RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Guardians (2-0, one to play), Rangers (three to play), and White Sox (three to play) today at Tropicana Field...have won five of their last six games following a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19), which was their longest since April 2-8, 2025 (also 5G — excl. multi-season streaks)...are 18-10 since June 24, third in MLB to the Red Sox (21-5) and Cubs (18-8), on the heels of an MLB-worst 9-18 stretch (May 24–June 23)...are currently 5-5 on stretches of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...overall, lead the AL with a 61-43 record, tied for third best in the majors and tied for their fifth-best mark through 104 games...became the first AL team to reach 60 wins for the second time, joining 2023 (60-35)...have spent 70 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 29 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.), their second-longest stay atop the division this season behind May 9–June 12 (35 days)...the 70 total days in first lead AL East clubs, ahead of the Yankees (62)—in all of MLB, only the Dodgers (117), Braves (115), Guardians (95), and Brewers (85) have spent more days leading their respective divisions...marks the latest into a season they have led the AL East since winning the division in 2021.

✦ The Rays logged their seventh shutout win and fourth at Tropicana Field in last night's 3-0 win, clinching a series victory and a season series win over Cleveland...all four of their home shutouts have come by 3-0 finals (also: May 1 vs. SF, May 6 vs. TOR, July 8 vs. NYY).

✦ With the win, the Rays improved to 6-2-2 in their last 10 series (June 19–pres.) and have claimed back-to-back sets for the first time since June 26–July 2 (vs. AZ, at KC)...they are 11-1-2 in their last 14 series at Tropicana Field (April 24–pres.) and 5-0-2 in their last seven (June 8–pres.), their most consecutive home sets without a series loss since May 9–June 20, 2025 (7-0-1) at Steinbrenner Field and most at the Trop since June 11–July 31, 2024 (6-0-1).

✦ Yandy Diaz became the fourth player to tally 1,000 hits as a Ray with a leadoff single in the opening frame...he joined Carl Crawford (1,480), Evan Longoria (1,471), and Ben Zobrist (1,016).

✦ It marked the Rays AL-leading 30th victory in which they never trailed...in all of MLB, only the Phillies (33) and Brewers (31) have more...they have not faced a deficit in four of their five wins since the All-Star break (July 22 at TOR: trailed 1-0, won 4-2).

✦ The Rays have permitted three runs or fewer in six straight games, their second-longest streak this season behind a franchise-record 13-game stretch from April 22–May 6, which tied the longest streak by an AL club in the Wild Card era (since 1995)...the staff has turned in an MLB-best 1.87 ERA (53.0IP, 11ER) with 40 SO, 10 BB, and a .199 (38-for-181) opp. average during the current streak.

✦ The Rays' .280 RISP average ranks second in MLB to the Twins (.282)...the club is 20-for-47 (.426) with RISP across the last five games (July 21–pres.).

✦ They are an MLB-best 37-15 at home, including wins in 11 of their last 14 contests at Tropicana Field, outscoring opponents, 76-44 (+32), in that span while out-homering them, 23-16 (+7)...the 37-15 record is their second best through 52 home games behind 2008 (38-14) and marks the best such record by an AL club since the 2022 Yankees (40-12).

✦ The club's 20-10 (.667) winning pct. vs. left-handed starting pitchers is the best in the majors...this includes a 13-1 record at Tropicana Field...today marks the fifth time in 11 games since the All-Star break the Rays will be opposed by a southpaw starter.

✦ In conjunction with MLB Hall of Fame Weekend, the Rays are donning their green Devil Rays caps and throwback Devil Rays uniforms this series...the club is 9-0 when wearing the latter in 2026.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

✦ With a win today the Rays would:
✦ Reach a season-high-tying 19 games over .500 for the fourth time (last: 56-37 on July 11).
✦ Tally their 10th series sweep, extending an MLB lead...match five other seasons (2023, 2019, 2012, 2011, 2008) for the fourth-most sweeps in team history, trailing only 2021 (14), 2018 (12), and 2013 (12)...record 10 sweeps before the end of July for the first time, surpassing the previous mark of nine (2026, 2013).
✦ Sweep the Guardians for the seventh time, first since July 5-7, 2021 at Tropicana Field...earn their sixth sweep over Cleveland at the Trop.

