FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals embark on their season-ending six-game road trip with tonight's opener of a three-game series against the Colorado Rockies at Coors Field ... The Redbirds recently went 5-2 on their final homestand against Pittsburgh (3-1) and Cleveland (2-1) ... St. Louis enters today a half game behind Chicago (80-77) in 3rd place in the National League Central Division ... The Cardinals need two more wins to end at .500 and at least three victories for a winning season record (82+ wins).

WESTWARD HO: For only the second time in franchise history and first time since 1960, St. Louis will *start and finish* the regular season on the West Coast. - *Elias*

- The Cardinals started the 1960 season at San Francisco and 1964 and 1984 seasons at the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- St. Louis ended regular seasons in San Francisco twice (1958 and 1960) and once in Los Angeles (1962).

ROSTER MOVE: Prior to tonight's series opener in Colorado, the Cardinals recalled outfielder **Victor Scott II** from Memphis (AAA) and placed first baseman **Luken Baker** on the Paternity List.

TAP THE ROCKIES: St. Louis has won their season series vs. the Rockies 23 times in 30 seasons since Colorado joined MLB as an expansion team in 1993 ... Tonight marks the Cardinals first visit to Denver since April 10-12, 2023, and this is the latest in the calendar year for a Cards-Rox series since Sept. 25-27, 2009 at Coors Field.

AN ERA OF EXCELLENCE: It has been 65 years since the Cardinals last experienced back-to-back losing campaigns in *full seasons* from 1958-59 (excluding seasons shortened by war, work stoppages, or COVID), the 2nd-longest all-time timespan by any franchise of the four major North American sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, & NHL).

- The NHL's **Montreal Canadiens** hold the record of 80 years between consecutive full losing seasons occurring from 1938-39 to 1941-42 (4 seasons), and then again during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons.
- The Los Angeles Dodgers have the 2nd-longest active streak, last experiencing losing seasons 37 years ago from 1986-87.

GAMES THAT MATTER: From 2011 Opening Day through the end of this season, the Cardinals will have played 2,142 out of a possible 2,164 regular season games (99.0%) during which they still maintained playoff aspirations and had not yet been eliminated ... St. Louis was eliminated from postseason contention on Sept. 20.

NADO DINGERS: With his next home run, **Nolan Arenado** would pass **Carlos "Cargo" Gonzalez** (139 HR) for 3rd all-time at Coors Field, pass **Whitey Kurowski** (106 HR) for 4th all-time among Cardinals primary third baseman, and reach 342 for his career to tie **Evan Longoria**, **Ron Santo**, & **Manny Machado** for 13th all-time among primary third baseman.

MILE HIGH HIKE: The Cardinals (105g), Cubs (105g), and Mets (104g) are the only three National League teams that have never had a pitcher throw a complete game at Coors Field ... **Braden Loooper** (8.1 IP) came the closest by a Cardinal in Denver on May 6, 2008 ... The Cardinals, who also had no route-going efforts in their 12 games played in 1993-94 at Denver's Mile High Stadium, also lack a complete game effort in their 63 regular season games at Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park.

MASYN MILESTONES: **Masyn Winn** tonight ties **Julian Javier** (1960) with his 98th game at leadoff this season, 4th-most in franchise history by a rookie ... With his next hit, Winn becomes the 4th Cards rookie in the last 68 seasons (1957-present) with 150+ hits, joining three NL Rookie of the Years: 2001 **Albert Pujols** (194), 1985 **Vince Coleman** (170), & 1974 **Bake McBride** (173).

KID'S CLUB: The Cardinals lead MLB this season in combined games (975) by players age 25 or younger, 5th-most in franchise history behind 1937 (1,008 g), 1973 (1,042 g), 1977 (1,084 g), and 1974 (1,089 g) ... Over the last six seasons (2019-24) across Major League Baseball, only the Cleveland Guardians from 2023 (1,041g) and 2022 (1,038 g) have had more.

COLORADO CONNECTIONS

Nolan Arenado played eight seasons with Colorado (2013-20), where he was a five-time NL All-Star and the winner of four Silver Sluggers, eight Gold Gloves, and four Platinum Gloves...originally selected by Colorado in the 2nd round of the 2009 MLB Draft...Acquired by St. Louis with cash in exchange for **Austin Gomber**, **Elehuris Montero**, **Tony Locey**, **Mateo Gil** and **Jake Sommers**.

