AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. Texas (through Wed.)...dropped two-of-three vs. Cleveland this weekend...after an off day on Thursday — their first since 9/2 — will embark on their final road trip of the year with three games at Boston (Fri.-Sun.) and Toronto (9/28-30).

- ▶ Have lost three of their last four games after winning four of their previous five...are still 27-18 in their last 45G, 30-19 in their last 49G and 32-20 in their last 52G.
- ▶ **Are 41-26 (.612) in their last 67 games (since 7/6), tied for the fifth-best record in the Majors and tied for the second-best record in the AL in that span**, trailing only San Francisco (44-22, .667), Tampa Bay (43-22, .662), Los Angeles-NL (43-22, .662) and Milwaukee (40-23, .635).
- ▶ Are 17G into a 20-day stretch without an off day (9/3-22).
- ▶ Have lost five of their last seven series (2-5-0) since 8/30 after going undefeated in their previous 11 series from 7/27-8/2...have still won or split 32 of their last 45 completed series since 4/20 (28-13-4 in those series).
- ▶ Have recorded 39 come-from-behind wins this season, tied with San Francisco for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Boston (45) and Tampa Bay (44).
- ▶ **The Yankees clinched their 29th consecutive winning season** (since 1993)...marks the second-longest such stretch in Major League history and **is tied with the Boston Bruins' 29-season winning streak from 1968-96 for the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL)**, behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).
- ▶ Have also clinched their 30th straight winning season at home (since 1992)...according to *Elias*, is the Majors' longest current streak and the longest streak by any team since a Major League-record 47-year streak for the Yankees from 1918-64.

SEVY SEASON: RHP Luis Severino was reinstated from the 60-day injured list prior to tonight's game...has not pitched in a Major League game since 2019 ALCS Game 3 on 10/15/19.

- ▶ His season debut will mark his 100th career appearance... in 99 games (88 starts) with the Yankees (2015-19), has gone 42-26 with a 3.46 ERA (530.0IP, 204ER) with 589K.
- ▶ **From 2017-19, posted a 34-15 record and 3.13 ERA (396.2IP, 138ER) in 66 starts.**
- ▶ The two-time All-Star (2017-18) has two of the top-seven single-season strikeout totals in Yankees history (230K in 2017, 220K in 2018)...is one of three pitchers in Yankees history with multiple 200-strikeout seasons (also David Cone, 1997-98 and Ron Guidry, 1978-79)...his 450K from 2017-18 were the most over a two-season span in Yankees history (previously Guidry, 449K from 1978-79)...he finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting.
- ▶ Has made 11 career relief appearances — all coming in 2016 — going 3-0 with a 0.39 ERA (23.1P, 1ER).

ROLL CALL: The Yankees have used 58 players this season (P: 29, C: 3, INF: 13, OF: 13), tying their franchise record for most players used in a season (also 58 in 2014)...would set a new franchise record with RHP Luis Severino's season debut.

NATIONAL GIO-GRAPHIC: INF Gio Urshela hit a solo home run in the third inning on Sunday vs. Cleveland...has 2HR in his last five games after going homerless in his previous 27 games from 7/6-9/14.

- ▶ Has 5RBI in his last five games.
- ▶ Is hitting .333/.357/.593 (9-for-27) with 3R, 1 double, 2HR, 5RBI and 1BB in his last eight games since 9/12.
- ▶ Is hitting .300 (48-for-160) with 16R, 8 doubles, 6HR, 16RBI, 8BB and 1HP in 45 home games this season.

NASTY NESTOR: LHP Nestor Cortes will make his 12th start and 20th appearance of the season tonight vs. Texas...is 2-2 with a 2.60 ERA (79.2IP, 23ER) and 87K in 19 appearances (11 starts) this season...since making his season debut on 5/30, his 2.60 ERA is the second-lowest in the AL and ninth-lowest in the Majors over that span (min. 60.0IP).

- ▶ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in nine of those 11 starts...has tossed at least 5.0IP in each of his last nine starts.
- ▶ Has held right-handed to a .205/.272/.353 (46-for-224) slash line with 6 doubles, 9HR and 20BB.
- ▶ In 10 appearances (five starts) at Yankee Stadium this season, is 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (37.1IP, 8ER) and 41K.

GLEYBER DAY WEEKEND: INF Gleyber Torres has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games.

- ▶ Is hitting .298 (25-for-84) with 11R, 6 doubles, 1HR, 8RBI, 5BB/1BB, 2SF and 45B in his last 24 games since 8/1.

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu has multiple hits in four of his last seven games...is batting .324 (24-for-74) with 12R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI, 7BB and 2SF in his last 19 games (since 8/30).

RELEASE THE KRAKEN: C Gary Sánchez has hit .340/.421/.720 (17-for-50) with 13R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI, 4BB and 3HP in 15 career games vs. the Texas Rangers.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton has reached base safely in 38 of his last 43 games since 8/2, batting .302/.360/.593 (49-for-162) with 22R, 5 doubles, 14HR, 34RBI, 13BB, 2HP and 1SF over that span.

