YESTERDAY'S RECAP—The Rays won, 14-4, over the Nationals yesterday afternoon at Charlotte Sports Park...Tampa Bay tallied 15 hits in the contest, with 13 different players tallying at least one...C Danny Jansen and INF José Caballero both had multi-hit performances...INF Brandon Lowe and INF Coco Montes were each able to leave the yard for their third and first home runs of the spring, respectively...the bullpen went 4.2 scoreless innings in relief behind LHP Mason Montgomery (0.2IP), RHP Kevin Kelly (1.1IP, 2H, BB, 2SO), LHP Garrett Cleavinger (1.2IP, 2SO) and RHP Mike Vasil (1.0IP, BB, SO).

BREAKING OUT—Last night, the Rays Prospects won against the Red Sox Prospects, 7-5, in the 2025 Spring Breakout...INF Cooper Kinney led the way with a 3-for-4 (2B) performance...INF Carson Williams showcased some power with his 8th-inning home run to pad the lead...speed was also on display as the Rays Prospects stole four bases in total...two were by OF Homer Bush Jr., one from OF Chandler Simpson and one by INF Emilien Pitre...RHP Jackson Baumeister started and went 2.0 scoreless innings with one walk...RHP Paul Gervase closed the game with a perfect 9th inning to earn the save.

3.1415926535897 DAY—This is the fourth and final scheduled meeting between the Rays and Twins this spring training...they were slated to play on Feb. 24 at Charlotte Sports Park—however, the game was cancelled due to rain after two innings...the second matchup was on March 2 in Fort Myers, with the game ending in a 5-5 tie...the third game also ended in a tie, a 9-9 result in Port Charlotte...this will be the 106th meeting between Tampa Bay and Minnesota in Grapefruit League play all-time, with the Rays holding a 44-55-6 record...Tampa Bay has played Minnesota more times in spring training than any other opponent.

* This regular season, Minnesota and Tampa Bay will meet at George M. Steinbrenner Field from May 26-28 and at Target Field from July 4-6.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, the Rays exercised a 2026 club option for INF Yandy Diaz and added a vesting option for the 2027 season, pending 2026 performance thresholds.

* Yesterday, RHP Cole Wilcox was reassigned to minor league camp and LHP Jake Brentz was released...these moves bring the number of players in major league camp to 57 and the number of non-roster invites to 19.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN—The Rays have 57 players in major league camp, including 19 non-roster invites...of those 57 players, 16 (28.1%) are homegrown, meaning they were drafted or signed as an amateur free agent and developed by the Rays player development system, while 15 (26.3%) are new to the organization since the conclusion of the 2024 season...the Rays have 27 pitchers (6 NRI, 1 IL), seven catchers (4 NRI), 14 infielders (6 NRI) and nine outfielders (3 NRI) in major league camp.

* Eleven players have been added to the Rays 40-man roster since the conclusion of last season: RHP Joe Boyle, RHP Mason Englert, RHP Alex Faedo, C Danny Jansen, INF Ha-Seong Kim, LHP Nate Lavender, OF Jake Mangum, RHP Eric Orze, LHP Joe Rock, LHP Ian Seymour and RHP Mike Vasil.

COMING DOWN THE PIPELINE—Last Friday, the Rays farm system was ranked second behind the Detroit Tigers in MLB.com's annual preseason rankings...the system features five players ranked inside the MLB Top 100: INF Carson Williams (No. 9), INF Xavier Isaac (No. 51), INF Brayden Taylor (No. 67), INF Tre Morgan (No. 93) and OF Theo Gillen (No. 99)...additionally, the top-ranked pitchers were RHP Brody Hopkins and RHP Santiago Suarez, who ranked eighth and ninth, respectively...two 80 grades were handed out amongst the prospects with OF Chandler Simpson and OF Homer Bush Jr. each receiving the grade for their speed.

AT THE HELM—Entering his 11th season, Rays manager Kevin Cash is the longest-tenured skipper in the majors with his current club...he surpassed his predecessor, Joe Maddon (2006-14), as the longest-tenured manager in Rays history last season...he earned his 755th career win on May 4, 2024 vs. NYM, overtaking Maddon as the winningest manager in club history...despite being the seventh-youngest skipper in the majors, Cash ranks sixth among active managers in career wins (819) and winning pct. (.540)...he has guided the Rays to the postseason in five of the last six seasons.

* He has been named a BBWAA AL Manager of the Year finalist five times in the last seven seasons (since 2018), winning the award twice (2020-21) and receiving votes in six of those seven campaigns.

* Cash, who joined the Rays on Dec. 5, 2014, is the eighth-longest-tenured manager head coach in the big four North American professional sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, NHL) by hiring date...hired in Dec. 2014, he trails Gregg Popovich (Dec. 1996), Mike Tomlin (Jan. 2007), John Harbaugh (Jan. 2008), Erik Spoelstra (Dec. 2008), Andy Reid (Jan. 2013), Jon Cooper (March 2013) and Steve Kerr (May 2014).

ACROSS THE BAY—The Rays will host the upcoming regular season at Tampa's George M. Steinbrenner Field, spring home of the Yankees...Tropicana Field will not be available due to significant damage incurred on Oct. 9 during Hurricane Milton...the Rays will move into the facility following the completion of Yankees spring training...for more information, visit tbrayspressbox.com.

* In order to avoid the summer heat and rain, the Rays have swapped home-and-away series with the Angels and Twins, moving road games to Tampa in April and May while playing in Minnesota and Los Angeles in July and August, respectively...as a result, the club is scheduled for a 13-game homestand from April 8-20, a nine-game homestand from May 19-28, a 10-game road trip leading into the All-Star break from July 4-13 and a 12-game road trip from Aug. 4-17...the Rays will play 37 of their first 58 games at home and will be on the road for 35 of 51 games in July and August.

ON THE AIRWAVES—All weekend games this spring will air on WDAE 95.3 FM/620 AM, with Andy Freed and Neil Solondz on the call...Freed begins his 21st season with the Rays while Solondz embarks on his 14th, including his third as part of the primary broadcast duo...all weekday home games will be available on MLB.com, with Chris Adams-Wall, entering his third season with the Rays, providing play-by-play.

* FanDuel Sports Network Sun will televise nine of the Rays 15 games at Charlotte Sports Park in addition to three road games and the Spring Breakout game vs. the Red Sox on March 13...Dewayne Staats, the Rays play-by-play voice since their inaugural 1998 season, enters his 28th season with the club and 50th broadcasting major league games...Brian Anderson begins his 16th season as full-time color analyst and 18th on the broadcast team...in-game reporter and host Ryan Bass enters his fourth season on the telecast.

* The Rays provide a daily video feed of all non-televvised spring training games, which features approximately two minutes of highlights plus two short interviews...to receive updates, contact Chris Tilley at raysspringtraining@gmail.com or 727-434-0497.
