TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand (1-4) with the finale of 3 games against the Los Angeles Angels ( $0-2$ )...Seattle opened the homestand with a 3 -game series vs. the Houston Astros (12) over the weekend...following an off day Thursday, the Mariners will begin a 6-game road trip at ChicagoAL (3 G, July 26-28) and Boston (3 G, July 29-31)...today's game against the Angels will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Dave Sims and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports ( 710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Aaron Goldsmith.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost last night's game by a 5-1 score against the Angels...the Mariners are 38-6 (.864) when out-hitting their opponent this season...Seattle is 34-31 in night games and 19-19 in day games.

- Start Your Engines - The Mariners starting rotation has posted a 1.59 ERA (8 ER, 45.1 IP) with 4 walks and 43 strikeouts over their last 7 games (7/13-c), while holding opponents to a . 164 average during that span with a 0.66 WHIP.
- Heavenly Halo Splits - Luis Castillo is 2-0 in 2 starts against the Angels this season, tossing 13.0 scoreless innings with 5 walks and 11 strikeouts between the 2 outings.
- The Muny Effect - Andrés Muñoz has not allowed a hit over his last 6.0 innings ( $7 / 5-\mathrm{c}$ )...he has not allowed a run over his last 8.0 innings ( $6 / 28-\mathrm{c}$ ).
- Yesterday's Roster Moves - The Mariners yesterday (7/23) recalled INF Leo Rivas, OF Cade Marlowe and INF Tyler Locklear from Triple-A Tacoma...in corresponding moves, INF J.P. Crawford was placed on the 10-day Injured List with a right hand fracture, OF Julio Rodríguez was placed on the 10-day Injured List with a right high ankle sprain and INF Ty France was designated for assignment...OF Jonatan Clase was also recalled from Triple-A Tacoma after being optioned post-game on July 22.
NEW FACES...Seattle added 3 new players to the active roster prior to last night's game, each of whom recorded a hit in the contest...OF Cade Marlowe went 1-for-2 with 1 walk, INF Jason Vosler went 1-for-3 with 1 double and 1 walk, INF Tyler Locklear went 1-for-4...last night's game marked Vosler's Mariners debut, while Marlowe made his first appearance in the 2024 season with the club...Locklear is in his second stint with Seattle after previously appearing in 11 games during his first stint from June 9-24.
JULY HEAT ...Luis Castillo has recorded a quality start in each of his 3 July outings this season, going 2-1 with a 1.83 ERA ( 4 ER, 19.2 IP) with 5 walks and 16 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .177 batting average against...overall in his career, Castillo has been his best during the month of July, going 13-8 with a 2.72 ERA ( 70 ER, 231.1 IP), his best ERA in any month ahead of a 3.02 ERA ( 69 ER, 205.1 IP) in Sept./ Oct...dating back to July 19, 2023 vs. Minnesota, Castillo has recorded a quality start in each of his last 6 July outings, including 4 starts allowing 2 -or-fewer runs and 2 scoreless starts.
ROBLES IS ROLLING...Victor Robles has reached base safely in 7 consecutive games (7/13-c), batting .435 (10x23) with 2 runs scored, 2 doubles, 3 walks, 1 hit-by-pitch and 5 stolen bases during that span...in July, Robles is batting .414 (12x29) with 4 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 2 RBI and 6 stolen bases, getting on base at a .500 clip and slugging . 621 (1.121 OPS), ranking 11th in the Majors in OPS during the month (min. 30 PA)...since joining the Mariners, Victor is batting $.375(18 \times 48)$ with 5 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run 3 RBI and 7 stolen bases with a .455 on-base percentage, .542 slugging percentage and a .996 OPS.
HISTORIC HURLERS AT HOME...Seattle pitchers are $31-22$ with 16 saves and a 2.70 ERA (145 ER, 483.0 IP) with 106 walks and 496 strikeouts in 53 games at T-Mobile Park this season...among teams pitching at home, the Mariners lead MLB in ERA (2.70), opponent batting average (.201), WHIP (0.95), hits-per-9 innings (6.56), walks-per-9 innings (1.98), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.68), FIP (2.99) and opponent OPS (.571)...the 4.68 strikeout-to-walk ratio is on pace to be 3rd-best at home in MLB history, trailing the 2017 Guardians (4.81), and the 2019 Dodgers (4.75)...the 0.95 WHIP is on pace to be 3rd-best at home in MLB history, trailing the 1910 White Sox (0.92) and 1908 White Sox (0.93).
