RAY MATTER—The Rays have won two of their last 3 games after a 2-8 stretch...today the Rays are attempting to win back-to-back games for the first time since June 7-9 vs. STL (3)...a win today or tomorrow would snap their streak of four consecutive series losses, their longest since Aug 4-20, 2017 (5)...last night the Rays won in walk-off fashion for the fourth time this season, first since a 3-run homer on June 7 vs. STL...the Rays are 3-7 in their last 10 games, 7-11 in their last 18 games and 20-22 in their last 42 games after an 18-10 start to the season...the Rays are in 4th place in the AL East for a fifth straight day, the first time they have been alone in 4th place (or below) at least 50 games into a season since they were 34-40 through the end of play on June 20, 2018 (4th)...the Rays are in a virtual tie (pct. points ahead) with the Twins for the AL's final Wild Card spot.

- + Today the Rays continue a stretch of 13 games in 13 days from June 24–July 6, with a June 27 off day and July 2 doubleheader at TOR.
- + Since May 26, the Rays are 12-15 and they have seen their divisional deficit grow from 4.5 GB to 13.5 GB...the Rays are averaging 3.44 runs per game since then, 27th in the majors...their .217 avg. ranks 27th over that stretch, .280 OBP ranks 27th and .336 SLG is 29th.
- + The Rays are 9-14 in series openers and 7-6 in openers at home.
- + The Rays are 2-6-2 in their last 10 series after a 7-2-0 stretch.
- + Rays games are averaging 3:01 this season, 2nd-fastest in MLB.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays have played three straight 1-run games and 10 straight decided by 2 runs (or fewer)...this 10-game streak is the longest in club history, passing April 15-24, 2007 (9)...both the Rays and Giants have active 10-game streaks of this type, the majors' longest since the Mariners (10) from Aug 3-13, 2021—the last longer streak was the Orioles (12) from May 8-21, 2017...the Rays have played a majors-most 28 1-run games this season, going 14-14 in them including 4-8 since June 4 and 6-11 since May 8 after an 8-3 start...the Rays have played 40 games decided by 2 runs (or fewer), tied with the Orioles for the most in the majors...the Rays are 20-20 in games decided by 2 runs (or fewer), including 10-14 since May 16.

- + The Rays are 7-3 in extras after going 7-12 last season...the 10 extra-inning games rank 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (11).

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have a 3.17 ERA this season, 4th in the majors behind the Dodgers (2.90), Yankees (2.94) and Astros (3.07)...they have a 2.36 ERA (95.1-IP, 25-ER) in the last 11 games and have yielded 3 ER (or fewer) eight times over that stretch...the Rays have a 2.66 ERA in the last 39 games, 1st in the majors since May 11 ahead of the Yankees (3.18).

- + Last night the Rays totaled 17 SO, their most since June 9, 2021 vs. WSH (18)...it marked the fourth time in club history they combined for 17 SO (or more) without issuing a walk, joining Aug 17, 2019 vs. DET (24), June 30, 2019 vs. TEX (17) and Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL (18).
- + The Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 42 times this season, 3rd in the majors...they are 31-11 when yielding 3 runs (or fewer), compared to 7-21 when allowing 4 runs (or more)...the Rays have yielded 2 runs (or fewer) 30 times this year, tied for 4th in the majors.
- + Rays starters have a 3.33 ERA this season, 4th in the majors behind the Dodgers (2.59), Yankees (3.00) and the Astros (3.32)...the starters have a 2.76 ERA in the last 39 games since May 11, best in the majors since then over the Dodgers (3.12)...the Rays have used 12 starters, 2nd in MLB behind the Tigers (13)...the starters have combined for 322 IP, fewest in the AL and 29th in the majors (Pirates, 319 IP).
- + The Rays bullpen ranks 3rd in the majors with a 3.00 ERA behind the Astros (2.65) and Yankees (2.85)...Rays relievers yielded 1 hit in 4 IP last night and have a 2.01 ERA in 17 games since June 5...the Rays have seven pitchers with a save, tied for most in the majors...last season they had 14 pitchers with a save, setting a ML record.