Nolan Arenado's cousin, **Josh Fuentes**, played three seasons with the Rockies (2019-21) and college baseball at Missouri Baptist Univ. (2014).

Daniel Descalso played two seasons with Colorado (2015-16).

Kyle Leahy was born in and resides in Boulder...graduated from Erie High School, and selected to play at the Colorado High School Futures Game at Coors Field...played college baseball at Colorado Mesa University in Grand Junction (2016-18).

Austin Gomber pitched parts of two seasons with St. Louis (2018, '20)...originally selected by the Cardinals in the 4th round of the 2014 MLB Draft...shared Cardinals Co-Minor League Pitchers of the Year honors with **Alex Reyes** in 2015.

Dakota Hudson pitched six seasons and the 2019 Postseason (2018-23) with St. Louis, where he made his MLB debut...selected by the Cardinals in the 1st round (#34) of the 2016 MLB Draft.

Daniel Bard made 10 appearances for Springfield (AA) in 2017.

John Mozeliak began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season...graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher...graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder.

Cardinals Asst. GM & Scouting Director **Randy Flores** pitched in 82 games in three seasons (2002, '09-10) over two stints with Colorado.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Holliday** was originally selected by Colorado in the 7th round of the 1998 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons for the Rockies (2004-08, '18) where he was a three-time All-Star and appeared in the 2007 World Series.

Rockies Special Assistant to the GM **Clint Hurdle** played in 78 games for St. Louis in 1986.

Rockies MLB.com **Thomas Harding** covered the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) for two seasons for the Commercial Appeal (1998-99)...mentored recent Cardinals MLB.com writer **Anne Rogers**.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist **Benjamin Hochman** previously worked as a sports writer and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15).

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Derrick Goold** is originally from Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo...worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01).

Rockies Communications Coordinator **Kevin Collins** previously served as the 2015 Media Relations Intern for the Memphis Redbirds (AAA).

Rockies Digital Comm. Manager **Nora Farrell** previously worked in communications and social media for St. Louis for part of seven seasons (2016-22).

Rockies VP Ticket Sales, Ops & Svcs. **Sue Ann McClaren** worked 15 seasons (1978-92) in the Cards sales department before joining the Rockies in 1992.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his 2nd career start in the Major Leagues and 3rd career appearance.
- Looking to become the 6th Cardinal overall and first since **René Arocha** (April 9-30, 1993) to win each of his first three career games.
- Is the only Cardinal in franchise history to earn a win as a starter and then as a reliever in his first two career appearances. - *Elias*
- Made his Major League debut vs. Texas (July 31), hurling 7.0 innings of one run ball for the victory as the Cardinals won 10-1.
- Earned a win in his 2nd Major League appearance, a 3.0-inning relief job to close out a 10-5 win vs. Pittsburgh (Sept. 18).
- Was the second Cardinal to make his Major League debut against the Texas Rangers, but the first to start a game as a pitcher. **Michael Blazek** was the other, coming in relief at Busch Stadium on June 22, 2013 in a 4-2 loss.
- First Cardinals pitcher to throw 7.0+ innings and earn the win in his Major League debut at home since **Jason Simontacchi** vs. Atlanta on May 4, 2002 at Busch Stadium II (7.0 IP, 2 ER).
- First Cardinals pitcher to throw 7.0+ innings with 1 ER or less in their debut since **Michael Wacha** vs. KC on 5/30/13 (7.0 IP, 1 ER) and first to do so and earn a win since **Tyler Lyons** at SD (7.0 IP, 1 ER) on 5/22/13.
- First Cardinal to allow no runs through 5.0 frames in his first MLB start since **Austin Gomber** at CIN on July 24, 2018 (6.1 before allowing first run...**Daniel Ponce de Leon** also did so the day prior at CIN on 7/23/18 - 7.0 IP, 0 ER).
- Became the 8th to make his MLB debut with the Cardinals in 2024 and the 6th pitcher.
- Posted a 9-8 record with a 4.02 ERA in 27 starts at Memphis (AAA). Posted a career-high 138 strikeouts to lead the Redbirds and an International League leading three complete games, tied with **Ian Mejia** (Braves) for the minor league lead. Ranked 5th in MiLB with 150.0 innings pitched.

LAST TIME OUT

- Threw 3.0 scoreless inning of two-hit ball in relief as the Cardinals rallied for a 10-6 win vs Pittsburgh.
- Was the first relief appearance of his professional career, beginning with 90 games started between St. Louis (7/31/24) and his 89 starts in the minor leagues.
