**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Padres, 5-2, at Citi Field...Tonight, the Mets begin their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip against the Athletics (three games), Dodgers (three games) and Giants (four games).

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The Mets begin Interleague play tonight with a three game series against the Athletics...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...In 2022, the Mets went 9-11 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 235-227 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

**INTERSTELLAR:** Jeff McNeil owns a .345/.388/.486 slashline with 36 runs, 14 doubles, seven home runs and 34 RBI in 67 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .330/.389/.551 with 113 runs, 44 doubles, 11 triples, 27 home runs and 83 RBI in 170 Interleague games...They rank first and second in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's .345 clip is the highest all-time by a Met.

**INTERLEAGUE PETE:** Pete Alonso batted .333/.410/.639 against AL opponents last season with 15 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI and 10 walks...His six home runs were tied for the sixth-most in the majors...Alonso has hit 29 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 29 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player in that time frame...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

**OAK AGED:** Pete Alonso is 6-12 with six runs two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and two walks in three games at the home of the Athletics...Brandon Nimmo is 4-8 with four runs, two RBI and a walk in three games there...Jeff McNeil is 6-14 with three runs, a double, and RBI and a walk in three contests...In 19 games in Oakland, Francisco Lindor has hit .368/.383/.539 with 11 runs, seven doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and three walks...Starling Marte played 32 games at the ballpark and slashed .328/.359/.515 with 11 doubles, a triple, four home runs and 22 RBI...Mark Canha appeared in 323 games at the ballpark and has slashed .243/.348/.433 with 52 doubles, six triples, 45 homers, 146 RBI and 128 walks.

**SCARY STUFF:** Kodai Senga has 14 strikeouts in the first two starts of his career, tied with Steven Matz for the second-most by a Met to begin their major league career...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Daisuke Matsuzaka for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born player in their first two major league career starts...Masahiro Tanaka has the most strikeouts by a Japanese-born player in their first two career major league starts with 18...Senga has won his first two career starts and is the fourth player in Mets history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts joining Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to earn the win in their first two career major league starts...No Mets starting pitcher has won each of his first three career games.

**DO THE RIGHT THING:** Senga is holding right-handed hitters to a .080 (2-25) batting average...That is the fourth-lowest average in the majors and the second-lowest in the Senior Circuit...Only Drew Rasmussen (.053, 1-19), Shohei Ohtani (.067, 2-30) and Keegan Thompson (.071, 1-14) have lower average against right-handed hitters.

**DOCTOR ROBERT-SON:** David Robertson has appeared in six games and has yet to allow a run...He allowed only three hits with eight strikeouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .182 (2-11) batting average this season.

**OTTAMATIC:** Adam Ottavino earned his first save of the season on Wednesday...He has allowed only a solo homer in six games this season, giving him a 1.80 ERA (1 ER/5.0 IP) with one walk and seven strikeouts.

**A'S-METS NOTES:** The Mets played a three-game set in Oakland from September 23-25 last season...Prior to that series, the Mets had not visited Oakland since 2014.

**CURTAINS FROM CURTISS:** John Curtiss hasn't allowed a run in his last 4.1 innings with five strikeouts and has yielded one run overall in 5.1 innings (1.42 ERA) in five outings.

**THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:** The Mets have posted a 3.72 ERA with 19 walks and 49 punchouts from their bullpen this season...That places them tied for fourth in the National League...Over the last five games, the pen has pitched to a 1.93 ERA (4 ER/18.2 IP) with 10 walks and 22 strikeouts.

**OUCH:** The Mets are tied for the major league lead with 10 HBP...Mark Canha has been hit by 46 pitches at RingCentral Coliseum, the most in the history of the ballpark...Only five active players have been hit by more pitches in a single ballpark during their career...Courtesy Sportradar.

**WALK THE WALK:** The Mets rank third in the majors and second in the National League with 59 free passes this season...Brandon Nimmo is second in the majors with 12 walks...The Mets have recorded two walks with the bases loaded this season, which is tied for the third-most in the majors...In 2022, the team drew 10.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets have committed only two errors in 13 games this season...The team's .996 fielding percentage is the best in the majors.

**ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US:** The Mets have stolen 14 bases this season, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...Starling Marte fourth in the NL with four steals...Brandon Nimmo, who is tied for fifth in the NL, has stolen three bases in 12 games this year...Nimmo stole a total of three bases in 151 games last season.

**HOMER HAPPY:** Pete Alonso has homered in four of his last seven games, hitting five home runs in that span...He is batting .346 (9-26) with seven runs, 10 RBI and three walks over that span...Alonso has hit six home runs this season, which is tied with Ryan Mountcastle for the major league lead.

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Alonso has hit 86 home runs on the road in his career...That places him in sixth place in franchise history...Next up is Carlos Beltran who hit 88 road home runs.

**OPENING LIN-DOOR:** Over the last seven games, Francisco Lindor is batting 8-26 (.308) with seven runs, three doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, three walks, one steal with a .400 OBP and a .654 SLG.

**THE LEFTOVERS:** The Mets has left 99 on base this season...That is tied for the sixth-most in the majors and the third-most in the National League.

**HITTING THE ROAD:** New York is 3-4 on the road his year...The team finished the 2022 season going 47-34 on the road...Their .580 road winning percentage placed them third in the majors and second in the NL...It was tied for the fourth-best road record in team history and the highest road-winning percentage since 2007.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** In his Citi Field debut, Senga earned the win on April 8 against the Marlins...Senga allowed one run over 6.0 innings on three hits, three walks and six strikeouts...His 14 strikeouts in the first two starts of his career tie with Steven Matz for the second-most by a Met to begin their major league career and is tied with Daisuke Matsuzaka for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born player in the first two starts of their major league career...Senga is also tied with Matz and Chris Bassitt for the fifth-most strikeouts by a Mets pitcher in their first two starts with the club.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Senga has won both of his starts this season, making him the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to earn the win in their first two career major league starts...Tampa Bay's Josh Fleming and Boston's Tanner Houck (2020) were the last starting pitchers to win each of their first three career games...No Mets starter has ever earned a win in each of his first three career games.

**MLB DEBUT NOTES:** Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

**NOW YOU SEE IT, NOW YOU DON'T:** Included in Senga's pitching repertoire is a unique pitch called the 'ghost fork'...The pitch is so named because its break gives the appearance that it disappears out of the strike zone...All eight of Senga's strikeouts on April 2 and four of his six strikeouts on April 8 came via the 'ghost fork'.

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

**2022:** Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

**INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION:** Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (0-2, 11.42)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Carrasco pitched 4.2 innings in his last appearance on April 9 against the Marlins...Allowed six runs on six hits with three walks and one strikeout...The outing marked the first time Carrasco allowed six runs since June 28, 2022

**MILESTONES & MORE:** Heading into the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1452.0...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 284 and 237, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.
