SAFTE AT CITI: Governor Cuomo announced today that beginning on May 19, Covid testing requirements will no longer be in place for fans entering Citi Field as well as a new ticket voucher program that will go into effect starting Monday, May 24...Go to Mets.com/SafeAtCiti to view all the latest details...For the Mets upcoming homestand beginning this Friday through Wednesday, May 12 vs. Arizona and Baltimore, the current requirements will remain in place...The new rules and regulations at Citi Field set forth by the Governor will begin on Monday, May 24 when the Mets start a homestand vs. Colorado.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to last night's game, RHP Jordan Yamamoto was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...He will wear #45...RHP Sean Reid-Foley was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...He was recalled today and will serve as the team's 27th man for both games.

STAFFING CHANGES: On Monday evening, the Mets relieved hitting coach Chili Davis and assistant hitting coach Tom Slater of their duties, effective immediately...The club named Hugh Quattlebaum the team's new hitting coach and Kevin Howard the new assistant hitting coach...Both will be in St. Louis tonight...Quattlebaum will wear #56, while Howard will wear #54.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets are playing a doubleheader against the Cardinals for the first time since July 26, 2016 in New York...The Mets lost the first game, 3-2, before winning, 3-1, in game two...This will be the first twinbill for the two teams in St. Louis since June 28, 1983...The Mets won, 10-1, in game one and fell, 8-1, in game two...The Mets are 3-1 in doubleheader games this season...New York swept a doubleheader from Philadelphia on Tuesday, April 13 at Citi Field...The Mets split a twinbill with the Rockies on April 17...New York will also play two on June 19 at Washington, June 25 vs. Philadelphia, August 31 vs. Miami and September 4 at Washington...The team played four doubleheaders in 2020, going 2-6 in those games...The Mets swept one doubleheader (at Yankee Stadium) and were swept three times (vs. Miami, at Yankees and at Washington).

WHO'LL STOP THE RAIN: The Mets were once again postponed due to weather last night...The team has played the fewest games in the majors...The Mets have had three games postponed due to COVID-19 safety protocols, one suspended game due to rain, another postponed due to snow and three additional postponements due to rain.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cardinals, 6-5, on Monday...The Mets are in the midst of a seven-game road trip (2-2) against the Phillies (2-1) and Cardinals (0-1)...Following this series, the team heads back to New York for a five-game, six-day homestand against the Diamondbacks (three games) and Orioles (two games).

POWER! UNLIMITED POWER!: The Mets have scored 18 runs over their last three games...The team had scored a total of 16 runs over their previous seven games...Over the last three games, the Mets are batting .291 (32-110) with 11 extra-base hits, 10 walks and an .806 OPS...The team is 11-29 (.379) with runners in scoring position in that span...The team had gone 7-48 (.146) with RISP in their previous seven games.

SOMEBODY HAS TO SAVE OUR SKINS: Jeurys Familia has 124 saves as a member of the Mets...He ranks third all-time in saves for the club behind Armando Benitez (160) and John Franco (276)...After allowing an earned run in his first appearance of the season on April 6, Familia has made eight scoreless appearances (6.0 innings), allowing five hits, three walks and striking out seven.

I LIKE MIKE: Over his 15 games, Michael Conforto is batting .302 (16-53) with six runs, five doubles, two home runs, six RBI, seven walks, a .383 OBP and an .893 OPS...This compares to a .120/.313/.160 slash line over his first seven games of the year...Conforto 120 career homers, tied with Edgardo Alfonzo for 10th on the Mets all-time list...Kevin McReynolds is ninth with 122.

MAY THE FOURTH BE WITH YOU: The Mets are 9-2 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 2-10 when scoring three or fewer runs...Overall the team has scored 76 runs this year, the fewest in the majors...New York is averaging 3.30 runs per game, the second-fewest in the majors and the lowest in the National League.

CARDINALS-METS NOTES: The Mets return to Busch Stadium for the first time since 2019...The Mets are 17-28 at the ballpark...The team is looking for their first series win in St. Louis since August 23-25, 2016.

SLIPPERY PETE: Pete Alonso is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .381 (8-21) with four runs, four doubles, four RBI and a walk in that span...He has safely hit in 12 of his last 15 games, batting .321 (18-56) with 10 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 11 RBI, five walks, a .387 OBP and a .994 OPS since April 17...This compares to a .207 (6-29) batting average over his first eight games...Alonso has 74 home runs since he entered the league in 2019...That is the highest total in the majors in that span...Alonso already ranks 27th on the Mets all-time list...He trails Rusty Staub who is 26th with 75.

THE STRO SHOW HITS THE ROAD: Marcus Stroman has won all three of his road starts this season, posting a 0.95 ERA (two earned runs/19.0 innings)...He is one of six qualified pitchers with an ERA under 1.00 away from home.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen added 5.1 scoreless innings on Monday night, allowing only two hits, a walk and struck out four...The bullpen has posted a 1.93 ERA (five earned runs/23.1 innings) with seven walks and 31 strikeouts over their last seven games...Overall, the Mets bullpen owns a 3.63 ERA (28 earned runs/69.1 innings), ranking 12th in the majors and fifth in the Senior Circuit.

