The Mariners and Astros meet for their first of 4 series matchups this season...they are set to square off 13 times in 2026, including a 2-game series during the Mariners final homestand of the regular season:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners play the second game of a 4 game homestand against the Houston Astros (1-0)...following the series, the Mariners will travel to San Diego for a 3 game set before returning back to T-Mobile Park for a 6 game homestand against the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/17-19) and Athletics (3 G, 4/20-22)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call, with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night's series opener against the Houston Astros by a 9-6 score...Seattle has won the last 4-consecutive games against Houston dating back to Sept. 19, 2025.

- Division Foes** - Since 2023, the Mariners are 26-14 (.650) against the Houston Astros, going 12-8 (.600) at T-Mobile Park during the stretch.
- Long Division** - The Mariners today are playing their eighth of 10 consecutive divisional games...from April 3-22, Seattle is playing an AL West Division opponent in 16 of 19 games.
- Down on the Farm** - Yesterday, Mariners no. 1 pitching prospect **Kade Anderson** struck out 11 batters and allowed just 2 walks over 5.0 innings of work in his 2nd career professional start with Double-A Arkansas.

THEY CALL HIM LA PIEDRA...starter **Luis Castillo** is 40-31 with a 3.45 ERA (260 ER, 628.0 IP) and 644 strikeouts in 108 career starts with Seattle...since his 2022 season, "The Rock" has recorded 72 quality starts (62 with Seattle), the 4th most such games by any MLB starter during that span...in his first start of the season on March 30 vs. New York-AL, he notched his 1,500th career strikeout, becoming one of 16 active starts in the Majors to reach the milestone.

WELCOME TO RANDYLAND...**Randy Arozarena** last night hit his first home run of the season, a go-ahead 2-run shot in the 5th inning...in 14 games to begin his 2026 campaign, he is batting .271 (13x48) with 3 doubles, 1 homer, 6 RBI, 8 walks, 3 stolen bases and 3 HBP, reaching base at a .407 clip...last night, he recorded his 101st career HBP, the 4th most in the Majors since his debut in 2019.

LIGHTS OUT IN THE 'PEN...the Seattle bullpen owns a 2.47 ERA (12 ER, 43.2 IP) that ranks 3rd best in the Majors this season...their 1.03 WHIP leads the American League and ranks 2nd in MLB...they also rank 3rd among Major League bullpens in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.67), 3rd lowest in walk rate (6.9%), 7th in opponent batting average (.210) and 8th in strikeout rate (25.4%)...**Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 4.2 IP) and 0.43 WHIP that ranks 7th in MLB in 5 appearances this season...closer **Andrés Muñoz** has posted a 40.0% strikeout rate that ranks 7th among Major League relievers this season (min. 5.0 IP).

TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...since 2023, Seattle owns a 149-102 (.594) record when playing at T-Mobile Park, **the best home record in the American League** and 4th best in the Majors during that span...Seattle has drawn 283,972 fans so far this season, the 2nd highest attendance total in the AL and 5th highest total across MLB in 2026.

ICHIRO'S STATUE UNVEILED...yesterday, **Ichiro Suzuki** became the third Mariners legend to be honored with a statue outside of the ballpark, joining Ken Griffey Jr. and Edgar Martínez...legendary broadcaster Dave Niehaus is also honored with a statue on the centerfield concourse...the celebrations will continue on Sunday, where the first 15,000 fans can secure an Ichiro Statue T-Shirt.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...upcoming events and promotions on the homestand include **Humpy Shoulder Plush Night** tonight, **Ichiro Statue T-Shirt Day** tomorrow and the first **Value Game** of the season on Monday...the first 40,000 fans last night received an **Ichiro Replica Statue**...tickets and more information can be found at Mariners.com/Tickets.

"THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW" RETURNS...**"The Cal Raleigh Show"** presented by the Puyallup Tribe returns for a second season on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)**...the show, hosted by Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer**, features in-depth conversations with Mariners star catcher, **Cal Raleigh**...the program will air **every Thursday**, usually at 5:00 p.m. PT, moving into an earlier slot when the Mariners play in different timezones...catch all of the episodes on SeattleSports.com or on the Seattle Sports app.

MARINERS TV...Mariners TV brings Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming is be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including Xfinity, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners drew 10 walks in last night's game, the most walks drawn by Seattle batters in a single game since April 21, 2022 vs. Texas, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that 4 players (**J.P. Crawford**, **Cal Raleigh**, **Cole Young** and **Leo Rivas**) also recorded individual multi-walk games last night, which is the most such Mariners to record 2+ walks in a game since 2018?...on June 25, 2018, Nelson Cruz, Guillermo Heredia, Chirs Herrmann and Jean Segura each tallied 2 walks a piece...only 14 times in franchise history have 4-or-more players drawn multiple walks in a single game...a franchise record 5 players each drew multiple walks on May 9, 2002.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 11

