SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

TONIGHT'S TV BROADCAST: Tonight's game @ Reds will simulcast on DBACKS.TV with Steve Berthiaume and Luis Gonzalez and FS1 with Kevin Kugler and Tom Verducci.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 6-2 @ Reds last night.

- ◆ **Corbin Carroll** tied for a career high with 5 RBI while he marked his second multi-hit performance in as many games.
- ◆ **Ketel Marte** hit his seventh home run of 2024 and second in as many games...he has hit safely in his 8 straight games.
- ◆ **Zac Gallen** made his first start since April 26 (11 days), earning his fourth win (0 ER in 6.0 IP, 6 K).
- ◆ **Paul Sewald** made his first appearance of the season in the ninth inning (1 ER in 1.0 IP, K).

VS. REDS: Over their last 21 matchups vs. Reds, the D-backs are 12-9 overall...in their last 11 on the road, they are 6-5.

SERIES OPENING W: The D-backs collected their second series-opening victory of the season and first since Opening Night on March 28 vs. Rockies (W, 16-1).

CORBIN BARRELS IS BACK: Last night, **Corbin Carroll's** 5 RBI tied a career high (also: June 9, 2023 @ Tigers).

- ◆ It was the first time this season Carroll collected 2+ hits and 2+ RBI in consecutive games and third time overall in his career (also: Aug. 22-24, 2023 and June 7-9, 2023).
- ◆ It was his fifth career back-to-back multi-RBI performance.

THREE STRAIGHT FOR CORBIN: Last night, **Corbin Carroll** became the first D-back ever to homer in 3 consecutive games @ Great American Ball Park (July 22-23 2023 and last night)...the last NL player to homer in 3 consecutive games was Christian Yelich/MIL (July 15, 2023-April 8, 2024)...only 2 previous NL West opposing players have ever homered in 4 straight games (Troy Tulowitzki/COL, June 4, 2013-May 10, 2014 and Matt Kemp/LAD, Aug. 29, 2009-April 21, 2010).

◆ **Fun fact:** Current D-back and former Reds infielder **Eugenio Suárez** tied for the longest streak of games with a home run @ Great American Ball Park with 5 from July 23-27, 2018 (also: Adam Dunn/CIN in 2008 and Jim Edmonds/STL in 2004).

5+ RBI FROM THE LEADOFF: Per Stats LLC, **Corbin Carroll** became the third D-back leadoff hitter (fourth time) to collect 5+ RBI in a game (also: Chris Young, 7/2/2010 & 9/2/2006) and Steve Finley (4/26/2001).

BACK 2 BACK: **Corbin Carroll** and **Ketel Marte** marked the second occurrence of back-to-back homers this season in the top of the seventh inning [both off Justin Wilson] (also: March 29 vs. COL in BOT 1 by Lourdes Gurriel Jr. & Christian Walker off Cal Quantrill).

FOR YOUR GALL-ENTERTAINMENT: Since 2022, **Zac Gallen's** 13 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are the most in the Majors, ahead of Corbin Burnes/BAL (12), Blake Snell/SF (11) Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

NEW MONTH FOR NEWMAN: **Kevin Newman** has hit safely in 3 of his 4 games so far in May...he has notched a hit in 3 straight games, batting .444 (4-for-9) with only 1 strikeout.

SCORING FIRST: The D-backs marked their 14th win last night when scoring first in the game...oppositely, Arizona is 2-11 when opponents score first in a game.

SEEING IT WELL VS. CINCY: Since 2022, **Corbin Carroll's** 1.566 OPS vs. Reds ranks atop all active hitters (min. 30 PA) while **Ketel Marte's** 1.238 OPS is third.

- ◆ In his 8 career games vs. Reds, Carroll is hitting .407 (11-for-27) with 1 double, 2 triples, 4 home runs, 10 runs, 10 RBI and 7 walks...7 of his 11 hits are for extras.
- ◆ Marte, in his last 7 games @ Great American Ball Park, is hitting .480 (12-for-25)/.581 OBP/1.000 SLG with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 7 RBI and 5 walks.

CLEAN FIELDING: Since April 22, the D-backs have made 2 errors (one being Catcher's Interference), which are tied for fewest in the Majors (also: Orioles).

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: **Ketel Marte's** 2.4 bWAR is fourth among all players (pitcher or position), behind Mookie Betts/LAD (3.3), Bobby Witt Jr./KC (2.8) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (2.6).

D-BACKS MINOR LEAGUE APRIL MONTHLY HONORS: Yesterday, the D-backs named Double-A Amarillo INF **Deyvison De Los Santos** and High-A Hillsboro RHP **Billy Corcoran** the organization's Minor League Player- and Pitcher-of-the-Month for April.

- ◆ De Los Santos hit .376 (32-for-85)/1.112 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 18 RBI, 7 walks, 1 stolen base and 18 runs scored while reaching safely in 20 of 21 games with the Sod Poodles.
- ◆ Corcoran went 2-0 with a 2.53 ERA (7 R-6 ER in 21.1 IP), .259 opponents average (21-for-81), 5 walks and 28 strikeouts in 4 starts (2 quality) with the Hops.

NEXT STARTER: RHP SLADE CECCONI (1-2, 4.96)

- ◆ Took the loss in his last start on May 3 vs. Padres (6 ER in 4.1 IP).
- ◆ In his previous 2 starts, went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER in 12.0 IP) with only 1 walk allowed and 11 strikeouts.
- ◆ In his lone start vs. Reds last season on Aug. 27, 2023, went decisionless after allowing 1 run on 3 hits through 5.2 innings in the 5-2 win @ Chase Field.

