METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned their second win of the season with a 6-2 victory over the Fish yesterday...The Mets are going for their first series victory of the season today...The Mets continue their first road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Miami (2-1) and Milwaukee (three games).

LET'S GO FISHING: The Mets are now 53-47 at loanDepot park...The team has won four of their last five here and nine of their last 12 games at the yard...The team owns a 3.44 ERA at the yard and has hit .250/.325/.406.

RISPY BUSINESS: Last night the Marlins went 0-7 with runners in scoring position...Over the last three games, Mets pitching has held the Marlins to three hits in 22 at bats with runners in scoring position...That equates to a .136 opponent average in RISP situations...Last season, the Mets ranked fourth in the majors and second in the NL with a .228 opponent average with runners in scoring position.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Kodai Senga is set to make his major league debut today against the Marlins...Senga will become the 14th Japanese born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...He was signed by the Mets to a five-year contract in December of 2022...He enters the season as the 16th-best prospect in baseball according to Baseball America...The right-handed pitcher spent the past 11 seasons in Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball with the Fukuoka . Softbank Hawks and went 87-44 with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0) in his NPB career...Is a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017, 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019, 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019, 2020).

DEBUT NOTES: Today, Senga is slated to become the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...Masato Yoshii is the only other Japanese-born pitcher to make his MLB debut in a start for the Mets... New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Peterson is the most recent Mets hurler to win as a starter in his major league debut... Overall, 15 Mets have started and earned a win in their major league debut (eight Mets have won in relief in their MLB debut)...Matt Harvey (2012) is the only pitcher in Mets history to record a double-digit strikeout game in his major league debut.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen three bases this season...New York has a stolen base in each of its first three games for the first time since the 1993 season...The team's three steals places them tied for the National League lead and tied for fifth in the majors...In 2022, the Mets stole a total of 58 bases, which placed them 23rd in the majors and 12th in the majors.

 $\textbf{THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:} \ In \ three \ games \ this \ year, \ the \ Mets \ bullpen \ has \ allowed$ one run in 10.0 innings, good for a 0.90 ERA...They have allowed seven hits, striking out 11 and issuing only one walk...The team's 0.90 ERA is fourth in the and second in the Senior Circuit...Last year, the Mets bullpen posted a 3.50 ERA, which ranked third in the National League.

OMAR'S COMING YO!: In three games with the Mets, Omar Narváez is 3-7 with a run, two RBI and a walk...In December, the Mets signed catcher Narváez to a one-year contract with a player option for 2024...He is a .412 (7-17) hitter with two runs, a double, three RBI and four walks in six career games at loanDepot park.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are opening the season in Miami for the first time since 2011.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha went 3-4 with three runs, a double, a home runs, a walk and two RBI in yesterday's victory over the Marlins...He is in his second year with the Mets and has hit .267/.369/.409 with 74 runs, $25\ \text{doubles},\,14\ \text{home runs},\,63\ \text{RBI}$ and $50\ \text{walks}$ in $143\ \text{games}$ with the club.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 2-1 against the division this year...The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022...Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history...They lost only three series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18, Washington, September 2-4 and September 30-October 2 at Atlanta)...They won the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...Overall, the Mets posted a 3.38 ERA against the East, while hitting .262/.335/.425...The Mets outscored their divisional opponents, 380-272.

DAY MAN!: The Mets are 2-0 in day games this year...In 2022, the Mets went 39-19 in day games...The team's .672 winning percentage in the sunlight was the second-best in the National League and third-best in the majors...The Mets posted a 3.16 ERA with 150 walks and 564 strikeouts in the daytime last year...Their 3.16 ERA in the daytime was third in the majors and second in the NL.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte is 5-9 with a run, an RBI, a double, a walk and two steals in three games this season...Marte has batted .297/.351/.472 with 77 runs, 25 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs, 63 RBI, 27 walks and 20 steals in 1211 games as a member of the Mets...Marte owns a .309/.371/.450 slashline with 50 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, eight home runs, 32 RBI, 20 walks and 21 steals in 75 career games at loanDepot ballpark.

DOUBLE DARE: The Mets have recorded seven doubles this season which is tied for fourth in the major leagues.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso socked the first Mets home run of the year on Friday...He has hit 12 home runs in 31 career games at the ballpark...That is tied with the Nationals Park for his most home runs at an opponent's ballpark.

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 last year...His 131 RBI were tied for the major league lead and led the National League...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most or tied for the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He had 27 game-winning RBI season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI were tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

HITTING THE ROAD: New York is 2-1 on the road his year...The team finished the 2022 season going 47-34 on the road...Their .580 road winning percentage placed them third in the majors and second in the NL...It was tied for the fourth-best road record in team history and the highest roadwinning percentage since 2007...Overall, they hit .265/.334/.424 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average was second in the majors and the best in the NL, while their .334 OBP led The Show...They ranked fourth in MLB and second in the Senior Circuit with a .424 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.406), Jeff McNeil (.399) and Mark Canha (.378) ranked three through five in road OBP in the National League.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

MLB DEBUT: Senga is making his MLB Debut today against the Miami Marlins after spending the first 11 seasons of his pro career with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks of Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball...His desire to play in MLB came from his experience playing against major league stars in the 2017 World Baseball Classic...He enters the season as the 16th-best prospect in baseball according to Baseball America.

DEBUT NOTES: Today, Senga will become the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Peterson is the most recent Mets hurler to win as a starter in his major league debut...Overall, 15 Mets have started and earned a win in their major league debut (eight Mets have won in relief in their MLB debut)... Matt Harvey (2012) is the only pitcher in Mets history to record a double-digit strikeout game in his major league debut.

NOW YOU SEE IT, NOW YOU DON'T: Included in Senga's pitching repertoire is a unique pitch called the 'ghost fork'...The pitch is so named because its break gives the appearance that it disappears out of the strike zone.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: With his start today, Senga becomes the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...The last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

FIRST SPRING IN THE STATES: Senga made three starts in Spring Training and went 1-2 with a 4.00 ERA (4 ER/9.0 IP)...The right-hander had 10 strikeouts and held opposing hitters to .194 average in Grapefruit League play...In his final tuneup before the regular season, Senga allowed two runs over 4.0 innings with three strikeouts on March 22 against Houston.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (0-0, -.-)

SPRING IN HIS STEP: Made four starts in spring exhibition play, three of which were at home at Clover Park in Port St. Lucie...He posted a 4.15 ERA in 13.0 innings pitched...Carrasco's best appearance of Spring Training was his last on March 17 against the Marlins, in which he tallied seven punchouts in his first win of the 2023 campaign...Ended exhibition play with a 1.08 WHIP and with batters hitting .240 against him.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP)...Ended the season ranked fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 10th in win percentage with .628... According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Posted a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) in five July starts, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

- Has 23 career homers vs. the Marlins, third-most among active players and 13th-most all-time...David Wright (26) is the only Met with more.
- Ranks seventh on the Mets all-time home run list with 147 homers in 533 career games...Carlos Beltrán (149) is sixth...Attempting to become the second-fastest
 player in major league history to reach 150 career home runs...Ryan Howard got there in 495 games and Aaron Judge is currently second-fastest (552 games).
- Posted a 1.047 OPS in 12 spring training games, going 10-34 (.294) with four home runs, seven RBI, seven runs scored and five walks.
- Represented the United States in the 2023 World Baseball Classic...Went 2-14 with an RBI and a run scored in five games for Team USA.
