings in a game since Steve Cooke pitched 7.0 scoreless innings in the team's 3-0 win on September 21, 1992 vs. St. Louis.

HISTORIC OUTING: Mlodzinski allowed two hits and struck out five batters over 6.0 scoreless innings of relief on April 15 vs. Washington...He became one of nine Pirates relievers during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 6.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and striking out at least five batters...He joined Mike Lynch (1906), Erv Kantlehner (1915), Bill Swift (1935), Mace Brown (1937), Dick Littlefield (1954), Harvey Haddix (1961), Al McBean (1963) and Bob Johnson (1972) on that list.

AGAINST THE BREWERS: Mlodzinski is 2-1 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1ip/6er) in 12 career relief appearances against Milwaukee...He allowed one run in 1.1 innings during his Major League debut here at American Family Field on June 16, 2023...Mlodzinski earned his first career win with 2.0 scoreless innings of relief against the Brewers on June 30, 2023 at PNC Park...He has recorded a 4.32 ERA (8.1ip/4er) here in Milwaukee.

2026 DEBUT: Mlodzinski had a no-decision after allowing two runs and striking out a career-high eight batters (did not issue a walk) over 4.1 innings on March 29 at Citi Field (the Pirates defeated the Mets, 4-3, in 10 innings)...He became the second Pirates pitcher (first starter) during the Modern Era to have at least eight strikeouts while issuing zero walks in an outing of 4.1 innings pitched or fewer, joining Rich Gossage, who did so across 3.0 innings in his relief appearance on May 19, 1977 vs. Los Angeles.

HALT THE HOMERS: Mlodzinski has not allowed a home run in 71.1 consecutive innings (the streak began last season on July 6 at Seattle)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak is the longest-active streak among all Major League pitchers.

FIRING BLANKS: Mlodzinski had his 13.0-inning scoreless streak (began on April 4 vs. Baltimore) snapped when he allowed two runs in the second inning on April 21 at Texas...His career-best streak was a 14.1-inning streak last year from July 19-August 9.

RELIABLE RELIEVER: Mlodzinski posted a 2.15 ERA (50.1ip/12er) and 53 strikeouts in 22 relief appearances with Pittsburgh last season...His 2.15 ERA out of the bullpen ranked 10th in the National League among relievers with at least 50.0 innings pitched.

FINISHING STRONG: Mlodzinski pitched to a 1.63 ERA (55.1ip/10er) and recorded 58 strikeouts over his final 23 games (three starts) last season (June 21 onward)...He did not allow more than two runs in any of those 23 appearances...Mlodzinski's 1.63 ERA in that stretch was the best among all Major League pitchers (minimum 50.0 innings).

STARTING US OFF: Mlodzinski was in Pittsburgh's starting rotation to begin the year for the second straight season...He went 1-4 with a 5.67 ERA (39.2ip/25er) over nine starts from March 31-May 17 before being optioned to Triple-A Indianapolis on May 21...Mlodzinski was recalled on June 11 after going 2-0 with a 1.15 ERA (15.2ip/2er) and 16 strikeouts over three starts with the Indians...He went 4-4 with a 2.12 ERA (59.1ip/14er) and 61 strikeouts over 25 appearances (three starts) after he was recalled...Mlodzinski had a 4.99 ERA (48.2ip/27er) over 12 Major League starts in 2025.

TOMORROW'S STARTER

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Monday night's game against St. Louis at PNC Park.