- 1984** - Rookie first baseman Alvin Davis makes his MLB debut and becomes the second Mariner to homer in his first ML game, a three-run homer off Dennis Eckersley, in his second at-bat...Davis went on to win the American League Rookie of the Year award for 1984.
- 1996** - Dan Wilson becomes the fifth Mariner to hit three home runs in a game in a 9-1 win at Detroit.
- 2001** - Ichiro guns down Oakland's Terrance Long at third base (trying to advance from 1st base), in a play that is now known as "the throw".
- 2002** - Edgar Martínez scores a run in Seattle's 8-4 win at Anaheim...it is the 1,063rd run scored in his career, surpassing Ken Griffey Jr. as the Mariners' all-time leader in runs scored.
- 2014** - Félix Hernández strikes out 11 batters in 7.0+ innings to lead the Mariners to a 6-4 win over the A's...Felix becomes the 5th starting pitcher in club history to open a season by winning his first 3 starts (beginning the season in the starting rotation).
- 2025** - With the go-ahead 2-run homer in the bottom of the 8th inning in a 5-3 win over the Rangers, **Cal Raleigh** made history, hitting his 96th career home run, snapping the tie with Mike Zunino for the most home runs by a catcher in franchise history.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 3rd start of 2026 and his 246th career start...it will also be his 1st start of the season against the Astros and his 10th career start against Houston.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on April 5 at Los Angeles Angels, tossed 3.2 innings and allowed 4 runs (3 ER) on 6 hits and 1 walk with 4 strikeouts...he tossed 84 pitches (53 strikes) in his second start of the season...marked his shortest start since tossing 3.0 innings on Sept. 8, 2024 at St. Louis when he left early due to injury.

HOME SWEET HOME...is making his 2nd home start of the season, last tossing 6.0 shutout innings vs. NYY on March 30...across 57 starts at home as a Mariners starter, he is 22-14 with a 2.75 ERA (104 ER, 340.0 IP) and has thrown 6.0+ IP in 40 of those starts with the Mariners going 30-10 when he tosses 6.0+ innings at home.

HOW HE FARES...among Mariners pitchers with 50+ home starts, he leads in ERA (2.75) and in opponents batting average (.202), ranks 2nd in WHIP (0.988) behind rotation-mate Logan Gilbert (0.986), 2nd in SO/9 (10.16), and 10th in strikeouts (384).

LAST 10...across his last 10 home starts since June 18, 2025, he is 3-2 with a 2.54 ERA (17 ER, 60.1 IP) and 64 strikeouts to 12 walks allowed...he has tossed 6.0+ IP in 7 of those 10 starts with the team going 6-1 in those starts.

GETTING STARTED...across 21 starts in March/April as a Mariner (since 2023), he is 8-6 with a 2.97 ERA (39 ER, 118.1 IP), 126 strikeouts, 1.166 WHIP, and 9.58 SO/9 compared to his 33 walks and just 9 home runs allowed.

HEATED RIVALRY...is making his second consecutive start against an AL West rival team...went 2-2 with a 2.37 ERA (15 ER, 57.0 IP) and 47 strikeouts across 10 starts against AL West teams last season...is 15-10 with a 3.10 ERA (77 ER, 223.2 IP) and 231 strikeouts to 60 walks allowed across 38 career starts against AL West teams...is also 8-5 with a 2.72 ERA (33 ER, 109.1 IP) and 119 strikeouts across 19 home starts vs. AL West teams as a Mariner.

AGAINST HOUSTON...is making his 10th career start against Houston and his 9th with the Mariners...in his last appearance vs. Houston on July 18, 2025, he tossed 6.2 shutout innings at T-Mobile Park...he has spun 6.0+ innings in 8 of his 9 career starts against Houston, tossing a quality start in 6 total starts vs. the Astros.

IN COMMAND...has tossed 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks in 54 career games since 2023 (last: 3/30 vs. NYY), the 4th-most in MLB across that span, trailing only Logan Webb (68 G), Zack Wheeler (59 G) and teammate George Kirby (57 G).

1,500...collected his 1,500th career strikeout on a swinging strikeout to Yankees batter Aaron Judge in the 6th inning of his March 30 start vs. Yankees...he became just the 7th pitcher to throw 1,500 career strikeouts since 2017.

STEERING THE SHIP...across 108 career starts in a Mariners uniform since 2022, he has gone 5.0+ innings in 99 of those starts, 6.0+ innings in 68 starts, and 7.0+ innings in 22 starts...in his start on Aug. 26, 2025 vs. San Diego, recorded his 600th strikeout with Seattle, becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 600+ strikeouts.

WHO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.43 ERA (241 ER, 628.0 IP) with Seattle is the 5th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), and ranking ahead of teammates George Kirby (3.59) and Logan Gilbert (3.62)...his 644 strikeouts with the Mariners ranks 11th in franchise history while both his 1.145 WHIP and 9.2 SO/9 each rank 4th-best...with his next win (41 W), he joins John Halama, James Paxton and Bill Swift, tied for the 17th most wins in a Mariners uniform.

LA PIEDRA...among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he is 5th in quality starts (136), 6th in both games started (245) and innings pitched (1420.1), 7th in total strikeouts (1504) and 12th in wins (84).

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES...is one of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining Gerrit Cole, Aaron Nola, Max Scherzer, and Zack Wheeler...also ranks 4th in the league in swinging strikeouts since 2017 with 1,249 swinging strikeouts, trailing Max Scherzer (1,315), Kevin Gausman (1,290), and Gerrit Cole (1,262).

2025 TOTALS...went 11-8 with a 3.54 ERA (76 ER, 180.2 IP), 46 walks, 162 strikeouts and a 1.19 WHIP across 32 starts last season.

TOP OF CLASS...held a 3.54 ERA last season, his 7th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA (2019-25), tied for the most in MLB during that span (also: Shane Bieber-CLE/TOR, Jacob deGrom-NYM/TEX and Zack Wheeler-NYM/PHI)...recorded 11-or-more wins in his 3rd consecutive season with the Mariners (2023-25), and the 4th time in his career (also: 15 wins in 2019 w/CIN).

CAREER...pitched in parts of 10 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...named to the All-Star Team three times in his career (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.
