# ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (43-40) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (40-43) July 2, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#84/HOME \#40 RHP KYLE GIBSON ( $5-3,3.70$ ERA) vs. RHP MITCH KELLER ( $9-4,3.20$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:....had the day off yesterday...Went 3-3 on their road trip to Cincinnati (2-1) and Atlanta (1-2)...Have gone 14-13, including 9-6 at home, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have gone $30-3$ (. .909 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have not been shut out in 28 straight games, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in MLB (the Cardinals have the longest active streak at 61 games)...Are 14-13 in series openers, including 8-5 at home.

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH: Bryan Reynolds had his career-high 25-game hitting streak come to an end Sunday in Atlanta... Reynolds' 25 -game hitting streak is tied for the fifth-longest in club history dating back to 1900 along with Freddie Lindstrom in 1933 and Clyde Barnhart in 1925...The only Pirates with longer hitting streaks, which includes spanned seasons, are Charlie Grimm (30 games in 1922-23), Danny 0'Connell (26 games in 1953), Kenny Lofton (26 games in 2003) and Dick Groat (26 games in 1961-62)...Reynolds' 25 -game hitting streak is the longest one in all of MLB this season.

GIMME FIVE: Mitch Keller worked 5.2 innings in his last start one week ago today against the Reds, giving him 47 straight starts of working at least 5.0 innings in a game...It's the longest active streak in all of MLB coming into today and the longest in MLB since Max Fried had 50 straight from June 6, 2021, to September, 30, 2022... It's also the longest streak by a Pirate since A.J. Burnett made 49 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings from May 8,2012 , to August 10, 2013.

THE MATURATION OF MITCH: Since the beginning of the 2023 campaign when he was named an All-Star for the first time in his career, Mitch Keller has gone 22-13 with 301 strikeouts...Keller's
 22 wins since the beginning of last season are tied for the secondmost among all National League pitchers along with Zack Wheeler (Zac Gallen leads all National League pitchers with 23 wins)... In addition, Keller's 301 strikeouts during that time are tied for the third-most among National League pitchers along with Aaron Nola...The only two National League pitchers with more strikeouts since the beginning of last year are Freddy Peralta (330) and Zack Wheeler (324).

CASHING IN AT PNC: Mitch Keller has thrown 28.2 innings while allowing two runs over his last four home games...According to StatsPerform, Francisco Liriano (2013) and Kip Wells (2005) are the only two other Pirates over the past 40 seasons to have had a four-game home span with at least 28.0 innings pitched and two or fewer runs allowed.

THE MONTHLY REPORT: The Pirates produced a winning record (14-12) during the month of June for the first time since going 17-9 in 2015...Pittsburgh's starting rotation recorded the thirdlowest ERA (3.51) in all of MLB last month, trailing only the Mariners (3.25) and Astros (3.32)...The pitching staff also allowed a Major League-low 20 home runs in 229.0 innings of work.
HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS: Tonight the Pirates will open a three-game series against the Cardinals as part of a seven-game homestand that will include a wraparound series against the Mets that gets underway Friday night and concludes Monday afternoon...This series will be the first time the Pirates and Cardinals play on Independence Day since 2016, but the first time Pittsburgh will host St. Louis on July 4 since 1996...The Pirates have scored multiple runs in 16 straight home games against the Cardinals, which is their second-longest active streak against any opponent (Padres - 21)...It is Pittsburgh's longest such streak against St. Louis since August 1972 - August 1974 (18 straight).

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen is one walk shy of tying Ralph Kiner (795) for fifth place on the Pirates all-time base on balls list...McCutchen is also one extrabase hit shy of tying Max Carey (590) for sixth place in that category on the Pirates all-time list.


ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY
July 2, 2004: Jack Wilson hit his first and only career inside-the-park home run in the bottom of the sixth inning against Milwaukee as the
Pirres Pirates defeated the Brewers 8 - 1 in game one of a doubleheader. The Pirates won their sixth in a row during a streak that lasted ten games.

