**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Tigers, 2-0, in Detroit yesterday...The Mets were swept for the second time this year... Both sweeps have occurred on the road...The Mets have dropped nine of their last 11 games and five of their last six contests... Tonight, the Mets return home for three games against the Rockies...The Mets are off on Monday before hitting the road for a six-game road trip to Cincinnati (three games) and Washington D.C. ( three games).

**SUGAR, SUGAR:** Prior to tonight's game, Edwin Díaz will receive the 2022 National League Trevor Hoffman Reliever of the Year trophy... Mets pitching coach Jeremy Hefner will present the trophy... In 2022, Díaz led major league relievers with 118 strikeouts...He struck out 118 of the 235 batters he faced, a rate of 50.2 percent, the third-best mark in major league history...Díaz was selected to his second All-Star Game and was named the NL Reliever of the Month three times...The right-handed pitcher recorded 32 saves and posted a 1.31 ERA.

**MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS DAY:** Tomorrow, the In an effort to help end the stigma, the New York Mets will host Mental Health Awareness Day presented by Carelon...The day will help bring attention to the importance of mental health and wellness, while providing information and resources throughout the game...A ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by Mets alumni, Bill Pulsipher...A former second-round draft pick of the New York Mets in 1991, Pulsipher has spoken publicly about his battle with anxiety and depression...Additionally, the Mets will honor several organizations as their Mental Health Heroes of the game, each representing one of the Mets Employee Resource Groups.

**THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Kodai Senga has 32 strikeouts in 26.0 innings through his first five starts this year...According to Sportradar, that gives him the a 11.08 k/9 IP ratio...That is the third-best strikeout rate by a Mets rookie through their first five starts behind only Nolan Ryan and Dwight Gooden.

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets are 6-6 at Citi Field this year...The team's 12 home games tied for the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26... Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

**ON THE ROX:** Starling Marte has hit .345 (74-209) with 47 runs, 10 doubles, four triples, seven home runs, 33 RBI and 11 walks in 53 career games against the Rockies...Pete Alonso has hit .344 (21-61) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, three walks and a .623 SLG in 16 games against the Rockies...Brandon Nimmo, who grew up less than 100 miles from Coors Field has hit .309 (25-81) with 17 runs, a double, five home runs and 14 RBI and 12 walks in 23 games against the Rockies...Luis Guillorme is .625 (5-8) with two runs and two walks in nine games against Colorado.

**TASTE THE ROCKIES:** The Mets are set to play the Colorado Rockies for the first time this season...New York went 5-2 against Colorado last season including 3-1 at Citi Field...The Mets are 6-4 against the NL West in 2023.

**ROCKIES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won eight of their last 10 games against the Rockies at Citi Field...Overall the Mets are 26-20 against Colorado at Citi Field.

**BRETT THE MET:** Over the last 12 contests, Brett Baty is batting .325 (13-40) with five runs, two doubles, two home runs, three RBI and four walks in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games.

**DOCTOR ROBERT-SON:** David Robertson has appeared in 12 games and has allowed one run in 13.1 innings of work, good for a 0.68 ERA...He has allowed seven hits, three walks while striking out 18 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .120 (3-25) batting average this season...He has converted all six save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 163 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

**JEFF McHITS:** Jeff McNeil is batting .286 (32-112) with 13 runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs, 10 RBI and 16 walks with a .398 OBP and a .411 SLG in 32 games this season...Since April 16, he has raised his batting average from .212 to .286 and his OBP from .359 to .398...His .398 OBP is the 12th-best in the majors and eighth-highest in the National League.

**MULTIPLICITY:** McNeil has recorded nine multi-hit games this season...He has 172 multi-hit games in his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 62 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is the third-most during that span behind Freddie Freeman (68) and Bo Bichette (67).

**GUESS WHO'S BACH?:** Over his last 15 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 12-37 (.324) with three runs, three doubles, one home run, nine RBI, six walks with a .419 OBP and a .486 SLG...He has posted a .405 OBP in 24 games this season, which is leads the team.

**STEAL MY SUNSHINE:** The Mets are tied for second with a 83.9% success rate in steals this season...The Mets are tied for fourth the NL with 26 steals this season...Starling Marte is tied for 10th in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with nine steals...He ranks third among active players with 323 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (338) and Billy Hamilton (326) have more.

**A HIT'S A HIT:** The Mets have collected 37 infield hits this season, which is the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in MLB in 2022.

**OUCH:** The Mets have been plunked 29 times this season...That is tied for the third-most in the majors and tied with the San Francisco Giants for the most in the National League.

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME:** With the expected large crowd at Citi Field on Sunday, May 7 and the 5 Boro Bike Tour scheduled to take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. traveling through the five NYC boroughs, the Mets encourage fans to avoid delays due to various local street closings by taking mass transit.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Senga threw 5.0 innings in the Mets 4-1 loss on April 26 against Washington...He allowed two runs on five hits with four walks against seven strikeouts in his first career loss.

**STRIKE 'EM OUT:** Senga has 32 strikeouts through his first five major league games, tied with Noah Syndergaard and Nolan Ryan for the fourth-most in franchise history...His 32 strikeouts rank sixth by a Japanese-born pitcher through their first five career games.

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 20 of his 32 strikeouts through five starts...The pitch has a 54 percent whiff rate and a 28 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just three hits in 29 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .103 batting average.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

**MLB DEBUT NOTES:** Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

**2022:** Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

**INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION:** Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (3-1, 4.11)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 5.2 innings and allowed three runs on four hits, three walks and four strikeouts against the Braves in Game 2 on May 1 at Citi Field...His outing did not factor into the decision.

**BIG DRIP VS. THE ROCKIES:** Megill has never faced the Colorado Rockies in his career...In matchups against NL West teams, he holds a 2-2 record in eight starts and has pitched to a 5.66 ERA (26 ER/41.1 IP)...Has held NL West opponents to a .298 average and fanned 37 batters.