QUALITY EATS: Through 22 complete games this season, the Mets have made 12 quality starts...The Mets hurled 17 quality starts in 2020, going 9-8 in those games...Mets starters are 7-9 and own a 2.66 ERA (36 earned runs/121.1 innings) with 35 walks and 146 strikeouts in 2021...The team's 3.04 starters' ERA is fifth in the majors and fourth in the Senior Circuit.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have struck out 233 in 193.1 innings this season which equates to a 10.83 strikeout per nine ratio...The team's 10.83 mark is the third-best in the majors and second in the NL...The team has walked only 62 this season, giving them a 2.88 walks per nine inning ratio, the eighth-best in the majors and third-best in the NL.

IT'S GONNA BE MAY: After allowing two runs in his first appearance of the season on April 5 in Philadelphia, Trevor May has made nine appearances, allowing only an unearned run on six hits with a walk and 13 strikeouts...Right-handed hitters are 4-21 against him with zero extra-base hits.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are in stretch where 12 of their next 17 games will be on the road...New York is 5-8 away from Citi Field in 2021...The team owns a 4.49 ERA (53 earned runs/106.1 innings) with 41 walks and 126 strikeouts on the road, compared to a 6-4 record with a 1.75 ERA (17 earned runs/87.0 innings) with 21 walks and 107 strikeouts at home.

HONORING HIS LEGACY: The New York Mets will wear a "41" Tom Seaver tribute patch on the right sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2021 season...Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2004, Mike Piazza hit his 352nd home run as a catcher, surpassing Carlton Fisk for the most as a backstop...Piazza hit a solo hot in the first inning to put the Mets on top, 1-0...New York went on to defeat the Giants, 8-2, at Shea Stadium...Jae Weong Seo made the start, but did not receive the decision...David Weathers earned the win in relief...The Mets collected 11 hits in the win including a three RBI game from Shane Spencer...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

STROMAN NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Will make his seventh start of the season and fourth on the road today...Will be his first start against St. Louis as a member of the Mets and second career start against the Cardinals...In his last start, Stroman threw 5.0 innings, allowing two runs, both earned, on three hits on April 30 against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park...Suffered his second loss of the season in the Mets' 2-1 loss...Left the game early due to hamstring tightness after striking out a season-high eight batters and walking just one...Doubled in the contest for his third career extra-base hit.

KEEP IT ON THE GROUND: Stroman ranks second in the majors with a 60.0 percent ground ball rate and seventh with a 0.31 HR/9...He recorded an 83.3 percent ground ball rate in his first start of the season...That is the highest grounder rate in any start of at least 6.0 innings so far this season...It's been almost six years since a Mets pitcher had a higher rate of ground balls in a start of 6.0 innings or more (Jonathon Niese, 85.7 percent on June 11, 2015 vs. San Francisco).

WINNING!: From September 12, 2019 to April 18, 2021 (Stroman opted out of the 2020 season), Stroman went 6-0 with a 1.43 ERA (seven earned runs/44.0 innings) over seven starts...The Mets won all seven of those games...He has limited his opponent to a .178 average (27-152) during his six-game winning streak...It's tied for the second-longest streak of his career...He won nine games in a row from September 20, 2014-May 1, 2016 and earned six straight wins from April 23-June 10, 2017.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Stroman did not allow a run in his 14.1 innings until giving up a run in the seventh inning at Colorado on April 18...This scoreless streak extended from the last 2.0 innings of his first start on April 6, his 0.1 innings on April 11, his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 13 and his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 18...He fell 1.2 innings shy of tying his career-best streak (16.0 IP).

HIGH QUANTITY OF QUALITY: Stroman has thrown more than 6.0 innings in three of his five completed starts this season and is currently sporting a 1.86 ERA.

THE STRO MUST GO ON: Threw nine pitches in a game suspended by rain on April 11 versus Miami at Citi Field, allowing one hit in 0.1 inning...In his first start of the season, Stroman earned the Mets' first win and picked up a quality start on April 6...Pitched 6.0 innings, allowing three hits and one run against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park...Induced 15 ground balls and allowed only one batter to lift the ball into the air...Walked two batters and struck out three in his first regular season start since Septemper 27, 2019.

LAST START VS. ST. LOUIS: Making his second career start against the Cardinals and first in a Mets uniform...Last faced St. Louis on June 6, 2014 with Toronto...Earned the win, tossing 6.0 innings of one-run ball...Gave up seven hits while walking two batters and striking out seven...Was the second start of his career and his third consecutive win.

WITH THE METS: Stroman has gone 7-4 with a 3.13 ERA (31 earned runs/89.0 innings) in his 17 starts with New York...The Mets have gone 12-5 in his 17 starts after he joined the team on July 28, 2019...In 2019, he struck out 60 in 59.2 innings with the Mets (Stroman never averaged more than 9.0 K/9 in a season with Toronto).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (1-1, 3.00 ERA)

LAST START: Walker tossed 6.0 innings and allowed four runs on seven hits in his last outing, May 1 at Philadelphia...Walked one and fanned four...The Mets won, 5-4, and improved to 4-1 in games that Walker has started.

AW, SNAP: Walker ran his homerless innings streak to 35.0 before allowing a sixth-inning home run in his last start...He was 2.0 innings shy of a new career-high homerless streak.