BLANK SPACE: Yankees pitchers held the Rangers scoreless in the final 22.0 innings of their four-game set earlier this year in Texas...the Yankees went 3-1 during the series, posting a 2.31 ERA (35.0IP, 9ER) in those games.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 20, 2010: The Yankees dedicate a monument to Principal Owner George M. Steinbrenner III in Monument Park. The Yankees go on to defeat the Rays that night, 8-6.

Sept. 20, 1980: In a pregame ceremony, the Yankees dedicate a plaque in Monument Park in honor of Thurman Munson.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 21, 2014: Brett Gardner hits the 15,000th home run in franchise history in a 5-2 win vs. Toronto.

Sept. 21, 2008: The Yankees play their final game at the original Yankee Stadium, defeating Baltimore, 7-3. Following the game, Derek Jeter addresses the crowd of more than 54,000 people, declaring Yankee fans "the greatest fans in the world."

Sept. 21, 1955: In his final bout, boxer Rocky Marciano knocks out Archie Moore in the ninth round to retain his world heavyweight title at Yankee Stadium.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Indians, 11-1, on Sunday at Yankee Stadium...RHP Gerrit Cole (5.2IP, 10H, 7ER, 1BB, 7K, 2HR, 1HP) started and took the loss, allowing a season-high-tying 7ER...Yankees pitchers allowed double-digit runs for their second straight game, marking just the third time since 2016 that the Yankees have allowed at least 10R in back-to-back games (also 2G from 7/25-26/19 and 9/20-21/20)...SS/3B Gio Urshela (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) drove in the Yankees' only run with a solo HR in the third inning...3B DJ LeMahieu (2-for-4) and 1B Anthony Rizzo (2-for-4) each picked up multi-hit games...LHP Lucas Luetge (1.1IP, 2H, 1R/OER, 1K) and RHP Clarke Schmidt (2.0IP, 4H, 3R/2ER, 2BB, 4K) each pitched in relief.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have homered in a season-high 12 straight games (since 9/8)...marks their longest streak since a 13-game stretch from 9/29/19-8/6/20 (last game in 2019 and first 12 games in 2020)...have hit multiple HR in eight of those 12 games, hitting 29HR in that span.

- ▶ In their last 12 games, 45 of their 55R have scored via the home run.
- ▶ Have hit 75HR in 47 games since the beginning of August, the second-most in the Majors in that span, trailing only the Toronto Blue Jays (80HR).

DOWN ON THE FARM: FCL Yankees' OF Grant Richardson was named the "FCL Player of the Week" after batting .467/.619/1.000 (7-for-15) with 5R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 6BB and 2SB over five games...SS Dayro Perez of the DSL Yankees 2 earned "DSL Player of the Week" honors after hitting .750 (9-for-12) with 9R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 9RBI, 4BB and 1SB over four games...recorded multiple RBI in three of those four games.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP NESTOR CORTES (2-2, 2.60)

LHP Nestor Cortes will make his 12th start and 20th appearance of the season in tonight's series opener vs. Texas...will make the start on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Wednesday at Baltimore, striking out a career-high 11 batters (6.1IP, 3H, 1ER, 2BB, 1HR) without recording a decision...was signed to a Major League contract and selected to the Yankees' 26-man roster from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre prior to the game on 5/30 at Detroit...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 1/4/21...in 2020, went 0-1 with a 15.26 ERA (7.2IP, 13ER) in five games (one start) with the Seattle Mariners before missing the remainder of the season with a left elbow impingement...was originally selected by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft...was selected by the Baltimore Orioles from the Yankees in the 2017 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Yankees on 4/13/18...was acquired by the Seattle Mariners from the Yankees in exchange for international bonus pool money on 7/25/19...over parts of four Major League seasons, has played with Baltimore (2018), the Yankees (2019, '21) and Seattle (2020).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 11th start and 19th appearance of the season on Wednesday at Baltimore, striking out a career-high 11 batters (6.1IP, 3H, 1ER, 2BB, 1HR) without recording a decision...surrendered a solo HR to Austin Hays in the sixth...has allowed at least 1HR in each of his last eight starts after not allowing a HR in his first three starts of the season...marked the ninth time in 11 starts this season he has received 3 runs-or-less support.

- ✦ **With LHP Jordan Montgomery's 12K on Thursday, it marked just the third time in the last 21 seasons that Yankees starters recorded back-to-back double digit strikeouts games** (AJ Burnett's 12K and CC Sabathia's 10K from 8/27-28/09; CC Sabathia's 10K and Andy Pettitte's 10K from 8/13-14/09).
- ✦ *Elias* confirms that Cortes and Montgomery are the first pair of Yankees starters to record at least 11K in back-to-back games.

NASTY NESTOR: Since making his season debut on 5/30, **his 2.60 ERA (79.2IP, 23ER) is the second-lowest in the AL and ninth-lowest in the Majors over that span** (min. 60.0IP).

