LHP Sean Manaea (3-5, 4.33 ERA) vs. RHP Jared Jones (2-3, 4.02 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have split the first two games of this brief, three-game homestand vs. New York-NL (Friday-Sunday), including a 9-0 win on Saturday at PNC Park (it marks their only three-game homestand of 2026 and their first three-game homestand since June 20-22, 2025 vs. Texas)...Won two of eight games on their recent road trip to Cincinnati (1-3, July 30-August 2) and Milwaukee (1-3, August 3-6)...Will embark on a three-game road trip to Miami (Tuesday-Thursday) after today's game...Are in the final day of a stretch of 17 consecutive days with a game (their last off day was on July 23)...Have hit 144 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1060) in Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (601) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (636) and Chicago-NL (604), after scoring 583 runs in 2025...Have struck out the third-most batters (1103) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1153) & Milwaukee (1141).

BEACH BOUND: Pittsburgh will have the day off on Monday before starting a brief, three-game road trip to Miami (Tuesday-Thursday)...It will be the Pirates' first three-game series at loanDepot park since taking two of three games there from September 17-19, 2021...They split a four-game series from July 11-14, 2022, lost three of four games from June 22-25, 2023, swept a four-game series from March 28-31, 2024 and lost three of four games from March 27-30, 2025 in Miami...It is the Pirates' second and final three-game road trip of the season (they also won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago-NL) and their first against a non-National League Central team since winning two of three games from September 27-29, 2024 at Yankee Stadium.

BEAT THE METS: The Pirates can pick up their fourth straight series win or split against the Mets at PNC Park with a win today (they lost, 6-4, on Friday night and won, 9-0, on Saturday night)...They won two of three games from June 9-11, 2023, split a four-game series from July 5-8, 2024 and swept a three-game series from June 27-29, 2025...Pittsburgh has won or split at least four straight home series against the Mets only five times in series history (since 1962), coming from April 21, 1962-June 6 (G2), 1965 (10 straight series), September 20, 1965-August 11, 1966 (four straight series), September 19, 1980-August 16, 1983 (eight straight series), April 15, 1991-June 20, 1993 (seven straight series) and July 12, 2013-June 8, 2016 (four straight series).

JAKE RAKES: Jake Mangum went 3-for-5 with two doubles, an RBI, a stolen base and two runs scored in Pittsburgh's 9-0 win on Saturday vs. New York (NL)...It was his third career multi-double game (he also did that on June 22, 2025 with Tampa Bay vs. Detroit and last year on August 22 with Tampa Bay vs. St. Louis)...Mangum became the first Pirate to post those stats since Ke'Bryan Hayes went 5-for-5 with two doubles, four RBI, a steal and three runs in their 14-7 victory on June 9, 2023 vs. the Mets...Mangum, who was selected by New York (NL) in the 2019 First-Year Player Draft, is 24-for-80 (.300) versus lefties so far this year.

SHUT 'EM DOWN: Pittsburgh picked up its seventh shutout and first since May 20 at St. Louis with its 9-0 win on Saturday vs. New York (NL)...It marked the Pirates' fourth shutout in 79 all-time games vs. the Mets at PNC Park (since 2001)...They also did that on September 19 (G1), 2004 (1-0), September 17, 2006 (3-0) and July 28, 2018 (5-0)...It also marked their eighth all-time shutout with a run margin of at least nine runs against the Mets (since 1962) and first since August 9, 1984 at Shea Stadium (11-0).

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe connected for his 25th home run of the season with his solo shot (off Luis Torrens) in the seventh inning of Saturday's 9-0 win vs. New York (NL)...His 24 home runs as a second baseman this season are the most by a Pirate in team history (since 1887), breaking a tie with Neil Walker (23, 2014)...Lowe is the first Pirate to hit at least 25 home runs in a season since Jack Suwinski hit 26 home runs in the 2023 campaign.

A GREAT PITCH: Bubba Chandler, Lake Bachar and Kirby Yates combined to allow four baserunners (three hits and one walk allowed by Chandler) and strike out nine batters in Saturday's 9-0 win vs. New York (NL)...It marked only the seventh time in PNC Park history (since 2001) where Pirates pitchers allowed four or fewer baserunners and struck out at least nine batters in a shutout and the first since last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics (2-0).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 9, 2015: The Pirates exploded for a nine-run seventh inning to turn a 5-3 deficit into a 12-5 lead in their 13-6 win vs. the Dodgers on ESPN's "Sunday Night Baseball" at PNC Park. The victory helped Pittsburgh capture its first sweep of Los Angeles in Pittsburgh since doing so from May 31-June 2, 1999 at Three Rivers Stadium. Francisco Cervelli finished a double shy of the cycle in that evening's win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2020 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Jones lost a 4-2 decision after allowing three runs on a career-high-tying eight hits (also June 15 at the Athletics) and one walk over 4.0 innings on August 4 at Milwaukee...He has a 2.61 ERA (31.0ip/9er), 37 strikeouts, a .170 batting average against (19-for-112) and a 0.84 WHIP in his last six starts (since July 2 at Philadelphia).

AGAINST THE METS: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one baserunner (a second-inning double to Pete Alonso) and striking out seven batters over 5.0 scoreless innings in his only career start against New York (NL), which came in a 3-1 loss on April 16, 2024 at Citi Field...He also owns a 2.38 ERA (34.0ip/9er) in six career starts against the National League East, including a 0.90 mark (10.0ip/1er) in two starts this season.

SKY-HIGH JULY: Jones’ 2.00 ERA (27.0ip/6er) during the month of July was tied with Atlanta’s Chris Sale and San Francisco’s Robbie Ray (he was traded to San Diego on August 3) for the seventh-lowest mark in the National League (minimum 27.0 innings pitched), behind Chicago’s Shota Imanaga (1.53), Chicago’s Matthew Boyd (1.67), Miami’s Eury Pérez (1.69), New York’s Nolan McLean (1.78), Arizona’s Brandon Pfaadt (1.88) and Arizona’s Merrill Kelly (1.95)...His .120 batting average against (11-for-92) during the month of July was first among Major League pitchers (minimum 90 at-bats).

DYNAMIC DUO: Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run on two hits and one walk in 6.0 innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-2, 10-inning loss on July 24 vs. Chicago (NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Bubba Chandler (July 22 [G2] at New York-AL) and him were the first pair of Pirates starters since at least 1893 to pitch at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer hits, one or zero runs & one or zero walks in back-to-back games.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Jones became the only Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) with three or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed and at least six strikeouts in three consecutive outings when he accomplished that from July 2-18 (G1).

30 ROCK: Jones retired his final four batters on July 2 at Philadelphia, retired each of his 18 batters on July 8 vs. Atlanta and retired his first eight batters on July 18 (G1) at Cleveland (Steven Kwan snapped the streak with a two-out single in the third inning)... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Jones became one of only three Pirates pitchers in the last 70 years (since 1957) to retire at least 30 consecutive batters, joining Harvey Haddix (38 straight batters, May 21-26, 1959) & Jim Bibby (32 straight batters, May 19-24, 1981).

YOU’RE PERFECT: Jones had a no-decision after striking out eight batters over 6.0 perfect innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-0 loss on July 8 vs. Atlanta...He was the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have an outing of at least 6.0 perfect innings.

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).