FEAST OR FAMINE—The Rays are averaging 4.03 runs per game this season, 23rd in the majors and 11th in the AL...this is a 1.26 decrease from their 5.29 runs per game last season, the 3rd-largest in the majors behind the Athletics (-1.52) and Tigers (-1.40)...the Rays have seen the 3rd-largest decrease in home runs per game, dropping from 1.37 in 2021 to 0.94 this season...the Rays rank 12th in the AL in avg. (.232), 7th in RISP avg. (.251), 13th in on-base pct. (.295), 12th in slugging (.373) and 10th in homers (66).

- + The Rays have hit 6 HR in the last 3 games, compared to 3 HR in the previous 9 games...last night was the seventh time in club history they hit 0 HR, allowed 3 HR (or more) and still won, joining May 15, 2021 vs. NYM, Sep 21, 2018 at TOR, April 20, 2018 vs. MIN, May 5, 2013 at COL, Aug 30, 2008 vs. BAL and April 23, 2003 vs. TOR.
- + The Rays have combined for 27 runs in the last 10 games, but have

scored 4 runs (or more) in three straight games compared to one of the previous 7 games...over this 10-game stretch the Rays are 3-7, have out-hit opponents, 76-58, and out-hit them in five of 7 losses.

- + The Rays are 29-8 when scoring 4 runs (or more) and 22-5 when scoring 5 runs (or more), compared to 9-24 when scoring 3 runs (or fewer)...the Rays are 29-9 when scoring first and 9-23 when their opponent scores first...the Rays are 30-8 when they out-hit their opponent and 7-22 when recording fewer hits than their opponent.
- + The Rays have 12 SB in the last 29 games, compared to 34 SB in the first 41 games this season...they rank 3rd in the AL with 46 SB behind the Rangers (60) and Guardians (47) and 1st in the majors with 19 CS...the Rays are 70.8 pct. on steal attempts, 22nd in the majors.
- + This season the Rays are batting .294 (100-for-340) with RISP in the 38 wins, compared to .186 (41-for-221) with RISP in the 32 losses.
- + The Rays have made 33 outs on the bases this season, according to Baseball Reference, most in the majors (Cubs, 29)...the website does not include pickoffs, caught stealing or force plays in this statistic.

UNDER THE LEATHER—The Rays have allowed 46 unearned runs this season, 2nd in the majors behind the White Sox (48) and their most before the All-Star break since 2005 (46)...this is 79.3 pct. of their total (58) from last season, when they didn't allow their 46th until the 108th game (Aug 3)...the Rays have allowed 11 unearned runs in their last 13 games since June 10...they have made 15 errors and yielded 10 unearned runs in their 38 wins, compared to 29 errors and 36 unearned runs in their 32 losses.

- + The Rays are 25-14 in errorless games; 13-18 when making one.
- + The Rays have 44 errors this season, 9th in the majors...they have 24 errors since May 20, 3rd in the majors and most in the AL.
- + Rays catchers have caught 6.8 pct. (3 of 44) of attempted base stealers this season, 29th in the majors, including 0-for-15 in June.

RAYS vs. PIRATES—Last night marked the first time in franchise history the Rays defeated the Pirates in walk-off fashion...this is the first series between the Rays and Pirates since June 27-29, 2017 at PIT (1-2)...it marks the third series all-time at Tropicana Field, following June 23-25, 2014 (1-2) and June 13-15, 2003 (1-2)...the Rays were scheduled to host the Pirates on Opening Day in 2020 until the COVID-19 shutdown resulted in a revised schedule...the Rays are 7-9 all-time against them, including 1-4-0 in series play...the only series win was June 27-29, 2008 at PNC Park (2-1).

- + Pirates Manager **Derek Shelton** is one of three current managers who are former members of **Kevin Cash's** coaching staff, along with **Charlie Montoyo** (Blue Jays) and **Rocco Baldelli** (Twins)...he spent parts of seven years on the Rays staff as the hitting coach.
- + The Rays are 8-1 in interleague games this season...since the start of last season, their 23-6 record in interleague games leads the majors over the Red Sox (20-7)...the Rays are 15-1 in interleague home games over that same span, while pitching to a 2.19 ERA at home.

