RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of 2025 this afternoon at Steinbrenner Field, a seven-game stretch against the Blue Jays (1-2, one to play) and Red Sox (3G)...snapped a three-game losing streak last night, but have still dropped nine of their last 12 contests on the heels of a season-high seven-game winning streak (Aug. 29–Sept. 4)...are 10-9 during a stretch of 23 games in 24 days from Aug. 29–Sept. 21...are fourth in the AL East for the 69th consecutive day dating back to July 11, 15.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 99 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** recorded a go-ahead RBI-single in the 7th inning and the Rays held on for a 2-1 win last night, snapping a three-game losing streak, a five-game skid at Steinbrenner Field and a seven-game skid vs. AL East opponents.
- ★ It was their third time this season winning despite scoring two runs or fewer, joining April 25 at SD (1-0) and Aug. 16 at SF (2-1).
- ★ Five straight and nine of the Rays last 11 games have been decided by one run...the five-game streak ties their longest this season, matching June 4-8, and falls one game shy of the longest streak in franchise history (6G, 2x, last: Aug. 3-9, 2018).
- ★ They lead the majors with 10 one-run affairs this month and have 50 on the season, second most in the AL behind the Mariners (51G) and tied for fifth most in MLB.
- ★ The Rays need to go 2-2 or better over the rest of this homestand to clinch their ninth consecutive winning season at home (2017–pres.)...among all MLB clubs, only the Yankees (33), Dodgers (19) and Brewers (9) have longer active streaks (excl. 2025) than the Rays current eight-season run.
- ★ Today marks the fourth of 13 straight games vs. AL East opponents to conclude the regular season...the Rays are 4-13 in their last 17 intra-division games.
- ★ Tampa Bay leads the majors with a 3.03 ERA (213.2IP, 72ER) over its last 24 games since Aug. 22...the clubs paces the AL in strikeouts (530) since the All-Star break.
- ★ The Rays need to win today to snap a three-series losing streak...it would mark their third series split this season, first since June 16-19 vs. BAL.

SEE MORE WINS—Last night, **Ian Seymour** (7.0IP, 1R-0ER, BB, 3SO) became the first Rays rookie to allow 0 ER over 7.0 IP or more since **Alex Colomé** on June 21, 2015 at CLE (7.0IP) and the first left-handed Tampa Bay rookie since **Matt Moore** on June 15, 2012 vs. MIA (7.0IP)...through four career starts, Seymour is 3-1 with a 1.21 ERA (22.1IP, 3ER), a 0.81 WHIP, 24 SO and 5 BB while holding opponents to a .163/.209/.200 (13-for-80)...he is the first pitcher in Rays history to record 5.0 IP or more with 2 ER or fewer in each of his first four career starts and the second AL hurler this season along with **KC Noah Cameron** (5GS).

- ★ Excluding openers, Seymour is the third Ray to hold opponents homerless in each of his first four career starts, joining **James Shields** (6GS) and **Blake Snell** (4GS).

BASH BROTHERS—**Brandon Lowe** is one long ball shy of becoming the second Ray to reach 30 HR along with **Junior Caminero** (44HR)...the Rays would be the seventh team in the majors with multiple 30-HR hitters and the fifth AL club, joining the Angels (Adell/Ward), Athletics (Kurtz/Langeliers), Mariners (Raleigh/Rodriguez) and Yankees (Grisham/Judge)...they would become the sixth set of Rays teammates to both hit 30 HR in a season, first since Lowe (39HR) and **Mike Zunino** (33HR) in 2021...Lowe would also become the fourth active second baseman with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining ATL **Ozzie Albies** (2), HOU **Jose Altuve** (2) and AZ **Ketel Marte** (2)...he would also join **Evan Longoria** (4) and **Carlos Peña** (3) as the only players in franchise history with multiple 30-HR campaigns.