PITCH PERFECTS...the Mariners pitching staff is $53-50$ with 27 saves and a 3.43 ERA (347 ER, 911.0 IP) with 244 walks and 866 strikeouts this season...Seattle leads the Majors in ERA (3.43), ranking ahead of Atlanta (3.46) and Philadelphia (3.44)...Mariners pitchers lead the Maiors in opponent batting average (.217), WHIP (1.07), walks-per-9 innings (2.41), hits-per-9 innings (7.1) and rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.55) behind Minnesota (3.60).
SHAKE YOUR MUNY MAKER...right-handed reliever Andrés Muñoz, who was named a 2024 American League All-Star for the first time in his career, has recorded 16 saves, 6 holds and a 1.35 ERA (6 ER, 40.0 IP) with 18 walks and 49 strikeouts in 40 appearances this season...Muñoz sports a 1.00 WHIP and 11.00 strikeouts-per-9 innings...Muñoz is tied for the MLB lead with 6 saves of $4+$ outs and is 1 of only 3 MLB pitchers with $10+$ saves and $5+$ holds, joined by José Alvarado-PHI and Jason Foley-DET...Muñoz is 1 of 3 AL relievers with a sub-2.00 ERA and 10+ saves, along with Emmanuel Clase-CLE and Kirby Yates-TEX. CAL DOES IT ALL...Cal Raleigh has 20 home runs, 62 RBI and 5 stolen bases this season...Cal leads MLB catchers in both home runs and catcher caught stealing (18), while he is tied for the lead in stolen bases...Cal could become the first player to lead catchers in HR, CCS and SB since they began tracking catcher caught stealing in 1974...Cal could also become the first player to lead catchers in both HR and SB in a season since JT Realmuto-PHI in 2020 and the first to lead catchers in a full 162-game season since Carlton Fisk-CWS in 1985.
2024 MLB DRAFT RECAP ...the Mariners announced the signing of 16 drafted players prior to yesterday's game, including first round pick (15th overall) switch-pitcher Jurrangelo Cijntje (jurr-angelo SAIN-jah) and 2nd rounder, right-handed pitcher Ryan Sloan...Seattle also announced 5 undrafted signings yesterday... Seattle drafted 20 players in the 2024 MLB First-Year Player Draft from July 14-16...Seattle selected 14 pitchers, 5 position players and 1 two-way player.
AS YOU KNOW...Jorge Polanco went 0-for-4 in last night's game, despite recording 3 hard-hit balls (95+ mph ) with hit probabilities of $95 \%, 86 \%$ and $51 \%$, but...DID YOU KNOW?...Polanco leads the American League with a $38.9 \%$ line drive rate during the month of July, trailing only Nico Hoerner-CHC (39.4\%) for the MLB lead?...Polanco also holds a .325 expected batting average (xBA) during July, ranking 7thbest in the American League behind Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (.396), Juan Soto-NYY (.356), Brent Rooker-OAK (.349), Nolan Schanuel-LAA (.346), Lawrence Butler-OAK (.345) and Yordan Alvarez-HOU (.334).

## ABOUT CASTILLO.

- The 31-year-old right-hander is set to make his 22nd star of the year and 3rd against Los Angeles-AL...he is also making his 203rd Major League start and 9th career start against the Angels.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11
- Made MLB debut on $6 / 23 / 17$ vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati)
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
LAST TIME OUT...L\#10 on $7 / 19$ vs. Houston...threw a quali-
ty start with 7.0 innings pitched and allowed 3 runs on 6 hits with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts...he has gone 5.0+ innings pitched in every start in 2024...it was his 13th quality start of the season.
