BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their Antepenultimate homestand this afternoon when they play the series rubber game of a three-game series with the Colorado Rockies...the Redbirds will host the Philadelphia Phillies for a three-game series beginning tomorrow night in what will be their first meeting of the season with Philadelphia...the Cardinals have 45 games remaining in the regular season with 19 at home and 26 on the road.

HARD RUBBER: St. Louis is playing its 15th series-breaking rubber game of the season today, going 7-7 in the previous 14 including a 3-4 mark in their previous rubber games at Busch Stadium - the last rubber game win at Busch coming on April 15 vs. Cleveland.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 15.0 games behind 1st place Milwaukee; 1.0 game ahead of 4th place Pittsburgh and 3.5 games out of the final National League Wild Card position...the Cardinals are 5-5 in their last 10 games, 7-13 in last 20 and 11-19 in last 30...they are 30-34 vs. teams that are currently above .500 and 28-25 vs. sub .500 teams.

KEYSTONE COMBO: The Cardinals keystone led by Gold Glove shortstop **Masyn Winn** and rookie 2nd sacker **JJ Wetherholt** is leading all of MLB by far in Middle Infield Fielding Run Value according to *Baseball Savant*...the Cardinals keystone fielders have recorded a **31 FRV** that is more than **DOUBLE** the next closest team, the Chicago Cubs (15).

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: Winn and Wetherholt hold the top MLB total for starting middle infielders in doubleplays (138) with Winn ranking 2nd among all MLB shortstops (74) and JJ ranking a near 2nd at second base with 64.

REDBIRD ROOKIES: Not including pitchers or the designated hitter, the Cardinals position player rookies have totaled a combined 275 games started this season...Cardinals rookies combined for 157 starts all of last season...**JJ Wetherholt's** 105 starts at 2nd base are the most among Cardinals rookies at 2B since 1960 when Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** started 119 and **Blaze Jordan's** 33 starts at the Hot Corner are the most by a Cardinals rookie since **Tommy Edman** (41) in 2019.

HEAD FOR THE MOUNTAINS OF BUSCH: The Cardinals .714 home win pct. (50-20) vs. the Rockies is its best against any opponent since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006 ... St. Louis has won the season series vs. the Rockies 22 times in 32 seasons since Colorado joined MLB as an expansion team in 1993.

THE GOOD EYE GUY: **JJ Wetherholt**, who has gone without a multi-strikeout game since July 26 vs. CIN, owns a 6.52 plate appearances/strikeout ratio, the best by a Cardinals rookie since **Albert Pujols'** 7.27 in 2001...it's the top mark among LH-hitting Redbird rookies since **Bake McBride** (10.96) in 1974.

DH DAMAGE: While splitting his time at DH and catcher in 2026, **Iván Herrera's** 22 extra base hits as a DH are two shy of his 24 from last season and three back of **Albert Pujols** (2022) club single-season record 25 (HR-15, 2B-10)...**Herrera's** next double would be a Cardinals single season DH record at 13 and he's 4 HR's shy of **AP's** team record 15 for a DH in 2022.

IT ALL STARTS HERE: Cardinals starting pitchers have provided the team with excellent stability, pitching to a 4.00 ERA that ranks 4th in the NL behind Division leaders MIL (3.45), LAD (3.52) and ATL (3.74)...the Cardinals 44 Quality Starts rank 3rd in the loop behind just the Dodgers (61) and Phillies (50).

HOLDING IT TOGETHER: The Cardinals bullpen corps rank 2nd in the NL with 77 Holds, behind Atlanta (85)...**Ryne Stanek** is ranked 2nd in the NL in Holds (21) and **George Soriano** is T-7th (17)...**Stanek** matched his single-season high from 2021 with HOU with his 21st Hold in Friday night's win...the Cardinals single-season Holds record was set in 2008 (106)...the Redbirds totaled 93 Holds last season...**Riley O'Brien's** 28 saves rank 2nd to the Padres **Mason Miller** (29) for tops in the NL.

RED JACKET BIRTHDAYS: National Baseball Hall of Famer/Cardinals Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** celebrates his 77th birthday today along with fellow Cardinals Hall of Fame Red Jacket members **Julián Javier** (90) and **Matt Morris** (52).

Cardinals Assistant General Manager **Randy Flores** pitched in 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Rockies Special Assistant **Clint Hurdle** played in 78 games for St. Louis in 1986.

Rockies Bullpen Coach **Matt Buschmann** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Lafayette High School in Wildwood, Mo.

TJ Rumfield's father, **Toby Rumfield**, played in 13 games for Memphis (AAA) in 2002 where he was teammates with **Stubby Clapp**.

Jaden Hill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 38th round of the 2018 MLB draft, but did not sign Louisiana State University.

National Baseball Hall of Fame outfielder **Larry Walker** played for Colorado (1995-04) and St. Louis (2004-05); member of 2004 NL Champions.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Holliday** was originally selected by Colorado in the 7th round of the 1998 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons for the Rockies (2004-08, '18) where he was a three-time All-Star and appeared in the 2007 World Series.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is Boulder native...graduated from Centaurus High School in Lafayette...worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist **Benjamin Hochman** previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

Rockies MLB.com **Thomas Harding** covered the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) for two seasons for the Commercial Appeal (1998-99)...mentored recent Cardinals MLB.com writer **Anne Rogers**.