- ★ With **Yandy Diaz's** (24HR) next long ball, he, Caminero and Lowe will become the third trio of Rays teammates to each hit 25 HR, joining 2021 (Lowe/Zunino/**Austin Meadows**), 2017 (**Corey Dickerson**/**Logan Morrison**/**Steven Souza Jr.**) and 2009 (Longoria/Peña/**Ben Zobrist**).
- ★ Rays infielders have launched an AL-leading 99 HR, third in MLB behind the Diamondbacks (104HR) and Mets (103HR) and tied with 2017 for fourth most in team history behind 2016 (111HR), 2023 (109HR) and 2009 (108HR).

THE GREAT YANDINO—**Yandy Díaz** has reached base safely in four straight plate appearances and 13 of his last 15 trips to the plate (6 1B, 2B, 6BB)...he is 7-for-9 (.778) with 5 BB through three games of this series—the 12 times on base via hit or walk are tied for third most in a single series in franchise history, one shy of the club record of 13 shared by Díaz (9/14/BBB, June 30–July 3, 2022 at TOR–5G) and **Carl Crawford** (11H/2BB, Aug. 6-9, 2007 at DET–4G), according to Stats Perform...Díaz, who has an active five-game hitting streak, has tallied a hit in 16 of his last 20 games dating back to Aug. 25, batting .427/.506/.627 (32-for-75) with 6 2B, 3 HR, 8 RBI, 12 BB, 10 SO, 14 R and a 1.132 OPS...he leads the majors in batting average over that stretch and ranks second in both on-base pct. and hits.

- ★ He has already set career highs in home runs (24) and RBI (81) and is approaching career bests in games played (145G in 2024; currently 142G), hits (173H in 2023; currently 167H) and extra-base hits (57XBBH in 2023; currently 53XBBH).
- ★ With 28 doubles, he is a pair of two-baggers away from joining **Ben Zobrist** (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons...he is also two doubles shy of tying **Aubrey Huff** (172 2B) for fifth most in Rays history.
- ★ His next extra-base hit will mark his 273rd with the Rays, tying **Kevin Kiermaier** for eighth most in team history...his next home run will be the 100th of his career and his 99th with Tampa Bay, which would tie **Fred McGriff** for eighth most in club history.

CATCH HIM IF YOU CHAN—**Chandler Simpson's** 42 SB rank second in the majors behind NYY **Jose Caballero** (48SB) and are tied for 10th most in a season in franchise history...he is 3 SB shy of joining **Carl Crawford** (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays with a 45-SB campaign...with a .296 average on the year, Simpson is attempting to become the ninth rookie since 1901 to steal 40 bases or more while batting .300 or better and the second since 2004 along with LAA **Mike Trout** (.326/.495B) in 2012.

- ★ He is 12-for-26 (.462) with 2 BB, 6 R and 3 SB over his last seven games.
- ★ After a three-hit effort last night, Simpson has tallied 69 hits out of the leadoff spot, third most by a rookie in franchise history behind **Akinori Iwamura** (115H) in 2007 and **Randy Winn** (80H) in 1998.

THE CAMINER SHOW—With 10 games remaining, **Junior Caminero** (44HR) is two homers shy of tying **Carlos Peña's** franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...he has gone deep an MLB-leading 17 times in his last 42 games since the calendar flipped to August...his 108 RBI are the most by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (113RBI) in 2009 and are fourth most in franchise history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBBH, which are tied for third most in the AL, match **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of Longoria in 2010 (73XBBH) for sixth and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74XBBH) for fifth.

- ★ Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season.
- ★ He has tallied 22 HR at Steinbrenner Field, tied with **Brad Miller** (2016) for the second-most long balls at home in franchise history behind Peña (23HR) in 2007.

JAYS IN THE BAY—The Rays and Blue Jays will wrap up a 13-game season series with seven meetings over a two-week timeframe to close the season (Sept. 15-28)...this comes after the clubs met six times in a 13-day span from May 13-25...the Rays have won five of seven and 10 of their last 13 games vs. Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024 and have won 15 of 22 matchups since the start of last season...they need to go 2-2 or better over their final four meetings to secure an eighth straight season series win and 10th in 11 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (2015–pres.).