STARTING OFF: The 28 -year-old righthander is in his sixth Major League season, all with the Pirates...Keller signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 22, 2024...The 2023 All-Star has been Pittsburgh's Opening Day starter in each of the last two seasons, making him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16...He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Keller enters play among the NL leaders in several categories, including tied for third in wins (9), seventh in run support (62), tied for eighth in innings pitched (98.1) and ninth in home runs per 9.0 IP (0.73).

RARE AIR: Keller currently has nine wins, 98.1 innings pitched and 91 strikeouts so far this season...With one more win, 1.2 IP and nine strikeouts, Keller could become the fourth pitcher in Pirates franchise history to record $10+$ wins, $100.0+\mathrm{IP}$ and $100+$ strikeouts before the All-Star Break, joining Gerrit Cole in 2015 ( 13 wins, 117.1 IP, 116 strikeouts), Bob Veale in 1966 ( 10 wins, 142.0 IP, 134 strikeouts) and Bob Friend in 1960 ( 10 wins, 153.1 IP, 109 strikeouts).
\#WINNING: The Pirates are 8-1 in Keller's last nine starts since May 6 vs. LAA.
With a win today, Keller would become the first Pirates pitcher since Gerrit Cole in 2015 (13) to record 10+ wins before the All-Star Break.

ALL HE DOES IS WIN: Keller earned his ninth win of the season in his last outing on June 25...Keller has now earned nine wins before July 1 in back-to-back seasons, the first Pirates pitcher to accomplish this feat since Steve Blass did so in 1971 (9) and 1972 (9) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

He is the first Major League pitcher to post back-to-back seasons of $9+$ wins before July 1 since Justin Verlander did so for the Astros from 2018-19...The last National League pitcher to do so was Max Scherzer with the Nationals for four straight seasons from 2015-18 (also did it from 2013-14 with the Tigers...six consecutive seasons in total).
Keller was also the first Pirate to have seven-plus wins through June 1 in consecutive years since Howie Camnitz from 1908 (7) to 1909 (8)...The only other Pirates to accomplish this feat were Frank Killen in 1896 (10) and 1897 (8) (courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau).

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win after allowing four runs (three earned) on six hits with six strikeouts against three walks over 5.2 innings of work on June 25 @ Cincinnati.

GETTING IT DONE: In nine starts since the beginning of May, Keller is 7-1 with a 1.85 ERA (12 ER in 58.1 IP ) and .223 (49-for-220) batting average against... His seven wins in that time are tied for the most in the NL (also: Chris Sale, Gavin Stone and Zach Wheeler) and are second in the Majors behind only NYY Luis Gil (8)...His ERA since May 1 is second-best in the NL and third in the Majors behind only CWS Garrett Crochet (1.49) and PHI Cristopher Sanchez (1.83).

VS. ST. LOUIS: Keller will be making his 12th career start against the Cardinals tonight and his second of the 2024 season... He took his only loss since the start of May on June 13 at Busch Stadium, allowing four runs on eight hits with four strikeouts and no walks in 6.0 IP .

He has pitched to a 3.47 ERA (9 ER in 23.1 IP) in four career starts against St. Louis at PNC Park, including two scoreless efforts (0 R on Sept. 19, 2020; 0 R on Sept. 11, 2022).

CENTRAL PERK: Keller has gone 5-1 with a 3.23 ERA (22 ER in 61.1 IP) in his last 10 starts against teams from the National League Central since August 13, 2023...The Pirates are 8-2 in those games.

COMPLETE GAME MITCH: On May 6 vs. Los Angeles-AL, Keller threw his second career complete game, with the other being on May 8, 2023 vs. Colorado.

LAST SEASON: In 2023, Mitch Keller set the franchise record by a right-handed pitcher with 210 strikeouts, surpassing the previous mark of 209 held by A.J. Burnett in 2013. Keller also rewrote the Pirates record book for strikeouts at various points throughout the season, including being the first pitcher in team history to record 90+ strikeouts prior to June 1 as well as being the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to record eight or more strikeouts in seven consecutive starts from April 27-May 31.
