ROSTER MOVES: The Mets announced that the club has acquired RHP Ariel Jurado from the Texas Rangers in exchange for a player to be named later and cash considerations...To make room on the 40-man roster, outfielder Ryan Cordell has been designated for assignment...Jurado has been assigned to the team's Alternate Training Site in Brooklyn.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 5-3, last night...The team has dropped six of their last seven games...The Mets finish their second road trip of the season tonight against the Nationals...The Mets are off on Thursday and return home on Friday for the start of a seven game homestand against Miami (three games) and Washington (four games).

REVOLUTION 9: J.D. Davis is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .444 (11-31) with four runs, a double, two home runs, six RBI, four walks and a 1.025 OPS over that span...It is the fourth longest active streak in the majors...He is one away from matching his career-best streak of 10 games, which he accomplished from August 5-16 last year...Davis ranked 10th in the NL with a 136 wRC+ (weighted runs created plus) and was 17th in the NL with a .373 wOBA (weighted on-base average) last season.

CHEAPER BY THE DOZEN: Michael Conforto has safely reached base in all 12 games this season...He is batting .318 (14-44) with six runs, two doubles, two home runs, six walks, two steals, six RBI and a .412 OBP...He enters the day tied for fifth in the NL with 14 hits...Conforto has hit 111 home runs in his career which is 12th on the Mets all-time list...Ed Kranepool is 11th with 118 followed by Edgardo Alfonzo who is 10th with 120.

ONE MORE TIME: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in all 12 games this season...Nimmo has reached base safely in each of his last 27 games dating back to last season, the longest active streak in the majors...He owns a .407 OBP and a .765 OPS this year...The 27-game on-base streak is the second-longest in his career...Nimmo safely reached base in 28 straight games from August 11-September 21, 2018...In addition, Nimmo has scored a run in each of his last six games, the longest streak of his career...He is tied for third in the NL with nine walks and is tied for seventh with nine runs.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: Andrés Giménez is hitting .333 (7-21) with two runs, a triple, an RBI and two steals in 11 games...He has reached base in all four starts this season, batting .400 (6-15) with a run, a triple, an RBI, a walk and a steal...Giménez entered the season as the third-best Mets prospect and the No. 84 overall prospect in the majors, per *MLB Pipeline*...After spending the 2019 season with Binghamton (AA), the Venezuelan shortstop led the Arizona Fall League with a .371 (26-70) average and .999 OPS.

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Giménez is all over the MLB rookie leaderboard...He is first in steals (2), tied for first in hits (7), second in SLG (.429) and in total bases (9), tied for second in average (.333) and third in OBP (.364) and OPS (.792),

STRIKE THAT: The Mets pitching staff has struck out 112, which is fourth in the majors and second in the NL, behind only the Reds (129)...Cleveland leads the majors with 130...The Mets have recorded five games with 10 or more strikeouts this season.

NO OFFENSE, BUT...: The Mets are second in the major leagues and first in the National League with 110 hits this season...The Mets are third in MLB and second in the NL with a .263 batting average and second in MLB and first in the NL with a .349 OBP...The Mets have recorded six games where they racked up 10 or more hits this season, which is tied for the major-league lead...In 2019, the Mets recorded 69 such games, the fifth-most in the majors and the second-most in the National League...Colorado recorded 77 such games.

LEFT OVERS: The Mets left 10 on base yesterday...The team entered the day with the major league-lead with 107 runners left on base...The team has left 49 runners on base during the current road trip.

THE FIRST PITCH IS THE DEEPEST: The Mets as a team are hitting .406/.418/.641 on the first pitch...Their 26 hits on the first pitch lead the majors...Michael Conforto is tied for the NL lead with five such hits...Jeff McNeil is tied for fourth in the NL with four first-pitch hits.

WASHINGTON, D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: Three active Mets have a lifetime average of .300 or better in at least 25 at-bats at Nationals Park: Jeff McNeil (.353, 18-51), J.D. Davis (.345, 10-29) and Pete Alonso (.325, 13-40).

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won eight of their last 11 games vs. the Nationals...The two teams will play each other five more times in the next 10 days.

VS, MAX SCHERZER: Max Scherzer, a three-time Cy Young Award winner, is 10-5 with a 2.63 ERA (31 earned runs/137.0 innings) in 21 career games, 20 starts vs. the Mets...Last year, Scherzer was 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (10 earned runs/26.0 innings) over four starts vs. New York.

WAY AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: The Mets have scored 35 runs in seven games on the road, compared to 12 runs in five games at home...The Mets are batting .275/.365/.418 on the road...This compares to a .246/.326/.347 slash line at home...The team's .275 road batting average is the best in the NL and ranks third in the majors...Their .365 OBP is the best in the NL and second in the majors...The team's 35 road runs are third in the NL and tied for fourth in the major leagues.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 3-4 on the road this year...This compares to 1-4 at home...The team was an NL-best 21-12 on the road in the second half of the 2019 season...The Mets finished winning 13 of their last 20 and four of their last five games on the road...Overall, the team went 38-43 on the road last year.