CRUISE CONTROL...since his start on April 20 at Colorado, the right-hander is 8-6 with a 3.07 ERA ( 35 ER, 102.2 IP) and 92 strikeouts... 12 of the 17 starts in that span have been quality starts.
BEST IN THE WEST....in 7 starts against the American League West this season, he is $5-1$ with a 2.25 ERA ( 11 ER, 44.0 IP ) and a 8.39 SO/9...each of the 7 starts have been quality starts... 5 wins vs. AL West teams is tied for the most in the Majors.
LUCKY 7s...Castillo has gone 7.0+ innings and allowed 0 runs on 3 occasions this season, tied for the 2nd-most in the Majors (also: Ranger Suárez-PHI, Tyler Glasnow-LAD, Tyler Anderson-LAA and Max Fried-ATL)...each of the 3 outings have come since April 20.
BARNSTORMING...since 9/25/22, he has thrown 5.0+ innings in 26 consecutive road starts...marks the 2nd-longest active streak in the Majors, behind, Corbin Burnes-BAL/MIL (29)...this is the longest such streak by a Mariners pitcher in franchise history.
WHIFF ARTIST...currently 14th in the AL in strikeouts this season with 119...he is also 7th in the AL in swings-and-misses (263) this year...since he made his Mariners debut on $8 / 3 / 22$, Castillo is 1st the Major Leagues with 934 swings-and-misses and in strikeouts (346).
GETTING AHEAD AND STAYING AHEAD...the right-hander has a 63.1\% 1st pitch strike rate so far this year...this marks his 2nd-best 1st-pitch strike rate in his career (2023, 63.7).
START \#200...made his 200th career start in his July 5 outing vs. Toronto....he is 1 of 48 players in MLB history to have 1200+ strikeouts within his first 200 career starts.
FOR CLUB \& COUNTRY...in MLB history, he ranks highly among Domini-can-born pitchers in various categories...minimum 1100.0 innings pitched, he ranks 2nd in SO/9 (9.70), 3rd in SO/BB (3.23), 7th in ERA (3.54) and 15th in strikeouts (1275)...he is 6 strikeouts from tying Wandy Rodriguez for 14thmost strikeouts...among active Dominican-born pitchers, he is 1st in games started (202), wins (70), innings pitched (1179.0), strikeouts (1275) and quality starts (112)...Castillo was born in Bani, Dominican Republic.
CRITICAL MOMENTS...in 2024, he is holding opposing hitters to a . 211 ( $8 \times 38$ ) average with runners in scoring position with 2 outs...has allowed 10 runs in such situations this season, with 10 strikeouts and 1 walk.
CHASING A DREAM...entering today he sits in the 84th percentile for Chase\% in the Majors (Chase\% measures the proportion of pitches outside of the strike zone that batters swing at), (per Baseball Savant)...has a Chase\% of $32.1 \%$ so far in 2024, which registers as the tied for the best in his career.
HEART OF THE ORDER ...has held batters in the $4-6$ spots in the lineup to a .216 ( $35 \times 162$ ) average with 11 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs and 43 strikeouts this season.
OF QUALITY...in 7 starts from 4/14-5/18, he was $4-2$ with a 2.01 ERA (10 ER, 44.2 IP), 48 strikeouts, 11 walks and a 0.90 WHIP...all 7 starts were quality starts, while opponents slashed $.236 / .281 / .402 \ldots$ he is 1 of 24 pitchers in Mariners franchise history to have 7 straight quality starts, 1 of 2 to do so in 2024 (also: George Kirby, 8, 6/9-c).
HOME IN THE PNW...Castillo has now made 65 career starts for Seattle...he ranks 1st in strikeouts (415) and T-2nd in ERA (3.38) in franchise history though a starting pitchers' first 65 starts...he trails Erik Hanson (3.30) and James Paxton (3.38) in ERA...he is 1 of 10 pitchers in franchise history to have 26+ wins in their first 65 games.
QUANTITY AND QUALITY...during his start against the Chicago Cubs on 4/14, he earned his 100th quality start in his career...he is 1 of 20 active pitchers to have 100 or more quality starts in their career $(19 \mathrm{th}, 112)$.