BOTTOMS UP—The 5-9 spots in the Rays lineup have batted .398 (37-for-93) with 37 of the club's 56 hits (66.1%) and 23 of its 29 RBI (79.3%) over the last five games...during the month of July, the Rays 5-9 hitters are slashing .307/.350/.491 (120-for-391) with an .841 OPS—the average, slugging pct., and OPS all lead the majors, and only the Brewers 5-9 batters have a better on-base pct. (.354)...that portion of the order is on pace for their best average in a calendar month in club history, ahead of April 2005 (.302), and their fourth-best OPS to April 2023 (.866), June 2009 (.849), and June 2008 (.846).

✦ Over his last 12 games, Victor Mesa Jr. is slashing .353/.405/.824 (12-for-34) with 1 2B, 5 HR, 8 RBI, 3 BB, 6 R, and 2 SB...min. 30 PA during that span (July 7–pres.)...he leads the AL in slugging pct., is tied for first in homers, and ranks second in OPS (1.229) to BOS Andrew Monasterio (1.266).

✦ Nick Fortes is 10-for-15 (.667) over his last four games, tied for the most hits by a Rays catcher across any four-game span in team history (5x, last: Travis d'Arnaud from July 6-15, 2019)...between his four-hit effort on Fri. vs. CLE and his 4-for-4 performance on June 10 vs. BOS, Fortes joined Dioner Navarro (2G, 2008) as the only Rays backstops with multiple four-hit games in a season...he has hit safely in each of his last 5 AB, the longest active streak in the majors.

✦ In his last 19 games (June 24–pres.), Fortes is 21-for-53 (.396) with 5 XBH and 13 RBI, MLB's third-best average in that span (min. 50AB) to ATH Joshua Kuroda-Grauer (.417) and HOU Jeremy Peña (.400).

✦ Chandler Simpson is 14-for-29 (.483) in his last eight games and has hit safely in 24 of his last 29 contests (June 19–pres.), slashing .374/.400/.477 (40-for-107) with 7 2B, 2 3B, 6 RBI, 12 R, and 12 SB...he paces the majors in average over that timeframe, is tied for the MLB lead in steals with MIA Esteury Ruiz, and is tied for second in hits, one shy of leader COL Jake McCarthy (41).

✦ Jonny DeLuca has gone 9-for-22 (.409) with 3 XBH, 7 RBI, and four multi-hit efforts across a five-game hitting streak...Ben Williamson is batting .333 (12-for-36) with 2 2B and 4 RBI in his last 10 games.

KIDCAMI—Junior Caminero needs 1 HR to become the fourth player in franchise history with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining Evan Longoria (4), Carlos Peña (3), and Brandon Lowe (2)...he would join Peña (3 straight, 2007-09) as the only Rays to reach the mark in back-to-back seasons...he currently has 74 HR between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), third most in the modern era (since 1900) behind MLN Eddie Mathews (87) and NYY Joe DiMaggio (75)...Caminero could become the 11th player in the modern era with multiple 30-HR campaigns before his age-23 season, joining LAA Mike Trout (2012, 2014), FLA Giancarlo Stanton (2011-12), FLA Miguel Cabrera (2004-05), STL Albert Pujols (2001-02), SEA Alex Rodriguez (1996, 1998), OAK José Canseco (1986-87), ATL Bob Horner (1978-80), CIN Frank Robinson (1956, 1958), Mathews (1953-54), BOS Ted Williams (1939, 1941), and PHA Jimmie Foxx (1929-30)...he could also become the seventh Dominican-born third baseman in MLB history with multiple 30-HR seasons in his career, joining Adrian Beltré (5), José Ramírez (4), Aramis Ramírez (4), Rafael Devers (3), Tony Batista (3), and Pedro Alvarez (2).

