TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-game series against the Houston Astros (0-1) tonight, the final stop on a 9-game, 3-city road trip that began with series against the Tampa Bay Rays (1-2) and Miami Marlins (1-2)...following tomorrow's series finale against the Astros, the Mariners will return home to T-Mobile Park for a 7-game homestand against Tampa Bay (4 G) and Philadelphia (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost last night by a score of 3-0, but are 10-7 over their last 17 games since April 14...Seattle is 11-4 when scoring at least 4 runs and 1-7 when scoring 3 or fewer runs this season.

- Outfield Defense** - The Mariners outfield defense ranks tied for 4th-best in the Majors with 3 Outs Above Average (Statcast) this season, trailing only Houston (5 OAA), Tampa Bay (5 OAA) and San Diego (4 OAA)...during the 2021 season, Seattle outfielders ranked 24th in the Majors with -10 OAA.
- Let the Kids Play** - The Mariners boast the 2nd-youngest position player group in the Majors this season with an average age of 26.8, trailing only Cleveland (26.2)...the Mariners pitching staff ranks tied for 4th-youngest in the Majors with an average age of 27.8 (via. Baseball Reference).
- vs. Houston** - The Mariners are 6-7 against Houston over their last 13 matchups spanning 4 series...the home team has won the last 4 series between Seattle an Houston...Seattle has not won a series at Minute Maid Park since they took 2-of-3 from Sept. 17-19, 2018.
- Long Stretch** - The Mariners are on their 8th of 16 consecutive days with a scheduled game, their longest streak of days with a scheduled game this season.
- Series Record** - The Mariners own a 3-3-1 series record (0-3-1 on the road) this season.

STREAKER...J.P. Crawford has hit safely in 11 consecutive games dating back to April 21...during the 11-game hitting streak, Crawford is batting .429 (18x42) with 8 runs scored, 3 doubles, 4 home runs, 8 RBI and 6 walks...the 11-game streak is the longest active streak in the Majors and is tied for the 4th-longest hitting streak this season (longest: 12 games, done 3x)...Crawford's active 11-game hitting streak is the 2nd-longest of his career, trailing only a career-high 12-game streak from June 13-26, 2021.

DOMINATE THE ZONE...only 9 qualified players in the Majors this season have walked more than they have stuck out, with both **Jesse Winker** (18 BB, 12 K) and **J.P. Crawford** (12 BB, 10 K) among them...Winker ranks 3rd in MLB with a 1.50 BB/K ratio, while Crawford ranks 8th with a 1.22 BB/K ratio...the Mariners are joined by the Nationals as the only other team to have 2 players in that group (Josh Bell & Juan Soto)...overall, the Mariners offense has the best BB/K ratio in the Majors with a mark of .494 BB/K (94 BB, 190 SO), ranking ahead of Los Angeles-NL (.482, 82 BB, 170 K), and San Diego (.479, 92 BB, 192 K).

A LITTLE HELP PLEASE...Chris Flexen has allowed 3 runs or less in each of his first 4 starts of the season, including 3 consecutive quality starts (4/16-c)...despite holding a 3.38 ERA (9 ER, 24.0 IP) in 4 starts to begin the season, Flexen finds himself with a 1-3 record and is the only pitcher in the Majors this season to record 3+ losses with an ERA below 3.75...Flexen is averaging 1.88 runs of support over his 4 starts, 7th-lowest among all Major League starters...the Mariners have tallied 1 run or less in 3 of his 4 starts, including 2 games in which the offense failed to score.

GO LONG...Chris Flexen is averaging 6.0 IP per start this season, tied for 5th-most in the American League...Mariners starters have pitched at least 6.0 innings in 10 starts this season, ranking tied for the most in the American League (also: Houston, 10)...the Mariners are also tied for the American League lead with 9 quality starts this season (also: Toronto & Houston)...Seattle starters rank third in the American League with 119.1 IP this season, trailing only Houston (120.1 IP) and Toronto (119.2 IP).

