SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 8-3, vs. Tigers due to a 6-run seventh inning.

- ◆ Zac Gallen, who struck out 6 of the first 9 batters, opened with 6.2 scoreless frames before allowing back-to-back run-scoring hits to tie the game 2-2 in the seventh inning.
- ◆ Ketel Marte and Corbin Carroll each tripled.
- ♦ Ketel Marte, Joc Pederson and Lourdes Gurriel Jr. each drove in a run.

ABOUT YESTERDAY: Last night was Zac Gallen's 43rd consecutive home start of 5.0+ innings, the fourth-longest streak by a starter in franchise history behind Curt Schilling (54), Brandon Webb (48) and Dan Haren (44) and ahead of Randy Johnson (40) and Merrill Kelly (34) [source: Stats Inc.].

DURING THE DAY: The D-backs are 5-1 in their last 6 day games and 9-6 overall in day games this season.

- ♦ Are 4-2 in home day games this season.
- ♦ Dating back to Aug. 13, 2023, the D-backs are 10-4 in their last 14 home day games.

MONTY'S QUALITY STREAK: Jordan Montgomery's 4 straight quality starts vs. Tigers (4 GS), going 1-1 with a 2.96 ERA (8 ER in 24.1 IP), opponent .209 AVG/.583 OPS, 4 walks and 20 strikeouts, is tied for his most against a single opponent, along with the Cubs from May 6, 2017-Sept. 2, 2022.

A CAREER BEST FOR EL PIKE: Ketel Marte has a new career best 17-game hitting streak, which is the longest active streak in the Majors and second-longest streak this season, behind Alec Bohm/PHI (18).

• His streak is 1 of 16 by a D-back of 17+ games...his 17-gamer is tied for the 11th-longest in franchise history...there are 5 18-gamers courtesy Ender Inciarte (2014), Miguel Montero (2011), Justin Upton (2009), Junior Spivey (2002) and Mark Grace (2001).

EL PIKE AT HOME: Ketel Marte has hit safely in 12 straight home games at a .360 clip (18-for-50)/1.045 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 6 RBI and 2 walks.

- Franchise record for home hitting streak is 21 games by Luis Gonzalez (April 12-June 4, 1999) and Stephen Drew (July 17-Sept. 10, 2006).
- ♦ Has reached base safely in 23 straight home games, since March 28, tied for the 10th-longest streak in club history, with Tony Womack (1999), Steve Finley (2004) and Nick Ahmed (2019).
- Franchise record for home on-base streak is 48 games by Steve Finley (Sept. 15, 1999-June 26, 2000).

THREE-BAGGERS: Ketel Marte's sixth-inning triple last night was his 38th triple as a D-back, third in franchise history, passing Tony Womack (37), and putting him behind only Stephen Drew (52) and David Peralta (46).

OFF DAY May 23

NO LONGBALLS FOR JOE: Joe Mantiply's 38.2-inning homerless streak, since August 8, 2023 (Top 5), is the seventh-longest active streak in the Majors...Reese Olson/DET has the longest active streak (53.0 IP).

♦ Has held 159 batters faced homerless in 41 games (3 starts) since August 8 last season...is 1 of 3 pitchers (min. 30 G, max. 5 GS) during that stretch to not allow a home run along with Jake Diekman/NYM (143 BF/37 G/0 GS) and Cionel Pérez (99 BF/33 G/0 GS).

STARTERS STALLING OPPONENTS: D-backs starting pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 9 of their last 11 starts, since May 7 (4.52 ERA, .261 opponent average, 19 walks and 50 strikeouts)...of the 32 runs allowed during this stretch, 14 have come in 2 outings while the other 9 games totaled 18 runs.

• When D-backs starters allow 3 or fewer runs, the team is 19-15.

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: Ketel Marte's 2.6 bWAR is ninth among all players [pitcher or position]...the Top 3 are Mookie Betts/LAD (3.4), Shota Imanaga/CHI (3.0) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (3.0).

JOC AT HOME: Joc Pederson, among all players at home (min. 50 PA), is tied for eighth with a .643 SLG and 12th with a 1.052 OPS.

♦ In his last 8 home games, is hitting .323 (10-for-31)/.935 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 homers and 4 RBI.

BULLPEN HANGING ZEROES: Ryan Thompson has held opponents scoreless in his last 8 games (8.1 IP) and 16 of 18 games overall (2 ER in 18.0 IP).

◆ Justin Martinez has held opponents scoreless in 6 outings in May (7.0 IP) and 10 of 11 overall this year.

DEFENSE RULES: The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the Top 10 among outs above average (OAA) leaders: **Christian Walker** (4th, 7) and **Ketel Marte** (T-5th, 6).

- ♦ Marte (7 DRS) and Walker (7 DRS) are tied for sixth (with 4 others), respectively, in defensive runs saved (DRS)
- ♦ The D-backs' 9 DRS are fourth in the NL, behind the Dodgers (35), Braves (18) and Cardinals (11).

ON DECK - LOS ANGELES DODGERS: The D-backs are facing the Dodgers for the second time, having won 1 of 3 games @ Chase Field from April 29-May 1.

- ◆ Christian Walker has reached base safely in 6 straight vs. Dodgers and 17 of his last 21 games.
- ◆ **Ketel Marte** has reached base safely in 11 of his last 12 games vs. Dodgers since April 2, 2023.

NEXT STARTER: RHP SLADE CECCONI (1-3, 5.27)

- ♦ Making his sixth start of the season, fourth road start.
- ♦ In 3 road starts this season, is 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (4 ER in 17.1 IP), opponent .138 AVG (8-for-58)/.495 OPS, 0.69 WHIP, 4 walks and 13 strikeouts.
