SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

YESTERDAY'S GAME: The D-backs won the series-finale, 5-3, @ Giants to salvage a series split.

◆ **Slade Cecconi** got the late starting nod, when scheduled starter Merrill Kelly was scratched, and secured his first big league win with his first quality start, allowing 2 runs on 2 hits and 0 walks with 3 strikeouts over 6.0 frames.

◆ **Gabriel Moreno's** go-ahead 2-run single in the top of the sixth inning gave the D-backs a 3-2 lead and proved to be the difference.

◆ **Ketel Marte, Jake McCarthy** and **Kevin Newman** each drove in a run.

VS. CARDINALS: The D-backs took 2 out of 3 vs. Cardinals 10 days ago (April 12-14).

◆ Last season, the D-backs went 2-1 @ Cardinals.

◆ Over his last 9 games vs. Cardinals, **Corbin Carroll** is hitting .356 (9-for-26) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5 runs, 5 RBI, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases.

MARTE'S PART-AY: **Ketel Marte**, in 6 games since April 16, is batting .481 (13-for-27)/1.261 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers, 5 RBI and 1 walk...among all players since April 16 [min. 15 PA], ranks first with 13 hits and sixth with a .481 AVG.

◆ in his 23 games this season, is slashing .330/.377/.564/.941 with 7 doubles, 5 homers (3 lead-off), 13 RBI and 9 walks (15 K).

BLAZIN' HOT: **Blaze Alexander's** .321 AVG (17-for-53) is second among all rookies (min. 50 PA), behind Colton Cowser/BAL (.373)...his .945 OPS is third to Colton Cowser/BAL (1.195) and Michael Busch/CHC (1.002).

WALKS OVER STRIKEOUTS: The D-backs have a trio of players in the Top-10 in strikeout-to-walk ratio [min. 50 PA] with **Joc Pederson** first at 0.30 (3 K: 10 BB), **Gabriel Moreno** second at 0.50 (5 K: 10 BB) and **Corbin Carroll** tied for 10th at 1.00 (14 K: 14 BB).

◆ The D-backs' 1.74 strikeout-to-walk ratio (155 K:89 BB) leads the Majors ahead of the Yankees (1.76, 178 K:101 BB), Blue Jays (2.00, 160 K: 80 BB), Padres (2.01, 179 K:89 BB) and Astros (2.03, 154 K:76 BB).

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 12 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning is tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers).

◆ In the opening frame, the D-backs have a MLB-leading 27 runs, .396 AVG, .389 OPB, .704 SLG, 1.145 OPS, 42 hits, 10 doubles, 8 home runs and 7 stolen bases.

WHEN SCORING FIRST: The D-backs have scored first in all 11 games they have won this season...their 17 times scoring first are tied for most in the Majors with the Red Sox (17).

OFFENSE OFF STARTERS: D-backs hitters, against opposing starting pitchers, are batting .293 (134-for-457)/.818 OPS with 74 runs, 27 doubles, 17 homers and 40 walks.

◆ Among all teams' offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first in AVG (.293), hits (134), runs (74), total bases (212), second in OBP (.354), third in OPS (.818) and fourth in SLG (.464).

MILESTONE WATCH: **Randal Grichuk** has 999 career hits, **Eugenio Suárez** has 248 career home runs and **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has 97 career home runs.

MAJOR LEAGUE LEADERS: D-backs' in Top-10 in the Majors:

HARD HITTING: The D-backs' 252 hard hit balls (number of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) are fourth in the Majors, behind the Astros (269), Dodgers (261) and Orioles (261).

◆ **Ketel Marte's** 45 hard hits are second in the Majors, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (47).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +28 run differential is sixth in the Majors, behind the Guardians (+52), Royals (+38), Braves (+35), Brewers (+35) and Orioles (+29).

◆ The D-backs' 131 runs in their first 23 games of a season are fourth most in franchise history, behind 2001 (140), 2008 (139) and 2010 (134).

STOPPING THE RUNNING GAME: D-back backstops have held opponents to MLB lows with 4 stolen bases and 8 attempts.

◆ **Gabriel Moreno's** 40.5 caught-stealing pct. (32-for-79) since 2022 leads active catchers.

VS. RIGHT-HANDED STARTERS: The D-backs are 7-4 against right-handed starting pitchers.

RISP-Y BUSINESS: The D-backs, with runners in scoring position, are hitting .300 (66-for-220)/.865 OPS with 110 runs scored on 16 doubles, 7 home runs and 40 walks (33 strikeouts).

FRIDAY'S FRANCHISE MARKS: The D-backs' 22 hits on Friday @ Giants were the most hits in a 9-inning game in club history (previous: 21, 4x; last: July 17, 2019 @ Rangers) and tied for the most in any game by the D-backs (22 hits in 18 innings on Aug. 24, 2013 @ Phillies).

◆ The 16-run differential tied for the largest win margin in club history (also: May 24, 2019 @ Giants).