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: In his eighth MLB season...has spent seasons with the Yankees (2017-22), Cardinals (2022-23) and Rangers (2023).

- Signed by the D-backs as a free agent on March 29.
- Has 3 consecutive seasons (2021-23) of 30+ starts and 150.0+ innings.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Fourth start and third road start of 2024.

- In 2 road starts, is 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 ER in 13.0 IP), .224 average (11-for-49), 0.92 WHIP, 1 walk and 7 strikeouts.
- In his last 5 regular season road starts dating back to Sept. 13, 2023, is 2-1 with a 1.73 ERA (5 ER in 26.0 IP), .211 opponent average (20-for-95), 0.92 WHIP, 4 walks and 15 strikeouts.

LAST START: Made his D-backs home debut on May 1 vs. Dodgers (L; 6 ER in 3.0 IP).

VS. REDS: In 4 career starts (2 quality) vs. Reds, is 2-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) with 25 strikeouts and just 2 homers allowed.

- Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start vs. Reds on June 9, 2023 while with the Cardinals (3 H, 1 BB, 6 K).

VS. NL CENTRAL: Has posted quality starts in 3 of his last 4 outings.

D-BACKS DEBUT: Earned the win in his D-backs debut on April 19 (6.0 IP, 1 R, 4 H, 0 BB, 3 K) in a 17-1 victory @ Giants.

LIMITING LEFTIES: In his career (540 PA), has held lefties to a .220/.258/.314 slash line with 11 homers, 20 walks and 126 strikeouts.

- His .572 opponent OPS vs. lefties is third among active starters (min. 500 LHB faced) to Chris Sale (.531) and Clayton Kershaw (.561).
- Has issued walks to just 3 of 215 (1.4%) left-handed batters faced since 2022, the lowest walk pct. against lefties in MLB (min. 200 LH batters faced).

IT'S UNDER CONTROL: Has 2 or fewer walks in his last 12 regular-season road starts, including 8 starts with 1 walk and 1 start with no walks.

INNING BREAKDOWN: In his last 5 road starts tossing 6.0+ innings, is 2-1 with a 1.32 ERA (5 ER in 34.0 IP), .200 average (24-for-120), 0.85 WHIP, 5 walks and 37 strikeouts.

- In innings 1-5 on the road, owns a 0.90 ERA (1 ER in 10.0 IP) .171 opponent average (6-for-35), 0.70 WHIP, 1 walk and 6 strikeouts.
- Is 31-15 with a 2.32 ERA (114 R-105 ER in 407.2 IP), 0.97 WHIP, .208 average (311-1494) and 359 strikeouts when he pitches 6.0+ innings (64 GS).

BATTERS 4-6: Is holding batters 4-6 in a lineup to a .167 average (5-for-30) with 4 walks, 9 strikeouts and 80.0% out rate.

- On the road, hitters 4-6 are batting .143 (3-for-21) with 1 walk, 7 strikeouts and 78.6% out rate.

RISPY BUSINESS: On the road, is holding runners in scoring position to a .111 average (1-for-9) with 4 strikeouts.

PITCH BREAKDOWN: Is limiting opponents to a .143 average (2-for-14) with 3 strikeouts off his curveball.

FIRST PITCH SUCCESS: His first-pitch swing (37.3) and first-pitch strike (70.1) percentages are career-highs.

2023 RECAP: Earned All-MLB Second-Team honors after going 10-11, 3.20 ERA (67 ER in 188.2 IP) with 166 strikeouts in 32 starts between the Cardinals (21 GS) and Rangers (11 GS).

- Ranked among MLB qualifiers in home runs per 9.0 innings (7th, 0.86) and ERA (8th, 3.20).
- Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins (10), innings (188.2) and strikeouts (166) in 2023.
- Started the season with the Cardinals, going 6-9 with a 3.42 ERA (46 ER in 121.0 IP) over 21 starts with 108 strikeouts and 35 walks allowed...ranked among NL leaders in quality starts (T-7th, 12) and ERA (9th, 3.42).
- Was acquired by the Rangers on July 30 in a trade with the Cardinals along with RHP Chris Stratton in exchange for LHP John King, INF/OF Tommy Saggese and RHP T.K. Roby.
- Went 4-2 with a 2.79 ERA (21 ER in 67.2 IP), 58 strikeouts and 13 walks over 11 starts (8 quality) as a Ranger...ranked among AL leaders from Aug. 1-end of season in innings (4th), opp. OPS (7th, .630) and ERA (8th).
- His 1.71 ERA in June (6 ER in 31.2 IP) was his lowest in any month of his career with more than 1 start.

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: In 6 postseason games (5 starts), went 3-1 with a 2.90 ERA (10 ER in 31.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts with the World Series Champion Rangers.

- Went 3-0 with a 1.83 ERA (5 R-4 ER in 19.2 IP, 14 K) in 4 road games (3 starts).

GO GAMECOCKS: Attended the University of South Carolina from 2012-14.

- Was teammates with D-backs first baseman Christian Walker in 2012, when they finished as National runner-ups after falling to the University of Arizona.
- Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in his first College World Series appearance, defeating Arkansas 2-0, on June 21, 2012.

HOW HE STARTED: Yankees fourth-round pick in the 2014 draft out of South Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on April 12, 2017 for the Yankees @ Rays (8-4 win, ND, 4.2 IP, 5 H, 3 R-2 ER, 2 BB, 67 K).