THE PEN IS NOT MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has not allowed a run in the last two games, a span on 8.0 innings...Overall, the team ranks 24th in the majors and 11th in the NL with a 5.55 (29 earned runs/47.0 innings) bullpen ERA after 12 games...Last year, the Mets pen ranked 26th in the majors with a 4.99 ERA...The pen's 4.99 ERA was the highest in franchise history...Mets relievers are tied for third in the majors with three losses this season and are tied for fourth in the majors with three blown saves...The pen is tied for eighth in the majors allowing eight homers.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets went 1-6 with runners in scoring position last night...Overall, the team is batting .221 (25-113) with runners in scoring position this season...That puts them 25th in the majors and 13th in the National League.

IN NEW YORK YOU CAN BE A NEW MAN: Billy Hamilton, who joined the team yesterday, ranks third among active players with 299 career stolen bases...His 81.3 percent stolen base success rate ranks fifth among active players with at least 200 stolen base attempts...Since 2013, Hamilton ranks fourth among all centerfielders with 72 defensive runs saved and ranks second among all active centerfielders with 55 outfield assists and a .995 fielding percentage.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Ali Sánchez will make his major league debut when he enters a game...He would become the fourth player to make his major league debut with the Mets this year, joining Andrés Giménez, Franklyn Kilome and David Peterson.

HE'S HEATING UP: Over his last six starts, Jeff McNeil is batting .458 (11-24) with two runs, two doubles, four walks, four RBI and a 1.093 OPS...This compares to his first three starts where he went 1-10...McNeil has recorded four multi-hit games this season, tied for the fourth-most in the NL...McNeil collected 53 multi-hit games last year, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NL.

SIXTY-GAME SPRINT: Over the final 60 games of the 2019 season, the Mets' 39-21 mark tied for the second-best in the majors and co-lead the NL...Only one team, the Astros (42-18), had a better record in the season's last 60 games...The Rays, Twins, Dodgers and A's all also ended last year on a 39-21 run...See the chart below for the Mets' best 60-game starts to a season:

MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Strained right triceps (On DL 8/2/15-8/26/15)

LAST TIME OUT: Yielded four runs, three earned, on five hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 4.0 innings at Truist Park as the Mets fell to the Braves, 11-10...Was his second-straight outing in which he walked three batters...He had not walked three or more in consecutive starts since his first three starts of last season (March 31-April 13).

VS. NATIONALS: Porcello has faced the Nats twice in his career and beaten them each time...He's 2-0 with a 3.21 ERA (five earned runs/14.0 innings)...In his last start against the club, he threw a quality start here in D.C., pitching 6.0 innings of two-run ball on July 2, 2018.

150 ON THE HORIZON: With a win tonight, Porcello will become the 10th active pitcher to reach the 150-win milestone and would move into a tie for ninth among active players in career wins (also, David Price).

WINNER: Porcello is 10th among active pitchers with 149 career wins...He's earned at least 10 victories in all but one of his 11 major league campaigns...He is one of just five pitchers with at least 10 seasons with double-digit wins since his rookie year in 2009, joining Zack Greinke (11), Max Scherzer, Justin Verlander and Jon Lester.

INNING EATER: Porcello completed at least 6.0 frames in 207 starts during the 2010s, making him one of just 13 pitchers who made at least 200 starts of at least 6.0 innings in the last 10 seasons...Porcello is one of just 10 pitchers in the modern era to throw at least 162.0 innings in each of his first 11 major league seasons...He's the only active pitcher who has done so.

A DECADE OF DURABILITY: In the last 10 seasons, Porcello ranks in the top-10 in the majors in wins (seventh, 135), games started (fifth, 308) and innings pitched (eighth, 1,866.2)...He has landed on the injured list just once, missing a total of three weeks.

CLOSE TO HOME: Went to Seton Hall Preparatory School in West Orange, NJ, 21 miles away from Citi Field...Grew up rooting for the Mets...Was born in Morristown, NJ and resides there in the offseason.

2019 RECAP: Surpassed career milestones of 2,000.0 innings (2,037.1) and 1,500 strikeouts (1,507)...Finished the season one win shy of 150, ranking fifth among active pitchers with 149 wins...Went 14-12 overall in 32 starts in his final season of a five-year stay in Boston.

RELIABLE RICK: Over the last four years (2016-2019), Porcello and Justin Verlander are the only pitchers in the majors to make 32 or more starts each season...He is the only qualifying pitcher to average fewer than 3.0 walks per nine innings in each of the last 11 seasons.

FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP MICHAEL WACHA (1-1, 6.00 ERA)

LAST START: Wacha took his first loss of the season after allowing five runs, earned, on seven hits in 4.0 innings at Atlanta on August 1...He walked two and fanned five...The Mets lost, 7-1.

2019 RECAP: Wacha went 6-7 with a 4.76 ERA across 29 games (24 starts) in his last season with the Cardinals...In 126.2 innings, he walked 55 batters and fanned 104...In his last nine starts, he posted a 2.89 ERA (12 earned runs/37.1 innings).