THE J-ROD SHOW...Julio Rodríguez has reached base safely in 5 consecutive games and 9 of his last 10 games dating back to April 22...after starting the season 1-for-18 over his first 5 games, he is batting .290 (18x62) with 9 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 9 RBI, 6 walks and 8 stolen bases in 17 games since April 14...during that span, his .290 batting average ranks 2nd among all qualified Major League rookies, trailing only Sheldon Neuse-OAK (.305), while ranking ahead of Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (.263) and Seiya Suzuki-CHC (.246).

DYNAMIC DUO...J.P. Crawford and Ty France have combined for 2.8 WAR (*FanGraphs*) this season, more than any other position player duo in the American League, ranking ahead of Cleveland's Jose Ramirez and Myles Straw (2.7), New York-AL's Anthony Rizzo and Aaron Judge (2.4) and Houston's Yordan Alvarez and Jeremy Pena (2.1)...among AL fWAR leaders, Crawford ranks tied for 2nd with 1.6 fWAR, while France ranks tied for 6th with 1.2 fWAR.

JULIO THE SPEEDSTER...Julio Rodríguez leads the Majors with 9 stolen bases this season, ranking ahead of Jorge Mateo-BAL (7) and Harrison Bader-STL (6)...according to *Statcast* sprint speed, Julio is tied as the 4th-fastest baserunner in the Majors at an average of 29.9 feet per second, trailing only Jose Siri (30.1), Bobby Witt Jr. (30.1) and Trea Turner (30.0).

WALK THE LINE...the Mariners offense has drawn 94 walks this season, leading the Majors and ranking ahead of San Diego (92) and Arizona (88)...Jesse Winker leads the AL with 18 walks, trailing only Juan Soto-WSH (21) for the Major League lead...Eugenio Suárez (12 BB) and J.P. Crawford (12 BB) are tied for 10th-most walks in the AL.

IN THE BOX...through the first 22 games of the season, the Mariners offense carries a 120 weighted runs created plus (*FanGraphs*), ranking tied for 3rd in the Majors (also: New York-NL), trailing only the Los Angeles Angels (122 wRC+) and New York Yankees (122)...Seattle's 120 wRC+ signifies that the club has been roughly 20 percent better than average as an offense this season.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Chris Flexen has made 35 career starts with the Mariners, posting a 3.58 ERA (81 ER, 203.2 IP) with 46 walks and 140 strikeouts, but...DID YOU KNOW?...Flexen's 3.58 ERA is the best by any Mariners starter over their first 35 games with the club since James Paxton posted a 3.19 ERA in 35 starts between 2013-16?...Flexen is the only pitcher in MLB to have joined a new team in 2021 and have already tallied 15 wins with an ERA below 3.60 over his first 35 starts with his new club...3 pitchers have accomplished the feat who joined a new club in 2020: Kevin Gausman-SF, Hyun Jin Ryu-TOR and Gerrit Cole-NYY.

ABOUT FLEXEN...

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 5th start of 2022, 47th career start (63rd appearance) and 6th career start against Houston.
- Signed with the Mariners as a free agent, agreeing on a 2-year contract with an option for 2023 on Dec. 18, 2020.
- Was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School...made his ML debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at SD.
- Graduated from Newark Memorial High School (CA) in 2012... played 4 years of baseball and was a quarterback on the football team for 2 years...was committed to Arizona State University before signing with the Mets.
- Appeared in parts of 8 minor league seasons with Mets organization (2012-19)...overall, went 43-31 with a 3.61 ERA (236 ER, 588.0 IP) with 192 walks and 513 strikeouts in 122 games (105 starts)...in 2013, was named Topps Appalachian Player of the Year.
- In his Mariners debut on April 3, 2021, became the 900th Seattle Mariners player in franchise history.
- Recorded his 100th career strikeout when he struck out Cavan Biggio on 6/29/2021 against Toronto (in Buffalo).

LAST START...tagged with 3rd loss of the season on 4/28 at Tampa Bay despite tossing 6.2 innings allowing just 2 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts.

IN NEED OF SUPPORT...through his first 4 starts this season, Flexen has recieved just 5 runs of support...his run support average of 1.88 ranks as the 5th-lowest in the AL (min. 4 games started).

ONE AND DONE...has 7 starts with at least 7.0 innings pitched and no more than 1 run allowed since the start of 2021, tied for the most in the American League during that span (also: Nathan Eovaldi-BOS).