- ★ Rays pitchers have produced a 2.63 ERA (82.0IP, 24ER) against the Blue Jays this season...it would mark their second-lowest ERA vs. Toronto in franchise history behind 2012 (2.40) and lowest vs. an AL East opponent since the Yankees (2.29) in 2021.
- ★ **Brandon Lowe** is 14-for-34 (.412) with 2 2B, 5 HR, 14 RBI and five multi-RBI efforts in eight games vs. the Blue Jays this season...min. 25 PA, his .912 SLG vs. Toronto this season is the highest in the majors...he has 11 XBBH (4 2B, 7HR) in his last 12 games against Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024, producing a 1.334 OPS in those contests.

DOWN ON THE FARM—Double-A Montgomery continues its Southern League South Division Series with Game 2 at Biloxi (MIL) tonight at 7:35 p.m. ...after a 7-2 win in Game 1, the Biscuits need to win one of the next two games to advance to their second consecutive SL Championship Series and third in the last five seasons since 2021...Rays Minor League Pitcher of the Year **T.J. Nichols** will make his first professional postseason start this evening.

TODAY’S START—Shane Baz will toe the rubber for his 30th start of the season and 53rd of his career this evening at Steinbrenner Field...marks his 16th home start this season and the 26th of his career...is his fourth career start opposite the Blue Jays...was acquired from the Pirates as a player to be named later (Aug. 14, 2018) along with **RHP Tyler Glasnow** and **OF Austin Meadows** for **RHP Chris Archer**, July 31, 2018.

LAST TIME OUT—Baz suffered his 12th loss of the season after working a career-low-tying 2.1 innings in a 6-4 defeat to the Cubs on Sept. 12 at Wrigley Field (2.1IP, 6H, 5ER, 3BB, 5SO)...worked a scoreless 1st frame but a single-ground out-double sequence to open the 2nd scored the game's first run...three batters later, a pair of back-to-back run-scoring singles by **Michael Busch** and **Ian Happ** helped Chicago tie the game at 3-3...in the 3rd, Baz fanned his first batter before allowing a walk and then an RBI-triple to **Moisés Ballesteros** that broke the tie...Baz departed in the inning after hitting a batter and allowing a walk but was charged with one more run when **Ballesteros** scored on a ground out in the next at-bat.

- ✦ Allowed 3 BB, the most since he allowed a season-high 4 on June 20 vs. DET...was his ninth start with 3 or more this season and his 11th outing with multiple walks in his last 12 starts.

NEIGHBORS TO THE NORTH—Baz will be making his fourth career start opposite the Blue Jays and his third this season...in two starts against them in 2025, he is 1-0 with a 3.48 ERA (10.1IP, 4ER) with a .216 (8-for-37) opp. average...his last outing came on May 24, when he tossed 5.2 frames of one-run ball in a 3-1 victory at Steinbrenner Field...is 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA (27.1IP, 8ER) and a .210 (21-for-100) opp. average over five career starts against Toronto...the Rays have won five of his seven starts against the AL East this season, with losses in each of the last two.

WOES IN THE BAY—Baz’s 6.28 ERA (77.1IP, 54ER) at home is the second highest among qualified MLB pitchers, behind ATH **Luis Severino** (6.51)...min 50.0 IP, it would mark the highest home ERA by a Rays pitcher since **Scott Kazmir** (6.89) in 2009...Baz has allowed 3 ER or more in five of his last seven starts at home, a stretch in which he has gone 2-3 with a 7.39 ERA (35.1IP, 29ER) with 46 SO and a .301 (44-for-146) opp. average.

SEPTEMBER SHANE—In 10 career starts during the month of September, Baz is 5-2 with a 2.82 ERA (54.1IP, 17ER), holding opponents to a .182/.254/.313 (35-for-192) line—the opp. AVG and OBP are the lowest in any calendar month of his career and the ERA is second lowest, behind April (2.45)...the Rays have won five of Baz’s six career home starts during September and have gone 6-4 overall.

STRIKEOUT STUFF—Baz has recorded 9.67 strikeouts per 9.0 IP, sixth in the AL...he has fanned six batters or more in six of his last eight starts, striking out 53 of his 177 BF in that span (29.9%)...since recording 38 strikeouts in a 10-start span from April 19–June 9 (6.62 SO/9.0IP), Baz has averaged 10.80 SO per 9.0 IP in his last 16 outings since June 15, fourth in the AL in that span (min. 75.0IP) behind SEA **Logan Gilbert** (12.04), BOS **Garrett Crochet** (11.65) and DET **Tarik Skubal** (10.94).