TODAY'S START:

- Making his 23rd start of the season, continuing to add to his career-high in starts and appearances.
- Allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of his 22 starts this season; his 13 starts of 6.0+ IP and 2 or fewer runs allowed trailing only Cristopher Sanchez (PHI), Eduardo Rodriguez (ARI) and Cam Schlitler (NYY) with 14.**
- Since making his MLB debut (July 31, 2024), leads qualifying Cardinals starting pitchers in WHIP (1.18) and Hits/9 (8.66).
- Has held his opposition to 3 runs or fewer in 9 of 11 home starts this season (2-4, 3.28 ERA, 60.2 IP).
- Is 1-2 with a 2.68 ERA in 8 day games starts this season with an 1.02 WHIP. Lowest day tilt ERA among Cardinals starters and has allowed more than two runs in a day game just two times (at DET, 4/3 - 3 R & vs. ARI, 7/23 - 4 R).
- Distributes pitches well ranking among N.L. leaders in Pct. Pitches Taken (55.0%, 4th), Pct. Pitches Put in Play (19.5%, 7th) and **Pct. Swings Put In Play (43.3%, 1st)**.
- Has made 22 career appearances (20 starts) at Busch Stadium where he is 7-7 with a 3.89 ERA (120.1 IP).
- The Cardinals are 23-18 (.561 win pct.) in his 41 career games started.
- Has yet to issue more than three walks in any of his first 41 career starts, longest such streak to begin a career by a Cardinal. Seattle's **George Kirby** leads active leaders with 132.
- Has pitched 6.0+ innings in 26 of 41 career starts (22 quality starts), including seven of his last 11 since June 1.
- Allowed 1 run or fewer with 6.0+ IP in a four-start stretch (April 26-May 14), the longest such streak by a Cardinal since **Adam Wainwright** had four straight starts from Sept. 2-18, 2019.
- Since joining the rotation June 8, 2025, St. Louis has won 20 of his starts - three shy of **Matthew Liberatore** for the most among all STL starters.

LAST TIME OUT (Monday, August 3 at New York Yankees): ND, W, 13-7; 4.1 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR; 91 pitches

- Was removed after a 91 pitch count twice through the order facing 18 batters, the last of which was a 2-run HR by Austin Wells, the first by a Cardinals starting pitcher in 35.0 innings
- Held his opposition to two runs for the 15th start this season but only pitched 4.1 innings.
- Pitched less than 6.0 innings in consecutive starts for the first time since 5/20 & 5/26; only the 3rd time this season.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: Has induced 12 grounded into double plays - a new career high.

HERE COMES THE SUN...: His 2.68 ERA (47.0 IP/14 ER) in Day games is tops among all Cardinals pitchers with 29-to-8 strikeout to walks ratio, however has allowed 7 of 15 HR in his 8 afternoon starts.

EMPTY HANDED: The Cardinals have given him 2 runs of support or fewer in 13 of his starts. The Cardinals have been shut out five times this season, four of which were when McGreevy starts.

FAITH IN FIELDERS: Has the NL's lowest percent (18.7) of Swing & Miss and 12th-best BABIP (.272). His difference in Opponent BA (.252) vs. xBA (.289) ranks 4th among qualified MLB starting pitchers (-.037).

NESTING: Has worked at least 5.0 innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in eight of his 11 home starts this season, and did so in each of his 1st four starts before allowing three runs in his May 20 start vs. PIT.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Celebrated his 26th birthday on July 8 with a 5-1 win over division-leading Milwaukee, limiting the Brew Crew to one run over a season-high 6.1 innings. **HAPPY IT HAPPENED:** Had a 14.0 scoreless innings streak that covered portions of three starts from April 26-May 8 snapped on a leadoff HR by **Nick Kurtz** that was his only run allowed during a 6.0-inning start 5/14 at ATH during a 5-4 St. Louis victory.

ONE-HIT WONDER: Struck out a career-high nine batters at SD (May 8) over 6.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball at Petco Park in a 6-0 Cardinals win.

DODGE BALL: Blanked the Dodgers on 3 hits over 6.0 IP in a 3-2 win on May 2 as the Cardinals turned 4 double plays behind him.

"NO" NEWS IS GOOD NEWS: Retired the first nine batters en route to 6.0 no-hit innings in his first start of the season vs. TB (3/28) in a no decision the Cardinals won in 10 innings (6-5).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: Became the first Cardinal to throw 6.0+ no-hit innings in a completed start since **Erick Fedde** on April 9, 2025 at Pittsburgh (6.0 IP). Since 1961, the Cardinals record for the longest hitless inning streak as a starter (excluding any possible intervening relief appearances) to begin a season is 8.0 IP by **Daniel Ponce de Leon** - July 23, 2018 (7.0 IP) and Aug. 21, 2018 (1.0 IP) - *Elias*

RARE BIRD: In his season debut on 3/28 vs. TB, became the 2nd pitcher in team history with a hitless start within his first 2 starts (**Jack Flaherty** 4/1/23 vs. TOR) and the 14th time in MLB a pitcher has in a start of 6.0+ IP. **Emerson Hancock** (SEA) had 6.0 no-hit innings vs. CLE the next day.

McGREEVY vs. COLORADO:

- Making his 4th start vs. the Rockies with a 1-0 record and 3.50 ERA over 18.0 innings.
- Cardinals won both his starts at Coors Field; a 7-3 no decision on Sept. 24, 2024 and a 6-2 win on July 21, 2025.
- Received a no decision in his most recent start, a Cardinals 6-5 loss at Busch Stadium as JoJo Romero surrendered a 9th inning two-run home run to Hunter Goodman with the win in-hand leading 5-4.
- Pitched a 2025 season-high 7.0 innings in his start at Coors Field on 7/21/25; was one of 12 opposing pitchers to eclipse 7.0+ innings at Coors Field in 2025 (2nd youngest to Keider Montero, DET). Only Chris Sale (4/30) and Yoshinobu Yamamoto (8/18) did not leave with wins.
- Surrendered his first career Major League home run to Aaron Schunk (9/24/24).