FROM THE INFIRMARY—The Rays currently have 15 players on the injured list, tied with the Reds for most in the majors...they have 10 pitchers on the injured list, 3rd in the majors behind the Nationals (11) and Reds (11)...five of their 9 hitters from their Opening Day starting lineup are on the injured list...the Rays have had 23 different players total 25 stints on the injured list this season...according to Spotrac's tracker, the Rays have totaled 929 days on the injured list this season, most in the AL over the Twins (818) and 3rd in the majors behind the Reds (1,053) and Cubs (929).

PARADES OF HOMERS—In his last 2 games, **Isaac Paredes** has 4 HR, 5 RBI and 1 HBP in 8 PA...he homered in all 3 AB on Tues vs. NYY and homered in his first at-bat on Wed vs. NYY...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he was the first player in franchise history to homer in four straight at-bats and second in the majors to do so in the last five seasons, joining **CHW José Abreu** (4) in 2020...he became the second player in the expansion era (since 1961) to homer in four straight at-bats against the Yankees, joining **KC/CHW Bo Jackson** (4) from 1990-93...he is the fourth Ray to hit 4 HR in a 2-game span, following **Brandon Lowe** from Sep 30–Oct 2, 2021 at HOU/ NYY, **Curt Casali** from July 27-28, 2015 vs. DET and **Greg Vaughn** from May 18-19, 2002 vs. BAL...he leads the team with 9 HR despite making his season debut on May 1 and being optioned from May 8-15...all 9 HR have come in his last 24 games since May 18, compared to 2 HR in the first 65 games of his career...since May 18, his 9 HR are tied for 6th in the AL behind Judge (13), Trout (12), Alvarez (10), Devers (10) and Guerrero Jr. (10).

LAST START—On Sun at BAL, lost a start of 6 IP (or more) and 2 runs (or fewer) for the 11th time in his 12-year career and for a second consecutive start (June 14 at NYY)...yielded a solo homer to **Anthony Santander** in the 1st inning, his sixth 1st-inning run allowed this season after pitching to a 0.56 ERA (16-IP, 1-ER) in that frame last season (with NYY)...allowed a 1-out RBI double to **Cedric Mullins** in the 3rd inning, then retired 11 of his last 13 BF...his line: L, 6 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 92 pitches, 68 strikes.

- Is 0-2 in his last 2 starts despite allowing 8 hits, 4 runs and 2 ER...is the first Rays starter to lose back-to-back starts and allow 2 ER (or fewer) in each since **Jake Odorizzi** from Aug 9-14, 2017...is the first starter in club history to lose back-to-back starts while going 6 IP (or more) and yielding 4 hits (or fewer) and 2 ER (or fewer) in each.
- Has made 7 starts this season of at least 6 IP and 2 runs (or fewer), tied for 7th in the AL...has done this in four of his last 5 starts since May 28, pitching to a 2.17 ERA (29-IP, 7-ER) over that stretch...has yielded 2 runs (or fewer) in six of his last 7 starts since May 16.
- Has issued 1 BB (or fewer) in 11 of his 13 starts and five straight.
- His 1.96 ERA (36.2-IP, 8-ER) in day games this season is 4th in the AL (min. 5 starts)...has a 5.23 ERA (31-IP, 18-ER) in night games.

vs. PIRATES—Will be making his second career start against the Pirates, following July 23, 2018 at Progressive Field (with CLE) when he took the loss after allowing 7 runs (3 ER) in 4 IP...a 4-run 2nd inning was extended by a dropped infield popup with 2 outs, and his next 4 BF reached, including a **Josh Harrison** 3-run homer...surrendered 3 runs with 2 outs in the 4th on a **Starling Marte** RBI single and a **Gregory Polanco** 2-run triple.

