ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (4-6) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (4-7)  
April 8, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #12/Home #5  
RHP Sonny Gray (1-0, 5.73 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (1-0, 1.46 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** defeated St. Louis, 8-4, last night and have now won back-to-back games for the first time in 2025...Wrapped up a stretch of six consecutive games against American League East opponents with their walkoff win against the Yankees on Sunday and are now in the middle of a six-game stretch against National League Central foes (will also go to Cincinnati for a three-game series with the Reds this weekend)...Went 25-27 within their own division last season.

**OUR ACE:** Paul Skenes earned his first win of the season in his last start on April 2 at Tampa Bay, allowing just an unearned run and three hits while striking out six Rays over 7.0 innings...Through his first 25 Major League starts, Skenes has struck out 183 batters and posted a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in the National League/1913 in the American League) to post a sub-2.00 ERA and have 175-plus strikeouts over his first 25 Major League appearances...His 183 strikeouts since making his MLB debut on May 11, 2024 are fourth-most in MLB.

**TOMMY TERRIFIC:** In Monday's win vs. St. Louis, Thomas Harrington pitched 4.0 innings en route to earning his first Major League save and first professional save at any level...It was only Harrington's second relief outing in 50 professional games (also June 5, 2024 with Double-A Altoona), and it was the first save of 4.0-plus innings by a Pirates pitcher since Jason Christiansen (also 4.0ip) on July 17, 1998 at Montreal...Harrington, who made his Major League debut on April 1 at Tampa Bay, is one of four Major League pitchers to start his MLB debut and earn a save in his second MLB game (stats became an official stat in 1969), joining Los Angeles (NL)'s Tony Gonsolin (2019), Washington's A.J. Cole (2015) and Montreal's Kent Bottenfield (1992), per the Elias Sports Bureau...He's also one of three Pirates rookies to earn a save of 4.0-plus innings, along with Blas Minor (1993) and Kent Tekulve (1975).

**JOEY BARRELS:** On Monday, Joey Bart hit a solo home run (his first home run of the season) in the first inning off Matthew Liberatore and an RBI triple in the seventh inning...It was the third triple of Bart's Major League career and his first since September 23, 2020, for San Francisco vs. Colorado...He became the first Pirates catcher to have a triple and a home run in the same game since Francisco Cervelli on April 12, 2018 at Chicago (NL).

**LOCKED IN, KE':** Ke'Bryan Hayes extended his hitting streak to six straight games (began on April 1 at Tampa Bay) with an RBI single that brought home Isiah Kiner-Falefa in Monday's second inning...It's his longest hitting streak since hitting safely in seven straight games from September 3-10, 2023...He's gone 8-for-22 (.364) during the streak.

**KINER-FALEFA'S CONSISTENCY:** Isiah Kiner-Falefa had two hits on Monday and has hit safely in nine of 11 games (he's started each of Pittsburgh's 11 games at shortstop and has batted ninth in 10 of 11 games)...Kiner-Falefa enters today tied with St. Louis' Nolan Arenado for the seventh-best average (.343, 12-for-35) in the National League...Pittsburgh's .343 average from the shortstop position ranks third in all of MLB, trailing only the Phillies (.353) and Athletics (.349).

**KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH:** Andrew McCutchen had two hits, including a two-run double, on Monday vs. St. Louis and has now hit safely in four of his last five games (since March 30 at Miami), going 7-for-15 (.467) in that span...McCutchen's next RBI will be the 1100th of his Major League career, which are fifth-most among active players (St. Louis' Nolan Arenado ranks third on that list with 1138)...McCutchen also has 801 extra-base hits in his Major League career, third-most among active players (former Cardinal Paul Goldschmidt ranks second on that list with 834, while the Dodgers' Freddie Freeman leads with 885)...With his double on Monday, McCutchen moved into a tie with Houston's Jose Altuve for the third-most doubles (431) among active players...When McCutchen scored on Joey Bart's triple on Monday, he scored his 937th run as a Pirate, moving past Arky Vaughan and into sole possession of 10th place on the club's all-time runs list.

**GUIDING THE SHIP:** With two more wins, Pittsburgh skipper Derek Shelton will reach 300 managerial victories...He would become one of 12 managers in franchise history to win at least 300 games as the team's skipper (Fred Clarke 1422, Danny Murtaugh 1115, Jim Leyland 851, Clint Hurdle 735, Chuck Tanner 711, Frankie Frisch 539, Pie Traynor 457, Bill McKechnie 409, George Gibson 401, Lloyd McClendon 336, Billy Meyer 317)...Shelton's first win as a Major League manager came against St. Louis at Busch Stadium on July 26, 2020.

**HOW ACQUIRED:** Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 22-year-old righthander will make his third start of the season tonight and first here at PNC Park in 2025...Took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors last season after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. the Cubs...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Louisiana State University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Skenes earned his first win of the season in his last start on April 2 at Tampa Bay, striking out six Rays while allowing only an unearned run over 7.0 innings...He threw 102 pitches in that start, marking the 10th time in his 25 Major League starts that he's thrown 100-plus pitches, the first since also throwing 102 pitches on September 16, 2024 at St. Louis.

**NO. 1:** Skenes made his 25th Major League start his last time out on April 2 at Tampa Bay, posting a 1.92 ERA (145.1p/31er) with 183 strikeouts...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official stat (1912 in the N.L./1913 in the A.L.) to post a sub-2.00 ERA and have 175-plus strikeouts over his first 25 Major League appearances...His 183 strikeouts since making his Major League debut on May 11, 2024 are fourth-most in all of MLB, behind Logan Gilbert (191), Chris Sale (185) and Tarik Skubal (185).

**OPENING DAY HONORS:** Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings but had a no-decision on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins....At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)....He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old....Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start....According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).

**ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORS:** Last year, Skeries became the second player in Pirates history to take home BBWAA Rookie of the Year honors, along with Jason Bay in 2004...He became the first rookie pitcher to make at least 23 starts and post a sub-2.00 ERA in a single season since Scott Perry with the Philadelphia Athletics in 1918...He also became the 24th pitcher to win the N.L. Rookie of the Year Award and the first to do so since Devin Williams with Milwaukee in 2020.

**IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN:** Skenes recorded a 1.96 earned run average in 23 starts during his rookie season in 2024...His 1.96 ERA from the time of his big-league debut on May 11 through the end of the season was the lowest in all of MLB...His .198 batting average against was also the lowest by a Pirates starting pitcher in team history (minimum 16 starts)...His 1.96 ERA was the lowest by a Major League rookie pitcher (minimum 18 starts) in the Live-Ball era (since 1920).

**ALL-STAR HONORS:** Skenes entered the 2024 All-Star break with a 6-0 record, 1.90 ERA, 0.92 WHIP, 89 strikeouts and 13 walks in 11 starts...The strikeout total was the fifth-most in Major League history (since 1901) through 11 starts...When he started for the National League on July 16 in Arlington, he became one of five rookie pitchers to start the All-Star Game, joining Hideo Nomo (1995), Fernando Valenzuela (1981), Mark Fidrych (1976) and Dave Stenhouse (1962).

**AND THE WHIFF:** Skenes struck out a club rookie-record 170 batters last season...He became the first pitcher in the Modern Era with 150 strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00 over his first 22 games...The previous club record since 1900 was 142, which was held by Cy Blanton in 1935.

**MILITARY MAN:** Spent his first two years of college at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player (pitched and caught)...He majored in military strategic studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.
