CINCINNATI REDS (62-65) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (59-67)

AUGUST 22, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME #127/HOME #62

LHP NICK LODOLO (9-5, 4.55 ERA) vs. RHP PAUL SKENES (7-2, 2.30 ERA)

THE PIRATES: were walked off 1-0 in nine innings yesterday in the finale of their series against the Rangers...Are 3-3 in their last six games following their season-high 10-game losing streak from August 4-14...Have won 14 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have played in 45 one-run games, which is tied for the most in MLB along with the Cubs...Have won eight of 10 and 11 of their last 14 games when going deep multiple times in a game...Have the best stolen base percentage (84.6 percent) in MLB...Have recorded an extra base hit in a season-high 27 consecutive games (tied for the third-longest active streak in all of MLB)...Are tied with the Braves and Orioles for the fourth-most quality starts (55) in MLB...The only teams with more quality starts are the Mariners (78), Phillies (65) and Royals (64)...Are hitting .333 with the bases loaded; the fourth-highest average in MLB behind the Royals (.371), Diamondbacks (.370) and Reds (.364)...Have the third-highest batting average (.250) in MLB in pinch-hit situations behind Baltimore (.347) and Arizona (.303)...Have gone 21-20 in series openers (12-8 at home)...Have not been charged with an error in six of their last seven games.

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Paul Skenes will make his 17th start of the season in the opener of this four-game series against the Reds...Skenes is one of five rookies in MLB history to strike out at least 11 batters per nine innings pitched while maintaining a WHIP below 1.00 (minimum 75 innings pitched)...The most recent rookie to finish a season with such numbers was Spencer Strider in 2022...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

FOR STARTERS: Each of Pittsburgh's last two starters have pitched at least 6.0 scoreless innings while allowing three or fewer hits...In the modern era, the Pirates have never had their starting pitcher reach those marks in three straight games...Coming into today, Pittsburgh's starting rotation the fourth-lowest ERA (3.73) in all of MLB behind the Mariners (3.32), Phillies (3.46) and Royals (3.54)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Pittsburgh's starting rotation has recorded the lowest ERA in the National League once in team history, doing so in 1921 with a 3.21 ERA.

LOVING LEFTIES: The Pirates will be opposed by a starting lefthander today for the third straight game and 39th time this season (the Bucs are 19-19 in games started by opposing lefties)...The Pirates will also be opposed by southpaw Andrew Abbott tomorrow night...It will be the first time for the Pirates to face four straight lefties since the first five games to begin the 2024 campaign.

SETTING UP THE SERIES: The Pirates have won their first two series against the Reds this season...The Bucs are looking to win their first three series of a season against Cincinnati for the first time since 2011...Tonight will also begin a stretch of seven straight and 10 of the next 13 games against teams from the National League Central for the Pirates.

RED HOTS: Since the beginning of last season, Jared Triolo owns an OPS of 1.577 against the Reds...That is the highest mark by any of the 160 players with at least 25 plate appearances against Cincinnati over that span...Bryan Reynolds has 15 home runs against the Reds since the beginning of 2019...That's tied for the third-most by any player behind Ian Happ (21) and Paul Goldschmidt (16).

CRUZING ALONG: Oneil Cruz went 1-for-3 with a walk and stolen base yesterday to extend his on-base streak to 13 games...Cruz is hitting .326 (15-for-46) with four doubles, a triple, home run, six RBI, .426 OBP, .522 slugging percentage and a .948 OPS during his current 13-game on-base streak.

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman ranks 10th in all of MLB and fourth among all National League relief pitchers with 70 strikeouts...The only three National League relievers with more punchouts are Ryan Walker (80), Jeremiah Estrada (79) and Fernando Cruz (78)...Chapman comes into today one strikeout shy of tying Lee Smith for the fourth-most punchouts in MLB history among relief pitchers.

CALL TO THE PEN: Pittsburgh's bullpen has recorded a 2.74 ERA since August 7...The only three National League teams with a lower bullpen ERA during that time are the Nationals (2.15), Diamondbacks (2.65) and Padres (2.73)...The bullpen's .216 batting average against since August 7 is also the third-lowest in the National League behind the Dodgers (.199) and Reds (.209).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 22, 2009: The Pirates won their fifth straight game in a 12-2 rout of the Cincinnati Reds at PNC Park. Garret Jones and Ryan Doumit each went 3-for-5 with three RBI in the win. Doumit hit his seventh homer of the season and finished the night a triple away from the cycle. Zach Duke shut down the Reds, allowing just two runs on eight hits to earn his 10th win of the season.

