TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners wrap up the 9-game, 10-day homestand with the last of 3 games against the Tampa Bay Rays (0-2)...Seattle has hosted the Minnesota Twins (2-1) and the Detroit Tigers (1-2) on the homestand...following an off-day Monday, the Mariners will embark on a 3-city road trip at the Yankees (3 G, 8/11-13), at the Astros (3 G, 8/14-16) and at the Brewers (3 G, 8/18-20)...today's game will be streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Rays in last night's game by a 3-2 final...the Mariners are 41-15 (.732) when they score at least 4 runs in a game and 35-8 (.814) when they score at least 5 runs.

- **Quality Check** - The Mariners starting pitching staff has recorded 54 quality starts this season, the most in the American League and 2nd-most in MLB behind only the Dodgers (62 G).
- **Vargas Begins Rehab** - Yesterday **Carlos Vargas** made the first appearance of his rehab assignment with High-A Everett, tossing a 1-2-3 inning...in 70 appearances in 2025, Vargas went 5-5 with a 3.97 ERA (34 ER, 77.0 IP), 23 walks and 54 strikeouts.

RICK RIZZS TO BE INDUCTED TO MARINERS HOF IN '27...the Mariners announced yesterday that legendary broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** will be the 12th inductee into the Mariners Hall of Fame during the 2027 season...Rizzs is in his 41st and final season as a Mariners broadcaster, as he previously announced his plans to retire following the season...Rizzs will join his friend and long-time broadcast partner Dave Niehaus as the only non-uniformed members of the Mariners Hall of Fame.

MARINERS UNVEIL 50 GREATEST PLAYERS IN FRANCHISE HISTORY...yesterday during a pre-game ceremony at T-Mobile Park, the Mariners unveiled the 50 greatest players in franchise history, with 44 of the 48 players in attendance, with 2B Julio Cruz and CF Dave Henderson included posthumously...the group of 50 was selected based on a combination of fan vote, and input from Mariners alumni, Mariners baseball operations and longtime Mariners front office and Seattle media...the list features 7 active Mariners and 43 Mariners alumni, 22 pitchers (15 right-handers and 7 left-handers, 16 starting pitchers and 6 relievers) and 28 position players (3 catchers, 2 first baseman, 4 second baseman, 2 third baseman, 2 shortstops, 2 left fielders, 6 center fielders, 3 right fielders and 2 infielder/outfielders).

NAYLOR'S DOUBLE DINGER DAY...**Josh Naylor** hit a pair of solo homers in last night's game, finishing the night going 3-for-4 with 1 doubles, 2 HR, 1 SB and 2 RBI...it marked his 7th career multi-HR game and his 2nd of the season (also: 4/13 vs. HOU)...his 10 total bases and 3 extra-base hits also tied his single-game career-best (5/9/22 at CWS w/CLE)...in 20 games since the All-Star break, Naylor is batting .311 (23x74) with 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, 5 stolen bases and an .830 OPS.

J-ROD PUTTING ON A SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** went 1-for-4 in last night's game...he has hit safely in his last 8 games (7/31-c), batting .379 (11x29) with 3 runs, 2 homers, 5 RBI and 2 stolen bases during the span...Julio is also approaching his 5th-consecutive 20+ homer season and with 2 more home runs would become the 8th player since 2022 to record 5 seasons with 20+ home runs, joining Pete Alonso-NYM/BAL, Rafael Devers-BOS/SF, Manny Machado-SD, Matt Olson-ATL, Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD, Kyle Schwarber-PHI and Juan Soto-3Tms...he would also join Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodríguez as the only Mariners players to accomplish the feat at age 25-or-younger.

COLE "COLE YOUNG" YOUNG...in 21 games since the All-Star Break, **Cole Young** is batting .305 (25x82) with 9 runs, 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and 6 walks, reaching base at a .360 clip and slugging .476 for an .835 OPS over 89 plate appearances...Young ranks as the best second baseman in the American League this season by *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement (3.7).

RANDYLAND...**Randy Arozarena** faces off against his former team this weekend...Randy played for the Rays from 2020-24, where he was an All-Star (2023), Rookie of the Year (2001) and ALCS MVP (2020)...Randy was acquired by the Mariners on July 26, 2024...in 110 games this season, Randy is batting .279 (113x405) with 73 runs, 24 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 49 RBI, 20 stolen bases, a .372 OBP and slugging .447 for an .819 OPS and 136 OPS+...Randy leads MLB left fielders with 3.3 Wins Above Replacement (*FanGraphs*) and ranks T-14th among all qualified hitters in OPS+.

FUEGO FROM THE 'PEN...closer **Andrés Muñoz** has recorded three consecutive 20+ save campaigns, joining Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) as the only Mariners with three consecutive 20+ save seasons...Muñoz also has 98 saves in his career, inching closer in becoming the 40th pitcher in MLB history to record 100 saves by age 27-or-younger...97 of his 98 saves have come with the Mariners (1 with San Diego), 3 saves shy of becoming the fourth pitcher in Seattle history with 100+ saves,joining Sasaki (129 SV), Edwin Díaz (109) and J.J. Putz (101).