✦ Caminero leads MLB with 14 HR in his last 29 contests since June 23...he has hit safely in 12 of his last 14 games (July 9–pres.), batting .333 (18-for-54) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, and a 1.021 OPS in that span.

THE BAKE SHOW—Bryan Baker converted his 16th consecutive save opportunity last night, the majors' third-longest active streak behind SD Mason Miller (26) and TOR Louis Varland (21)...it marks the seventh-longest streak in franchise history and is the longest since Alex Colomé (21) from April 17–July 21, 2016...Baker's 27 saves on the year are second most in MLB to CLE Cade Smith (29) and mark the most by Ray before the end of July since Colomé's club-record-tying 30 saves in 2017.

✦ Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 40 saves, their second most before the calendar flips to August behind 2015 (41)...the Brewers and Guardians (both 33) are the next closest clubs...the Rays are on pace for a club-record 62 saves, which would surpass 2015 (60) and tie the 2015 Cardinals for the fifth-highest total by any team since saves became an official statistic in 1969...they own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.633/38-22).

CAN'T TOUCH THIS—After winning four of the first five matchups, the Rays have clinched their second season series win over the Guardians in the last three years (4-3 in 2024), improving to 5-2-1 in the last eight season sets since 2018 (clubs did not meet in 2020)...between the current set and April 27-29 at CLE, they have claimed back-to-back series victories over Cleveland for the first time since a six-series streak from Aug. 31, 2018–July 25, 2021...this includes three straight home series wins (Aug. 11, 2023) and six in their last seven meetings at Tropicana Field (Sept. 10, 2018–pres.)...the Rays staff has turned in a 1.43 ERA (44.0IP, 7ER) through five matchups this season, which would mark their lowest single-season mark vs. an AL opponent in team history...they have yielded 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight games vs. CLE (Sept. 15, 2024–pres.)...the second-longest streak over any opponent in club history (see tables on the right)...their 1.96 ERA (114.2IP, 25ER) against the Guardians in that span is the second lowest by any AL team against an AL opponent, trailing the Yankees vs. KC (1.58)...this year, Guardians hitters are 2-for-28 (.071) against Rays pitching with runners in scoring position.

✦ The Rays have won seven straight games vs. AL Central opponents (June 24–pres.), which comes on the heels of a six-game losing streak against the division (April 29–June 23) and a 10-game winning streak (April 4-28)...overall, their 17-7 (.708) record against the AL Central is the best by any AL team, ahead of the Orioles and Red Sox (both 14-8/.636).

TODAY'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber today for his 20th start of the campaign and 150th career appearance (101st start)...has made the ninth-most starts in franchise history (100GS), trailing sixth-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (108GS)...ranks highly among AL qualifiers in strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 5.72), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.55), opp. on-base pct. (3rd, .258), WHIP (T3rd, 0.98), and opp. SLG (5th, .343).

- With a win today, Rasmussen would improve to 2-0 following the All-Star break, becoming one of six AL starting pitchers to do so this season...would be the first time in his career he has earned a win in his first two starts after the break.
- His .700 (14-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the second-highest winning percentage in franchise history, behind **Blake Snell** (.741/20-7)...a victory today would trim the gap to 0.027 behind Snell.
- Owns a .210 (44-for-210) opp. average in day games this season, ranking fourth among major league arms (min 50.0IP in day games) this season...his 58 strikeouts rank sixth among AL arms.
- He is limiting right-handed batters to a .177 (28-for-158) clip this season, pacing the Tampa Bay rotation and is the third-best mark among MLB arms, trailing LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (.142) and ATH **J.T. Ginn** (.168).
- Since 2021, his 2.84 ERA ranks sixth best among all major league pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind Ohtani (2.68), MIL **Brandon Woodruff** (2.79), ATL **Chris Sale** (2.80), PHI **Zack Wheeler** (2.83), and NYY **Max Fried** (2.87).