VS. TEXAS: Has not recorded a decision in three career relief appearances vs. the Rangers, posting a 16.20 ERA (3.1IP, 6ER).
 ✦ Has made one career relief appearance vs. the Rangers at Yankee Stadium, allowing 4ER in 2.0IP (3H, 1BB, 3K, 1HR) on 9/2/19 with the Yankees.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 10 appearances (five starts) at Yankee Stadium this season, is 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (37.1IP, 8ER) and 41K.
 ✦ Has made five home starts this season (7/4 vs. New York-NL-G2, 8/5 vs. Seattle, 8/20 vs. Minnesota, 9/3 vs. Baltimore and 9/9 vs. Toronto), going 1-0 with a 2.67 ERA (27.0IP, 8ER).
 ✦ Has made 29 career appearances (five starts) at home in his career, going 3-0 with a 4.42 ERA (73.1IP, 36ER) and 80K.

THE RIGHT STUFF: Right-handed batters are hitting just .205/.272/.353 (46-for-224) with 6 doubles, 9HR and 20BB against Cortes this season...among left-handed pitchers vs. right-handed batters this season (min. 100 batters faced), he ranks eighth in the AL in on-base percentage and opponent's BA and tenth in slugging percentage.

AS A STARTER: Is 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA (60.0IP, 18ER) with 59K and a .213 opponents' BA (47-for-221) in 11 starts this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in nine of his 11 starts this season...has tossed at least 5.0IP in each of his last nine starts...is 2-3 with a 3.88 ERA (62.2IP, 27ER) in 13 career starts (11 in 2021, one in 2020 and one in 2019).

2021: Is 2-2 with a 2.60 ERA (79.2IP, 23ER) and 87K in 19 appearances (11 starts) this season...is 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA (60.0IP, 18ER) as a starter this season...also has a 2.29 ERA (19.2IP, 5ER) in eight relief appearances...has tossed at least 2.0 innings in 17 of his 19 appearances this season...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 13 of his 19 appearances this season and has been scoreless in six of those outings.

- ✦ Since making his season debut on 5/30, **his 2.60 ERA (79.2IP, 23ER) is the second-lowest in the AL and ninth-lowest in the Majors over that span (min. 60.0IP)**.
- ✦ Has allowed at least 1HR in each of his last eight starts after not allowing a HR in his first three starts of the season.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 5/30 at Detroit, allowing 2R/1ER in 3.2IP (3H, 4BB, 3K)...issued a career-high 4BB in the outing (previous: 3BB, two times)...marked his longest appearance since 6/25/19 vs. Toronto with the Yankees (4.1IP).
- ✦ Recorded a season-best 11.2-inning scoreless streak from 6/19-7/4-G2.
- ✦ In Game 2 on 7/4 vs. New York-NL, started and took a no-decision after allowing 1ER in 3.1IP (2H, 0BB, 4K)...marked his third career start and first start since 8/14/20 at Houston with Seattle (L, 0.1IP, 5H, 8R/7ER, 2BB, 1K, 2HR).
- ✦ Made his second opening assignment on 7/9 at Houston and took a no-decision after tossing 4.2 scoreless innings (2H, 2BB, 2K)...was his fourth career start and first scoreless start.
- ✦ Was placed on the COVID-19 injured list on 7/15 and was reinstated prior to the game on 7/23...missed six team games from 7/15-22.
- ✦ Made his fifth start of the year on 8/10 at Kansas City, recording his first loss of the season after allowing a season-high 5R/4ER in a career-high 5.2IP (7H, 5K, 2HR).
- ✦ Tossed a career-high 7.0 innings (4H, 2ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR, 1HP) on 8/20 vs. Minnesota, recording his second win of the season...also threw a career-high 104 pitches (previous: 98) and tied his career high in strikeouts (also 7K on 8/15/21 at Chicago-AL and 6/15/19 at Chicago-AL).
- ✦ Recorded a career-high 11K on Wednesday at Baltimore (6.1IP, 3H, 1ER, 2BB, 1HR), marking his first career double-digit strikeout game.

IN 2020: Went 0-1 with a 15.26 ERA (7.2IP, 13ER) in five games (one start) with the Seattle Mariners before missing the remainder of the season with a left elbow impingement...following the season, made five starts for las Estrella Orientales in the Dominican Winter League without recording a decision (4.91 ERA, 18.1IP, 17H, 10ER, 5BB, 27K, 2HR).

CAREER NOTES: Has appeared in parts of four Major League seasons with the Baltimore Orioles (2018), the Yankees (2019, '21) and the Seattle Mariners (2020).

- ✦ Was originally selected by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft.
- ✦ Was selected by Baltimore from the Yankees in the 2017 Rule 5 Draft...made his Major League debut with Baltimore on 3/30/18 vs. Minnesota before being returned to the Yankees on 4/13/18.
- ✦ Was designated for assignment by the Yankees on 11/20/19 and traded to the Seattle Mariners for international signing bonus pool money on 10/25/19.
- ✦ Was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 1/4/21 with an invitation to spring training as a non-roster invitee.