STEFEN ROMERO WINS FIRST EVER ALUMNI HOME RUN DERBY...on Friday, the Mariners hosted the first ever Alumni Home Run Derby...former Mariners outfielder **Stefen Romero** (2014-16) edged out current Mariners Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola** in the final round by a 12-11 score to earn the title of Derby champion...the 5 other Derby participants included Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki**, along with **Mike Cameron**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith**, **Ryon Healy** and **Bucky Jacobsen**.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Emerson Hancock** is set to make his 22nd start of the season today, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that today also marks the 3 year anniversary of his Major League debut?...on Aug. 9, 2023, Hancock debuted against the San Diego Padres, spinning 5.0 innings of 1-run ball.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 9

- **1988** - Alvin Davis becomes the Mariners all-time home run leader with his 106th career home run off of California's Mike Witt.
- **2005** - Félix Hernández earns first MLB win, tossing 8.0 innings in a 1-0 win over Minnesota.
- **2010** - Mariners dismiss manager Don Wakamatsu.
- **2014** - Lou Piniella became the 8th member of the Mariners Hall of Fame in a pre-game ceremony.
- **2018** - The Mariners hit for the cycle in reverse order to start the game against the Astros, becoming the first team in the live-ball era (since 1920) to have its first four batters of a game hit for the cycle in reverse order. Seattle won the game 8-6.
- **2022** - The Mariners win an instant classic over the Yankees, 1-0 in 13 innings...Mariners starter Luis Castillo tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his T-Mobile Park debut, while the Mariners bullpen tossed 5.0 innings of hitless relief...Luis Torrens plated the winning run with a pinch-hit, walk-off single in the bottom of the 13th.
- **2023** - **Emerson Hancock** makes MLB debut against Padres...Hancock was selected by the Mariners with the 6th overall pick in the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- **2025** - The Mariners retired Ichiro Suzuki's #51 in a pregame ceremony, where he joined Ken Griffey Jr. (#24), Edgar Martinez (#11) and Jackie Robinson (#42, retired across MLB) as the only numbers retired by the Mariners.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season and the 53rd of his career...this will be his 59th career appearance, including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 2nd appearance of the season (2nd start) and 4th career appearance (2nd start) against the Rays.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...on August 4 vs. Detroit, tossed 6.0 innings with 4 runs allowed (3 ER) on 8 hits (1 HR) and 2 walks while striking out 6 batters...is his 6th outing with 6+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks and his 8th quality start with 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks, tied for 10th most in the AL this season.

THIS SUMMER SURE IS HOT...has allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his last 3 starts with 2 of the 3 being quality starts...in 5 of his last 6 starts, extending back to June 28, Hancock has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP with 5+ strikeouts in 4 of the 5...over 6 starts since June 28, owns a 2.59 ERA (9 ER, 31.1 IP) for his best ERA over a 6 game span this season.

ON HIS TURF NOW...will be facing the Rays for the first time at T-Mobile Park...has faced Tampa Bay twice in relief entering the 2026 season and made 1 start against them this season, logging only 1.2 innings due to leaving in the 2nd inning after being struck by a come backer...all 4 occasions have been at the Rays home ballpark...in 2 of his 3 outings, both 1.2-or-fewer innings, Hancock has struck out 2 batters...in his start this season he did not allow a hit through his 1.2 innings of work.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE...across 11 home starts this season, owns a 3.08 ERA (22 ER, 64.1 IP), 14 walks and 68 strikeouts for a 4.86 K/BB and a 0.964 WHIP...his WHIP at home ranks 8th while his 4.86 K/BB ranks 14th-best in MLB (min. 50.0 IP)...among AL pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) his 27.6 K% in home games ranks 13th-best and his ERA ranks 13th-lowest...has recorded 5.0+ IP in all 11 home starts this season, allowing 3-or-fewer runs in 10 of the 11.

WFH TODAY...Hancock recorded back-to-back home starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed over his last 2 July appearances at home, marking the 2nd time in his career he has recorded such starts in consecutive home games (last: 5/2-5/15)...has allowed 2-or-fewer runs while tossing 5+ strikeouts over 6.0+ IP in 5 outings at home, tied for 8th most in MLB...the Mariners 26 such games this season are most in MLB...is 1-of-9 pitchers in MLB with 6+ home starts with 6-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP, along with **Bryan Woo** (7 G) and **Logan Gilbert** (6 G)...allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his first 7 home games of the season, becoming the 7th Mariners pitcher all-time to do so (last: J.A. Happ, 2015).

SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUNSHINE...will be making his 9th day start of the season in today's game...owns a 2.83 ERA (41.1 IP, 13 ER) with 35 strikeouts, 13 walks, and a 1.113 WHIP while limiting opposing batters to a .217 (33x152) batting average over 8 day starts....the Mariners are 5-3 over those 8 starts...has tossed 5.0+ innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in 6 of his 8 outings with 4 quality starts...2 of his 3 scoreless outings over 6.0+ IP have taken place during the day...in his first day start of the season on March 29 vs. Cleveland, did not allow a hit, walked only 1 batter and struck out 9 over 6.0 innings of work to become 1-of-9 pitchers to allow no hits over 6.0+ IP this season...is 1-of-2 to do so with 9+ strikeouts.

QUALITY CONTROL...in his last home start on Aug. 8 vs. DET, recorded his 11th quality start of the season and his 3rd over his last 5 starts since the start of July...owns 7 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks, tied for 10th most such starts in the AL (4 others)...has recorded a quality start with 5+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks in 6 starts this season, tied for 8th most in the AL (4 others)...the Mariners are 10-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since the start of 2025.

NO FREE PASSES...has allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 19-of-21 appearances this season, tied for 6th most in the AL...his 2.24 BB/9 is 10th best in the AL (min. 100.0 IP)...has contributed 11 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks (last: 8/4 vs. DET) to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd-most such games (59) in 2026.