- Is 16-9 with a 3.03 ERA (193.1-IP, 65-ER) in 31 interleague starts, including a win on June 8 vs. STL when he yielded 3 runs in 5 IP.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN—Has induced a swing on 36.3 pct. of pitches outside the strike zone this season, according to FanGraphs, the 7th-highest rate in the AL (min. 60 IP)...batters are making contact on just 64.5 pct. of those swings...has induced an avg. exit velocity of 86.8 mph this season, according to Statcast, including 85.3 mph over his last 7 starts...only 41.0 pct. of his pitches have landed in the strike zone this season, but his

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH SHANE McCLANAHAN (7-3, 1.81 ERA)

LAST START—On Mon vs. NYY, left with a 1-0 deficit but got no decision after the Rays tied it in the 8th...faced the Yankees in back-to-back starts, both winless, on the heels of a career-best 6-game winning streak...his only run allowed was a homer by **Anthony Rizzo** in the 1st inning, his second allowed to a lefty this season (also May 5 at SEA, **Jesse Winker**)...after the Rizzo homer, retired his next 11 BF including striking out the side in the 4th...yielded back-to-back singles and a walk with 1 out in the 5th but escaped the jam with a 5-4-3 GDP...pitched around a 1-out single in the 6th...his line: ND, 6 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 8 SO, 1 HR, 92 pitches, 60 str.

- Has allowed 10 runs (6 ER) in his last 8 starts spanning 52 IP.

4.0 pct. walk rate ranks 6th in the majors and 5th in the AL (min. 50 IP).

- His 5.45 SO/BB ratio this season ranks 9th in the majors (min. 50 IP).
- Since April 29, has thrown first-pitch strikes to 68.4 pct. of his batters faced, the 6th-highest rate in the majors over that stretch...this comes after doing so at a 54.7 pct. clip through his first 3 starts.
- Has a 42.5 pct. flyball rate, according to FanGraphs, and avg. launch angle of 19.2°, according to Statcast, both the highest of his career.

COREY'S CURVE—Since the start of last season, has used his curveball on 28.6 pct. of his pitches, compared to 18.6 pct. over his first 10 seasons...over that span, has limited opponents to a .210 avg. (39-for-186) and avg. exit velocity of 85.8 mph in at-bats ending with the pitch...since 2014, his 619 SO with the curveball rank 2nd in the majors behind **Charlie Morton** (675)...this season, 21 of 28 SO with the curveball have been a swing-and-miss.

- Has induced a whiff on 42.2 pct. of swings against the curveball in his career...from 2014-18, his curveball was 120.2 Runs Above Avg., according to FanGraphs, the highest-rated pitch in the majors.

CHANGE IT UP—Has used his changeup on just 9.4 pct. (97 of 1,027) of his pitches this season, but has a 35.1 pct. whiff rate on the pitch...opponents are batting .056 (1-for-16) in at-bats ending with the changeup, the lowest opp avg. among his four primary offerings...opponents are hitless in their last 15 AB against his changeup...min. 10 PA, his .056 opp avg. is the 5th-lowest mark in the majors this season and the 4th-lowest in the AL.

- Has allowed just 12 batted balls against his 97 changeups thrown and has yielded an avg. exit velocity of 79.3 mph against the pitch.
- His “put away” rate on the changeup, or the rate of 2-strike pitches that result in a strikeout, is 30.0 pct., his highest rate of any pitch.

DECORATED CAREER—Among active pitchers with at least 1,000 IP, he ranks 6th in ERA behind **Clayton Kershaw** (2.48), **Jacob deGrom** (2.50), **Chris Sale** (3.03), **Max Scherzer** (3.15) and **Gerrit Cole** (3.19)...his 18 CG ranks 4th, 1.10 WHIP ranks 6th and .620 winning pct. ranks 9th...won the AL Cy Young Award in 2014 and 2017 and remains one of 21 pitchers since the Cy Young Award was introduced (1956) to win multiple times.

- Yesterday vs. PIT, made his ML debut and delivered a RBI single in the 2nd inning...became the 20th Ray all-time to hit safely in his first career PA, first since Vidal Bruján on July 7, 2021 vs. CLE (G1), and became the sixth in club history with a run-scoring hit in the first at-bat of his ML debut.
- Recalled on Tuesday from Triple-A Durham, his first major league action.
