**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Rays, 8-7, in 10 innings, walk-off fashion last night...The Mets are seeking their sixth series victory and the third series victory at home...With a win today, the Mets would snap a streak of seven series without a victory...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (1-1) against Tampa Bay (1-1) and Cleveland (three games).

**RUBBER BAND:** The Mets are 2-2 in rubber game this year and 20-6 in rubber games dating to the start of 2022.

**EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Mets improved to 2-0 in extra-inning games this year...Since the start of last season, the Mets are a major league-best 12-2 in extra-inning games.

**THE ICEMEN COMETH:** Pete Alonso iced last night's 8-7, walk-off win with a three-run home run in the 10th inning...It was his fourth career walk-off blast and his fourth career extra-inning home run...Alonso is a lifetime .417 (10-24) hitter with a 1.442 OPS in extra innings...Alonso has 31 extra-base hits, including 17 home runs, in the ninth or later in his career (both marks lead the majors since 2019)...His 42 RBI in the ninth or later are surpassed only by Brandon Crawford (44) since Alonso's debut...In addition to Alonso, Brandon Nimmo and Starling Marte have also made the most of their late-inning opportunities over the last five years:

**WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** Pete Alonso recorded his fourth career walk-off home run last night...It was the first walk-off victory by the Mets in 2023...Alonso's four career walk-off home runs tie a franchise record with Chris Jones, Kevin McReynolds, Cleon Jones, Mike Piazza and Wilmer Flores.

**FIRST TIME IN FOREVER:** The Mets hit three home runs last night in the seventh inning or later when down by two runs to tie the game or take the lead in each instance...They are the only team to do in a single game over the last 50 years...Hat tip to OptaSTATS.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has homered in back-to-back games...He owns the major league lead with 15 home runs...His 36 RBI are tied for fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 416 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).

**CITI BOMBS:** Alonso has 69 homers at Citi Field, the second-most in the ballpark's history...Lucas Duda is first with 71.

**STRIKE THAT:** The Mets recorded a season-high 17 strikeouts last night...It was also the highest total for the Rays this season...Kodai Senga set a career-high with 12 strikeouts...It was the first double-digit-strikeout game by a Mets pitcher this season and the most strikeouts by a Japanese-born pitcher in Mets history...Senga now has a 1.57 ERA (4 ER/23.0 IP) in his first four career home starts, the best mark by a Mets starter...He has 55 strikeouts through his first eight games of his career, the third-most by a Met...Only Nolan Ryan (64) and Dwight Gooden (59) have more.

**RAYS-METS NOTES:** The Mets snapped their five game losing streak to Tampa Bay last night...New York has lost 10 of its last 13 to the club.

**INTERLEAGUE PETE:** Pete Alonso has hit 33 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 33 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

**ATTABOY ÁLVAREZ:** Francisco Álvarez tied the game with a three-run homer in the ninth inning last night...He became the fourth Met to hit a game-tying three-run home run when down to the last out...Carl Everett (September 13, 1997 vs. Montreal - Grand Slam), Victor Diaz (September 25, 2004 vs. Chicago-NL - three-run homer) and Daniel Murphy (September 13, 2015 at Atlanta - three run homer) are the others to accomplish the feat.

**ON THE MARK:** In his first major league game of the year, Mark Vientos homered...He became the seventh-youngest Met (23 years, 157 days old) to homer in his first game of a season...Darryl Strawberry is the youngest at 22 years, 21 days (1984)...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 4-4 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 239-231 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

**FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY:** The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2019 (Brett Baty), 2018 (Tylor Megill), 2017 (Mark Vientos, Josh Walker), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Luis Guillorme, Jeff McNeil), 2012 (Tomás Nido) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets are 8-9 at Citi Field this year...The team's 17 home games are the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26...Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

**AND THEY'RE OFF:** Starling Marte is tied for 12th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with 11 steals...He ranks third among active players with 325 career steals...Only Elvis Andrus (340) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more...The Mets are fourth in the National League with a 82.4% success rate in steals this season...The Mets are ninth the NL with 28 steals this season.

**COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF:** Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

### MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in the Mets' 3-2 victory over the Washington Nationals on May 12...Pitched 5.0 innings, allowed one earned run on four hits, four walks and four strikeouts

**BIG DRIP VS THE RAYS:** Today, Megill will make his first career start against the Rays...In four career Interleague games (three starts), Megill is 2-0 with a 2.16 ERA (4 ER/16.2 IP) and 19 strikeouts...Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 ER/13.0 IP) in two career starts against NL East opponents.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** This season, Megill is holding opposing batters to a .158 average (6-38) with runners in scoring position, the fourth-best mark in the NL and the seventh-best mark in the majors...Megill also ranks fourth in the NL and seventh in the majors with a .451 opponent's OPS with runners in scoring position (Min. 40 batters faced w/RISP).

**NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK:** This season, Megill is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (8 ER/21.1 IP) in four home starts this season...In four road starts this season, Megill is 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP)...In 20 career home games (18 starts), Megill is 6-4 with a 4.30 ERA (44 ER/92.0 IP) and in 21 career road games (17 starts), Megill is 6-6 with a 4.85 ERA (46 ER/85.1 IP).

**THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY:** On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

**COMBINED NO-NO:** Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodriguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

**2022 RECAP:** Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

**OPENOR:** Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

### TOMORROW'S STARTER CARLOS CARRASCO (0-2, 8.56)

**REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP:** Made two appearances with Binghamton (AA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 15-day IL with right elbow inflammation, both against the Hartford Yard Goats...Threw 33 pitches in his first start since the injury on May 9, allowing one earned run on three hits and a walk...On May 14, threw 4.0 scoreless innings, allowing two hits and one walk while fanning four batters.

**FACING A FAMILIAR FOE:** Tomorrow, Carrasco will face his former team in Cleveland for the first time in his career...However, having pitched for the Guardians for the first 11 years of his career, he has faced AL Central opponents 115 times, including 95 starts and has pitched to a 41-40 record with a 3.89 ERA (249 ER/576.2) in those appearances...He has fanned 587 AL Central batters in his career.
