METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned a 3-2 victory over the Pirates on Sunday...The Mets have won back-to-back games after losing three straight... New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break..They are 5-5 in that span...The Mets are at the end of an eight-game road trip (4-3)...They traveled to Washington D.C. for a four-game series (2-2) and to Pittsburgh, PA (2-1) for a four-game series...Following this trip, the Mets head to Citi Field to close out the first-half with a six-game homestand against Nationals (three games) and Rockies (three games).

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Congrats to Pete Alonso who was named to the 2024 NL All-Star team...The 94th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 16 in Texas...Alonso, 29, was named to the All-Star team for the fourth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history one more than Keith Hernandez...Alonso, who was also an All-Star in 2019. 2022 and 2023, becomes the 11th Met to be named to four or more All-Star

**DERBY DAY:** Alonso also announced last night that he will participate in the 2024 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffev Jr.)...He will be the sixth player to compete in the HR Derby at least five times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six) and Albert Pujols (five).

fWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor ranks 10th in the major leagues and fifth in the National League with a 3.5 fWAR...Brandon Nimmo is 24th in the majors and 12th in the NL with a 2.8 fWAR...His 2.8 fWAR is third among NL outfielders (min. 100 PA) behind only Jurickson Profar (3.3 fWAR) and Christian Yelich (3.1 fWAR).

WE REMEMBER: Today, we say goodbye to New York Mets Team Photographer Marc Levine who sadly passed away...For more than three and half decades, Marc documented every move our team made from minor leaguers to Hall of Fame and number retirement ceremonies...He photographed over 2,000 Mets.

I DON'T WANT TO BE A PIRATE: Pete Alonso is a .318 (14-44) hitter with five runs, five doubles, one RBI and five walks in 12 career games at PNC Park... Jose Iglesias has hit .342 (25-73) with five runs, five doubles, seven RBI and 11 walks in 23 career games at the yard...Tyrone Taylor has hit .306 (19-62) with five doubles, two triples, one home run, nine RBI and three walks with a .500 SLG in 18 games in Pittsburgh.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break...New York is 23-19 on the road...Their .548 road winning percentage is the seventh-best in the majors and the third-best in the National League... The Amazins' have hit .268/.329/.444 on the road in 2024...They are second in the majors in AVG, SLG and OBP and are third in OPS...They have scored 231 runs on the road, averaging a major league-best 5.50 runs/game...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 45 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .298/.362/.521 with 34 runs, 18 doubles, eight home runs, 25 RBI, 14 walks, 10 steals with an .883 OPS......Francisco Lindor has posted a 3.0 fWAR since May 1...That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Bryce Harper (3.2 fWAR) and Shohei Ohtani (3.2  $\bar{\text{fWAR}}$  )...It is seventh in the majors in that period...In 59 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .276/.333/.490 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won 14 of their last 18 games against the Pirates...New York is 34-39 at PNC Park.

INVADER NIMS: Entering June, Brandon Nimmo was batting .214/.350/378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 28 games since then, he is batting .318/.409/.573 with 26 runs, seven doubles, one triple, six home runs, 24 RBI, 13 walks with a .982 OPS...He has safely reached base in 19 of his last 20 games, posting a .456 OBP in that

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game...Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season...He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts...In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1 IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts...The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington.

ROAD SHOW: Nimmo is batting .290/.411/.559 with 34 runs, nine doubles. one triple, nine home runs, 29 RBI and 23 walks in 38 games on the road this season...He is fifth in the majors with a .411 OBP on the road and is ninth with a .559 SLG...This compares to a .213/.328/.341 with 12 extra-base hits and 24 RBI in 45 games on the road.

**HOMEGROWN:** The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2021 (Christian Scott), 2020 (Eric Orze), 2017 (David Peterson, Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts...ln addition, the team features several players who signed via International Free Agency including Francisco Alvarez, Jose Quintana, José Buttó and Dedniel Núñez.

### **BUTTO NEWS & NOTES**

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** Made his sixth start and first start since he was recalled back to the major league team on July 3 in Washington... Allowed four earned runs on six hits with two walks and struck out two...Three of those earned runs were off a home run n his final inning of work.

**DOWN AT THE FARM:** Since he returned to Triple-A, Scott made four starts, posting a 2.12 ERA (4 ER/17.0 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...All together in nine starts at Triple-A, Scott is 3-0 with a 2.76 ERA (13 ER/42.1 IP) with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts.

**WHAT A DEBUT:** Christian Scott made his major league debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts... He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year... Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

**SIZZLING IN SYRACUSE:** At the time of his first call up, was 3-0 with a 3.20 ERA (9 ER/25.1 IP) at Syracuse...Has made five starts, allowing six walks and striking out 36...Led the International League in WHIP (0.71) and batting average against (.136), while placing fourth in strikeouts (36) and ninth in ERA (3.20).

**23 AND ME:** Named the New York Mets 2023 Pitcher of the Year after making 19 starts this across three levels season and posting a 5-4 record with a 2.57 ERA (25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts.

**HE'S GOT PROSPECTS:** Entered the 2024 season as the 99th best prospect in the minors by ESPN.

**SLIDE TO THE RIGHT:** While seeking a third pitch, looked at Pitching Ninja video and discovered the slider grip used by Max Scherzer...It's still the grip he uses today...Was predominately a reliever throughout his career at the University of Florida and transitioned to a starting role after he was selected by the Mets.

**MINOR LEAGUE BACKGROUND:** In 2023, held opposing hitters to a .199 batting average and posted 10.98 strikeouts per nine innings...Started for the Rumble Ponies in Game One of the Northeast Division Series...In 2022, he split his time between A St. Lucie and A+ Brooklyn with a combined 4.45 ERA in 18 appearances...In 2021, he had three relief outings for FCL Mets and threw 12 strikes out of 16 total pitches.