TODAY'S STARTER RHP PAUL SKENES #30

2024 RECORD: 7-2, 2.30 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-6/235 **BATS/THROWS:** R/R
BORN: May 29, 2002
AGE: 22 **SIGNED:** Thru 2024
HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...He began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he posted an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) and recorded 45 strikeouts while allowing just eight walks in seven starts before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed two runs in 6.0 innings while winning a 5-3 decision in his last start Friday night at PNC Park against the Mariners...The win snapped Pittsburgh's season-high 10-game losing streak.

VS. CINCINNATI: Skenes will be making his second start against the Reds this season...He struck out seven batters, allowed one run in 6.0 innings, and won a 4-1 decision against Carson Spiers in his first start on June 17 here at PNC Park.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 17th career start and appearance tonight...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 15 of his 16 career outings, including two or fewer 13 times and one or fewer eight times (three scoreless outings).
 • Of his 16 career starts, 12 have been quality starts...The only Pirate with more quality starts this year is Mitch Keller (13).

AS A PIRATES ROOKIE: Skenes comes into tonight with 121 strikeouts, which ranks second among all National League rookies behind Chicago's Shota Imanaga...Skenes' 121 punchouts are already the most by a Pirates rookie since Kris Benson had 139 strikeouts in 1999...Skenes also has seven wins after his first 16 starts...His seven wins are the most by a Pirates rookie since Gerrit Cole had 10 in 2013.

AT HOME: Skenes has gone 4-1 with a 2.80 ERA (54.2ip/17er) in nine starts this year at PNC Park (the Pirates are 5-4 in those games)...His only loss came on July 23 against the Cardinals when he allowed two runs in 8.1 innings in a 2-1 victory by the RedBirds.

HERE'S THE PITCH: Skenes has a 29.6 whiff percentage when throwing his sinker this year according to Baseball Savant...That's the eighth-best whiff percentage among all pitchers in MLB according to Baseball Savant...The only seven pitchers with a better whiff percentage when throwing the sinker are Andres Munoz (45.3 percent), Tanner Banks (40.0 percent), Josh Hader (33.1 percent), Aroldis Chapman (32.5 percent), Kenley Jansen (32.3 percent), Edwin Uceta (31.2 percent) and Calvin Faucher (30.0 percent).

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (first, 2.30), WHIP (second, 0.97), strikeout-to-walk ratio (third, 5.04), strikeouts (fourth, 121), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (fourth, 11.11) and batting average against (second, .202).

100 K CLUB: Skenes reached 100 career strikeouts in his 13th career game in his outing on July 29 at Houston...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the sixth player all-time since the current mound distance was established in 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014...The others to do so were Kerry Wood in 1998 (12 games), Hideo Nomo in 1995 (12 games), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13 games) and Herb Score in 1955 (12 games).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.
 • He was the fifth rookie to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

JUST KEEP WINNING: Skenes took his first loss as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues) on July 23 vs. St. Louis despite pitching a career-high 8.1 innings, allowing just two runs on four hits with eight strikeouts and no walks in what was his 12th career start...He was the first pitcher in Pirates history to not take a loss in each of his first 11 Major League games, all of which were starts...The previous best had been 10 by Zach Duke in 2005 (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

NO HITS (AGAIN): On July 11 at Milwaukee, Skenes threw 7.0 no-hit innings, walking one and matching his career high with 11 strikeouts...He was the seventh Pirates pitcher to ever leave a game with 7.0+ no-hit innings and the first since Francisco Cordova (9.0) did so in a combined, extra-inning no-hit bid on July 12, 1997.

ON DECK: The 27-year-old Falter will make his 22nd start of the season tomorrow night... Allowed two runs in 5.2 innings, struck out a career-high tying eight batters, and won a 7-2 decision in his last start on 8/17 against the Mariners...Is 3-3 with a 3.61 ERA (52.1ip/21er) in 10 starts this season at PNC Park...Has not allowed a home run in his last three starts and just one long ball in 28.0 innings of work in his last seven starts...Is 0-3 in seven career appearances (five starts) against the Reds.

RACKING UP PUNCHIES: Skenes recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine consecutive games dating back to the second game of the doubleheader in Detroit on May 29 through his start on July 23 vs. St. Louis, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

- The nine-game streak matched the Major League record by a rookie, done by Dwight Gooden from August 11-September 23, 1984 and Brandon Beachy from August 9-September 24, 2011 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 12 of his 16 career outings.

MILITARY MAN: Spent the first two years of his collegiate career at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player while both pitching and catching...He majored in Military Strategic Studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.

- Has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families, and those in need...ESPN's Pat McAfee has also pledged to match Paul's donation at the end of the season.