BEND IT LIKE BAZ—Min. 1,000 pitches thrown, Baz’s 26.9 pct. usage rate on his knuckle curve is third highest in the AL behind TOR **Brendon Little** (47.1%) and TOR **Louis Varland** (37.6%)...opponents are batting .223 (48-for-215) with only 3 HR against the offering, and nearly half (83) of his 169 strikeouts have come on the pitch...in his last 17 starts dating back to June 9, opponents are hitting .254 (26-for-118) with 54 SO and a 36.1 pct. whiff rate in at-bats ending with Baz’s knuckle curve.

HELPING HANDS—When Baz receives three runs of support or more in his career, he is 14-2 with a 3.42 ERA (136.2IP, 52ER), and the Rays are 21-5 (12-3 in 2025)...in 26 starts with two runs or fewer, he is 2-15 with a 5.32 ERA (140.1IP, 83ER), and Tampa Bay has gone 5-21 (2-12 in 2025).

- ✦ He has received zero runs of support in five of his last 11 starts, averaging 2.85 runs of support per 9.0 IP in that span (July 12–pres.), third fewest in the AL (min. 40.0IP), ahead of only HOU **Framber Valdez** (2.20) and HOU **Hunter Brown** (2.80).

10 FOR 10—Baz struck out a career-high 11 batters on April 14 vs. BOS...paired with his start on April 1 vs. PIT, he became the fifth pitcher since 1901 to record 10 SO or more with no walks in two of his first three starts of a season, joining MIL **Corbin Burnes** and CWS **Lance Lynn** in 2021, WSH **Stephen Strasburg** in 2010 and AZ **Randy Johnson** in 2000 (Stats Perform).

GOING STREAKING—Baz threw 6.0 IP or more with two runs or fewer in six consecutive starts from Sept. 17, 2024–April 14, 2025, tying the longest streak in franchise history (6GS, 5x, last: **Shane McClanahan**, June 20–July 26, 2022)...he was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (38.0IP, 8ER) and 0.74 WHIP during the streak, holding opponents to a .160/.218/.252 (21-for-131) slash line with 46 SO and 7 BB.

RUNNING OUT OF GAS—Over the first three innings, Baz has pitched to a 4.48 ERA (86.1IP, 43ER), 1.30 WHIP and .240 (79-for-329) opp. average...he has held opponents scoreless in the opening frame in 24 of his 29 starts this season and 41 of his 52 career starts...Baz went 13 straight starts from April 25–July 1 without a run allowed in the first two frames...from the 4th inning on, he owns a 5.96 ERA (71.0IP, 47ER), 1.46 WHIP and .279 (77-for-276) opp. average...48 of his 91 runs allowed (52.7%) have come from the 4th inning on.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER vs. BOSTON RED SOX: RHP DREW RASMUSSEN (10-5, 2.74)

LAST START—Did not factor into the decision after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing 3 ER in a 5-4 win over the Cubs on Sept. 13 at Wrigley Field (ND, 5.0IP, 4H, 3ER, HR, 3BB, 1BB, 5SO)...is set to become the fourth Ray (5x) to make 30 starts and record a sub-3.00 ERA...has not received a decision in each of his last five starts despite pitching to a 3.33 ERA (27.0IP, 10ER) and limiting opponents to a .213 (20-for-94) opp. average in those games.

vs. RED SOX—Is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (27.0IP, 9ER) and a .238 (25-for-105) opp. average in nine career outings (5GS) against Boston...in his lone start opposite the Red Sox this season, he allowed 1 ER on 3H and 1 BB with 1 SO over 2.0 innings in a 5-4 loss to the Red Sox at Fenway Park on July 11...is 2-2 with a 2.40 ERA (30.0IP, 8ER) and has limited opponents to a .217 (23-for-106) opp. average in six starts against AL East clubs this season, with a 1.96 mark (23.0IP, 5ER) at home.