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen earned his eighth win of the season after allowing two runs over 5.0 innings in a 12-2 victory on July 21 at TOR (W, 5.0IP, 7H, 2ER, BB, 5SO)...matched his season high by allowing seven hits (4x, last: July 9 vs. NYY)...after yielding three singles in the 1st inning, he permitted three baserunners over his next 15 batters faced...his lone blemish was an RBI-single by **Daulton Varsho** in the 6th inning before handing the ball to **Cole Sulser**, who allowed an inherited runner to score.

- With 5.0 IP and 5 SO in the outing, he eclipsed 100.0 IP and recorded 100 SO or more for the second consecutive season and third overall (104.1IP, 103SO), turning the trick in 2025 and 2022.
- Did not allow an extra-base hit until the 6th inning (**George Springer** 2B), marking his 13th outing of allowing one or zero extra-base hits in a contest this season, the third most among AL starters behind LAA **José Soriano** (15) and TOR **Dylan Cease** (14).
- Twelve of his 19 starts have been 5.0 innings or more with 2 ER or fewer, tied for the fifth most such starts among AL pitchers this year.

ON GUARD—Across seven career appearances (five starts) opposite the Guardians, Rasmussen is 0-1 with a 3.57 ERA (22.2IP, 9ER), a 1.24 WHIP, and a .247 (21-for-85) opp. average...this includes a 2.14 ERA (21.0IP, 5ER) across the five starts, with three of those starts being 5.0 innings or more.

- He is 7-5 with a 3.05 ERA (106.1IP, 36ER) over 29 career appearances (20 starts) vs. AL Central foes, including 6-5 with a 2.56 ERA (95.0IP, 27ER) in the 20 starts.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME—The right-hander is making his 10th start at home this season...is 5-3 with a 3.51 ERA (48.2IP, 19ER), with more than four times as many SO (49) than BB (10) in his previous nine outings...Rasmussen has logged a career 2.87 ERA (178.2IP, 57ER) at Tropicana Field, the fourth-lowest ERA in the venue's history (min. 150.0IP), behind **Blake Snell** (2.70), **Shane McClanahan** (2.77), and **David Price** (2.85).

- With a win today, the Rays would become the only team in the majors with three starting pitchers owning six or more home wins: **Nick Martinez** (7-1), McClanahan (7-1), and Rasmussen.
- Since 2021, Rasmussen's 17 career home wins with the Rays are second most behind McClanahan's 28 wins...min. 100.0 IP, his .567 (17-13) winning pct. at home as a Ray is the eighth best in franchise history.

A CUT ABOVE—Rasmussen's cutter is his most used pitched this season (31.2%), generating a team-high 25.3% whiff rate on the pitch...his 510 cutters this year are the second most among AL pitchers behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (542).

- Min. 300 pitches on the cutter, he owns the fifth best whiff rate among AL pitchers this year behind MIN **Taj Bradley** (36.9%), CLE **Tanner Bibee** (33.8%), TEX **Nathan Eovaldi** (27.3%), and DET **Kenley Jansen** (27.2%).

MORE OF FOUR—In the 4th inning this season, Rasmussen has logged a 2.55 ERA (17.2IP, 5ER) with 24 strikeouts, marking his most strikeouts and second-best ERA among the first seven frames...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 15.0IP in the 4th inn.) this year in WHIP (3rd, 0.68), opp. average (4th, .161), opp. OBP (4th, .212), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 12.00), and strikeouts (T8th).

DON'T WALK THIS WAY—Rasmussen's 4.3 pct. walk rate is the lowest among qualified major league pitchers, ahead of teammate **Nick Martinez** (4.4%)...he has yielded two walks or fewer in each of his last 21 starts dating back to Sept. 19, 2025 vs. BOS...has walked just 21 batters in that span, good for a 4.8 pct. walk rate, which is fifth lowest in the majors (min. 400BF) behind Martinez (4.4%), PHI **Cristopher Sánchez** (4.4%), COL **Kyle Freeland** (4.6%), and LAD **Justin Wrobleksi** (4.7%).