◆ The D-backs' 25 hard hit balls set a club record and tied for the second-highest mark by any team in the Statcast Era [since 2015] [also: Blue Jays, June 11, 2021 & July 22, 2022; Nationals, July 31, 2018 behind the White Sox (26, Sept. 8, 2022) and Giants (26, Sept. 1, 2020)].

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his third consecutive start against an NL Central opponent (faced the Cardinals on April 12 and Cubs on April 17).

- Has tossed 5.0+ innings in 5 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 27, 2023.
- Is limiting opponents to a .138 average (4-for-29) off his fastball.

LAST START: Took the loss in his last start on April 17 vs. Cubs (L; 2 ER in 7.0 IP, 6 H, 6 K).

VS. CARDINALS: In his lone start vs. Cardinals on April 12, went decisionless after allowing 6 runs thru 6.0 innings.

VS. NL CENTRAL: In 7 career games (6 starts) against the NL Central, is 2-2 with a 4.39 ERA (21 R-20 ER in 41.0 IP).

IT'S UNDER CONTROL: Has walked 2 or fewer batters in his 4 starts this season, including 1 game with 1 walk and 2 games with no walks.

- His 3 walks are tied for the fourth fewest among pitchers.

BATTER BREAKDOWN: Is holding hitters batting second to a .091 average (1-for-11) with 6 strikeouts.

FIRST PITCH SUCCESS: His first-pitch swing (46.5 to 34.0) and first-pitch strike (78.2 to 63.9) percentages are up from 2023.

BATTED BALL STATS: From 2023 to 2024, his groundball percentage is up to 38.4 from 32.6 while his fly ball percentage is down to 31.5 from 33.9.

HIT IT HERE: Limiting hitters with infield hits to a .091 average (3-for-33)/.091 OBP/.091 SLG.

2023 RECAP: Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts with Arizona.

- Entered the season rated as the D-backs' No. 4 prospect by The Athletic (No. 38 overall) and MLB Pipeline (No. 59 overall) and No. 5 by *Baseball America*.
- Made his Major League debut on May 3 @ Rangers (7 ER in 4.2 IP)... was the second D-backs starting pitcher to make their MLB debut @ Rangers and first @ Globe Life Field (last: Nelson Figueroa on June 3, 2000).
- Struck out Josh Jung in the second inning for his first career strikeout.
- Earned his first Major League win on August 25 vs. Reds (2 ER in 5.1 IP, 5 K).
- Recorded 3 career-high-tying 8-strikeout games on Aug. 13 vs. Padres and back-to-back on Sept. 22 @ Yankees and Sept. 27 @ White Sox.
- Owned a 12.2 inning scoreless streak from 8/13/23 vs. SD (2nd inning) - 8/25/23 vs. CIN (2nd inning).
- Appeared in 1 game in relief, the first of his career, on Sept. 10 vs. Cubs (4 ER in 6.0 IP).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared in 5 Postseason games, going 0-1 with a 3.27 ERA (8 ER in 22.0 IP) and 26 strikeouts.

- Made his Postseason debut in Game 1 of the NL Wild Card on Oct. 3 @ Brewers (3 ER in 2.2 IP).
- Was the second-youngest (24-353) pitcher to start a Postseason game in franchise history, behind Daniel Hudson (24-207 on Oct. 2, 2011 @ Brewers) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Became the third D-backs rookie to start a Postseason game (also: Josh Collmenter/2011 vs. MIL and Micah Owings/2007@ COL [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Tossed 4.1 scoreless innings in his second career Postseason start and first @ Chase Field on Oct. 11 vs. Dodgers in NLDS Game 3.
- Became the youngest (24-361) D-backs' pitcher to start a home Postseason game in franchise history (previous: Josh Collmenter (25-239) vs. Brewers on Oct. 4, 2011 in NLDS Game 3) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- Tossed 5.2 scoreless innings in his first career start vs. Phillies @ Chase Field on Oct. 19 in Game 3 of the NLCS (2 H, 0 BB, 9 K).
- Became the first pitcher in MLB history to allow 0 runs and 0 walks in consecutive Postseason starts (source: @ESPNStatsInfo).
- Became the second pitcher in franchise history to strike out 9+ batters without a walk in a Postseason game (also: Curt Schilling, 2001 World Series Game 7) and the fourth Rookie pitcher in MLB Postseason history to record 8+ strikeouts without a walk.

HOW IT STARTED: •Selected by the D-backs in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player draft out of Bellarmine University.

- Named the D-backs' 2022 Minor League Pitcher of the Year after going 11-7 with a 3.83 ERA (71 ER in 167.0 IP), 218 strikeouts and 1.16 WHIP in 29 starts with Double-A Amarillo and Triple-A Reno...led all organization farmhands in wins, ERA and strikeouts.
- Attended Bellarmine University for 3 years (2018-2020)...was the second-highest draft pick in school history behind Todd Wellemeyer (4th round, 2000) and 9th all-time.