2021 RECAP...went 14-6 with a 3.61 ERA (72 ER, 179.2 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 40 walks in 2021...led Mariners starters in ERA, innings pitched, and wins in 2021.

FIRST 11 AT HOME...Flexen went 6-3 with a 1.89 ERA (14 ER, 66.2 IP) in his first 11 home starts with the Mariners (April 3-July 22, 2021)...his 1.89 ERA was the lowest in club history through a player's first 11 home starts of a season, ranking ahead of Félix Hernández (2.09 in 2014) and James Paxton (2.15 in 2017).

AMONG AL LEADERS...Flexen ranked among the American League leaders in several categories in 2021, including 2nd in wins (14), 4th lowest walk per 9.0 IP (2.00), 7th in ERA (3.61), T5th most quality starts (15), and 7th in innings pitched (179.2).

DISTINGUISHED COMPANY...Flexen became the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record a 10-win season in their first season with the Mariners in 2021, joining Floyd Bannister (1979), Gaylord Perry (1982), Matt Young (1983), Mark Langston (1984), Tim Lincecum (1995), Sterling Hitchcock (1996), Jeff Fassero (1997), Freddy Garcia (1999), Aaron Sele (2000), Miguel Batista (2007), Joe Saunders (2013) and Roenis Elias (2014)...tied with Batista (20 GS) for the 3rd fastest to achieve the feat behind Aaron Sele (17 GS) and Freddy Garcia (19 GS).

WINNER...the Mariners went 22-9 (.710) in Flexen's 31 starts in 2021...posted a career-best 4-game winning streak, June 15-July 16, 2021...went 4-0, 1.36 (39.2 IP, 6 ER) in 6 starts during the streak...struck out 29 while walking just 8 and has limited opposing hitters to a .200 BAA...his previous career-best winning streak was 3 games (4/24-5/14/21).

CAREER DAY...earned win #6 of the 2021 season against Minnesota on 6/15 after setting career highs in innings pitched and strikeouts..went 8.0 scoreless IP, allowing 4 hits, striking out 8 without walking a batter...26 BF in 8.0 IP...threw 107 pitches, 77 for strikes.

FIRST WIN...earned his first win as a Mariner in his first Mariners start, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts on April 3, 2021 vs. San Francisco...became first Mariners pitcher to throw 5.0+ scoreless innings in his debut with the team since LH Wade LeBlanc threw 6.0 scoreless IP on June 24, 2016 in his Mariners debut in a 4-3 win vs. St. Louis...marked Flexen's first win in the Majors in 1,319 days (Oct. 1, 2017 w/New York-NL at Philadelphia).

23-year-old right hander is scheduled to make his 5th career start on Wednesday against Houston, marks the first time he will face an opponent twice...L#2 in last start on 4/29 at MIA (2.0,7,6,62,3,HR)...Career win #1 against Houston on 4/17 vs. HOU (5.1,2,2,2,6,5,HR)...Brash is ranked as the 6th best prospect in the Mariners organization and the 98th best prospect in baseball according to *MLB Pipeline*...Brash will become the 2nd Mariners player to make his MLB Debut this season (also: Julio Rodríguez on Opening Day)... Brash will also become the 43rd Mariners pitcher to start on their MLB Debut, (last: **Logan Gilbert** on 5/13/21)...Brash will be the 10th Canadian-born pitcher to appear in a game for the Mariners, and first since James Paxton on 4/6/21...Acquired by the Mariners from the Padres on 9/17/20 as PTBNL completing 8/31/20 trade for RHP Taylor Williams. **CAREER:** Selected by San Diego in the 4th round of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft...has appeared in parts of 2 minor league seasons one with the Padres organization and one with the Mariners...pitched across 2 levels in 2021 recording a 2.31 ERA (25 ER, 97.1 IP) with 142 strikeouts and 48 walks...**vs. HOU:** Earned first career win against the Astros on 4/17, tossing 5.1 innings, allowing 2 runs on 2 hits (1 HR) and 6 walks with 5 strikeouts...the Mariners turned 4 double plays behind Brash in that game.
