#### **SNAKEBITES**

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 6-3, last night vs. Giants.

- ◆ Joc Pederson (1-for-2, 2B, RBI), since July 1, leads the Majors in the first inning [min. 40 PA] with his 1.328 OPS while his 13 RBI are tied for the most (also: Matt Olson/ATL).
- ◆ Eduardo Rodriguez (L; 5 ER in 4.2 IP, 8 K) tossed his second consecutive 8+-strikeout bid, his first time since May 4, 2023 vs. Mets (9 K) and May 10 @ Guardians (8 K) while with the Tigers.

IN THE STANDINGS: The D-backs hold the third spot in the NL Wild Card, 3.5 games behind the Padres (first WC) and a 0.5 game behind the Mets (second WC) [hold tiebreaker], and 1.5 games over the Braves (fourth in WC).

The D-backs are in third place in the NL West, trailing the Dodgers by 6.5 games and the Padres by 3.5 games.

THE FINAL SPRINT: The D-backs face the Giants (Sept. 24-25) and Padres (Sept. 27-29) for their final 5 games of the regular season...the D-backs are a combined 11-10 against the two teams (6-5 vs. Giants and 5-5 vs. Padres).

- The D-backs average 5.36 runs per game vs. Giants (+7 run diff.).
- The D-backs average 5.40 runs per game vs. Padres and will face off to determine the season series.

WIN TOTAL: The D-backs' 87 wins, which surpass their total from last year (84-78) with 5 games to go, are their third-most wins since 2008, behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011...have reached 90+ wins 6 times (1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

START WITH MARTE: Ketel Marte's 13 first-inning homers are tied for the most in a season by a D-back with Paul Goldschmidt (13 in 2018), ahead Luis Gonzalez (11 in 2001), Goldschmidt (9 in 2015) and Chris Young (9 in 2007)...his 13 homers are third most in the Majors, behind Aaron Judge/NYY (18) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (15).

♦ Marte's 33 home runs in the first inning as a D-back are third in franchise history, behind Paul Goldschmidt (52) and Luis Gonzalez (41).

CARROLL AND KETEL COMBO: Since July 10, the D-backs are 24-7 (.774) when both Ketel Marte and Corbin Carroll start in a game, including victories in 5 of the last 6 games...in the span, Arizona won 12 of the 14 home games where they both started.

D-BACKS LOOKING TO MAKE DEFENSE HISTORY: Per Elias Sports Bureau...since 1900, there has not been a MLB team with consecutive seasons of 65 or fewer errors...Arizona has currently committed 60 errors in 2024 after finishing the 2023 season with a franchise-low 56 error.

◆ The D-backs' .989 fielding pct. and 60 errors are the best in the Majors, ahead of the Braves (.988, 67 E), Rangers (.988, 67 E) and Twins (.988, 67 E).

NEARING 30/100 SEASONS: Ketel Marte (35 HR/93 RBI) and Eugenio Suárez (29 HR/98 RBI) look to become the first D-backs pair to each have a 30+-homer, 100+-RBI season since 2017 (last: Paul Goldschmidt, 36 HR/120 RBI and Jake Lamb, 30 HR/105 RBI)...only other occurrence was in 1999 (Steve Finley, 34 HR/103 RBI; Jay Bell, 38 HR/112 RBI; Matt Williams, 35 HR/142 RBI).

DINGER SEASON: The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 206 homers are fifth most in a single season in franchise history, 2 shy of 2001 (208) for fourth all-time, and behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

- ◆ The D-backs' 206 homers this season are tied for fourth most in the Majors with the Braves, behind the Yankees (229), Dodgers (225) and Orioles (225).
- ◆ The only time the D-backs have finished a season in the Top 5 in home runs is 1999 (5th, 2016), behind the Mariners (244), Athletics (235), Rangers (230) and Rockies (223).

MLB'S BEST SINCE JULY 1: Since July 1, Arizona leads the Majors with an .844 OPS, .354 OBP .490 SLG, 704 hits, 126 homers, 266 extra-base hits, 470 runs, 6.44 R/G, 32 sacrifice flies and 22 sacrifice hits.

HOME TURF: The D-backs' .606 win pct. (20-13) @ home since July 1 is the fourth highest in the Majors, behind the Mets (.714, 25-10), Dodgers (.676, 25-12) and Phillies (.625, 20-12).

♦ Since Aug. 1 @ home, the D-backs are averaging an MLB-best 7.05 runs per game, ahead of the Mets (5.32), Rockies (5.27) and Dodgers (5.13).

FIRST-INNING FANS: The D-backs have recorded an extra-base hit in the first inning in 4 straight games [1 double, 3 homers] (and 5 of their last 6) and scored in the initial frame in 10 of their last 13 games (Sept. 10). ◆ The D-backs lead the Majors with a franchise-high 37 occurrences of

- scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (31) and Marlins (26).
- ♦ In the first inning, the D-backs lead MLB with a franchise-best .325 AVG, .383 OBP, .565 SLG, .947 OPS and 209 hits as well as their 122 runs.

FIRST & NINTH-INNING OFFENSE: In the first and ninth innings combined, the D-backs' offense leads the Majors with a .299 AVG, .363 OBP, .532 SLG, .895 OPS, 335 hits, 62 homers, 210 runs, 1.34 runs per game and 127 XBH.

RUNS PER GAME: The D-backs' 864 runs this season are second in franchise history, behind 1999 (908 runs) - a difference of 44 runs.

♦ Their 5.50 runs per game this season lead the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (5.15) and Yankees (5.02), and rank second in club history (5.60 R/G in 1999) [the last Arizona team to have 5.00+ R/G was in 2019 (5.02)].

NO-HIT FRAMES: Has opened with 4.0 no-hit innings twice this season (April 22 @ Cardinals and May 15 vs. Reds), which are tied for second longest in his career, behind his 6.1 innings on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Padres.

STEE-RIKEI: On Sept. 19 @ Brewers, set a career high with 12 strikeouts, his fourth career double-digit game.

2023 RECAP: Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts. • Entered the season rated as the D-backs' No. 4 prospect by MLB Pipeline (No. 59 overall) and No. 5 by Baseball America. • Made his Major League debut on May 3 @ Rangers (7 ER in 4.2 IP).

- Got his first Major League win on Aug. 25 vs. Reds (5.1 IP, 2 ER, 5 K).
- Had a trio of career-high 8-strikeout games on Aug. 13 vs. Padres
- and back-to-back on Sept. 22 @ Yankees and Sept. 27 @ White Sox. Had a 12.2-inning scoreless streak spanning 3 starts from Aug. 13 vs. Padres (2nd inning)-Aug. 25 vs. CIN (2nd inning).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared in 5 Postseason games, going 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) and 26 strikeouts.
